TOURNAMENT PLAY CONTINUES IN FRESNO

PROVO, Utah (March 3, 2009)—The BYU softball team (10-10) continues its 33-game road stand at the Bayer Cropsience Classic in Fresno, Calif., where it will face two top-25 opponents.

The Cougars will first face the hosting No. 21/24 Fresno State Bulldogs at 7 p.m. (PST) on Thursday. The Bulldogs are 8-6 on the season, but are coming off a tremendous 2008, when they finished 54-13 at the NCAA Regionals. Fresno State leads the all-time series 5-1.

On Friday BYU will take on Providence in the first game of an afternoon doubleheader. Providence is 5-8 on the season. The Cougars last met Providence in a 12-2 victory in 2002.

The nightcap will feature BYU against Northern Illinois. The meeting will be the first between the two schools.

With another matchup against Northern Illinois on Saturday morning, BYU will then face its toughest competition of the Classic in No. 9/10 Cal. After finishing 2008 in the NCAA Super Regional, the Golden Bears are 14-3 on the season.

The Cougars look to snap their five-game losing streak to top-25 opponents this season. BYU has faced No. 1/3 Washington (then No. 15), No. 3/1 Alabama (No. 1), No. 8/9 Michigan (No. 6), No. 7/8 Tennessee (No. 12) and No. 20/22 Louisville (RV) this season.

ABOUT THE TEAM . . .

LAST WEEK

The Cougars won three of four games on the road at the Mayfair Invitational in Long Beach, Calif. Strong pitching in the first day of the Invitational yielded two wins for BYU. Zinanti shut out Iowa State 5-0 allowing only four hits, but Paige Affleck struck out a season-high 12 batters against Wisconsin. The cougars took the Badgers, 8-2, led by freshman Tiffany Messerschmidt who went 4-for-4, scoring three runs.

On the second day of action, Affleck took the loss against Long Beach State, despite allowing only one earned run. The Cougar defense struggled and allowed four unearned runs to score in a 5-0 shut out loss. Against Cal State Northridge a three-run homer from Angeline Quiocho clinched BYU's come-from-behind, 5-3, win.

REMEMBERING LARRY H. MILLER

As a long-time fast pitch softball supporter, Larry H. Miller made significant contributions to the BYU softball team. The Cougars are proud of the baseball/softball complex that bears the Miller name. The softball team is wearing LHM patches on their uniforms in honor and gratitude to Miller. Both head coach Gordon Eakin and assistant coach Vaughn Alvey played on the Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch Softball Team.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Cougars are 20 games into a 33-game road trip to begin the season. The team travels as far as Tampa, Florida, to compete during their tournament schedule. BYU opens its home season on March 24 against Boise State at 4 p.m.

MILESTONE COACHING WIN

During the Louisville Slugger Classic BYU head coach Gordon Eakin earned his 250th win with a 8-0 victory over Virginia. As the second coach in BYU history he is the winningest coach in Cougar history.

NATIONAL TEAM COACHES POOL

The Amateur Softball Association of America and USA Softball announced that Eakin is one of 14 coaches selected to the 2009 Women's National team coaching pool. The coaches have been selected for the 2009-2012 quadrennium and are responsible for the training and preparation of the national team. The final selection will be released at a later date.

VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

BYU is set to take on two top-25 opponents at the Toyota Bingham Classic in No. 9/10 Cal and No. 21/24 Fresno State. The Cougars are now 0-5 against opponents ranked in the top-25 at the time of the game. BYU face No. 1/3 Washington (Then No. 15) in a 7-3 defeat before falling 0-4 in 10 innings against No. 7/8 Tennessee (Then No. 12) at the Red Desert Classic. BYU dropped a 4-2 game to No. 8/9 Michigan, before taking on No.3/1 Alabama in a 6-0 loss (then No. 1/1). BYU also dropped a game to No. 21/24 Louisville (then RV).

DID YOU KNOW...

- This year BYU carries two married players: Stephanie Hopkins and Whitney Nix-Thomas.
- The BYU softball program began in 2000, and the team has had eight-straight winning seasons.
- BYU has had four-consecutive berths to the NCAA Regional Tournament.
- During the program's existence it has carried six different All-Americans, including Jodi Norton and Jennifer Whitely from the 2007 MWC Champions.

BACK IN THE SADDLE

BYU junior Andrea Ramirez made her return to the diamond in St. George. Ramirez sat out the 2008 season following knee surgery. During her freshman campaign she was named to the MWC All-Conference team.

HOME SWEET HOME

The back-to-back Miller Park facility will host six dates when both baseball and softball compete at the same time. Larry H. Miller Field seats 2,204 fans in two-tiered permanent seating for baseball. Gail Miller Field has 2,100 chair seats, making it the fourth-largest on-campus NCAA softball facility.

SACRIFICIN' FLIES

The Cougars have recorded only two sacrifice flies during the 2009 season, but three runs have scored off of the two fly balls. Sophomore Jessica Purcell hit a 2-RBI sac fly against Texas on Feb. 20. The deep-hit ball was caught, but as the centerfielder caught it she tripped allowing enough time to bring around runners from third and second. Freshman Tiffany Messerschmidt leads the team with six sac bunts.

THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN

The seven freshman on the roster have already begun to make significant contributions to the Cougars. Eakin expects all of the rookies to continue to make impacts both with their defense, their speed and their strength at the plate. Six of the seven have made starting appearances.

COUGARS IN THE CONFERENCE

BYU and San Diego State are expected to contend for the MWC title according to a vote by the league coaches. The Cougars and Aztecs each received three first-place votes to finish in a tie for first in the pre-season poll. In 2008 the Aztecs took the Conference title, while BYU finished in second-place.
