Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU `93, played `85-`88) is in his second season as head coach at BYU, 32-21 (.604) in 2013. The 46-year-old coach had a 213-132 (.617) record in seven seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie `08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia `07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU `99), all in their second year at BYU.

Series Record vs. Utah, Nicholls State

BYU leads the series vs. Utah, 236-110-2, with a 109-58-1 advantage against the Utes on the road. Since leaving the MountainWest Conference, BYU has a 6-4 record vs. Utah. BYU has a 25-11-1 record in non-conference games against Utah. BYU's greatest and longest standing rivalry—with the University of Utah—did not start on the football field. On May 18, 1895, the Brigham Young Academy played against the Utes on a baseball diamond. The game ended in a 0-0 tie and a bench-clearing brawl. The other tie was a 2-2 tie in 1970 at Salt Lake City.

This is the first meeting between BYU and Nicholls State of the Southland Conference. BYU has played other schools from the Southland Conference, including Texas A&M-Corpus Christi this season and Incarnate Word, Lamar, Northwestern State, Oral Roberts, and Sam Houston in previous seasons.

BYU in NCAA statistics

BYU was ranked No. 12 in double plays after being perched in the No. 1 spot for three weeks at the beginning of the season, No. 14 in triples and No. 43 in sacrifice flies and home runs. Jacob Hannemann was ranked No. 31 in runs and No. 6 in triples, while Jaycob Brugman was No. 40 in that category and No. 36 in slugging. Desmond Poulson was No. 45 in complete games.

Regarding BYU This Season

- BYU has six players who are married: Barker, Jarvis, Kinser, Lopez, Robinson and Whitney.
- Incorporated into this year's team are four players who have just finished serving two-year Church missions (Kolton Mahoney, Wyatt Padgett, Dallen Reber, and Hayden Rogers)
- Eight players transferred to BYU (Bryan Heward, Brandon Kinser, Rhett Nelson, Dallen Reber, Michael Springer, Parker Starr, JC Snyder, Eric Urry)
- Two of the eight transfers have played at four-year schools, Rhett Nelson at Santa Clara and Dallen Reber at Kentucky. Heward, Nelson, Springer and Snyder all transferred from Salt Lake Community College (two more have signed for 2015 from SLCC).
- Three players on this years squad have younger brothers who are playing at Salt Lake Community College: Heward's (Bryan & Will), Snyder's (JC & Taylor) &, Whitney's (Brock & Derrick).

BYU vs. WCC in 2014

Here are a couple of interesting baseball facts on the WCC (BYU has a 56-61-1 record against that league). Pepperdine won the College World Series in 1992. Of the 10 WCC teams, only St. Mary's has not participated in the NCAA post-season tournament. BYU's 1-1 tie against Pepperdine came in the second game of a doubleheader in 1963. Quick Look at BYU

BYU was picked to finish seventh in the West Coast Conference after tying for second last season in its second year in the league and first under Coach Mike Littlewood. The Cougars return 17 lettermen and have 17 newcomers.

2013 in Brief

BYU won 12 of their last 16 games and 21 of their past 29 outings. For the fifth time since its creation in 2008, BYU won the Deseret First Duel by winning two of the three games against rival Utah. BYU was picked to finish sixth in the West Coast Conference and ended up tied for second in the regular season standings as it qualified as one of four teams in the WCC Tournament. In the WCC Tournament BYU was seeded No. 3 by virtue of a 2-1 record over No. 4 seed San Francisco and an 0-3 record against No. 2 seed San Diego. In the final month of the season, BYU led the WCC with a 56 ranking in the NCAA RPI and entered the tournament with a 52 ranking.

What Littlewood said the '13 Cougars:

"There are so many things that got us to the tournament. In my mind a key was Cody Shepherd's double against Portland; if he doesn't do that, we could be out of the tournament. There have been so many things two strike hits, two out hits, two-out RBIs I think that is what it takes is more of a team effort than one individual thing. It's an accumulation. There's a lot of character with these guys. (Matt) Milke came into his own., We told him, 'you have a great slider, use it.' He mastered the mental side of it. He was rarely in a game this year where it didn't matter. Mark Anderson got us the key win at LSU allowed us to see our potential and beat a good team in a hostile environment. There has been a lot of hard work, but it's been great. To see the guys rally around each other has exceeded my expectations 10 fold."

2013 Home Season

The Cougars finished the 2013 home season with a 168-94 (.641) record at Larry H. Miller Field which seats 2,204 fans in its 13th season since it was built. In the first nine years BYU drew 218,981 fans for an average of 1,177 and 142,248 at night for an average of 1,452. The largest crowd at home during 2013 was 1,593 vs. Pepperdine and the crowd of 11,240 fans at LSU was the largest on the road. BYU drew 20,313 fans (averaging 967) for an 16-5 home record in 2013. Weather caused the cancellation of two home games (Kansas & Washington State, plus) and forced postponing games against Utah and moving the three-game series vs. Creighton from Provo to St. George in 2013.

Hitting Streaks

Jarrett Jarvis has a current 10-game hitting streak, carrying over three games from last year, followed by Kelton Caldwell and Hayden Nielsen at six games and Brock Whitney and Trace Hansen are at five games and Bret Lopez is at three games.

Top 25 Teams

BYU played two nationally ranked teams this season, No. 19 TCU and No. 26 Texas Tech. Last year BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Then two weeks later BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1. The end of April BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball). In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after upsetting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.
