Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU `93, played `85-`88) is in his first season as head coach at BYU. The 46-year-old coach enters with a 181-111 (.620) record in six seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie `08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia `07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU `99), all in their first years at BYU.

Series Record vs. Saint Mary's

BYU leads the series with Saint Mary's, 8-2, who has never played in the state of Utah (see link at <http://byucougars.com/node/4636/m-baseball>). BYU has a 5-1 record at Moraga, Calif.

Hannemann close to recycling

Freshman Jacob Hannemann hit for the cycle last Fall in his first practice away from the BYU football team. He is three triples away from tying the school record in a season. Three times this season he has come close to hitting again for the cycle:

What Littlewood says about Hannemann:

“He’s one of those guys that whatever you tell him he just absorbs it and he’ll try to put it right into play. It’s fun to watch him play. We like to see him drive the ball up the middle with his swing. He is getting better and better every game. We’re going to ride him as long as we can. We talk about quick, fast-twitch muscle fiber, with his elbows, wrists and hands; he is so quick he can wait longer than the normal guy on pitches. It’s pretty incredible when you consider what he’s doing.”

On May 11, Brigham Young University retired the jerseys of hall of fame coaches Gary Pullins (No. 1) and Glen Tuckett (No. 20) in a special ceremony prior to the baseball game against the University of San Francisco.

Regarding BYU This Season

- BYU has 10 players who are married
- Incorporated into this year's team are four players who have just finished serving two-year Church missions (Jacob Hannemann, Andy Isom, Cody Shepherd and Derek Speigner)
- Three players transferred to BYU (Derek Speigner, Drew Dennis and Cody Shepherd)
- Adam Law, who switched from the middle infield to anchoring third base in the lineup, is one player who continues to take extra batting practice. Early mornings in the batting cages at Miller Park, Law takes batting practice from his grandpa Vernon Law, the 1960 Cy Young winner for the Pittsburgh Pirates. The 83-year-old Law often throws over 100 pitches from a bucket of balls to his grandson.

Home Season

The Cougars entered the 2013 season with a 152-89 (.631) record at Larry H. Miller Field which seats 2,204 fans in its 13th season since it was built. In the first nine years BYU drew 218,981 fans for an average of 1,177 and 142,248 at night for an average of 1,452. The crowd of 3,081 against Utah in 2010 was the fourth-largest in school history and the second-largest at Miller Park. The largest crowd at home during 2011 was 1,474 vs. Seattle and the crowd of 2,820 fans at Arizona State was the largest on the road. BYU drew 12,754 fans (averaging 797) for an 11-6 home record. Weather caused the cancellation of two home games (AFA & TCU) and forced a doubleheader vs. SDSU in 2011.

Live worldwide TV and Live AM Radio

There are eight games which will be televised live on BYUtv and at least 38 games scheduled to be broadcast live on BYU Radio 960AM. The 38 radio broadcasts are not always streamed on the Internet due to conflicts with other broadcasts for BYU volleyball and post-season softball.

BYU in NCAA statistics

BYU is ranked No. 21 in double plays after being perched in the No. 1 spot for three weeks at the beginning of the season, No. 13 in triples and No. 38 in sacrifice flies. Jacob Hannemann is ranked No. 5 in triples, while Jaycob Brugman is No. 37 in that category. Desmond Poulson is No. 23 in games started and No. 30 in complete games.

BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Then two weeks later BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1. The end of April BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball). In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after upsetting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.

