ROSE BOWL: THE 34th YEAR

The 2015 season marks the 34th year that the Rose Bowl, with a seating capacity of 80,616, will serve as home of the Bruins.

UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 138-62-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games.

UCLA is 14-6 under Coach Mora in games played in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins are 19-7 in the last 26 home contests and most recently posted an unbeaten home season in 2005 (6-0).

#10/12 UCLA RETURNS TO THE ROSE BOWL

Bruins Play #19/22 BYU for first time since 2008
 Pac-12 Play Begins at Arizona on Sept. 26



BRUINS PLAY BYU, FINAL NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENT, ON SATURDAY — #10 AP/#12 Coaches UCLA (2-0) will meet #19/22 BYU (2-0) for the first time since 2008 on Saturday, Sept. 19 at 7:30 p.m. PT in the Rose Bowl. The game will be televised by FS1. Calling the game will be Joe Davis, Brady Quinn and Kris Budden. The Bruin IMG Radio Network (Bill Roth, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest on 1150am. The game also will be aired on Sirius/XM (81/81), uclabruins.com and tunein.com and the TuneIn App. DL Bruce Davis (2004-07) is this week's Honorary Game Captain. This is the third straight season in which UCLA has made an appearance in the AP Top 10. Coming up, UCLA will begin Pac-12 Conference play the following Saturday at the University of Arizona. The Bruins are 2-1 in conference openers under Coach Mora, with wins at Utah in 2013 and at Arizona State in 2014.

VS. THE COUGARS — This will be the first meeting between the Bruins and the Cougars since 2008. Then 18th-ranked BYU won that contest 59-0 in Provo. UCLA had split a pair of games against BYU the previous season. The Bruins captured the regular season meeting, during 2007, by a score of 27-17 in the Rose Bowl. The Cougars won the December rematch, played in the Las Vegas Bowl, 17-16. UCLA holds a 7-3 overall series edge over BYU. The teams are slated to meet again next season in Provo. TICKETS — Tickets for the remaining UCLA home games for 2015 are on sale at uclabruins.com/tickets. The Bruins have five home games at the Rose Bowl – Sept. 19 vs. BYU (7:30 pm), Oct. 3 vs. Arizona State, Oct. 22 vs. Cal (6 pm), Oct. 31 vs. Colorado (homecoming) and Nov. 14 vs. Washington State.

IN BRIEF

- ***This is the third straight season in which UCLA has made an appearance in the Top 10 of the AP poll --- in 2014, UCLA was ranked #7 when it defeated Virginia (28-20), #8 when it lost to Utah (28-30) and #9 when it lost to Stanford (10-31); in 2013, UCLA was ranked #9 when it lost at Stanford (10-24). The last time it was listed in the AP Top 10 in three straight seasons was over a stretch of the 1984-85-86-87-88-89 seasons.
- ***With the victory over UNLV, UCLA won a school record 11th straight game played away from the Rose Bowl. The Bruins had won 10 straight contests away from the Rose Bowl in 1997-98. The last road setback came in Eugene on Oct. 26, 2013 at the hands of the then second-ranked Oregon Ducks.
- ***With the win over UNLV, UCLA has now won 13 of its last 14 non-conference matchups, including 10 straight since a loss to Baylor in the 2012 Holiday Bowl. UCLA has won all 11 regular season non-conference games under Coach Mora.
- ***UCLA is ranked 11th in the nation in scoring defense (9.5 pts/g) ... The last time it gave up as few as 19 points in its first two games of a season was in 2003, also 19, after going 1-1 in games against Colorado and Illinois.
- ***The last time UCLA did not allow an opponent touchdown was in a 2008 game v. Washington State (28-3).
- ***UCLA has posted a 9-6 record against ranked opponents under Coach Mora ... Last season, the Bruins owned a 4-1 record over ranked teams....2014: 4-1 -- W #11 Kansas St., W #24 USC, W #14 Arizona, L vs. #12 Oregon, W at #15 ASU
- ***With its first road win of the season over UNLV, UCLA is 14-4 in true road games under coach Mora -- 2015: 1-0, 2014: 5-0, 2013: 4-2, 2012: 4-2.
- ***The blocked punt, at UNLV, by Takkarist McKinley was the 14th kick blocked by a Bruin under Coach Mora ... The Bruins are at the top of the Pac-12 in Kickoff Return Defense (13.00) and Punt Return Defense (-2.00).
- ***RB Paul Perkins needs 226 rushing yards to enter the all-time school top 10 list and is also poised to become the 20th Bruin to surpass the 3,000 all-purpose yard mark (currently 2,943).
- **First career starts at UNLV --- LB Cameron Judge, DL Eli Anku

