Storylines

→ Fresno State travels to BYU for its final non-conference game and final road game of the 2015 season, playing at LaVell Edwards Stadium Saturday at noon PT.

→ Both teams rank in the top 20 nationally in sacks, BYU standing eighth with 31 and Fresno State in 22nd with 27. Cougar senior defensive lineman Bronson Kaufusi ranks sixth among FBS active leaders with 22.5 career sacks while Ejiro Ederaine is 10th with 20.0.

→ Ederaine has moved into third place for the most tackles for a loss in Mountain West history with 43.0, which ranks third among all active players. He needs 4.0 more tackles for a loss to tie San Diego State's Miles Burris (2008-11) for the most TFL's in league history. He also ranks No. 3 among active FBS players in career tackles for a loss.

→ Quarterback Zack Greenlee, making his fourth start of the season but first since Oct. 3, threw six touchdown passes in last week's win at Hawai'i. The six TD passes are tied for the single-game high from any FBS quarterback this year and tie for the second-most in Fresno State history.

→ The Bulldogs are coming off their best offensive game of the season in last week's win at Hawai'i when Fresno State set new season-highs in points scored (42), passing yards (285) and total offense (455).

→ In the first nine games of the season Fresno State had only five interceptions. Last week at Hawai'i, the 'Dogs picked off three passes. Junior corner Tyquwan Glass leads the team with three picks and he enters Saturday's game with an interception in two-straight games.

→ Senior running back Marteze Waller needs 51 yards to become the fifth running back in program history to rush for over 3,000 yards in a career.

→ The Bulldogs are 10-3 under head coach Tim DeRuyter in games played in the month of November.

Scouting Brigham Young

BYU enters Saturday's contest with a 7-3 overall record and is coming of a 20-16 loss to Missouri last weekend in a game played at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City. The Cougars are 5-0 at home this season and are 25-5 at home over the last five years. BYU is only giving up 22.4 points per game and 357.7 yards while scoring 30.7 points per game on 425.8 yards of offense. Running back Algernon Brown has nine rushing touchdowns, quarterback Tanner Mangum has 16 touchdown passes against seven interceptions and wide receiver Mitch Mathews has nine touchdown receptions on the year, which ties for the 11th most in the country. On the defensive side of the ball, BYU ranks eighth in the FBS with 31 sacks on the season.

Series History vs. BYU

Fresno State and BYU are meeting for the first time since 1998 when both schools were members of the Western Athletic Conference. The Bulldogs do hold a 5-4 overall advantage in the series against the Cougars and are 2-2 when playing them in Provo, Utah. In the five meetings from 1992-98, when both schools were in the WAC, BYU took three of those five games. The first-ever meeting came in 1956, a 26-13 victory for Fresno State in Provo.

Ederaine Eyes Mountain West Record

Senior OLB Ejiro Ederaine has moved into third place for the most tackles for a loss in Mountain West history. With 43.0 career TFLs, he is one behind BYU's Jan Jorgensen (2006-09) and four from tying the all-time record holder Miles Burris (2008-11) of San Diego State, who had 47.0 in his career. Ederaine this season has a tackle for a loss in 9-of-10 games and has had multiple TFLs four times this year and 12 games in his career.

Notches on Ederaine's Belt

- > With 14.0 tackles for a loss this season, Ederaine ranks No. 2 in that category in the Mountain West and a tie for No. 19 among all FBS defenders.
-> His 8.0 sacks is also second among Mountain West defenders and ties for the 16th most in the nation this year.
-> He has become the seventh Bulldog in program history to record 20 sacks in a career.
-> Intercepted his second pass of the season and of his career, which he returned 51 yards to the Hawai'i 14-yard line.
-> Needs 16 more tackles to become the first Bulldog since Ben Jacobs in 2009 to post 100 tackles in a season.

Greenlee Steps Up With Career Night

Being one of only two schools in the FBS to start four different quarterbacks this season, Fresno State was looking for a breakout game from a quarterback and got it last week at Hawai'i. Sophomore Zack Greenlee made his fourth start of the year, but first since Oct. 3 at San Diego State, had a career night. He completed 20-of-35 passes for 285 yards and six touchdowns - all career-highs - and did so without throwing an interception in the game. His six touchdown passes are the most by any Mountain West quarterback this season and tie for the single-game high in the FBS. It was the second-most touchdown passes by a quarterback in school history and the most since Derek Carr tossed six TDs at San Jose State on Nov. 29, 2013. Greenlee completed a pass to eight different receivers in the game, including five different ones who caught one of his TD tosses. He had a quarterback efficiency rating of 182.11 on the night and averaged 14.3 yards per completion - by far his best numbers of any start in his career.

→ Greenlee is now one of five QBs to have ever thrown 6 TDs in a game in MW history.
→ Two other quarterbacks - Jake Rudock of Michigan and Jared Goff of Cal - also threw six TD passes in a game this past weekend.

Offensive Gains

The Bulldog offense had their best game of the season last weekend at Hawai'i. Fresno State set new season-highs in first downs (29), passing yards (285), total offense (455) and points scored (42), all doing so without turning the ball over for just the second time this season.

