Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU `93, played `85-`88) is in his fifth season as head coach at BYU, 32-21 (.604) in 2013; 22-31 (.415) in 2014; 28-25 in 2015; and 37-17 in 2016 for an 119-95 (.556) record with the Cougars. The 49-year-old coach had a 219-128 (.631) record in seven seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie `08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia `07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU `99), all in their fifth year at BYU.

Series vs. UVU, Santa Clara

BYU leads the UVU series, 23-8. The Cougars won the first three of five games in 2005 when the series started. UVU won its first game in 10 tries at Miller part in 2010, 14-12 in 10 innings. BYU has an 11-5 record at UVU, winning the past five years in Orem. UVU won at BYU, 7-6 in 11 innings in 2016 and last beat BYU in Orem in 2012.

BYU leads the series with Santa Clara, 13-9. The Cougars won all three games vs. the Broncos in 2016 and 2013, but lost the first four meetings of the series which started in 1968. Santa Clara won the first and last of a three-game series in Provo in 2014. BYU won the last two games of the 2015 series at Santa Clara.

Hitting Streaks

Brennon Anderson leads the team with has a current seven-game hitting streak. Nate Favero has a current six-game streak, while Brock Hale, Daniel Schneeman and Tanner Chauncey have five-game streaks. Chauncey's 12-game hitting streak ended at San Diego. Schneemann had a 14-game hitting streak and Bronson Larsen had a nine-game hitting streak both ended at LMU. Hale had a 15-game hitting streak ended against UConn. Brennon Anderson had an 11-game hitting streak this season. Keaton Kringle's hitting streak ended at 13 games at Georgia State. Shaver had a 12-game streak last season as did Chauncey with a 17-game streak

No K's in the spelling of Tanner Chauncey's name

Tanner Chauncey is No. 1 in the nation in the category of toughest to strike out. In the month of April, Chauncey did not strike out at all in 67 at bats with 28 hits (.418 batting average), five walks and twice was hit by pitches. This season Chauncey has only struck out five times, the last being at Loyola Marymount. His other strikeouts came vs. Kennesaw State, Georgia State, San Jose State and UC Santa Barbara. He last struck out on March 25 in the final at bat of a 2-0 loss when Cory Abbott threw his perfect game. Had he not struck out at LMU, Chauncey would have extended his 18-game streak by seven more games.

Kringlen National & WCC Player of Week vs. Utah, SMC

Keaton Kringlen was named National Player of the Week by three organizations (Collegiate Baseball, National Baseball Writers Association and College Sports Madness) and Rawlings WCC Player of the Week. In the four games he had a slugging percentage of 1.571 with a batting average of .571, while going 8-for-14 with a triple, four homers, 14 RBI and 22 total bases for the Cougars. Three of those homers came in a 14-1 victory to complete a three-game sweep over league-leading Saint Mary's. His triple at Utah and his two-run inside the park homer vs. SMC in a 7-6 win were the game-winning RBI.

Quick Look at BYU

BYU was picked to finish fourth in the West Coast Conference after placing being tri-champs its fourth year in the league and third under Coach Mike Littlewood. The Cougars return 22 lettermen for Littlewood's fifth season. Preseason WCC prognostications have BYU first by Baseball America, second (D1baseball.com) and fourth by Perfect Game.

Top 25 Teams

BYU lost at No. 21 Georgia Tech in the season opener, 5-3 and the Cougars won 2 of 3 at No. 19 San Diego this season.

BYU won the first of three games in 2016 against No. 25 Creighton. In 2015 BYU played four nationally ranked teams: UC Santa Barbara, Nebraska, San Diego and upset No. 29 San Diego State.

In 2014, the Cougars played two nationally ranked teams, No. 19 TCU and No. 26 Texas Tech. In 2013, BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Also in 2013, BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1; and BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball).

In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after upsetting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.
