Final Road Swing Awaits BYU Volleyball

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 29, 2007) – The BYU women's volleyball team (15-6, 7-4 MWC) will play its last regular-season road matches this week as the Cougars take on TCU and New Mexico. BYU will travel to Fort Worth, Texas, to face the Horned Frogs on Thursday before battling the Lobos in Albuquerque, N.M., on Friday.

The pair of road contests will have lasting consequences in the Mountain West Conference race as the Cougars are just one game ahead of both teams in the MWC standings. With a 7-4 league record, BYU is currently in third place while TCU, New Mexico and Utah are locked in a tie for fourth place at 6-5.

"Obviously, this will be a very important weekend for us as we begin the crucial month of November," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "We need to play well on the road and take control of our own destiny in terms of seeding for the MWC Tournament."

The Cougars' final road swing will begin Thursday at TCU at 7 p.m. CT (6 p.m. MT). The Horned Frogs are 19-9 overall this season and 6-5 in the MWC. TCU is led by sophomore middle blocker Kourtney Edwards with 3.37 kills per game followed closely by senior outside hitter LeMeita Smith at 3.20 kpg and sophomore outside hitter Lauren Otto at 2.82. Edwards also ranks fourth in the conference hitting .351 and averages a team-best 1.17 blocks per game, seventh in the MWC. BYU leads the all-time series 10-0, including a sweep earlier this season.

Friday night's action begins at 7 p.m. and will have the Cougars looking for a little payback against the Lobos as New Mexico has taken the last two matches, including a four-game win in Provo earlier this season. The Lobos are 15-8 overall and 6-5 in the MWC after getting off to one of the best starts in school history. Their 15 total victories is the highest win total by a Lobo team since the formation of the MWC in 1999, and their six league victories matches the most MWC wins by a Lobo volleyball team (6 in 2005). Junior outside hitter Jeanne Fairchild paces New Mexico and the conference with 4.82 kills per game and 5.26 points per game. BYU owns a 58-8 all-time record in the series.

TCU IN 2007

The Horned Frogs are 19-9 overall this season and 6-5 in Mountain West Conference, in a three-way tie for fourth place. TCU is led by sophomore middle blocker Kourtney Edwards with 3.37 kills per game followed closely by senior outside hitter LeMeita Smith at 3.20 kpg and sophomore outside hitter Lauren Otto at 2.82. Edwards also ranks fourth in the conference hitting .351 and averages a team-best 1.17 blocks per game, seventh in the MWC. Junior setter Nirelle Hampton puts up 10.86 assists per contest while posting 0.30 aces per game. Senior libero Calli Corley is third in the MWC with 4.87 digs per game. As a team, the Horned Frogs outperform their opponents in kills (14.95-14.64), hitting percentage (.251-.195), assists (13.71-13.43), digs (16.75-15.88) and blocks (2.45-1.70).

LAST OUTING

FORT WORTH, Texas (Oct. 26, 2007) - After jumping out to an early two game lead, the TCU Horned Frogs held on for the 3-2 (30-23, 30-24, 24-30, 22-30, 15-12) victory over New Mexico Friday night at the University Rec Center. Christy Hudson was one of the many stars for the Frogs tonight as she notched a double-double with 16 kills and 12 digs. Defensively, Calli Corley tallied a match-high 21 digs, while Kourtney Edwards racked up five blocks.

In the decisive game five, the Horned Frogs stormed out to a 5-0 lead behind the serve of Hudson. An Irene Hester kill on the outside was followed by a Hudson ace to make it 2-0. Hester again drove the ball off the block and Edwards followed with another kill to keep the momentum going. A denial on the outside by Nirelle Hampton/Edwards gave the Frogs the commanding lead. New Mexico would battle back, pulling within two, 5-3, but that was as close as they would get as the Frogs kept rolling. A solo denial in the middle by Hester gave TCU a commanding 12-7 lead and they held on for the 15-12 win, as a LeMeita Smith cross-court kill sealed the victory.

