GAME STORYLINES

- **THE OLD WAGON WHEEL.** BYU and Utah State are playing for "The Old Wagon Wheel" 89th time. The Cougars hold a 48-37-3 record in the overall series dating back to 1922, though the Old Wagon Wheel did not become a tradition in the rivalry until 1948. BYU has only played more games against one other opponent (Utah-94) than the Aggies in the history of the program. The Cougars are 17-19-2 at Utah State. BYU holds a 6-4 advantage in the last 10 meetings and is 2-2 in Logan during that stretch. The Aggies have won consecutive games in the series for the first time since a streak of four games from 1971-74.
- **COACHING TREE.** Head coach of the Aggies Gary Andersen and BYU head coach Kalani Sitake have coached together multiple times over the years. Sitake coached running backs and tight ends under Andersen at Southern Utah in 2003 when Andersen was the head coach of the Thunderbirds. The two reunited at Utah from 2005-08 when Sitake coached linebackers with Andersen as the Utes' defensive coordinator. Sitake took over as DC after Andersen left for his first stint as head coach of the Aggies in 2009. The two coached together again in 2015 when Andersen was the head coach at Oregon State and brought Sitake in as his defensive coordinator.
- **TOUGH SCHEDULE.** According to the Jeff Sagarin ratings on USA Today, BYU has played the 7th toughest schedule in college football through seven games. BYU's opponents have gone a combined 55-39 to date. The Cougars have also faced four ranked teams this year. Only Northwestern, Auburn, South Carolina, Mississippi State, Michigan State and Stanford have played more difficult schedules.
- **WEEKLY AWARDS.** Following the Boise State game, tight end Matt Bushman was named the John Mackey Tight End of the Week while quarterback Baylor Romney and linebacker Tyler Allgeier both earned weekly awards for their performances against the Broncos.
- **COLLEGE FOOTBALL 150.** 2019 represents the 150th year of college football, celebrating the first game played between Rutgers and Princeton, Nov. 6, 1869. Throughout the 2019 season, watch for special ways college football programs honor the rich tradition that is college football, starting with a uniform patch the Cougars will wear each game and the CFB150 logo as the 50-yard markers on the field.

Coach Sitake and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. UTAH STATE LOSES MOUNTAIN DIVISION BATTLE AT AIR FORCE, 31-7

AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. – Three different Air Force players rushed for at least 88 yards and combined for four touchdowns as the Falcons beat Utah State 31-7 late Saturday night at Falcon Stadium.

The Aggies (4-3, 3-1 Mountain West) had trouble moving the ball all night against Air Force, which limited Utah State to just 128 total yards and seven first downs. In fact, USU did not record its initial first down until the second quarter, which proved to be the only time they moved the sticks during the first 30 minutes of play.

The Falcons (6-2, 4-1 MW), who improved to 4-0 at home this season, led 17-0 at halftime following a pair of 1-yard touchdown runs by Timothy Jackson and Kadin Remsburg, and a 57-yard field goal from Jake Koehnke.

Jackson finished with 148 yards rushing and the one TD on 25 carries, Remsburg added 92 yards and two scores on 16 carries, and Taven Birdow finished the night with 88 yards and one touchdown on 18 carries.

Air Force racked up 472 yards of total offense, including 448 yards on the ground. The Falcons had 30 first downs – holding USU to just eight in the process – and held the ball for nearly 46 minutes on the cold and windy night.

The Aggies, who have lost three straight on the road to Air Force, showed some life in the third quarter. USU took the second-half kickoff and marched 75 yards in nine plays, capped by a 27-yard touchdown pass from junior quarterback Jordan Love to graduate transfer wide receiver Siasoi Mariner, cutting the deficit to 17-7.

Utah State then forced the Falcons to punt on the ensuing possession, but Air Force's Charlie Scott pinned the Aggies on their own 1-yard line.

USU went three-and-out on its series, and punted the ball back to Air Force. The Falcons scored touchdowns on their next two drives to put the game away for good.

Love finished 14-of-23 for 114 yards. Sophomore wide receiver Deven Thompkins led the Aggies with six receptions for 26 yards.

Defensively, Utah State forced a pair of fumbles on Air Force's first two series. Senior cornerback DJ Williams recovered the first one for the Aggies, while junior graduate transfer defensive end Nick Heninger recovered the second. Heninger also forced a fumble.

