### Media Policies at Practices

- No live reports of any type from practice.
- Still photographers must give 24-hour advance notice.
- No reports permitted on injuries, protective gear, who is playing where or schemes unless initiated by Coach Whittingham.
- Interviews are typically conducted after practice on Mondays (players\*) and Tuesdays (players, Coach Whittingham, two assistant coaches).
- \*Players at the Monday press conference will not be available after practice that day.
- Media may observe the final 20 minutes of practice on Tuesdays.
- For weeks with Thursday games, the only media access is the Monday press conference. There are no assistant coach interviews the weeks of Thursday games and byes.
- 10-minute limit on player interviews beginning when they come off the field.

- > Utah moved up two places to No. 23 in this week's Coaches' poll and is first of the others receiving votes in the AP poll.
- > Utah is 22-1 in non-conference games since joining the Pac-12 in 2011, including a 16-0 non-conference record in the last four years.
- > Utah has won the last six games against BYU and **Kyle Whittingham** is 8-3 against his alma mater as Utah's head coach.
- > Utah leads the series with BYU 59-34-4, although the Cougars don't recognize six games (split 3-3) when it was known as Brigham Young Academy.

## Utah-BYU Series (59-34-4)

**Series Snapshot:** Utah leads the series with BYU 59-34-4, although the Cougars don't recognize six games (split 3-3) when it was known as the Brigham Young Academy. Utah has beaten BYU six straight times and has won 11 of the last 15 games. Kyle Whittingham is 8-3 against his alma mater as Utah's head coach. The Utes lead the Cougars 19-17-1 in Provo, including the last two meetings in Lavell Edwards Stadium in 2011 and 2013.

### Last Game • Sept. 10, 2016, Salt Lake City • Utah 20, BYU 19

With 0:18 remaining, Utah stopped BYU's 2-point conversion attempt to secure a 20-19 win. Utah got off to a quick start when Sunia Tauteoli picked off Taysom Hill's pass on the first play from scrimmage and returned it 41 yards for a touchdown. But the Utes had to overcome six turnovers of their own for their sixth-straight win over BYU. With BYU leading 13-7 and just seconds remaining in the first half, Troy Williams found Tim Patrick for a 21-yard touchdown pass to put Utah up 14-13. Andy Phillips had all six Utah points in the second half on field goals of 47 and 29 yards. Reggie Porter led the defense with seven tackles and his first career interception.

## In the Huddle

First-year Ute **Matt Gay**, who was perfect in field goals and PATs vs. North Dakota, has moved to No. 1 on the depth chart at placekicker ... **Alex Whittingham** has won the starting job at snapper ... Players making their first career NCAA start in last week's 37-16 win over North Dakota were defensive backs **Julian Blackmon**, **Corrion Ballard** and **Casey Hughes**; offensive linemen **Jordan Agasiva**, **Lo Falemaka** and **Darrin Paulo**; quarterback **Tyler Huntley**; kicker **Chayden Johnston** and **Whittingham** ... Five true freshmen have played: **Johnston**; **Tyquez Hampton**, **Jaylon Johnson**, **Javelin Guidry** and **Orlando Umana**.

## Two-Minute Drill

Utah's current six-game win streak against BYU is the Utes' longest since they took six in a row from the Cougars from 1959-64. The last time the Utes won seven straight against BYU was from 1951-57 ... Last week's win over North Dakota was the 190th victory **Kyle Whittingham** has participated in as a Utah coach—most of any football coach in school history. Of those wins, 105 have come with Whittingham as the head coach ... Utah is 16-6 all time in games televised on ESPN2.

## Last Game

After starting slowly, Utah dominated No. 8 FCS-ranked North Dakota before the 45th-consecutive sellout crowd in Rice-Eccles Stadium in a 37-16 win. In his starting debut, sophomore quarterback **Tyler Huntley** had a career night, throwing for 227 yards (23-32-1) and a touchdown, while adding 70 rushing yards with two touchdowns—the first on a 16-yard run that gave Utah a 7-3 lead. **Zack Moss** had a career-high 128 yards rushing (1 TD) and first-year Ute **Darren Carrington II** had 10 receptions for 127 yards and a TD. Another senior transfer—**Matt Gay**—also shined in his Ute debut, making all three field goal attempts, including a long of 49 yards. Linebackers **Sunia Tauteoli** (10 tackles, 1 TFL) and **Cody Barton** (7 tackles) led a defense that held North Dakota to 55 rushing yards and 242 total yards. **Julian Blackmon** had his first career interception.