 **Jordan Payton has caught a pass in a team-best 18 straight games...He moved into the top ten (ninth) of the all-time school receptions list with his five catches (131 career receptions) for 70 yards at UNLV.
 **PK Ka'imi Fairbairn has connected on 33 straight field goals from 35 yards and in and on 18 of his last 20 overall attempts
 **The Virginia game produced the first game action for QB Josh Rosen*, DB John Johnson, REC Jordan Lasley, DB Adarius Pickett, RB SoSo Jamabo*, DB Octavius Spencer*, DB Dylan Luther, RB Bolu Olorunfunmi*, DB Denzel Fisher, DL Ainuu Tava, LB Cameron Griffin, LB Sean Burd, OL Kolton Miller, TE Colby Cyburt, TE Chris Clark*, REC Austin Roberts.  **UCLA is 23-4 under Coach Mora when scoring first, 10-1 when doing so at home; the Bruins are 27-0 under Mora when ahead at the half.
 **The win over UVA was Coach Mora's fourth straight in a season-opener (12-at Rice, 13-Nevada, 14-at UVA, 15-UVA) making him the second UCLA coach to win four straight openers in his first four seasons on the job (William Spaulding 1925-28).
 **UCLA tied the school record with five 500-yard total offense games in '14 and has started '15 with 503 vs. UVA/ 526 at UNLV.
 **Junior LB Myles Jack ranked second on the team in tackles with 88 last season. In 2013, Jack became the first player in Pac-12 Conference history to be selected both Freshman Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year. He scored his 11th career offensive touchdown in the season-opener against Virginia.
 **Records Reach: PK Ka'imi Fairbairn (329 pts) needs 62 points to surpass John Lee (1982-85) and become the all-time leading scorer at UCLA; REC Devin Fuller (129) needs 18 catches to move into the school's all-time Top 5 in receptions; REC Jordan Payton (131) needs 16 catches to move into the school's all-time Top 5 in receptions
 **Paul Perkins matched his career-best with five receptions in the opening win over UVA and enters the BYU game with 57 receptions; he is closing in on all-time UCLA running back leader, Chris Markey (2004-07) who had 67 career catches.
 **Kenny Young's 23-yard interception return at UNLV was UCLA's 10th defensive touchdown scored since 2012.
 **UCLA has won 26 straight overall games and 45 straight regular season games in which it has held the opponent to less than 20 points (last loss 17-16 to BYU in 2007 Las Vegas Bowl /last regular season loss 16-14 at Colorado 2003).
 **True Freshmen Played: 2015: 8, 2014: 9, 2013: 18, 2012:12
 **Early Season Streaks: UCLA has started each of the past four seasons with a winning streak - 2015: 2, 2014: 4, 2013: 5, 2012:3
 **UCLA has won 27 of its last 32 non-conference matchups played in the the Rose Bowl ... It has won 13 of the last 23 home games played against AP-ranked opponents.
 **33 returning position players entered 2015 with starting experience.
 **Primarily defensive players have scored 17 touchdowns while playing on offense since 2012.
 **UCLA has won 28 of its last 33 games when winning the turnover battle (85%) and owns a 22-37 record in its last 59 games (37%) when losing or tying the turnover ratio
 **Junior receiver Thomas Duarte, who grabbed a 30-yard scoring pass against Virginia, led the Pac-12 (15th in NCAA) with a per catch average of 19.3 yards.
 **Redshirt junior Paul Perkins was the first Bruin to lead the conference in rushing since DeShaun Foster in 2001. His total of 1,575 yards (15th in NCAA) was the second-highest single-season total in school history. Perkins also became the first Bruin to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing mark in his first two seasons of action. He has run for at least 80 yards in 16 career games, including all 13 contests in 2014.
 **At least 20 career starts - OL Jake Brendel-41; REC Jordan Payton-29 (last 22 straight); LB Myles Jack-27 (last 27 straight), DB Fabian Moreau-27, DB Ishmael Adams-26; OL Caleb Benenoch-24 (last 24 straight); OL Alex Redmond-23; DB Randall Goforth-22; DL Eddie Vanderdoes-20; OL Simon Goines-20.
 **The Bruins have rushed for at least 100 yards as a team in 22 straight games.
 **In first road games of a season, Coach Mora's Bruins have won 4 straight: '15: UNLV; '14:UVA, '13:Nebraska, '12:Rice.
 **Josh Rosen became the first Bruin true freshman quarterback to start a season-opener for UCLA in the win over Virginia (dating back to when the 1972 freshman eligibility rule took effect).
 **UCLA has totaled at least 9 wins in three straight seasons for the first time ever (2012-9, 2013-10, 2014-10)
 **The 2014 team became the ninth in school history to register a school-record tying 10 wins in a season.
 **Punter Matt Mengel saw six of his punts downed inside the Arizona 20-yd line last season, the most by a Bruin punter since Chris Sailer had five v. Houston in 1998
 **UCLA's six wins in the 2014 regular season games away from home were the most in school history.
 **Safety Randall Goforth's 19 tackles at Stanford, in 2013, were the most since S Dennis Keyes recorded 19 v. USC '07.
 **Eddie Vanderdoes' 11 tackles at Stanford, in 2013, were the most by a Bruin D-lineman since 1992 (Bruce Walker-12 v. ASU)