→ The Bulldogs had seven explosive passing plays of 20 or more yards vs. Hawai'i. The 'Dogs only had 16 total in the first nine games of the season before erupting against UH.

→ In Fresno State's three wins this season, it has posted 20 or more first downs each game. In all seven of the Bulldog losses they failed to pick up 20 first downs.

→ It was the second game this season the 'Dogs did not turn the ball over and ninth time in the DeRuyter era.

→ The 42 points scored marked the first 40-point game of the season for the Bulldogs. In the first three seasons under head coach Tim DeRuyter and offensive coordinator Dave Schramm, Fresno State scored 40 or more points in 18-of-40 games (45 percent).

Greenlee to Jordan Connection

Fresno State's two longest plays from scrimmage this year have been touchdown connections between Zack Greenlee and Jamire Jordan. The longest was the 82-yard TD hook-up between the two against No. 21 Utah back on Sept. 19.

→ Jordan is tied with Da'Mari Scott for the most explosive plays in the passing game - receptions of 20 or more yards - with five this year.

Scott For Two

Junior Da'Mari Scott became just the second Bulldog this season to catch two touchdown passes in a game, joining Chad Olsen who had two TD grabs in the season opener. Both of Scott's TDs came in the second quarter against Hawai'i and they were his only catches of the game.

A Program First Among the Receiving Corps?

Eight different Bulldogs caught a pass in last week's win at Hawai'i, tying the season-high. Five different Bulldogs caught a touchdown pass on the night. There have been 14 previous games in school history where the Bulldogs have had five or more touchdown passes and in every single one of them but the 1978 game when Bill Yancy threw six TDs, there was not a case where five different Bulldogs caught a TD.

Defense Joins In On the Season-High Action Too

Fresno State's defense forced a season-high four turnovers in last week's win at Hawai'i and it was the most take-aways since the Nov. 22, 2014 when it forced Nevada into four turnovers. The Bulldogs have created a turnover in 9-of-10 games this year, but it was the first game since week three of the season against No. 21 Utah that the Bulldogs had multiple take-aways. Of the four take-aways against Hawai'i, three came on interceptions and one on a fumble recovery.

→ The last time Fresno State had three INTs in a game was on Oct. 5, 2013 at Idaho (4).

→ The Bulldogs now have 17 take-aways on the year, which is tied for sixth in the Mountain West.

→ After recording 35 take-aways in the first year under head coach Tim DeRuyter, which ranked No. 5 in the FBS, the 'Dogs have since had 23 turnovers gained in 2013 and 20 in 2014.

Glass with a Pick in Back-to-Back Games

Junior cornerback Tyquan Glass picked off a pass last week at Utah, giving him an interception in back-to-back games. His three interceptions on the year leads the team and are the most by a Bulldog since 2013 when Derron Smith had seven interceptions and ranked No. 2 in the FBS that season for INTs. Smith in 2012 was also the last Bulldog to record an interception in three-straight games.

Glass in his last three games has 24 tackles, the two picks and one pass breakup. He is fourth on the team with 51 tackles. The most tackles by a Bulldog cornerback in the last five years is the 56 that L.J. Jones posted in 2011. Six years ago in 2010 CB Desia Dunn recorded 65 tackles.

Big Second Quarter

After gaining just 71 yards and scoring seven points in the first quarter at Hawai'i, Fresno State came back in the second to score 21 points on 142 yards of offense. It matched the most points scored in a quarter this year for Fresno State, as the 'Dogs also scored 21 vs. No. 21 Utah in the fourth quarter back on Sept. 19. Before last week's game Fresno State had scored 61 points in the second quarter - the most of any quarter this year. The Bulldogs have put points on the board in the second quarter in 7-of-10 games this year, which is the best production by quarter. The next closest is the first quarter where Fresno State has scored in 6-of-10 games and put up 52 total points - 30 behind the 82 scored in the second quarter.

→ Fresno State actually scored in all four quarters last week at Hawai'i, doing so for the third time this season. All three of those occurrences have come in Fresno State's three wins this year.

Non-Conference Wrap-Up

Fresno State is set to play its final non-conference game of the season this weekend at BYU. The last time the Bulldogs played a non-conference game this late in the regular season was back in 2011 when the 'Dogs closed the year out at San Diego State, Fresno State's last season in the WAC before joining the Mountain West and becoming league affiliates with the Aztecs.

Counting only FBS opponents, Fresno State and UNLV played the toughest non-conference schedules this season when factoring in the win-loss record of its non-conference opponents.

Fresno State vs. The Beehive State

This will be Fresno State's third game this season against a school from the state of Utah, but first of the three actually played in the Beehive State. The Bulldogs fell 45-24 to then 21st-ranked Utah on Sept. 19 and lost to Utah State 56-14 on Oct. 10. Entering the 2015 season, Fresno State had played a combined 47 games against BYU, Utah and Utah State, but this is the first time in program history the Bulldogs will face all three of these schools from the Beehive State in the same season.

