BYU OPENS EXHIBITION PLAY THURSDAY AGAINST BROCK UNIVERSITY

Fans will have their first chance to see the 2006-07 BYU men's basketball team in action this week as the Cougars host Brock University out of Ontario, Canada, on Thursday at 7 p.m. in their first exhibition game of the season. Tipoff is set for 7:05 p.m. in the Marriott Center.

KSL Newsradio will stream the game live online at KSL.com via the KSL X-Stream. Greg Wrubell will call the play-by-play action with Mark Durrant providing game analysis.

"Brock is a good offensive team," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "They're skilled shooters from all over the floor, and they like to shoot the three."

The Brock University Badgers are off to a 7-1 start this season and are riding a four-game winning streak. Senior guard Brad Rootes leads the team in scoring with 24.8 points per game while dishing out a team-best 6.3 assists per outing. Senior forward Chris Keith leads the Badgers in rebounding with 7.9 per game, bolstered by 11 boards in each of the last two games. As a team, Brock is a high-scoring team, averaging 83.8 points. The Badgers are coached by Ken Murray, who has a 326-215 record in his 17th season with Brock and a 462-421 mark in his 27th year overall.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

— Cougar head coach Dave Rose guided BYU to a 20-9 record and an NIT appearance in his first year at the helm after eight years as BYU's lead assistant. He was named the Mountain West Conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year last season. Rose coach his team to a second-place MWC finish — one game behind league champion San Diego State — while turning a 9-21 season into a 20-9 product that proved to be the second-best improvement among all Division I programs.

— BYU has been picked in the preseason poll to finish second in the MWC race this year by the league's media.

— BYU went 14-1 at home last year, winning the last 14 straight in the Marriott Center, which is the nation's eighth longest active streak.

— BYU's roster this season includes a solid core of players returning, including six seniors and Trent Plaisted, the MWC Freshman of the Year last year. One of nine returning lettermen, Plaisted was named a Freshman All-American after leading BYU in both scoring (13.6) and rebounding (6.9) one year ago.

— Players on the roster who will see their first action for BYU this year include junior redshirt Vuk Ivanovic (Jr., 6-10, C/F) and five newcomers — freshmen Jordan Cameron (6-5, G/F), Jonathan Tavernari (6-6, G/F) and Brock Zylstra (6-6, G/F), sophomore Gavin MacGregor (6-9, F/C) and junior transfer Ben Murdock (6-2, G).

SCOUTING BROCK UNIVERSITY

The Brock University Badgers are currently 7-1 this season and are riding a four-game winning streak. Four starters return from last year's 22-12 team that advanced to postseason play after a second-place finish in the Ontario University Athletic Conference's Western division. Senior Brad Rootes leads the team in scoring this season with 24.8 points per game on .443 shooting from the floor, .413 from three-point range and .843 from the free-throw line. The 5-foot-10 guard who led the Badgers in scoring and rebounding last year is also dishing out a team-best 6.3 assists per game while ranking second in boards at 5.1 rpg. He has paced Brock in scoring five times this year, including a 31-point performance on Oct. 28, and rebounding once with 10 on Oct. 14 to go along with 27 points for his only double-double of the year. Senior forward Chris Keith leads the Badgers in rebounding with 7.9 per game, bolstered by 11 boards a piece in each of his last two games, and is second in scoring with 16.9 ppg. The 6-foot-6 Keith has also recorded five blocked shots in the first eight games of the year. Senior guard Scott Murray and sophomore guard/forward Mike Kemp round out Brock's returning starters and are averaging 11.8 and 11.4 points per game, respectively. Junior forward Owen White, the tallest player on the team at 6-foot-7, is third on the team in rebounding with 4.1 per game while Murray is close behind at 4.0. As a team, the Badgers are averaging 83.8 ppg on .410 shooting from the floor to go along with 34.4 rpg. Brock opponents are posting 75.2 ppg while shooting at a .443 clip from the floor and averaging 39.5 boards per contest. The Badgers are coached by Ken Murray, who has a 326-215 record in his 17th season with Brock and a 462-421 mark in his 27th year overall.

AINGE, BALDERSON, YOUNG NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

In conjunction with BYU's first action of the season, Coach Rose and the Cougar coaching staff have announced this year's team captains, calling upon seniors Austin Ainge, Jimmy Balderson and Keena Young to lead this year's team.

"I'm proud of the way these three players have developed and of their dedication to our team," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "They are totally commitment to this program and have earned the respect and confidence of their teammates. They will provide us with good leadership as we work together as a team to achieve our goals."

Ainge, a co-captain of last season's team, proved a valuable asset off the bench in 2005-06 after starting at the point guard spot and receiving All-Mountain West Conference honorable mention as a sophomore. Last season he ranked 11th in the MWC in assists while helping BYU lead the league in both scoring and assists. Balderson also provided a spark off the bench for the Cougars last season as he scored in double figures in 11 of the last 13 games and was the only player in the conference averaging more than 10 points per game off the bench with a 10.2 scoring average. Young led BYU in rebounding as a sophomore before becoming an All-MWC Third Team pick last year after starting the last 14 games of the year and ranking second on the team in rebounding (5.8 rpg) and third in scoring (10.3 ppg).

QUOTING COACH ROSE

On Exhibitions Opponents:

"[Brock] is a good offensive team. They're skilled shooters from all over the floor and they like to shoot the three. They're very unlike the team we'll play next week - Montevallo - who is very athletic. We're going to get two very different looks in these two exhibition games."

On Player Personnel:

"The roles of this year's team are a long way from being determined. It's a process, and it takes time. You really just hope that you've got a pretty good feel for your team by the beginning of conference play."

"It'll come down to the next 12 days and who can become the most consistent. These are all pretty talented guys, and they play pretty well as a team. It's going to come down to the guys who are the most consistent and who execute the best over the next couple of weeks."

On Expectations:

"Every coach comes into a new season with a lot of ideas about what your team's going to be like. I would like to expand this team by playing more lineups. I want to be able to go big or go small, put pressure on other teams, respond to what our opponents are doing. The question is can I put lineups on the floor that can play at both ends. I know I can put a team together and be pretty good at certain things, but I want to see how many things we can be good at."

On New Guys:

"I'm really happy with the new guys and how they're playing. Where they will all end up will depend on what happens over the next two weeks. All of that is still to be determined, but I know I've got a very talented, very good group of guys."
