Series Records:

BYU has a 208-92-1 record against the University of Utah. BYU's greatest and longest standing rivalry--with the University of Utah--did not start on the football field. On May 18, 1895, the Brigham Young Academy played the first ever intercollegiate event in Utah against the Utes on a baseball diamond. The game ended in a 0-0 tie and a bench-clearing brawl.

TV Games:

BYU has 13 games that will be televised live by BYUTV, including the final two of the Utah series this week. Calling the play-by-play is Jarom Jordan with former Cougar pitcher Justin Su`a as his color analyst.

Coach Vance Law

Vance Law is in his 10th season as head coach at BYU. He played 14 years of pro ball, including 11 years in the majors with six different teams. In 2001 he was named Coach of the Year in the Mountain West Conference. The 52-year-old coach entered this season with a 287-239-2 (.546) record. He is assisted by Ryan Roberts, in his seventh year at BYU. Pitching coach Bobby Applegate is in his sixth year with BYU, having last coached at the Air Force Academy.

Hitting Streaks

Michael Bowen has the team's top current hitting streak at four games, followed by Kasey Ko at three games. Sean McNaughton, had a seven-game hitting streak, carrying over a one-game streak from the end of last year, but lost it and now has a two-game streak. McNaughton had a team-best 16-game hitting streak last season, followed by Walton at 15 games.

Wolfe Injured

Alex Wolfe learns this week the status of what is believed to be an ACL injury to his knee. The sophomore catcher/first baseman injured it in the eighth inning during his fourth plate appearance of game one vs. St. John's last Friday.

Deseret First Duel, Round Two

The baseball portion of the Deseret First Duel starts this week with BYU and Utah. Last season BYU's baseball team earned three points in the first year of the promotion, with a run differential of 38 to 26 after the two teams split 2-2 in the four games. In the last meeting between BYU and Utah baseball the Cougars fashioned one of the most incredible comebacks in school history on May 18 at Franklin Covey Field in Salt Lake City. Down 10-0 after seven innings to the Utes in the finale, BYU scored a season-high 12 runs in the eighth, from 11 singles. BYU scored 10 of those runs before an out was made. That 13-10 victory gave the team the Deseret First Duel baseball portion of the trophy.

Baseball-Softball Play Same Days at Home

The back-to-back Miller Park facility will host six dates when both baseball and softball compete at the same time. Larry H. Miller Field seats 2,204 fans in two-tiered permanent seating for baseball. Gail Miller Field has 2,100 chair seats, making it the fourth-largest on-campus NCAA softball facility.

Mar. 24 baseball hosts Utah Valley at 6 p.m., while softball opens its home season against Boise State at 5 p.m. On April 16 baseball hosts Utah at 6 p.m., while softball hosts San Diego State at 7 p.m. On April 23 baseball hosts New Mexico at 7 p.m., while softball hosts Utah Valley at 6 p.m. On April 25 baseball closes a three-game series with New Mexico at 1 p.m., while softball hosts Utah at 2 p.m. On May 8-9 baseball hosts UNLV at 7 and 1 p.m., while softball hosts Colorado State at 7 and 2 p.m.--this is the same weekend BYU hosts the NCAA Men's Volleyball National Championships (May 7-9).

About the Team ...

Oldest to Youngest

There are eight seniors and seven freshmen on the current squad. The ages range from 25-year-old Thomas Bills to 18-year-old Nathan Bunch—the next youngest are Adam Law and Marc Oslund who just turned 19 in February. Last year there were no seniors on the team.

Room, but not bored

Kent Walton and Jonathan Cluff were housed in the summer of 2007 by Steve Garvey, a 10-time All-Star in the Majors, when they played for the Palm Springs Power in Calif.

Home Season

BYU drew 19,474 fans in its 21-game home schedule last season for an average of 927 with a 8-13 record. The Cougars schedule have a 114-54 (.678) record at Larry H. Miller Field which seats 2,204 fans in its eighth season since it was built. In those eight years BYU has drawn 200,331 fans for an average of 1,363 and 139,232 at night for an average of 1,450. This season BYU has drawn 2,781 fans at home, but most of the seven games were not paid admission.

- BYU's three starting freshman pitchers are a combined 4-0.
- BYU has four players who are married (Stetson Banks, Thomas Bills, Dane Nielsen and Kevin Sloan).
- Incorporated into this year's team are three players who have just finished serving two-year Church missions (Stetson Banks, Seth Johnson and Dane Nielsen).
- Five players transferred to BYU this season (Shawn Hardesty, Brock Luker, Matthew Neil, Jeremy Toole and Alex Wolfe).
- Among those who could throw batting practice to BYU again this season is former Cy Young winner Vernon Law (1960 Pittsburgh Pirates), father of BYU head coach Vance Law. Vernon turns 79-years-old on March 12 of 2009 and had seven-by-pass heart surgery four years ago.

Rare Monday Games

BYU's first game at Oregon State is a rare Monday appearance for the Cougars. As a church-sponsored university, BYU rarely plays a Monday game because of Family Home Evening. BYU has never played a game on Sunday and does not practice on that day either. In fact, BYU rejected an earned opportunity to play in the 1958 College World Series because of potential Sunday play, a rule which has since been modified as BYU played in the 1968 and 1971 College World Series. There are six Monday games on this year's schedule--all away. Thus far BYU has played on Monday at Baylor and at Wichita State. Last year BYU played three Monday games, one at home.

- Bryce Ayoso—brother, Jared, played baseball for two years at Utah Valley State College.
- Stetson Banks—uncle, Brian Banks, played baseball at BYU (1990, 1993), played in the majors with the Florida Marlins, and was a member of the 2003 World Series Championship team.
- Thomas Bills—father, Jeff Bills, played catcher for BYU from 1972-75, grandfather Karol Bills played football and baseball in the late 1940s and early 1950s. Brother Kevin Bills played for BYU baseball from 1999-2004.
- Seth Johnson—father, Bill, played semi-pro football for the Thunderbirds in Albuquerque, N.M.
- Vance Law, head BYU coach—father, Vernon Law, was 1960 Cy Young winner and was a pitcher for the Pittsburgh Pirates (1950-67), brother Veryl Law played basketball at BYU (1974-77) alongside Vance (1975-77), brothers Veldon Law (1975) and Vaughn Law (1979) played baseball for BYU, son Tim Law played baseball at Dixie in 1998, and at BYU in 2001, 2003-2004.