Stanley Notches Career-High

Third-year sophomore inside linebacker Robert Stanley set a new career-high last week with seven tackles at Hawai'i. Five of his seven tackles were solo stops. His previous career-high was the four tackles he posted in the San Diego State game and he had just 11 tackles on the year in the first nine games prior to the game against the Rainbow Warriors. Stanley's increased playing time came due to injuries at linebacker and he took advantage of his increased time to help Fresno State hold UH to just 14 points, the second-fewest points allowed in a game this season.

Senior running back Marteze Waller continues to inch closer to 3,000 career rushing yards. He now needs 51 yards to become the fifth Bulldog in program history to run for over 3,000 yards in a career. Waller has run for 761 yards this season and is also 239 yards away from registering a second consecutive 1,000-yard rushing season. If he can hit that mark in these last two games he would become the sixth Bulldog in program history to have two or more 1,000-yard rushing seasons.

Schramm vs. BYU

Fresno State offensive coordinator Dave Schramm is no stranger to the BYU Cougars, facing off against them each year when he was an assistant at Utah (2005-11) and 10 times in his 12 years as an assistant at San Diego State (1990-01). Schramm's teams went 4-3 vs. BYU while he was on the staff at Utah and was 2-7-1 while at San Diego State.

During the 2009 and 2010 seasons when he was the offensive coordinator at Utah, his Ute offense's averaged 297.0 yards per game and 20.0 points while posting a 1-1 record. His 2009 team fell 26-23 in overtime while winning 17-16 in 2010 when quarterback Jordan Wynn, now a volunteer coach with the Bulldogs, led a fourth-quarter comeback that saw the Utes score all 17 of their points in the final period to beat the Cougars at Rice-Eccles Stadium. Wynn threw for 199 yards and one touchdown in that victory.

→ Bulldog head coach Tim DeRuyter has also faced off against BYU in his career as an assistant coach and a player. As an assistant at Air Force (1989-92 and again from 2007-09), the Falcons were 0-7 against BYU. As a linebacker at Air Force from 1982-84, DeRuyter's Falcons won in 1982, but fell to the Cougars in 1983 and 1984.

Homecoming for Brown

Bulldog junior safety Stratton Brown is returning to his home state for this weekend's game. Brown is a native of Bluffdale, Utah and prepped at Riverton High School where he was an honorable mention all-state selection as a senior playing running back and defensive back. Brown went on to play one year at Snow College in 2013, where he recorded 45 tackles, had seven pass breakups and three interceptions. Brown enrolled at Fresno State for the spring 2014 semester.

TIM DERUYTER

FRESNO STATE HEAD COACH
4TH SEASON | AIR FORCE (1985)

In three seasons as the head coach at Fresno State, Tim DeRuyter has elevated the program back to heights not seen in over a decade and led a resurgence in the Bulldogs, who are the pride of the San Joaquin Valley.

DeRuyter (pronounced da-ROOT-er) took over a team that went 4-9 the year before he arrived and turned the tables by leading Fresno State to back-to-back Mountain West championships, back into the top 25 rankings in 2013 and turned the Bulldogs into one of the elite programs in the Mountain West by winning conference championships in 2012 and 2013, and capturing the league's west division title in 2014. Before the DeRuyter era launched, Fresno State had not won a conference championship since 1999 - a drought of 13 years - and had not won consecutive league titles since 1992 and 1993.

From the day he was hired as Fresno State's 17th head coach in program history on Dec. 14, 2011, DeRuyter proclaimed two things; winning conference championships would be the team's No. 1 goal and his squads would embody the mantra "fast, physical and fanatical," an up-tempo and exciting style of play that would captivate the Red Wave, Fresno State's loyal fan base.

DeRuyter delivered on his promise and in return Fresno State rewarded him with a five-year contract extension after the 2013 season.

In his first year with the new deal, DeRuyter led a young Bulldog squad that accomplished a feat no other team in program history had before. After a challenging non-conference schedule, one that started against three Power-5 teams that were all ranked in the top 25 during the 2014 season, Fresno State found itself winless after three games. No other Bulldog team in school history had rebounded to win six games and get bowl eligible until DeRuyter's Dogs did so in 2014. Since 1980, there had been 496 total FBS teams that started 0-3 and the 2014 Bulldogs became just the 21st of that group to make a bowl, playing in the Hawai'i Bowl for the second time in three years.

The prior year was a banner season for the Bulldogs, one in which they were in the national spotlight. Fresno State went 11-2, won the inaugural Mountain West Championship game and earned a berth in the 2013 Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl. DeRuyter's 2013 Bulldog squad matched the school record for wins in a season, were ranked as high as No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and closed out the Bowl Championship Series era ranked No. 20 in the final BCS standings, the highest of any non-automatic qualifying team that year.

Fresno State led the Mountain West in attendance in 2013 and 2014. The Bulldogs have also set records for merchandise sold, as DeRuyter's success and futuristic vision of the program more than satisfied the cravings of the Red Wave.

In DeRuyter's first season at Fresno State the Bulldogs went 9-4 overall and 7-1 in the Mountain West to share the league title with San Diego State and Boise State and gain a berth in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. The five-game improvement in the win column from the year before he took over to after his first season marked the sixth best turnaround in the FBS in 2012.