- Nate Favero—Uncle is Mike Nielsen who pitched for BYU, 1990-1992, 1995.
- Jacob Hannemann—Brother Micah played football for BYU, 2012. Cousin Heather played volleyball for BYU, 2009-2012
- Brent Haring—Wife, Mary Falatea, played volleyball at Snow College
- Dakota Hernandez—cousin is teammate Jaycob Brugman. Brother Hunter plays baseball at the College of the Canyons.
- Jarrett Jarvis—cousin to BYU volunteer assistant Casey Nelson who was a catcher for BYU; cousins also played for Snow College and Utah Valley College.
- Adam Law—Father Vance Law, was head BYU baseball coach from 2000-2012; and played 10 years in the Major Leagues after playing for BYU in both basketball and baseball. Vance Law is currently a hitting coach in the Chicago White Sox organization. Grandfather, Vernon Law, was 1960 Cy Young winner and was a pitcher for the Pittsburgh Pirates (1950-67). Uncle Veryl Law played basketball at BYU (1974-77) alongside Vance (1975-77), uncles Veldon Law (1975) and Vaughn Law (1979) played baseball for BYU. Brother Tim Law played baseball at Dixie in 1998, and at BYU in 2001, 2003-2004. Brother Andrew Law played with BYU baseball (2005-2011).
- Mike Littlewood—son Marcus was drafted in the second round of the 2010 MLB Draft by the Seattle Mariners, son Tyson played baseball at SLCC (2010) and Dixie State College (2008, 11-12), son Nate played baseball at SLCC (2009-10) and Dixie State College (2011-12). Younger brother Dave played baseball at Utah. Cousins Steve Bruce played basketball at Snow College and Assumption College (Mass.) Uncle George Bruce coached at Dugway High School for 40 years and is now at West Lake High.
- Matt Milke—Father, George, was MVP of the College World Series for USC in 1974. Practicing family Law

Adam Law's time has come. The junior third baseman from Brigham Young University is the latest in a long line of Law family members to make a splash on the diamond as he leads the Cougars in hitting and plays a formidable third base.

Law's grandfather Vernon pitched for the Pittsburgh Pirates (1950-67), winning the 1960 Cy Young Award. His father, Vance, who is currently a hitting coach in the Chicago White Sox organization, played in the Major Leagues for 10 years and served as BYU's head coach between 2000-12. Two of Law's uncles and two of his brothers also have played baseball for the Cougars throughout the years.

The family ties to the sport are strong, and Law has worked hard — and gleaned knowledge from his grandfather and father — to continue the legacy.

Law grew up hanging around the baseball field as his father coached the local high school, and eventually the Cougars.

While he was a three-sport athlete at Provo High School, Vernon Law volunteered to be the pitching coach for his high-school team when Adam was a junior.

"I honestly think why he wanted to be the pitching coach was to be closer to me and kind of help me along the way," Adam Law said.

The patriarch of the Law family — father to six, grandfather to 31 and great-grandfather to 30 — would hit Adam shopping carts-full of balls,

and then toss him batting practice.

"At that time, he was in his late 70s and out there in the heat of the day," Law said. "He would hit me ground ball after ground ball, and tell me stories about when he coached in Japan and how they do things over there."

Vernon Law, now 83 years old, still throws batting practice to his grandson in the offseason, or if Adam's father isn't available to throw.

"He hasn't thrown in about a month because my dad was preparing to go to spring training and wanted to get his arm in shape, but he would come down and watch early in the mornings," Adam Law said.

He's still really accurate and has a strong arm. If I hit four or five balls in a row, he'll change speeds on me or throw a slider or paint the black part of the plate, and kind of chuckle to himself. After about 45 minutes, he'll say, 'Adam you've had your fun, now I'm going to have mine.' Then, he really starts mixing it up on me."

Law enjoys bonding with his grandfather and listening to his stories about Hall of Fame players.

"It's a good bonding time and a great time for me to learn about what he calls the glory days of the game," he said. "He talks about facing Joe DiMaggio and Willie Mays and Hank Aaron and all of those classic players."

And, Vernon Law is ready to go if Adam needs more reps during the season.

"I wouldn't be a bit surprised if they have a weekend when they get rained out, and he calls and says, 'Papa, can you throw batting practice to me?'" Vernon Law said. "He doesn't want to miss a day."

It's pretty tough to miss a day of baseball in the Law family, and Adam has soaked up all the knowledge and experience he could from his elders, whether it was breaking down at-bats or learning situational tactics.

"My dad has taught me the most about the game in general," Adam Law said. "He was a position player like me, and really knows the ins and outs of the complete game, not just the pitching side. I attribute my knowledge of the game to him. We talked about baseball around the dinner table and what types of things you should do in certain situations."

Vance Law began coaching his son when Adam was a freshman in 2009. Adam had just seven at-bats, and barely played.

"I was a late sprouter, and didn't grow until I was 16 or 17 years old," Adam Law said. "When I came

to BYU as an 18-year-old freshman, I was probably as physically mature as a 14- or 15-year-old."