UCLA COACHES' RADIO SHOW

The weekly coaches' radio show, the Bruin Insider Show, is on each Tuesday night from 7 to 8 pm and will air live from the Wolfgang Puck Express location in the Ackerman Student Union Building on the UCLA campus in Westwood (either on AM570 FoxSports LA or 1150AM). UCLA head football coach Jim Mora will be a guest on the show during football season, and UCLA men's basketball head coach Steve Alford will be featured during basketball season. Also appearing throughout the year will be UCLA Athletic Director Dan Guerrero and various coaches and student-athletes from UCLA's storied athletics program that has won a national-best 2NCAA Championships. New Voice of the Bruins Bill Roth and local broadcaster John Ramey will serve as the hosts of the show.

UCLA HEAD COACH JIM MORA

On December 10, 2011, former Atlanta Falcons and Seattle Seahawks head coach Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history.

In 2014, Coach Mora guided the Bruins to the ninth 10-win season in school history, matching the school record for wins in a season. It marked the third straight year in which Mora's Bruins had produced at least nine wins, a first in program history. His 29 total wins are the most-ever by a UCLA coach in his initial three seasons on the job.

Following the victory in the 2015 Alamo Bowl, UCLA had captured wins in 10 straight games away from the Rose Bowl to tie that school record, including a school-best 7-0 slate in 2014. That win was also the team's third over teams ranked among the Associated Press' Top 15 at the time of the contest, which was the most by the program since it defeated four such teams in 1952. The Bruins capped off the season ranked No. 10 in the final AP poll which was the highest for the program since 1998.

Linebacker Eric Kendrick, who became the school's all-time leading tackler during the 2014 season, went on to be UCLA's first recipient of the Butkus Award and the second-straight winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy. Quarterback Brett Hundley set numerous school career records, including bests for most touchdown passes and total offense. Running back Paul Perkins led the Pac-12 in rushing and produced the second-highest rushing yardage total in school history.

In 2013, Mora led the Bruins to the eighth 10-win season in school history, tying the school mark for most wins in a season. UCLA remained in the AP rankings throughout the full 2013 season for the first time since 1998. Linebacker Anthony Barr was selected as a first-team All-America and as the school's first winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy. A school record 18 true freshmen saw action during the season and seven true freshmen position players started in a game to match that school record. Five Bruins, the most by the program since 2002, were selected in the 2014 NFL Draft, headed by Barr's pick at No. 9 overall by the Minnesota Vikings.

In his first year, Mora guided the Bruins to the 2012 South Division Championship of the Pac-12 Conference and matched the school-record for wins by a first-year coach, with nine. The Bruins, who played in the Holiday Bowl, set numerous offensive records during the course of the 2012 season, including establishing a new school rushing leader, in Johnathan Franklin, and several passing marks achieved by Hundley. On defense, Barr emerged as one of the most dynamic performers in the country in his first season as a linebacker and led the nation in sacks for a good portion of the year. Kendrick led the conference in tackles, ranking 11th in the country. Four players were selected in the 2013 NFL Draft, including defensive lineman Datone Jones in the first round by the Green Bay Packers.

Mora came to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brought 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in 2007 and 2008. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year.

The Falcon's defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

LINEBACKER — True junior linebacker **MYLES JACK (#30-Anthropology major)** ranked second on the team in tackles in 2014 with 88 and was named a second-team all-conference selection. He had at least six stops in 10 games with a high of 13 stops at Virginia. Jack also had a rushing attempt on offense in nine games and totaled 113 yards on 28 carries with three scores.