The Bulldogs have gone 19-5 in three seasons in Mountain West play under DeRuyter and are 26-14 overall.

There have been six players drafted that all played under DeRuyter at Fresno State, including second-round picks Derek Carr (Oakland) and Davante Adams (Green Bay) who both started as rookies in 2014. Those are two of the four All-Americans he has coached at Fresno State in his three years.

DeRuyter came to Fresno State with 22 years of coaching experience. He took over the Bulldog program after serving the previous two seasons as the assistant head coach/defensive coordinator at Texas A&M. There, he also served as the interim head coach for the Aggies in the Meineke Car Care Bowl of Texas against Northwestern on Dec. 31, 2011, leading A&M to a 33-22 victory.

Greenlee finished the night with 156 yards passing and three touchdowns, while Waller had 22 carries for 154 yards...

"I'm really pleased with how we played today," head coach Tim DeRuyter said. "Had a great crowd out there today, ton of energy in the stadium..."

"Our young guys are talented. They're going to make some mistakes, but I think you saw some of the explosive ability that a lot of those guys played with..."

Fresno State came out fast after holding ACU to a three-and-out, taking just four plays to cover 63 yards before recording their first touchdown of the season...

On their ensuing possession, the Bulldogs were pinned inside their 10-yard line led to a punt that gave the Wildcats the ball at the FS 49-yard line.

On the following drive, Fresno State put together a 13-play drive, three shy of its longest from the 2014 season. The Bulldogs steadily moved the ball down the field before Greenlee dropped back and rifled a pass over the defensive back to Josiah Blandin.

The shift in momentum continued as the Bulldog defense took the field. After two short runs from Sims, Sophomore linebacker Tobenna Okeke came up with a sack of Parker McKenzie to force ACU to punt.

Chason Virgil was then inserted into the lineup. The true freshman went 3-of-4 on the first drive of his career, completing a 21-yard pass on third-and-six to Blandin keep the drive alive.

With the Wildcats driving early in the second half, and facing a second-and-10 from the Fresno State 24-yard line, sophomore linebacker Brandon Hughes pulled down McKenzie for a sack for a loss of seven yards.

After the 'Dogs were unable to capitalize on a 38-yard run, senior defensive end Claudell Louis put heavy pressure on McKenzie on the Wildcats' first play of the next possession...

"Defensively, I was really impressed with how physical our defense played," DeRuyter added. "We limited them. We basically took the run away from them. I thought our defensive backs did a terrific job being physical..."

Fresno State turned the interception into points with a 40-yard field goal from Kody Kroening to give the Bulldogs a 24-7 lead. Senior outside linebacker Ejiro Ederaine ended ACU's next possession with a sack to force another Abilene Christian three-and-out.

Jimmy Camacho added a 36-yard field goal with 7:02 remaining to give the 'Dogs a 34-7 advantage. Abilene Christian scored with time expiring in the Dallas Sealey threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to Byron Proctor to make the final score 34-13.

OXFORD, Miss. -- Despite Fresno State making a push late in the first half, a four-touchdown first quarter by No. 17 Ole Miss was too much in hostile territory for the Bulldogs as they fell 73-21 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.



True freshman quarterback Chason Virgil created a spark late in the first half, going 7-for-7 through the air and adding a touchdown with time-expiring to pull the 'Dogs within 21. He finished the day with 140 yards passing on 12-of-18 attempts for two touchdowns.

"We played an excellent football team in Ole Miss," head coach Tim DeRuyter said. "Give them credit, they are coached very well and we knew going into the game we had to take care of the ball on offense, and defensively we could not give up explosive plays given the quality of opponent we are..."

Ole Miss opened the game with an 85-yard drive that ended in a 14-yard pass from Chad Kelly to Cody Core that took 3:05. The Rebels then held Fresno State to a three-and-out, stopping Waller on a third-and-1.

After five consecutive rushes from Waller on the 'Dogs next drive, Ole Miss took over. Kelly missed on his first two passes for Ole Miss, but then connected on five in a row to work the Rebels down the field, finishing with passes of 23 and 33 to Core, and then finding Quincy Adebayo for a 16-yard score, the first of three for the speedy wideout on the day.

Despite an 18-yard run from Waller to start the 'Dogs next possession, they were unable to sustain the drive. The Rebels then just took just two plays to make the score 28-0 as Kelly found Adebayo streaking down the middle of the field for a 50-yard touchdown.

The Bulldogs began to get the offense going, moving the ball down near the red zone, but the drive stalled as Da'Mari Scott came up a yard short on fourth down just outside of the red zone.

With 6:43 on the clock in the second quarter, defensive back Shannon Edwards grabbed his first career interception. The senior returned Ryan Buchanan's miscue 56 yards for the 'Dogs first score of the day.

"When I intercepted it, it was like a dream running down the sideline," Edwards said. "For my first career interception to be a pick six at Ole Miss, an SEC football team, it was a dream."

The feeling was short-lived though as Ole Miss' offense made up for the mistake, going 75-yards in eight plays on the next possession to make it a 35-7 game.