The Frogs put a total team effort on the court as they tallied 72 kills and had four Frogs in double-digits. Along with Hudson's 16 kills, Smith also tallied 16, followed by 12 from Edwards and 10 from Hester. Four Frogs also reached double figures in digs. Hampton completed her double-double with 17 digs. Katelyn Blackwood pitched in with 10.

NEW MEXICO IN 2007

The Lobos are 15-8 overall and 6-5 in the Mountain West Conference, in a three-way tie for fourth place after getting off to one of the best starts in school history. Their 15 total victories is the highest win total by a Lobo team since the formation of the MWC in 1999, and their six league victories matches the most MWC wins by a Lobo volleyball team (6 in 2005). Junior outside hitter Jeanne Fairchild paces New Mexico and the conference with 4.82 kills per game and 5.26 points per game. Junior libero Gayle Tripp is fourth in the league with 4.38 digs per game. Freshman outside hitter Lisa Meeter is second on the team in both kills at 3.10 and digs at 3.02 and second in the MWC in aces with 0.38 per game. As a team, the Lobos outperform their opponents in every statistical category.

LAST OUTING

FORT WORTH, Texas (Oct. 26, 2007) -- The University of New Mexico volleyball team lost a tough five-game match to TCU, 30-23, 30-24, 24-30, 22-30, 15-12. The Lobos came out of the intermission strong, but could not put away TCU in Game Five. It was a tale of two teams as UNM struggled in Games One and Two, then fought back in Games Three and Four to force Game Five.

Junior libero Gayle Tripp had 20 digs on the night to move up three places on the UNM career digs list during the match. At the end of Game Two, Tripp had nine digs to move into fourth place with 1,049. Her final dig of the match moved her into third place with 1,060 digs. She needs 54 digs to move into second place.

In addition to Fairchild's 23 kills, Lisa Meeter had 15, Rose Morris had 12, and Kerri Beck had 10. Jade Michaelson recorded her third double-double of the season with 43 assists and 12 digs. Kelsi Phillips also chipped in with 14 digs.

The Lobos got off to a rough start in Game Five as TCU took a 5-0 lead. Fairchild put down one of her team-high 23 kills to stop the run and get UNM back on the board. UNM closed to within two on another Fairchild kill, 5-3. TCU built the lead back up to five at 12-7. After a Lobo timeout, UNM chipped away at the lead, closing to within two, 14-12, on back-to-back kills by Fairchild. But TCU won the match on a kill, 15-12.

Cougars Sweep Away Horned Frogs

Behind a spectacular night from senior Chelsea Goodman, the No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team posted its third straight sweep Friday night with a 30-27, 30-20, 30-21 win over Mountain West Conference foe TCU in the Smith Fieldhouse. With the win, the Cougars improve to 11-4 overall and 4-2 in the MWC while the Horned Frogs fall to 15-6 on the year and 2-3 in league play.

"We're getting back to where we were in early September when we beat No. 10 Wisconsin," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "We've seen some incremental changes that have helped us prepare and play better."

BYU started out slow, falling behind 13-6 early in game one, but cut the lead to three points at 14-11 with a 5-1 run. TCU kept the Cougars at bay to a 20-15 lead until Porter found her rhythm, putting down three kills in the next five points to spark BYU on a 7-2 spurt, tying the game at 22-22. Three straight Horned Frog winners seemed to have TCU back in control at 25-22, but the Cougars scored eight of the last 10 points to take the game 30-27 as Goodman blasted eight kills.

The two teams traded points early in game two until four straight Cougar points secured a 9-6 BYU lead. The Horned Frogs had a chance to tie things up at 12-11 but were thwarted in their attempt by a kill down the middle from Dyer, sending the Cougars on a 7-2 run to extend their lead to 19-13. From there, BYU never looked back, cruising to the 30-20 victory.

Game three was a battle early on as neither team was able to lead by more than one point. Finally, BYU got back-to-back kills from Dyer and Lott to go up 10-8. Moments later, TCU was back within one at 11-10, but three straight bombs from Goodman established a 14-11 Cougar lead. The Horned Frogs wouldn't threaten again as BYU kept the pressure on to record the 30-21 win.