In 2013, he became the first player in conference history to be named both Offensive and Defensive Freshman of the Year by the Pac-12 coaches. He was a second-team all-conference selection and his 75 tackles ranked fifth on the team and as the second-most ever by a UCLA true freshman player behind only Kenny Easley who had 93 in 1977. Jack's 11 pass defenses led the team. He was also a finalist for the Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player.

Jack joined the starting lineup at linebacker in game two of 2013 at Nebraska. He had recorded eight tackles, including a tackle for loss, in the season-opener against Nevada. He was credited with his first interception at Utah. Jack forced a fumble and blocked a punt at Oregon. He returned an interception for a score against Virginia Tech.

He played on offense for the first time in 2013 at Arizona (game 9) and ran six times for 120 yards, including a 66-yard touchdown jaunt. His total of four rushing touchdowns against Washington set a true freshman record (old mark Wendell Tyler, 1972 and De-Shaun Foster, 1998 - 3). RUNNING BACKS — In 2014, redshirt junior **PAUL PERKINS (#24-Sociology major)** 2014 became the first Bruin to lead the Pac-12 in rushing since DeShaun Foster in 2001. His total of 1,575 yards rushing was the second-highest total in a season ever by a UCLA back. He ranked 15th in the NCAA in rushing yards (1,575), 16th in rushing yards per game (121.2) and 29th in the nation in all-purpose rushing (136.6).

Perkins had six 100-rushing games, topped by a 194-yard performance in the bowl win over Kansas State. He also ran for 190 yards on 22 carries against Oregon and went for 180 yards at Colorado, including a 92-yard scoring run which tied for the second-longest in school history. Perkins recorded his first two scoring receptions in the win at Cal. He was an honorable mention all-conference selection by the coaches. Named Offensive MVP of the Valero Alamo Bowl, Perkins became the first Bruin to rush for more than 2,000 yards in his initial two seasons in the program during the bowl game win.

Perkins saw his first game action in 2013 and made four starts. He ran for scores in games vs. Nevada, at Nebraska, Cal, ASU, USC and Virginia Tech. He caught three balls at USC for 79 yards and four balls vs. NMSU for 36 yards. Perkins ran for 92 yards on 16 carries at Utah and 93 yards on 22 carries at Oregon. He was named honorable mention academic all-conference.

KICKER — True senior kicker **KA'IMI FAIRBAIRN (#15)** has made 33 straight field goals from 35 yards and in. Last season he became the first Bruin to record three 100-point seasons. Fairbairn has handled all of the Bruin placekicking chores in his first three seasons in the program. He began the 2015 season sixth on the all-time school field goal list and fifth in career scoring.

In 2014, Fairbairn ranked 19th in the nation and third in the Pac-12 with his .818 field goal percentage after connecting on 18 of 22 field goal attempts. He finished the season by converting 13 of his last 14 attempts. His total of 18 made field goals tied for 10th-best on the school season list. Fifty of his 80 kickoffs went for touchbacks.

His 33-yard kick in 2012 at Arizona State, with no time left, provided the winning points in a 45-43 victory. His 104 points scored, rank tied for 11th on the school list and as the most ever scored by a Bruin true freshman.

HONORARY CAPTAIN FOR BYU GAME - BRUCE DAVIS

Bruce Davis was a four-year letterwinner for coach Karl Dorrell from 2004-07 as a defensive end and linebacker. As a starting defensive end in 2006, he earned first-team All-America honors from multiple publications. Davis ranked tied for fourth in the NCAA that season with 12.5 sacks, the second-highest total in school history at the time. He also ranked 18th in the nation in tackles for loss per game (1.35 avg.). Davis' total of 17.5 tackles for loss was the eighth-most in school history. He was a first-team All-Conference selection.

As a senior in 2007, he was voted a second-team All-America by the Walter Camp Foundation after recording 12.0 sacks (seventh-most in school history at the time) and 15.5 tackles for loss (10th highest total in school history at the time). He was named to the second-team All-Pac-12 squad and his sack average of 0.92 per game tied for ninth-best in the nation. Davis was a semifinalist for the Bednarik Award that season and finished his career ranked second on the all-time school list with 29.0 sacks. He was listed third on the all-time school list in tackles for loss (42.5).

Davis was selected by Pittsburgh in the third round of the 2008 NFL Draft. He also spent time on the rosters of the Patriots, Broncos, 49ers, Raiders and Bengals in the NFL. Davis went on to see action in the Canadian Football League.