Virgil then guided the 'Dogs offense on a 10-play drive to end the half. The freshman began looking Scott's way, chipping away as the Bulldogs drove down the field. He then hit Scott on a short out. With two players converging, Scott spun along the sideline to slip through both of the attempted tacklers. With time expiring, Virgil found junior Josiah Blandin on a quick slant from 9-yards out as the half ended 35-14 in the Rebels' favor.

"I think it was very impressive," DeRuyter said of Virgil's play. "He came in and the stage was not too big for him. I like how he competed. We just need to take care of the ball better."

Unable to get anything going on the opening drive of the second half, Fresno State was forced to punt, but senior captain Dylan Detwiler forced Carlos Davis into a fumble. Junior linebacker Brandon Hughes pounced on the loose ball at the Ole Miss 17-yard line to give the 'Dogs great field position.

Two plays later though, Virgil was intercepted by C.J. Johnson, who returned the ball 70 yards. Ole Miss used up just under two minutes before making it a 42-14 score as Robert Nkemdiche ended the drive by punching the ball in from 1-yard out.

With a minute remaining in the third quarter, Virgil found an open Waller on the right side. The senior running back found the end zone for a 7-yard score.

Ole Miss would outscore the Fresno State 38-7 in the second half.

FRESNO, Calif. -- No. 21 Utah overcame three turnovers the Bulldogs forced to beat Fresno State 45-24 Saturday night at Bulldog Stadium.

The Utes (3-0), the second-consecutive ranked opponent for the 'Dogs (1-2), opened up a 24-3 lead after three quarters and hung on during the fourth quarter when each team scored three touchdowns in the final 15 minutes.

"We played two top 25 teams and I thought our guys went toe-to-toe the last two weeks," head coach Tim DeRuyter said. "We gave up some big plays, our guys didn't quit, and I think they feel like we can compete with anybody in the Mountain West."

Fresno State made it a two-score game early in the fourth quarter on a Zack Greenlee touchdown pass to Josiah Blandin. However, Cory Butler-Byrd returned the ensuing kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown for the Utes and then two minutes later Britain Covey brought back a punt 77 yards for another score.

That gave Utah a 38-10 lead, but the Bulldogs did not go away.

Greenlee, who came in for Chason Virgil when he went down with a shoulder injury in the fourth, hit Jamire Jordan on an 82-yard touchdown pass. After a successful onsidest kick, Greenlee then found Da'Mari Scott for a 32-yard TD.

It was then 38-24 with seven minutes left, but as the story was for much of the game, the Utes ate the clock up the rest of the way with a 12-play, 75-yard drive that took the game clock down to 14 seconds.

"Our guys fought and clawed their way back into it and competed really hard," DeRuyter said.

Utah outgained the Bulldogs by just 15 total yards in the game (380-365), despite running 10 more plays and having a time-of-possession edge on the 'Dogs by 16 minutes.

Fresno State's offense gained the most traction in the fourth, gaining 174 yards and scoring three touchdowns - the first time since Nov. 9, 2013 (vs. Wyoming) the 'Dogs scored three TDs in a fourth quarter.

Greenlee was 6-for-10 passing in the game for 144 yards and three touchdowns - all in the fourth quarter. His 82-yard TD to Jamire Jordan is the longest TD pass since Derek Carr hit Davante Adams on an 89-yard TD on Oct. 27, 2012 at New Mexico.

True freshman Chason Virgil drew the start, becoming the first true freshman since 1973 to start a game at quarterback for the Bulldogs. He finished the day 11-for-25 passing for 97 yards while also rushing for 28 yards.

Josiah Blandin scored Fresno State's first offensive touchdown in the game on a five-yard pass from Greenlee early in the fourth. Blandin has scored a touchdown in each of the three Bulldogs' contests to start the 2015 season and joins Davante Adams (2013) as the only Bulldogs this century with a touchdown catch in each of the first three games of the season.

Ejiro Ederaine led the Bulldogs with a career-high 13 tackles, while Jeff Camilli (11) and Kyrie Wilson (10) both reached double-digit tackles in the game as well.

The three turnovers the Bulldogs created came on an interception by Tyquawn Glass in the end zone, a fumble recovery on the opening kickoff of the game that was forced by Scott and recovered by George Helmuth, and a fumble recovery by Claudell Louis.

Fresno State now heads to the road for the next two games to open Mountain West conference play. It starts on Saturday, Sept. 26 at San Jose State at 7:30 p.m.

SAN JOSE, Calif. - Tyler Ervin ran for a San Jose State school record 300 yards on 42 carries in leading the Spartans to a 49-23 victory over Fresno State Saturday at Spartan Stadium.

The Bulldogs (1-3, 0-1 MW) were outgained 543-247 in the game and dropped their third-straight contest. This was also the first time now in four seasons in the Mountain West that Fresno State dropped its league opener.

"Ervin is a heck of a back, we knew it. They ran the plays we practiced for all week. We got to execute better and got to coach better," head coach Tim DeRuyter said. "He beat us one-on-one in situations. We got guys at the point of attack that did not leverage well, we got to coach our guys to do that better and we got to wrap up and tackle better."