Unfortunately for Utah State, the offense couldn't do anything with the takeaways.

The Aggies had three defensive players with double-digit tackles in Williams (14), junior safety Shaq Bond (12) and junior linebacker David Woodward (11).

Utah State will return home to face BYU in its final non-conference game of the season on Saturday, Nov. 2, on Merlin Olsen Field at Maverik Stadium. The game, which will be televised nationally on ESPN2, is slated to kick off at 8 p.m.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR NINE

The 12-game independent schedule for 2019 features seven teams that played in a bowl game in 2018. Three games are against Pac-12 opponents. BYU also takes on the SEC's Tennessee on the road and features games against Mountain West foes Utah State, Boise State and San Diego State. Independents UMass and Liberty also appear on the schedule along with Mid-American favorite Toledo, USF from the American and FCS level Idaho State.

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates more than 400 missions around the world in over 150 nations speaking more than 160 languages. More than 67,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours — seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples) — teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

About 65 percent of the current team has served a mission. Members of the team have served in 28 different countries and six of the seven continents around the globe. More than 30 members of the team (previous signees or on roster) are currently serving in the mission field.

About 40 members of the current roster are of Polynesian descent.

Some of BYU's most celebrated and decorated players have come from the Pacific islands, including All-Americans, national record holders, players who have gone on to compete in the NFL and now, several members of BYU's current coaching and support staff.

Kalani Sitake was named BYU's 14th head coach on Dec. 19, 2015, becoming the first Tongan head football coach in the NCAA. His staff includes Polynesians Ilaisa Tuiaki, Fesi Sitake, Nu'u Tafisi, Jack Damuni, Jasen Ah You, Alema Fitsemanu, Vince Feula, Matt Ah You and Harvey Unga.

BYU UPSETS NO. 14 BOISE STATE 28-25 IN HOMECOMING GAME

PROVO, Utah – The BYU football team defeated No. 14 Boise State 28-25 on Saturday behind a big third quarter at LaVell Edwards Stadium on Homecoming night.

The Cougars (3-4) scored 21 unanswered points in the third to build a 28-10 cushion heading into the fourth and hung on to hand the Broncos (6-1) their first loss of the season. The defense held Boise State to 359 total yards and forced two turnovers on a cold, rainy and windy night.

Redshirt freshman Baylor Romney, making his first career start at quarterback, went 15 of 26 for 221 yards and connected with tight end Matt Bushman for two touchdowns. Bushman hauled in a game-high five receptions for 101 yards, followed by receiver Talon Shumway, who had three catches for 74 yards. Running back Sione Finau had 89 rushing yards and one touchdown, while Lopini Katoa rushed for 37 yards and added a touchdown of his own. Tyler Allgeier led the defense with nine tackles, all solo stops. Dayan Ghanwoloku added six tackles and a sack, while Lorenzo Fauatea recorded five tackles and a sack. Isaiah and Jackson Kaufusi each had an interception for the Cougar defense.

After a Bronco score on their opening drive, BYU's Romney found Shumway down the sideline for a 22-yard completion to the Cougar 47-yard line. Two plays later, Katoa dragged a couple of defenders during an 11-yard run into Bronco territory. A nine-yard completion from Romney to Aleva Hifo put BYU in the red zone at the Boise State 17-yard line. The Cougars finished off the 78-yard drive with a four-yard touchdown run by Katoa to tie the game.

The BYU defense came up with a turnover on the third play of the Bronco's following drive after Isaiah Kaufusi dove in front of a Boise State receiver and intercepted a Chase Cord pass at the Bronco 43-yard line. After both teams punted the ball back and forth to each other six consecutive times, the Broncos put together an 11-play 42-yard drive toward the end of the quarter, ending it with a 38-yard field goal to give them a 10-7 halftime lead.

BYU opened the quarter with the ball and, after an 18-yard completion from Romney to Bushman, put themselves in Boise State territory at the 49-yard line. Two plays later, Finau broke loose for a 46-yard touchdown run to give the Cougars their first lead of the game, 14-10.

On the second play of the BYU offense's following drive, Romney found Shumway over the top of the Boise State defense for a 39-yard gain to the Bronco 36-yard line. Facing a fourth-and-one situation at the 27-yard line, the offense remained on the field and Romney hit a wide-open Bushman on a play-action pass. Bushman run untouched into the end zone, increasing the Cougars' lead to 21-10.