The 2015 season is UCLA's 19th with Clear Channel Radio. This will be the ninth year for the Bruins games to be aired on AM 570 LA Sports (or am 1150 KTLK) in Southern California. The broadcasts are produced by IMG, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder.

The Los Angeles all-sports station's broadcast includes a two-hour pre-game show (one hour local, one hour network) and a post-game show. Hall of Fame broadcaster Bill Roth will be the new voice of the Bruins. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens ('83-86) is set to begin his 19th year on the broadcast team and his 15th as the analyst in the booth. Former Bruin quarterback Wayne Cook ('91-94) is in his 14th season as sideline reporter.

AM 570 LA Sports also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Radio Partner of UCLA Athletics.

Games can also be heard via internet at uclabruins.com and on tunein.com and the TuneIn App.

UCLA ON TELEVISION

Following the game at UNLV, 137 of UCLA's last 138 games have been televised live, including 73 in a row.

All of UCLA's games in the 2014, 2013, 2012 and 2011 seasons were on live TV. In 2010, each of the 12 contests were broadcast live. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was delayed).

The selection of linebacker Anthony Barr by the Minnesota Vikings in the first round of the 2014 NFL draft marked the 31st time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 31 of the last 34 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

Since 2000, UCLA has had 19 finalists / winners of National player awards — 2014 Eric Kendricks - Lott IMPACT Award winner; Butkus Award winner; Brett Hundley - Manning Award finalist, Unitas Award finalist; 2013 Anthony Barr - Lott IMPACT Trophy winner, Lombardi Award finalist, Bednarik Award finalist; Myles Jack - Hornung Award finalist; 2012 Johnathan Franklin - Doak Walker Award finalist; 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. BRUINS IN THE POLLS — The Bruins finished ranked in the final polls in 2013 for the first time since the 2005 season. It was most recently in the top five of the Associated Press poll in the 2001 season, when it spent two weeks at No. 4 after winning its first six games. It opened at #22 in the 2014 season's initial College Football Playoff poll and rose to as high as #8 before finishing at #14.

NON-SATURDAY GAMES — UCLA will play a pair of Thursday night affairs in back-to-back weeks this season at Stanford and in the Rose Bowl versus California. Last season on Thursday night at Arizona State, the Bruins bested the Sun Devils and on Friday of Thanksgiving week, at home, in the Rose Bowl against Stanford, the Cardinal dropped the Bruins.

In 2013, the Bruins won at Utah on a Thursday night and at home versus Washington on a Friday night. The last time UCLA had played a Friday game during the regular season was in 2011 at Arizona State. The most recent previous home game to have been played on Friday was against Arizona on Oct. 27, 1978.

In 2012, UCLA opened the season with a win at Rice on a Thursday evening. In 2011, it played at Arizona on a Thursday evening. In the 2010 season, the Bruins played three non-Saturday games - Oct. 21 at Oregon, Nov. 18 at Washington and Nov. 26 at Arizona State.

Prior to 2010, the last time the Bruins played a regular-season non-Saturday game was Friday, Nov. 28, 2008 at Arizona State, dropping a 34-9 decision. The Bruins also played a Monday night game that year, defeating Tennessee, 27-24 in overtime on Labor Day night (Aug. 30). Before 2008, UCLA had not played on a week night since Thurs., Sept. 30, 1993, a 52-13 victory at San Diego State. The Bruins also played at San Diego State on Thurs., Sept. 26, 1991 (won, 37-12).

BRUIN FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS — Five true freshmen saw action in the 2015 season-opener against Virginia --- QB Josh Rosen, RB SoSo Jamabo, RB Bolu Olorunfemi, DB Octavius Spencer and TE Chris Clark. Three more played at UNLV --- REC Stephen Johnson III, OL Tevita Halalilo, DL Fred Ulu-Perry. Seven true freshmen saw action in the 2014 opener at Uva -- OL Najee Toran, DB Jaleel Wadood, WR Mossi Johnson, LB Zach Whitley, LB Kenny Young, DL Jacob Tuoti-Mariner, DL Matt Dickerson. RB Nate Starks took the field v. Memphis and a ninth frosh, WR Alex VanDyke, saw his first action at ASU. The Bruins established a new school mark in 2013 when guard Scott Quessenberry took the field at Oregon as the 18th true freshman to see action that season. Fifteen true frosh saw action in the 2013

opener against Nevada. UCLA played 12 true freshmen in 2012. One first-year player saw action in 2011. In both 2009 and 2010, UCLA played 10 true freshmen.