Ervin scored three touchdowns in the game, his last on a 30-yard run early in the third quarter that put SJSU up by 18. Fresno State did cut the Spartan lead down to 28-23 with five minutes left in the third quarter following back-to-back touchdowns, but were outscored 21-0 the rest of the way.

Fresno State had six sacks in the game, but allowed SJSU (2-2, 1-1 MW) to average 6.7 yards per play and convert 7-of-10 third-down attempts in the game. San Jose State held the ball for over 15 more minutes than the Bulldogs had it and ran 19 more plays.

Redshirt freshman Jamire Jordan scored twice for Fresno State in the loss. The first was on a 7-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter and again in the third on an acrobatic five-yard run that was a busted reverse play, but he made three defenders miss to reach the end zone.

"The play just broke down and I was trying to not get tackled in the backfield, so I did whatever I had to do," Jordan said. "I didn't see half the guys that tried to hit me. It was a good play. It was a game at that point and I felt that we had a chance to come back."

Junior Ford Childress drew the start in place of Zack Greenlee at quarterback, who was serving a one-game suspension. He became the third quarterback to start this year for the Bulldogs, which research going back through 1979 when game-by-game starters are available shows that this is the first season the Bulldogs have started three different players at quarterback.

Childress was 19-of-32 passing for 159 yards and two touchdowns with one interception. He is the first Fresno State quarterback to throw multiple touchdowns in a starting debut since Jeff Grady had three touchdowns in a 23-21 loss at No. 25 Wisconsin in 2002.

The Bulldog defense created one turnover in the game that led to its first touchdown in the second quarter, pushing their streak up to 18 games against the Spartans that they have forced SJSU into at least on turnover. The turnover was a forced fumble by Stratton Brown that James Bailey recovered.

Senior outside linebacker Ejiro Ederaine had eight tackles, three tackles for a loss and two sacks in the loss. It was his fourth career game with two sacks, but first since 2013.

"Disappointment," is what Ederaine said is how the team is feeling after the loss. "Our playmakers on defense, we have to make plays. They had a great effort, we just have to make more plays."

Redshirt freshman KeeSean Johnson caught seven passes for 90 yards in the contest and his first career touchdown on a 29-yard connection with Childress in the third. Jordan had five receptions for 45 yards.

Senior running back Martezze Waller rushed 19 times for 72 yards.

SAN DIEGO, Calif. - In a defensive battle at San Diego State, Fresno State's offense was stifled for much of the night as the Bulldogs fell 21-7 on the road at Qualcomm Stadium.

The 'Dogs (1-4, 0-2 MW) were held to 89 yards of total offense, the fewest since totaling 117 yards in a loss at No. 12 Tennessee in the 2003 season opener.

"We came ready to play, but as you could see just a couple plays will make the difference in a game," said linebacker Jeff Camilli who recorded a game-high 14 tackles, his third-straight game with double-digit stops.



The Aztecs (2-3, 1-0 MW) got on the board first, opening the game with a 10-play, 78-yard drive. Junior running back Donnell Pumphrey ended the possession by slipping out to the left side and rushing for a 33-yard touchdown.

Early in the second quarter, Fresno State's Stratton Brown jumped on a muffed punt to give the Bulldogs the ball at the San Diego State 28-yard line. After a Marteze Waller rushed for an 11-yard gain on second down, Zack Greenlee tied the game at 7-7 on the following play.

From then on, the defenses for both teams began to dig in. Fresno State though found itself pinned deep in its own territory several times.

The Aztecs capitalized on the field position, finding the go-ahead score midway through the third quarter after forcing Fresno State to punt from its own end zone. On the fourth play of the Aztec drive, Maxwell Smith faked the hand off and threw a ball over the top to Rashaad Penny for a 33-yard touchdown.

San Diego State then made it a 21-7 game with 10:57 remaining in the game as Smith went to the air again. The Aztec quarterback threw up a deep ball along the left sideline to Eric Judge that the wide receiver hauled in for a 44-yard score.

"Coming out in the second half, we were backed up, giving them a short field," head coach Tim DeRuyter said. "When you keep giving them short fields, they score it. We got a little worn down at the end and they ended up throwing the ball down field on a double move."

The Bulldogs will head home next week to face Utah State on homecoming on Oct. 10. Kickoff is scheduled for 7:30 p.m., PT and will air on the CBS Sports Network.

FRESNO, Calif. - Fresno State was unable to slow down a Utah State offense that posted 482 yards of offense on an evening the Aggies topped the Bulldogs 56-14 at Bulldog Stadium.

For the 'Dogs, Kilton Anderson threw for 112 yards and a touchdown in his first career start and Marteze Waller rushed for 70 yards and a touchdown.

"We just felt that we needed a quick start and that Kilton's energy and athletic ability would give us a chance," DeRuyter said of starting Anderson.



The Aggies opened the game's scoring midway through the first quarter as LaJaun Hunt found the corner and rushed for a 15-yard touchdown run. The play was set up by a 43-yard throw and catch from Kent Myers to Hunter Sharp.

