Q & A:

Question: *If I'm not going to be using my complimentary admissions for an event, can I just sell them at face value?*

Answer: No. If you have complimentary admissions for any event (home or away) you may not sell them, even to a family member. You may, however, *give* them away to a family member or friend, but they cannot give you any kind of tangible compensation for the tickets.

Complimentary Admissions (Bylaw 16.2)

As student-athletes, you may be given complimentary admissions for athletics events.

- The general rule allows you to receive up to **four** complimentary admissions to a home or away event in your sport.
- For Conference Championships, NCAA Championships and Bowl Games, you may receive up to **six** complimentary admission. (Please take note that this does not mean that you will always receive the maximum permissible amount of admissions. It is entirely up to your coach. The amount indicated is the MAX complimentary amount you may receive.)
- For home events in sports other than you own, you may be provided admission through a pass list. (Often it is on a first come, first serve basis.)

- **You may not receive payment from any source for your complimentary admissions and may not exchange or assign them for any item of value.**
 - Individuals designated to receive your comp admissions may not receive any type of payment or exchange them for any item of value. (You are held responsible for assuring that this does not happen. Know who you are giving your tickets to.)
 - No special arrangements may be made for you to purchase additional tickets in any way that is different from the general public. **So please don't ask!**
 - You may not purchase tickets on your own, and then turn around to sell them at a price greater than face value.
 - Tickets to professional sporting events **may not** be given to student-athletes.

Actions to the contrary will jeopardize your eligibility. If you ever have any questions, please contact anyone in the Compliance Office to ask before you act!