Then, Law went on a two-year mission to Zimbabwe as a member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. While he didn't play much baseball, Law learned two different languages native to Zimbabwe and immersed himself in the culture while spreading the gospel. He learned the importance of focusing on people and relationships, rather than material items.

And, during the mission, Law physically matured and caught up to other players on the collegiate level. When he returned as a sophomore for the 2012 season, Law played in all but three games for the Cougars as a middle infielder, batting .221 with 14 RBI on the season.

"I played quite a bit as a sophomore but was really still in a transition phase of getting to know baseball and seeing good pitching," Law said.

After the 2012 season, a big change came for the Law family. Vance was fired as BYU's head coach after 13 seasons and Mike Littlewood — a former BYU player — was hired to take over the program.

"The main reason why I came to BYU was to experience playing for my dad, and when that ended after only two seasons I was disappointed," Adam Law said. "I was upset at the administration and all sorts of feelings went through my mind.

"But then I took a step back along with my dad, and we talked about it. I could look at two ways. I could be mad or I could put it behind me and be the type of person I should be. I accepted the fact my dad wasn't the coach, and since that decision I haven't second-guessed anything Coach Littlewood has done."

Littlewood, who has known the Law family for years, immediately reached out to Vance and Adam.

"Vance and Adam Law were my first two calls when I got the job," Littlewood said. "They were awesome. It's a tough situation with Vance getting let go and Adam still being on the team, but there has been 100 percent buy-in from the players with what we're trying to do."

Adam Law improved his physical strength and conditioning in the offseason, and played summer ball in Palm Springs, Calif., where he got the reps he needed to step up his game. Littlewood, a former third baseman, moved Law to the hot corner — a position his father also played.

"He's a lot bigger and stronger than he was last year," Littlewood said. "It made sense since our team has

two freshman middle infielders who can't move anywhere else. He's a team guy and made that move. I think he's great over there."

Through 17 games this season, Law is leading the team with a .354 batting average and with 13 RBI, he has almost matched his total from last year.

"I've worked hard," Law said. "Often times, people have talked about nepotism as the reason I'm playing college baseball. I wanted to really go out there and be who I am and work hard, so even Coach Littlewood would know I'm ready to help the team win in any type of situation."

Littlewood is most impressed with Law's baseball instincts.

"Adam is like having another coach on the field," Littlewood said. "His baseball IQ is off the charts. He actually carries his own stopwatch to time the pitchers in between innings himself. He is really one of most heady players I've ever coached.

"He's a great base runner, he knows how to work counts at the plate, he understands many situations," Littlewood said. "The only thing I have to do with him is position him at third base, and now he is starting to catch onto that."

Vernon Law also is impressed with the strides Adam has made, and believes his grandson has a bright future in the sport.

"All of them [boys in the family] have been good athletes, and I've tried to help them along and see if they could make something out of it," Law said. "But, I think this last one, Adam, has got a chance to play professionally. He runs very well, he can steal bases, he's got a great arm and good glove. He understands the game and has played almost all the positions and knows where to be."

Adam Law hopes to one day follow in his grandfather's and father's footsteps on the professional level, but right now he and his teammates are focused on winning. Beginning with a victory against then-No. 2 LSU on Feb. 23, the Cougars have won seven of their past nine games and own a 9-7 record entering a West Coast Conference-opening series at San Diego this weekend.

"I think they're starting to really believe they can win," Littlewood said. "The win against LSU was big. That was a tremendous confidence builder. It's amazing how much confidence comes into play with 18- to 20-year-old kids. There's a refreshed attitude with these guys. If we can sustain this, it will be a fun season for us."

Brugman, Five Tool Player

Jaycob Brugman is excited for the 2013 BYU baseball season to begin with changes around the program.

For the 6-foot, 195-pound junior outfielder from Arizona, a chance to work harder, play a new position and have a new coaching staff bring added excitement to the season.

"We are excited about this next year," Brugman said. "We have a new coaching staff and a new team and we are excited to work hard than we ever have in the past."

New head coach Mike Littlewood is confident Brugman will be an important part of the team's success this year.

"He is a true five-tool player," Littlewood said. "He will play a vital role in the three hole and will have a lot of opportunities to lead the team."

The new year also means that there are new positions for members of the team to fill. With the departure of former centerfielder Stephen Wells to graduation, Brugman hopes to return to the position that he grew up playing his whole life.