## Utah's All-Time Record

Utah's all-time football record is 662-453-31. The Utes are 401-188-16 at home (83-31 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 239-248-12 in road games and 22-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

## Utah vs. the Pac-12

Utah is 25-29 against Pac-12 teams as a conference member and 101-149-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools. The series breakdown follows: Arizona (2-4/21-19-2), Arizona State (2-4/8-20), California (2-2/5-6), Colorado (4-2/28-32-3), Oregon (1-3/9-21), Oregon State (4-2/9-11-1), Stanford (2-0/4-3), UCLA (3-3/4-11), USC (2-4/5-10), Washington (1-3/1-9), Washington State (2-2/7-7).

## Whittingham File

In his 13th season as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** owns a 105-50 overall record. His bowl win percentage of 91-percent (10-1) is the best in NCAA history and his 10 bowl wins is tied for second among active coaches (one behind Alabama's Nick Saban). The 2008 National Coach of the Year, Whittingham's postseason success includes a 2-0 mark in BCS bowl games (2005 Fiesta Bowl vs. Pittsburgh, 2009 Sugar Bowl vs. Alabama). His teams have finished in the AP top 25 five times, including the last three seasons. He came to Utah in 1994 as the defensive line coach. In his 23 seasons as an assistant and head coach, he has participated in more wins (190) than any football coach in school history. See the sidebar on page 2 for more on Whittingham.

## Quarterback Notebook

> In his starting debut, sophomore **Tyler Huntley** had career highs in both passing (227 yards, 1 TD) and rushing (70 yards, 2 TD).

> **Huntley** completed 23-of-32 passes with one interception against North Dakota.

> **Huntley's** 71.9% completion percentage ranks fifth in the Pac-12 and 23rd nationally, while his 23 completions against the Fighting Hawks ranks No. 4 in the Pac-12 and 22nd in the nation.

> **Huntley's** 70 rushing yards was the second most by a Pac-12 quarterback in week one.

> **Huntley's** 227 passing yards ranked 13th nationally (third in the Pac-12) among quarterbacks making their first career start last week.

> **Huntley's** two rushing touchdowns against North Dakota doubled his total from last season. His lone rushing score in 2016 came in Utah's Foster Farms Bowl win.

> **Huntley** was responsible for 18 of Utah's 37 points, putting him at No. 25 in the nation and fourth in the league.

> With his two rushing touchdowns, **Huntley** was one of just five quarterbacks in the nation to rush for multiple touchdowns in week one.

> Utah has three quarterbacks with NCAA FBS experience: **Huntley**, senior **Troy Williams** and senior **Cooper Bateman**.

> **Williams**, Utah's starter last season and now No. 2 on the depth chart, posted a 9-4 record his junior season, passing for 2,757 yards and 15 touchdowns (8 INT) and running for 235 yards and five scores.

> **Bateman** joined the Utes as a walk-on in the spring after lettering three seasons at Alabama.

> **Bateman** completed 49-of-66 (74%) passes for 410 yards and two touchdowns in his career at Alabama.

Father Paul played football and baseball for the Utes and spent a year in the minors with the Toronto Blue Jays' organization. Mother Mikki (Kane) Barton, a member of Utah's Crimson Club Hall of Fame, was an all-conference basketball and volleyball player at Utah. In basketball, she was the 1993 Western Athletic Conference Player of the Year, a three-time first-team all-WAC pick and a two-time honorable mention All-American. She also played two seasons of volleyball and led the nation in blocks in 1993 while making the all-conference team ... **Nick Ford's** heritage is black Portuguese and native American. He enjoys playing the piano and guitar, swimming, surfing, biking, horseback riding, camping and science ... **Leki Fotu** played on the USA Rugby Boys High School All-American team and trained with the London Wasps' rugby team in 2013 ... **Tyquez Hampton** has not declared a major but is interested in a career in nursing ... **Jordan Howard** was seriously wounded when he was 16 years old in a shooting that left two friends dead. He and four friends were walking to a movie when a man (since convicted of murder) stepped from a car and sprayed them with gunfire. A bullet struck near Howard's left eye, which doctors initially thought would need to be removed. Howard, who bears a scar by his eye, was awarded a scholarship for his final season during training camp ... **Ali'i Niumatalolo's** father Ken Niumatalolo is the head football coach at Navy.