BYU's defense came up with its second takeaway of the game on the ensuing Boise State possession after Jackson Kaufusi picked off a Cord pass and returned it 13 yards to the Bronco 41-yard line. The Cougar offense capitalized on the turnover two plays later, as Romney once again found a wide-open Bushman after a reverse flea-flicker for a 39-yard touchdown. The score gave BYU a 28-10 lead with 3:10 remaining in the quarter.

The Broncos scored their first points of the second half after capping off a 14-play 81-yard drive with a 13-yard touchdown pass in the corner of the end zone. Boise State proceeded to convert on the ensuing two-point conversion attempt, cutting the Cougar's lead to 28-18 with just over 12 minutes left in the game.

After forcing a BYU punt, the Broncos put together another long drive, marching 79 yards in nine plays and scoring on a five-yard touchdown completion. The score put the game at 28-25 for the Cougars with 3:17 remaining.

BYU picked up a gutsy first down on fourth-and-one at its own 34-yard line after the Cougars' lined up in a scrum formation with Austin Kafentzis in at quarterback. BYU kned the ball on each of the following three plays to run out the clock and give the Cougars the 28-25 win.

BYU OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

12 The Cougar offense spread the ball around to 12 different receivers this season, including quarterback Zach Wilson catching a pass in the USC game. BYU has had no less than seven different receivers in every game this season, and at least eight in five of seven contests.

100 Matt Bushman hit the 100-receiving yard mark for the first time in his career with five catches for 101 yards and two touchdowns against Boise State. It was the third 100-yard game by a BYU player this season (Micah Simon, Aleva Hifo). It is the first time a BYU tight end had 100 yards since Kaneakua Friel had six catches for 101 yards and two scores against Washington State in 2012.

200+ BYU has passed for 200+ yards in every game this year. Including the final two games of 2018, the Cougars have gone for 200+ in nine straight games, the longest streak since BYU had 10 in a row spanning nine games in 2015 and the first game of 2016.

262.4 Quarterback Zach Wilson is averaging 262.4 passing yards per game. The last two quarterbacks to average 250 yards or more for a single season were Tanner Mangum in 2015 (259.8) and Max Hall in 2009 (273.8).

THE BYU OFFENSE

- **QUARTERBACK STARTS.** With redshirt freshman quarterback Jaren Hall starting at USF due to Zach Wilson's injury, it marked the sixth consecutive year the Cougars have started at least two different players at quarterback through a single season. When Baylor Romney started last week it marked the second time in three years that at least three different players have started a game at quarterback. The 2013 season was the last time BYU started the same player under center for an entire season (Taysom Hill). Since 2009, BYU has had at least two different starting quarterbacks in all but two seasons (2009 and 2013).
- **FRESHMAN START.** With Hall getting the call at USF and Romney vs. Boise State, it made it six times since 2010 BYU has started a freshman signal caller. (2010 Jake Heaps, 2012 Taysom Hill, 2015 Tanner Mangum, 2017 Joe Critchlow and 2018 Zach Wilson).
- **FROM THE DIAMOND TO THE GRIDIRON.** Jaren Hall plays outfield for BYU's baseball team. He played in 27 games during the 2019 season with eight starts. He was the second Cougar that has played baseball and started at quarterback. Ryan Hancock, a pitcher for BYU in 1991-93, started eight games at quarterback in 1992, leading the team to a 7-1 mark during that stretch.
- **COACHING EXPERIENCE.** The BYU offensive staff has more than 85 years of coaching experience. Jeff Grimes has the most with more than 25 years. Tight ends coach Steve Clark has been coaching since 1994 and passing game coordinator Aaron Roderick has 20 years in the profession. Roderick, Clark and wide receivers coach Fesi Sitake have all been offensive coordinators at the college level.
- **TOTAL OFFENSE.** Zach Wilson is averaging 269.2 yards of total offense per game. The last time the Cougars had a player average over 250 yards of total offense was Tanner Mangum in 2015 when he averaged 252.4 yards per game.
- **UPPER CLASS REPRESENT.** The Cougar juniors and seniors have delivered on offense so far, with the top two rushers and top three receivers all being upper classmen. Ty'Son Williams and Emmanuel Esukpa, both graduate transfers have led in rushing with 264 and 184 yards respectively, while senior wide receivers Aleva Hifo and Micah Simon have 25 and 23 receptions, respectively. Hifo has 314 yards while Simon has 291 yards. Junior Matt Bushman leads with 28 receptions 398 yards and three touchdowns.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **KEEPING THEM IN FRONT.** The Cougars are ranked No. 3 in passing plays allowed of 20 yards or more, allowing just 12 plays of 20+ yards through the air through seven games. Only Utah, Clemson has allowed fewer chunk plays in the air. BYU is No. 4 in total plays of 20+ yards allowed, with just 18 total on the year, behind Utah, Clemson and Iowa.
- **STAYING FRESH.** BYU uses a lot of personnel on defense, making a lot of rotations to every position to keep guys fresh on the field. Ten different players have started games on the defensive line, six at linebacker, six at safety and five at corner this year.
- **KAUFUSI INTERCEPTIONS.** In the game against No. 14 Boise State, brothers Isaiah and Jackson Kaufusi both came away with interceptions. It was Isaiah's second of the season, while Jackson caught the first of his career and returned it 13 yards.