"I would love to play centerfield, that's my position I've played my whole life," Brugman said. "But it really doesn't matter; right, left or center, I'll play where the team needs me to be."

The junior hopes to rebound from an injury that sidelined him at the very end of the season last year. He suffered what is called "turf toe" when one stretches the ligaments too far in the big toe on their foot.

"It is a long, long road to recovery," Brugman said. "It seemed like it would never go away and always bug me."

The injury also kept him from competing last summer in the Cape Cod League in New England. The Cape Cod League is for college baseball players to play in during the summer and if they perform well, it usually helps them to get noticed by Major League clubs.

There is something to be said about someone who enjoys and consistently plays a sport where more than half the time you fail. For Brugman, playing baseball has made him develop the mentality of not accepting failure.

He has used that mentality to help him get through last season's injury.

"I was really excited to go and play there this summer," Brugman said. "But I have worked hard to recover and am excited to play this year. With everything going on, we are excited for the new year."

Playing in the Major Leagues has always been a dream for Brugman. His dad and older brother were athletic and they started him young playing sports.

He developed a love for the game at an early age. He started

swinging things and throwing things around the house when he was a baby.

"My dad played college basketball and my brother played college baseball," Brugman said. "I grew up playing sports and naturally began to like playing baseball."

That love of baseball has driven him to want to play college ball as well to go to Omaha to compete in the College World Series. He knew he would have to work hard to get there and was willing to do so.

"My freshman year in high school, I played on the varsity team," Brugman said. "It was then that I knew I had a shot to play college ball and worked really hard to make that dream come true."

He originally wanted to play for a Pac-10 school because of how good they are at baseball and because Arizona State and the University of Arizona are in his home state. But coming on a visit to BYU changed his mind.

"After my visit here, I really liked it," Brugman said. "I knew that this is where I was supposed to come for school."

He is even more grateful he made that choice because he met his wife here. He met his wife, Alexis, through a former teammate and got married this past August.

Her support will give him a different kind of assist compared to assists he recorded in his previous two seasons.

The outfielders at BYU are known to have strong arms, being among the leaders in the country in assists. An assist in baseball is similar to an assist in basketball.

In basketball, an assist is awarded when one player passes the ball to a teammate who then makes a basket. In baseball, an assist is awarded when a player throws a player out after the ball is hit. For example, when the shortstop fields a hit and throws

it to first getting the runner out, the shortstop is awarded an assist.

It is difficult for an outfielder to register assists in baseball. Most come from throwing out runners trying to get an extra base or by throwing out runners at home plate. His freshman year Brugman recorded 13 assists, including turning four double plays. Last year he recorded six assists.

"I got quite a few my freshman year and a lot at the plate," Brugman said. "I think people knew I have a pretty strong arm and didn't try and test me as much this past year. Keeping runners from advancing because of your arm tells a lot about your arm strength."

Growing up, many young players dream of pitching a perfect game or of hitting a walk-off homerun to win the game. Last year, Brugman did the latter in a big way.

Against Santa Clara last year, Brugman was up to bat in the bottom of the ninth inning. There were two outs left, the bases were loaded and the Cougars were down 6-4.

"I tried to stay as calm as possible but I was pretty nervous," Brugman said. "I had a 2-2 count and was looking to put the ball in play. When I hit it, I just started running as fast as I could around the bases."

He made pretty good contact with the ball, sending it over the centerfield wall for a walk off grand slam.

"I didn't think I had hit the ball that well," Brugman said. "It wasn't until I was rounding second that I realized that it had cleared the fence. That was a pretty cool experience to have and definitely one I will remember for a long time."

Brugman was originally drafted out of Phoenix's Desert Vista Thunder High School in the 39th round by the New York Yankees but chose to come to BYU to hopefully improve his stock and get drafted higher.

"In college, your junior year is extremely important to do well for the scouts," Brugman said. "I hope to perform well this year to show them what I am capable of."

With a new team and a new coaching staff, the team looks poised to do well in its second season in the West Coast Conference and looks to players like Brugman for success.

He has started in every game of his career at BYU and hopes to use that experience to help the team do well this year.

"I want us to be able to win regionals this year," Brugman said. "After that, we can take it game by game until we reach the College World Series in Omaha. That is something I think we can do this year."
