Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU '93, played '85-'88) is in his fourth season as head coach at BYU, 32-21 (.604) in 2013; 22-31 (.415) in 2014 and 28-25 in 2015 for an 82-77 (.516) record with the Cougars. The 49-year-old coach had a 219-128 (.631) record in seven seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie '08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia '07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU '99), all in their fourth year at BYU.

Brennon Anderson, Brennon Lund and Keaton Kringlen lead BYU with a current nine-game hitting streaks, followed by Eric Urry at six games. Schneemann had a 10-game streak ended last week. Lund WCC Player of Week vs. Saint Louis, Santa Clara

Brennon Lund was the Rawlings West Coast Conference Player of the Week by the league office and by College Sports Madness for his performance in the first three games against Saint Louis University, Lund was 10-for-16 (.625) with three RBI, and two doubles. Against Santa Clara he raised his batting average from .389 to .400. He hit the game-winning RBI with a two-out single in the fourth inning of BYU's 8-2 victory over Santa Clara in the opener.

Rucker WCC Pitcher of Week vs. Samford, Niagara

Michael Rucker was the Rawlings West Coast Conference Pitcher of the Week at Samford and against Niagara. He struck out a Samford batter in each of his seven innings (four swinging) of the series-opening 7-1 win at previously undefeated Samford to improve BYU's team record to 5-0. He struck out a career-high 10 batters in a 14-1 victory against Niagara.

Urry Sports Madness WCC Player of Week vs. Kansas

Outfielder Eric Urry was Sports Madness West Coast Baseball Player of the Week vs. Kansas. Urry raised his batting average from .233 to .295. Urry's game two catch at Kansas made ESPN SportsCenter Top 10 plays: <https://app.box.com/s/wuo72qbo7htn5qe25Ingudd940hy6hq5>

Shaver WCC Player of Week vs. Portland

Colton Shaver was the Rawlings West Coast Conference Player for the Week against Portland. He hit .545 (6-11) with a double, home run and nine RBI and elevated his batting average from .453 to .464.

Chauncey WCC Player of Week vs. Gonzaga

Tanner Chauncey raised his batting average from .358 to .388. The junior designated hitter from Las Vegas hit his first home run of the season, and second as a collegian, with a solo shot in the sixth inning of BYU's 11-2 victory over Gonzaga. In BYU's 5-4 comeback victory over Gonzaga on Saturday he had four consecutive singles, including knocking in BYU's first run of the game in the ninth inning.

Anderson WCC Player of Week vs. UVU, USF

Brennon Anderson raised his batting average from .319 to .341 in the four games last week, batting .538 with a slugging percentage of 1.000. He hit a pair of two-run homers in the San Francisco series, including the game-winning RBI in BYU's 12-6 victory.

Top 25 Teams

BYU won the first of three games in 2016 against No. 25 Creighton. In 2015 BYU played four nationally ranked teams: UC Santa Barbara, Nebraska, San Diego and upset No. 29 San Diego State. In 2014, the Cougars played two nationally ranked teams, No. 19 TCU and No. 26 Texas Tech. In 2013, BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Also in 2013, BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1; and BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball). In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after upsetting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.

Quick Look at BYU

BYU was picked to finish sixth in the West Coast Conference after placing seventh its third year in the league and second under Coach Mike Littlewood. The Cougars returned 20 lettermen and lost 12 letterman for Littlewood's third season. Preseason WCC prognostications have BYU third (D1baseball .com) and fifth by Perfect Game.

BYU vs. WCC in 2016

Here are a couple of interesting baseball facts on the WCC. Pepperdine won the College World Series in 1992. Of the 10 WCC teams, only St. Mary's has not participated in the NCAA post-season tournament. BYU's 1-1 tie against Pepperdine came in the second game of a doubleheader in 1963. BYU's win-loss baseball records and last action against the current WCC team is:

- 20-21 vs. Gonzaga, 2016, BYU won 5-4
- 11-9 vs. LMU, 2016, BYU won 7-4
- 14-23-1 vs. Pepperdine, 2015, PU won 8-7
- 20-11 vs. Portland, 2016, BYU won 5-3

Series Record vs. Gonzaga, St. Mary's & Pepperdine

Gonzaga leads the series 21-20 (see link at <http://byuougars.com/node/4193/m-baseball>). The series is tied 8-8 in Spokane and the Cougars are 11-7 vs. Gonzaga in Provo. BYU trailed 4-0 heading into the 9th inning in the last game between the two teams, with Bronson Larsen hitting a sac-fly for the walk-off 5-4 win.

Pepperdine leads the series 25-15-1, with the 1-1 tie coming in 1963 at Malibu. Pepperdine last won in the opening round of the WCC Tournament, 8-7, and the first of a three-game series in Provo in 2015, 11-3. BYU last won against the Waves in California in 2016 when Mike Rucker picked up his 10th win as 67 pro scouts were on hand to see him dual against A.J. Puckett, with Keaton Cenatiempo getting a save. Both Gelalich brothers played in that game, with BYU's Daniel scoring as a pinch runner.

BYU leads the series with Saint Mary's, 15-7, who has played twice in the state of Utah in 2013 and in 2015 when the two teams split. (see link at <http://byuougars.com/node/4636/m-baseball>). BYU has an 8-5 record at Moraga, Calif. Last year's weather-delayed finale scheduled for Provo was won by BYU and played at SMC, but the Cougars were the home team in the 4-3, 10-inning game won with a walk-off home run by Jarrett Jarvis. BYU was ranked No. 16 when it won the last of a three-game series at Saint Mary's last April, 5-4.
