Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU `93, played `85-`88) is in his third season as head coach at BYU, 32-21 (.604) in 2013 and 22-31 (.415) in 2014. The 48-year-old coach had a 213-132 (.617) record in seven seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie `08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia `07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU `99), all in their third year at BYU.

Series Record vs. Oklahoma

Oklahoma leads the series, 5-1. The Cougars won the last meeting in Tempe, Ariz., 21-13, at the Fiesta Diamond Classic in 1997. The Sooners won a pair of games in both 1975 (Honolulu) and 1976 (Las Vegas) in non-tournament play. Oklahoma won the first meeting in 1971 at the Riverside Baseball Invitational in California.

Playing in Las Vegas

This is the first time BYU has played at Cashman Field in Las Vegas, the pro home of the 51's. The Cougars played Oklahoma in 1975 at UNLV's Hustlin'Rebel Field (1973-1980) where BYU had a 10-9 record. BYU had a 12-13 record at renamed Rober Barnson Field (1980-93) and a 31-28 record at Earl Wilson Stadium (1994-present). Other than Oklahoma and UNLV, BYU has also played Air Force, UC Irvine, Cal-Northridge, New Mexico, Northern Arizona, San Diego, San Diego State, TCU, Tohku Fukushi University of Japan, Temple and Utah and in games at Las Vegas.

Hitting Streaks

Colton Shaver has a current four-game hitting streak and Bronson Larsen has a two-game streak. In the Nebraska series, Brennon Lund ended a five-game hitting streak, extending into the final game last season.

Regarding BYU This Season

- BYU has eight players who are married: Jeff Barker, Jarrett Jarvis, Andy Isom, Brandon Kinser, Dillon Robinson, Hayden Rogers, Michael Rucker and Derrick Whitney.
- Incorporated into this year's team are seven players who have just finished serving two-year Church missions (Blake Brailsford, Keaton Cenatiempo, Tanner Chauncey, Grant Hodges, Seth Huxford, Mason Marshall, Cole Wilstead)
- Three new players transferred to BYU (Brady Corless, Austin Kamel, Cole Wilstead)
- Three of BYU's transfers have played at four-year schools, Cole Wilstead at UNLV, Michael Rucker at Gonzaga and Dallen Reber at Kentucky. Corless, redshirt Michael Springer and Whitney all transferred from Salt Lake Community College.

Oldest to Youngest

There are four seniors and seven freshmen on the current squad. The ages range from 24-year-olds Eric Urry and Andy Isom to 18-year-old James Barker.

Live worldwide TV and Live AM Radio

There were 10 games televised live on BYUtv, one on KBYU, three games on the W.tv and two on the Pac-12 Network; and at least 34 games scheduled to be broadcast live on Radio 960AM, most are streamed on the Internet.

Deseret First Duel

For the sixth of seven times BYU won the baseball portion of the Deseret First Duel in games against Utah. BYU won the 2014 competition due to a tiebreaker with a 38-21 run differential after the two teams split the four-game series. BYU won the baseball portion of the Duel in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013 and 2014. The 2008 series won by BYU and the 2011 series won by Utah were also by run differential.

Recent Inductees

Coaches Mike Littlewood (& son Marcus), Trent Pratt, Gary Pullins, Bobby Noel and Dave Nelson were inducted this past January into the Mountain West Baseball Academy Hall of Fame. Coach Littlewood, Pullins, Noel and Nelson also played for the Cougars.

BYU vs. WCC in 2015

Here are a couple of interesting baseball facts on the WCC. Pepperdine won the College World Series in 1992. Of the 10 WCC teams, only St. Mary's has not participated in the NCAA post-season tournament. BYU's 1-1 tie against Pepperdine came in the second game of a doubleheader in 1963. BYU's win-loss baseball records and last action against the current WCC teams is: 16-19 vs. Gonzaga, 2014, Gonzaga won 6-4 7-7 vs. LMU, 2014, BYU won 6-2 12-23-1 vs. Pepperdine, 2014, PU won 9-1 15-10 vs. Portland, 2014, BYU won 6-1 12-4 vs. St. Mary's, 2014, SMC won 6-1 1-13 vs. San Diego, 2014, USD won 17-8 7-11 vs. USF, 2014, USF won 5-2 8-8 vs. Santa Clara, 2014, SCU won 5-1 *5-7 vs. Pacific, 2014, Pacific won 11-7 *Pacific entered WCC in 2014

BYU in NCAA statistics

BYU was ranked No. 13 in fielding in the first NCAA rankings of the 2015 season. Jeff Barker and Kolton Manoney were ranked No. 3 in games started. Mason Marshall and Michael Rucker were ranked No. 37 in appearances. Dillon Robinson was ranked No. 39 in triples.

Quick Look at BYU

BYU was picked to finish sixth in the West Coast Conference after placing seventh its third year in the league and second under Coach Mike Littlewood. The Cougars return 20 lettermen and lost 12 letterman for Littlewood's third season. Kolton Mahoney threw BYU's seventh no-hitter in a 5-0 win at Nicholls State. Third baseman Dillon Robinson injured his ankle in the third game of the Nicholls State series and has missed 14 games due to that injury. Hayden Rogers suffered a concussion when he was hit in the face in a freak injury by a batted ball as he was warming up in the bull pen during the pregame.

2014 Home Season

The Cougars finished the 2014 home season with a 174-105 (.624) record at Larry H. Miller Field which seats 2,204 fans in its 14th season since it was built. In the first nine years BYU drew 218,981 fans for an average of 1,177 and 142,248 at night for an average of 1,452. The largest crowd at home during 2013 was 1,593 vs. Pepperdine and the crowd of 11,240 fans at LSU was the largest on the road. BYU drew 20, 313 fans (averaging 967) for an 16-5 home record in 2013.

Top 25 Teams

BYU plays three nationally ranked team this season, UC Santa Barbara, Nebraska and San Diego. In 2014, the Cougars played two nationally ranked teams last season, No. 19 TCU and No. 26 Texas Tech. In 2013, BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Also in 2013, BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1; and BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball). In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after upsetting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.

Mahoney's No-hitter in 2014

Sophomore Kolton Mahoney threw BYU's seventh no-hitter in school history in a 5-0 defeat over Nicholls State University. He threw 102 pitches, striking out 11 Colonels in nine innings, and walking only two batters in leading BYU to its fifth straight win and was named pitcher of the week by four different organizations. Mahoney's was the second nine-inning no-hitter in school history and the second no-hitter on the road.
