Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU `93, played `85-`88) is in his fifth season as head coach at BYU, 32-21 (.604) in 2013; 22-31 (.415) in 2014; 28-25 in 2015; and 37-17 in 2016 for an 119-95 (.556) record with the Cougars. The 49-year-old coach had a 219-128 (.631) record in seven seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie `08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia `07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU `99), all in their fifth year at BYU.

Hitting Streaks

Brock Hale leads the team with a current 15-game hitting streak. Daniel Schneemann has a current 11-game hitting streak, followed by Brennon Anderson at nine games and Keaton Kringlen with seven. Kringlen's previous hitting streak ended at 13 games at Georgia State. Colton Shaver had a 12-game streak last season, while Chauncey had a hitting streak of 17 games.

Series vs. New Mexico State, UConn

BYU leads the series 9-0 record against NMSU. The Cougars swept the Aggies in a three-game series to open the 2006 season in Provo; swept a three-game series at Las Cruces, N.M., in 2005; won a single game in 1991 and a two-game series at NMSU in 1978.

This is the first meeting between BYU and the UConn Huskies of the American Athletic Conference. In the AAC, BYU has an 0-1 record against Memphis in 2007 at the Service Academy Spring Classic in Tennessee and a 3-2 record against Tulane. BYU won the first three games against Tulane in 1974, 1982 and 1986 at the Riverside Baseball Invitational in California and lost the last two games in 1986 and 1987 at the RBI.

Shaver WCC Player of Week vs. Portland in 2016

Colton Shaver was the Rawlings West Coast Conference Player for the Week against Portland. He hit .545 (6-11) with a double, home run and nine RBI and elevated his batting average from .453 to .464.

Chauncey WCC Player of Week vs. Gonzaga in 2016

Tanner Chauncey raised his batting average from .358 to .388. The junior designated hitter from Las Vegas hit his first home run of the season and second as a collegian, with a solo shot in the sixth inning of BYU's 11-2 victory over Gonzaga .In BYU's 5-4 comeback victory over Gonzaga on Saturday he had four consecutive singles, including knocking in BYU's first run of the game in the ninth inning.

Anderson WCC Player of Week vs. UVU, USF in 2016

Brennon Anderson raised his batting average from .319 to .341 in the four games culminating with the USF series, batting .538 with a slugging percentage of 1.000. He hit a pair of two-run homers in the San Francisco series, including the game-winning RBI in BYU's 12-6 victory.

Top 25 Teams

BYU lost at No. 21 Georgia Tech in the season opener, 5-3.

BYU won the first of three games in 2016 against No. 25 Creighton. In 2015 BYU played four nationally ranked teams: UC Santa Barbara, Nebraska, San Diego and upset No. 29 San Diego State.

In 2014, the Cougars played two nationally ranked teams, No. 19 TCU and No. 26 Texas Tech. In 2013, BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Also in 2013, BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1; and BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball).

In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after upsetting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.

Quick Look at BYU

BYU was picked to finish fourth in the West Coast Conference after placing being tri-champs its fourth year in the league and third under Coach Mike Littlewood. The Cougars return 22 lettermen for Littlewood's fifth season. Preseason WCC prognostications have BYU first by Baseball America, second (D1baseball.com) and fourth by Perfect Game.