KALANI SITAKE**HEAD COACH****YEARS AT BYU**

4th year at BYU

YEARS OVERALL

4th year as head coach, over 15 years in coaching

Kalani Sitake (pronounced kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay) enters his fourth season overseeing the BYU football program in 2019.

A former Cougar running back (1994, 1997-2000), Sitake is the 14th head coach in BYU history and just the fourth since 1972, when Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards took over the program. Sitake is the first former player under Edwards to be named head coach at BYU.

Named BYU's head coach on December 19, 2015, Sitake returned to his alma mater with 15 years of coaching experience, including seven seasons a defensive coordinator and four years as an assistant head coach. He came to BYU from Oregon State, where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator in 2015 under head coach Gary Andersen. Sitake spent the prior 10 seasons at the University of Utah under head coach Kyle Whittingham. He started at Utah in 2005 as the linebackers coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2009 before also being named assistant head coach in 2012. He coached 12 all-conference honorees at Utah, including Morris Trophy winners Star Lotulelei (2011) and Nate Orchard (2014).

During his career, Sitake has helped mentor 23 NFL Draft picks, including BYU linebackers Sione Takitaki and Fred Warner and running back Jamaal Williams. Takitaki was a third-round pick of the Cleveland Browns in this year's draft and Warner was one of the league's top rookies after being taken in the third round in 2018 by the San Francisco 49ers. Williams, who was selected in the fourth round by the Green Bay Packers in the 2017 NFL Draft, finished his BYU career as the school's all-time leading rusher after averaging the nation's fifth-best per-game totals at 137.5 yards per outing for Sitake's Cougars in 2016.

Sitake has coached in 10 bowl games during his career and has been on the winning side in nine of those 10 contests, including a 2-0 mark as a head coach. BYU is coming off a 49-18 victory over Western Michigan in last year's Famous Idaho Potato Bowl and defeated Wyoming 24-21 in the 2016 Poinsettia Bowl.

Sitake began his coaching career in 2001 as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Arizona before becoming a defensive graduate assistant at BYU in 2002 under Gary Crowton. Sitake then joined the staff at Southern Utah where he coached running backs, tight ends and offensive line during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

He began his BYU playing career in 1994 prior to serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Oakland, California. After returning and redshirting in 1997, Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000 under Edwards. A team captain as a senior, Sitake's last game as a player was also the last game coached by the legendary Edwards, who was a great mentor for Sitake.

Born in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, and raised in Laie, Hawai'i and Provo, Utah, Sitake is the nation's first FBS head football coach of Tongan descent. He graduated from BYU in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in English. Sitake and his wife Timberly have three children, Skye, Sadie and Kelaokalani (KK).

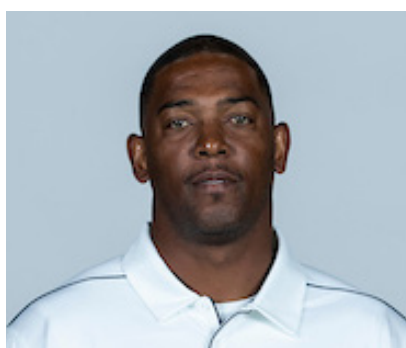
