Week in Review:

BYU Upsets No. 9 California

On a night when the No. 15 Cougars broke their attendance record for the second time this year, including the second straight home game, Natalie Nate gave BYU fans reason to cheer as she netted the lone goal off a penalty kick against No. 9 California.

The first half of action was a war with both teams proving exactly why they are two of the top ranked teams in the country. Demonstrating finesse, aggressiveness and technical skill, both teams battled to a scoreless first half. In the last ten minutes of the first half, the Golden Bears took control of the game, outshooting the Cougars 4-3, including a 2-0 advantage in shots on goal.

BYU came out with something to prove in the second half with their aggressive play earning several solid looks at the net. With 17 minutes remaining in the game, Jessica Aquino received a pass on a breakaway toward the goal. Aquino was tripped during her drive, awarding BYU a penalty kick.

After a deafening moment of cheers, the crowd went deadly silent as sophomore Natalie Nate took her turn on center stage.

Nate stood with just the ball between her and the goalie and plotted her shot. After what seemed like an eternity, Nate grounded the ball into the left hand corner of the net. The goal marked Nate's second of the season.

No. 15 BYU struggled to recover from an emotional victory over No. 9 California, ending in a 0-0 draw with Eastern Washington Saturday evening at South Stadium.

The Cougars dominated the game offensively, outshooting Eastern Washington 30-4, including a 12-2 advantage in shots on goal, but never found the back of the net. Eagle goalkeeper Tiera Como saved the ball 12 times.

Nate, Woodbury Named MWC Players of the Week

For the second straight week the No. 15 Cougars received the Mountain West Conference Women's Soccer Offensive and Defensive Players of the week. BYU sophomore midfielder Natalie Nate and sophomore goalkeeper Erika Woodbury won the offensive and defensive accolades, respectively.

Nate, from Salt Lake City, Utah, tallied the game-winning goal against No. 9 California in a 1-0 win. Her goal off a penalty kick gave BYU its third win against a ranked team this season. The goal was Nate's second of the season, giving her a season total of four points. As a sophomore, she has started in all 10 games this season.

Woodbury, a Murietta, Calif., native, led a Cougar defense that shutout both opponents last week, including No. 9 California. She made a total of four saves and faced 11 shots over the weekend. As of Sept. 18, Woodbury ranked No. 2 in the country for goals against (1) and goals-against average (.132). She currently boasts a 0.10 goals-against average.

Last week Jaime Rendich Beck received Offensive Player of the Week, while Jessica Harmon won the Defensive Player of the Week.

Friday night opened with the players, staff and fans of the Arizona State University soccer team celebrating the coaching accomplishments of Head Coach Ray Leone. It ended with more celebrating as Elizabeth Bogus netted her second game-winning overtime goal of the season to give the Sun Devils a 1-0 defeat of visiting UC Santa Barbara at Sun Devil Soccer Stadium.

Both teams played a physical, fast-paced match with the visitors accumulating nine fouls and a pair of yellow cards while the Sun Devils also collected two cautions with their seven fouls. The Sun Devils dominated the remaining categories as ASU outshot UCSB, 28-4, and took 16 corner kicks to the Gauchos four.

With the ball bouncing around late in the game, ASU finally gained control and put the ball into the middle of the field at the 18-yard box. Bogus moved in and fired a shot that was blocked straight up by a defender. The ball came back down and a falling Bogus lobbed a soft arching shot over the extended keeper for the winning tally.

Statistical Leaders: Elizabeth Bogus is the Sun Devils' major offensive threat, netting seven goals and providing two assists for 16 points. Bogus has help from Many Makoskio, who has supplied five goals and two assists, and Emily Coehlo, contributing three goals and two assists. Leading the team with three assists is Alissa Oldenkamp. Goalkeeper Kim Bingham has saved the ball 31 times in nine games.

Scouting the Wildcats

Arizona women's soccer team defeated UC-Santa Barbara on Sunday for its fifth victory of the season. Senior Mallory Miller scored three goals to give her nine goals on the season.

In the first half of play, Arizona took the early lead at 13:16 with a goal by Miller off of an assist from sophomore Nicole Scheid. The Gauchos responded at 20:03 off of a score from Darci Gwartz. Miller scored at 37:11, with an assist by sophomore Claire Bodiya, to give the Wildcats back the lead. At 50:07, sophomore Nicole Scheid scored with an assist going to senior Kamaya Damwijk to give Arizona the two-goal lead. UCSB once again responded by scoring at 58:16 with a goal by Allie Kueny off of a pass from Katie Smith. The Gauchos then tied up the game with less than 15 minutes to play with a goal coming from a corner kick. With less than two minutes to play in regulation, Miller scored the game-winning goal for the hat trick and the 4-3 Wildcat victory.

Statistical Leaders: Mallory Miller fronts the Wildcat offensive with six goals on the season. With her ninth game-winning goal in her career on Sunday, fourth this season, Miller holds the program record in that category. Miller has benefited from the nice passing of Nikki David, who leads Arizona with four assists. Goalkeeper Smith McCall has spent 675 minutes in the net and posted 37 saves.

The Rockwood File

After completing her tenth season, head coach Jennifer Rockwood has taken the BYU women's soccer team to national prominence and established herself as one of the premier coaches in Division I soccer today.

Rockwood currently ranks tenth in winning percentage among active NCAA coaches with an impressive 165-56-10 overall record for her career. Over the last ten seasons, Rockwood accumulated a .736 winning percentage.

In the past ten years, Rockwood has guided the Cougars to five conference championships. On the national scene, her teams have made seven appearances in the NCAA Tournament in the last eight years and reached the "Sweet Sixteen" in 1998, 2000 and 2003. The Cougars regularly maintain a consistent top-25 ranking. During Rockwood's tenure, the team finished in the top-10 three times, including a recent run in the 2003 NCAA College Cup. The tournament ended with BYU finishing No. 5 in the country after making

their first "Elite Eight" appearance in the program's history.

Among the many achievements and awards she has received over her career, Rockwood has been honored with two Coach of the Year citations, one by the Western Athletic Conference in 1996, and again by the MWC in 2000. She also became the first MWC coach to eclipse the 100-win total mark when the Cougars shutout Milwaukee-Wisconsin 2-0 on Sept. 23, 2000.

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Aleisha Rose, Jeni Viernes and Michelle Jensen. Among the players who have been coached by Rockwood are four additional All-American athletes that were drafted by the women's United Soccer Association: Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading and Staci Reynolds.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Rick's College on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management.

Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs, and the high school level.

Rockwood Among Coaching Elite

Rockwood currently ranks 10th in winning percentage among active NCAA Division I coaches with an impressive 165-56-10 (.735) overall record after the 2004 season. Anson Dorrance, Becky Burleigh, Jerry Smith, Chris Petrucelli, Len Tsantiris, John Walker, Randy Waldrum, G. Guerrieri and Patrick Farmer are the only coaches ahead of her.