Late in the first quarter, a sack by Utah State's Marwin Evans on third down left the Bulldogs to punt from inside their own end zone. As Aggie returner Sharp fielded the punt, Stratton Brown jarred the ball loose and Michael Martens recovered the fumble on the Utah State 35.

The forced fumble was Brown's second of the season. The junior has been a part of three turnovers over the last three games, forcing a fumble at San Jose State two weeks ago and recovering one last week at San Diego State. Heading into tonight's game, the Bulldogs were ranked fifth nationally in fumble recoveries.

On the ensuing drive, redshirt freshman Kilton Anderson, who is the fourth quarterback to start for the Bulldogs this season, tossed his first career TD pass, a 21-yard completion to Jamire Jordan to tie the game 7-7.

Early in the second quarter, the Aggies regained the lead. A 34-yard pass over the middle to Wyatt Houston set up a 5-yard rushing touchdown by Devante Mays with 10:04 on the clock.

On Fresno State's next possession, Utah State blocked a punt and recovered the ball at the Bulldog 8-yard line. Three plays later, Hunt rushed three yards for his second touchdown of the night to give the Aggies a 20-7 lead.

The Aggies tacked on a safety and a 44-yard touchdown reception from Devonte Robinson before the end of the half to give them a 29-7 advantage.

On the opening drive of the second half, the Aggies moved the ball down to the Fresno State 41-yard line and then Devante Mays capped the drive, running the ball the rest of the way to give the Aggies a 36-7 lead.

Mays found the end zone again for the Aggies with a 23-yard touchdown run in the third quarter to push their lead, 43-7. Waller made it a 43-14 game with a 1-yard touchdown rush at the beginning of the fourth quarter. It was his first rushing score since the 'Dogs faced Hawai'i on Nov. 29, 2014.

FRESNO, Calif. - Marteze Waller scored on a 38-yard rushing touchdown with 2:37 left and the Fresno State defense sacked the UNLV on a fourth down inside of two minutes with the rain pouring down in Bulldog Stadium as the 'Dogs won 31-28 Friday night over the Rebels (2-5, 1-2 MW).

The loss snaps a five-game losing streak for the Bulldogs and came after Fresno State (2-5, 1-3 MW) erased an 11-point deficit it faced entering the fourth quarter.

"I think in other games our guys had almost not a sense of despair, but a sense of I don't know if we could do this. There was some doubt lingering," head coach Tim DeRuyter said. "Tonight I had no sense of that. Guys were determined on the sideline and there was a look of we are going to find a way."

Leading the Bulldog offense on the comeback was redshirt freshman quarterback Kilton Anderson. Fresno State had been 1-18 in games when it trailed after three quarters over the last four years, but Anderson brought the team back in orchestrating a pair of touchdown drives in the fourth. The last quarterback to lead a fourth-quarter comeback was Derek Carr in a 2013 overtime win over Rutgers.

Anderson scored on a 12-yard run with 11:02 to pull the Dogs within five. Then on the game-winning drive he got the Bulldogs into UNLV territory and Waller handled the rest, rushing off the left side of the line and up the sideline for the deceive touchdown.

"It is great to finally get a victory for our guys," Anderson said. "We executed tonight. We played with great enthusiasm, came out and played our hearts and it is great to get a victory finally."

Anderson was 19-of-31 passing for 193 yards and also rushed for 78 yards -- the most by a Bulldog quarterback in any game since the turn of the century. He had two rushing touchdowns and after throwing three interceptions in his starting debut last week, played a clean game and the offense did not turn the ball over on the night.

Waller finished with 111 yards rushing, his 10th career 100-yard game, and two TDs as well. Defensively, Fresno State did not force a turnover for the first time this season but they did apply heavy pressure all night. The Bulldogs had six sacks in the game and held UNLV to 299 yards of offense -- the fewest allowed since their last win in the season opener against Abilene Christian.

"This is by far the greatest week of my life. I just had my son born last night," said the new proud father Todd Hunt, the senior defensive end who had eight tackles and a sack, "and for us to get this win, and not only because it was a win, but it was the way won. We didn't back down, we played like Bulldogs today."

Ejiro Ederaine had a game-high 12 tackles, 3.0 tackles for a loss and 1.5 sacks to lead the Bulldogs' defensive effort.

"The team as a whole just grew up and said you know what, 'enough is enough,'" Ederaine said. Fresno State overcame many obstacles throughout the game to earn this victory. The 'Dogs missed two field goals, a 23-yarder in the second quarter and a 38-yard attempt early in the fourth.

UNLV broke what was a tied ballgame at half with consecutive touchdowns in the third quarter. The second score, a 29-yard pass from Kurt Palandech to Devonte Boyd, came after the Bulldogs fumbled the ball over on a muffed punt.

Regardless, the team stayed in the game and rallied around its defensive pressure and Anderson guiding the offense.

On the final Rebel drive after the Bulldogs took the lead, UNLV quarterback Kurt Palandech rushed 39 yards to the Bulldog 36-yard line on the first play. The Rebels would get no more though as Ederaine and Claudell Louis sacked Palandech on a third-and-four and then Justin Green sacked him on the next play to seal the win for the 'Dogs.

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - Air Force quarterback Karson Roberts scored four rushing touchdowns and caught another to lead the Falcons back from 14 down in the first quarter to beat Fresno State 42-14 Saturday at Falcon Stadium.

The win was 10th-straight at home for Air Force (4-3, 3-1 MW). Fresno State (2-6, 1-4 MW) now must win out in order to get bowl eligible.

Fresno State opened the game with 14 unanswered points on touchdown runs of 64 and 60 yards by Marteze Waller and Dustin Garrison, respectively, only to see the Falcons come back and score 42-straight to beat the Bulldogs.

"Anytime you lose it is extremely disappointing," head coach Tim DeRuyter said. "I thought we started the game well, I thought our guys came out with a lot of fight and we executed well early. We gave up a chunk play when we didn't fit things well, let them score, get back in it and gave them some momentum."

Robert's five total touchdowns tied for the second most by any player in Air Force history. He finished the game with 92 yards rushing, was 5-for-10 passing for 108 yards and caught a 20-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter.

The Bulldogs had 234 yards of offense in the opening quarter when they opened up a 14-point lead after only nine minutes. Over the second and third quarters, Fresno State did not pick up a first down and had negative four total yards.

In all, Air Force outgained the Bulldogs 586-311 with 458 of that yardage coming on the ground. The Falcons entered the game ranked No. 5 in the FBS in rushing.

"They execute their offense well," DeRuyter said. "They came up with some schemes that they hadn't shown and we didn't fit things well or tackle well. We didn't get some first downs on offense, so it was just a tough outing."

Air Force had two players rush for over 100 yards in the game. Bryan Driskell had 144 yards on 12 carries and Jacobi Owens rushed 23 times for 137 yards and one touchdown.

When it was 28-14 Air Force in the third quarter, Bulldog corner Jamal Ellis forced a fumble on an option pitch, recovered it and returned it 24 yards to the Air Force 36-yard line. Fresno State was unable to do anything with it, going three-and-out, and saw the Falcons march 79 yards down the field on the ensuing drive to score a fifth-straight touchdown to put the game away in the third quarter.

After gaining 88 yards on five carries in the first quarter, Waller had negative eight yards the rest of the game to finish with 80 yards rushing on 10 carries.

Inside linebacker Jeff Camilli recorded his fourth game this season with 10 or more tackles and matched his career-high with 14 stops.

Ejiro Ederaine added nine tackles and Jamal Ellis, responsible for Fresno State's only take-away in the game, added five stops.

The win was Fresno State's first on the road of the season and it came in a game where the 'Dogs (3-7, 2-5 MW) forced four turnovers on a night full of penalties and scattered showers. "Our kids have grit," DeRuyter said. "We challenged them to practice hard. They did that. We took care of the ball on offense and we got four take-aways on defense. We played with grit and that's what we have to do."

Greenlee was 20-of-35 passing on the night and hit eight different receivers, including five different ones for touchdowns. His big night led Fresno State to a season-high in points, passing yards (285) and total yards (455) and it came in his first start since Oct. 3 against San Diego State.

"I think we just executed," Greenlee said of the offense. "That was the main thing. We went out there and [the wide receivers] made some great plays. For me to just sit in the pocket and get it to them and watch them go to work is awesome. It's a great game and when it goes like this it's just beautiful."

"The thing I was proudest of was that he hung in there," DeRuyter said of Greenlee's performance. "They took some shots at him. He didn't let it phase him. He stood in there and made the reads. Still has to get better, but I think he grew up by hanging in there and being a quarterback. You're going to take some hits and make some throws."

Junior Da'Mari Scott caught two passes for 53 yards, hauling in TD passes of 28 and 25 yards from Greenlee in the second quarter. Jamire Jordan added four catches for 79 yards and one touchdown.

Defensively, the Bulldogs four take-aways set a new season-high. Fresno State had three interceptions in the game when they entered the evening with just five picks in the first nine games of the season.

Hawai'i (2-9, 0-7 MW) was flagged 11 times for 132 yards in the game, including seven personal foul penalties.

Fresno State was aided in the first half by 10 Hawai'i penalties that went for 117 yards. Six of those were personal foul penalties, including four roughing the passer calls that helped the Bulldog offense get into a rhythm after a tough first quarter when the 'Dogs had just 71 yards of offense.

In the second quarter Greenlee threw three touchdown passes, two to Scott, to open up a 28-7 lead for the Bulldogs going into the half.

Greenlee threw a fifth TD early in the third, and it came after a 51-yard interception return by Ejiro Ederaine that set the 'Dogs up with the ball on the UH 14-yard line. Greenlee scrambled, pump-faked to get a defender up in the air, then found Marteze Waller in the corner of the end zone to put Fresno State up 35-7.

Late in the third quarter, Hawai'i drove down into the red zone but came away empty when Tyquan Glass intercepted Max Wittek in the end zone.

UH got one score back in the final minute of the third on a one-yard touchdown run from Melvin Davis, but Greenlee came back and hit Jordan on a 64-yard TD strike just one minute later.