Solid Team Effort Leads to Victory

The No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team ran into a buzzsaw Saturday night, falling 30-22, 26-30, 24-30, 25-30 to New Mexico.

"We just weren't as prepared and focused on some very specific details that we needed to take care of," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "New Mexico played a very competitive match."

BYU was in control through the first half of game one with a 17-12 lead but saw the Lobos come back with three straight scores. A solo block from Bryn Porter ended the UNM run and swung the momentum back in the Cougars' favor as they again led by five at 23-18. From there, it was all BYU as the Cougars cruised to the 30-22 win.

Game two was a battle early on as neither team was able to go up by more than one point. BYU finally did it with three straight points to take an 11-9 advantage but UNM came right back to go up 13-12. Back-to-back kills from Goodman and Dyer put the Cougars on top 16-14, but moments later it was 26-21 in favor of the Lobos as the BYU offense sputtered, leading to the 30-26 UNM win.

The Lobos built a 13-10 advantage in game three and put the Cougars on their heels. BYU battled back to tie the game at 14-14 on a tremendous block by Porter and Dyer and were soon in front, 20-16, after two high-flying kills from Goodman. But the Lobos pushed back with everything they could, putting together a 9-1 run to take a commanding 26-21 lead from which the Cougars could not recover, falling 30-24.

UNM again came out of the gate strong to start game four, building a 5-1 lead. Porter finally tied the game for BYU at 14-14, but four straight UNM points had the Cougars staring defeat in the face. Still trailing 21-18, BYU found some momentum, scoring three straight points capped by an ace from Goodman to tie the game at 21-21. However, New Mexico refused to let the victory slip away, scoring nine of the last 13 points to seal the 30-25 win.

Weekly Notes:**Week #10 In Review:**

The Cougars went 2-0 last weekend with a sweep of Air Force on Friday, their ninth of the year, and a four-game win over Wyoming on Saturday in the Smith Fieldhouse. Chelsea Goodman led a balanced BYU attack against the Falcons with 10 kills and four aces as 11 Cougars saw action. Rachel Dyer led the way against the Cowgirls with 18 kills and 10 blocks to post her third career double-double. Goodman added 16 kills while Bryn Porter posted 15 and Ashton Hansen tallied a career-best 12 kills. Porter also threw in five aces.

BYU Top Performer of the Week - Rachel Dyer

BYU middle blocker Rachel Dyer was instrumental in BYU's two weekend victories, posting 3.86 kills and 1.86 blocks per game in seven total games. Against Air Force on Friday night, Dyer tied her career high with three aces while coming in second for the Cougars with nine kills on .471 hitting. The junior followed up that performance with an impressive outing against Wyoming on Saturday, pacing BYU with 18 kills on .571 hitting, the eighth time this year she has hit above .500 in a match. She also added 10 blocks on the night for her third double-double of the season, helping BYU outblock the Cowgirls, 17-7. On the year, Dyer leads the MWC and ranks among the top 10 in the nation in hitting percentage at .423 while ranking sixth in the league in blocks with 1.23.

Winning With Watson

BYU head coach Jason Watson has compiled an impressive 65-16 (.802) record in his two-plus seasons at the Cougar helm, including a 34-9 mark in the Mountain West Conference. Watson coached his team to the league title in 2005 while earning Coach of the Year honors and has led BYU to back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths. After a three-year absence prior to his hiring, Watson's teams have been ranked in 33 of 40 weekly AVCA Top 25 Coaches Polls, including a No. 9 ranking this season, the program's highest since 1999.

Battle To The Finish

BYU's matches this week at TCU and New Mexico will have lasting consequences in the MWC race as the Cougars are just one game ahead of both teams in the standings. With a 7-4 league record, BYU is currently in third place while TCU, New Mexico and Utah are locked in a tie for fourth place at 6-5. The Cougars will also be looking for a little payback against the Lobos as New Mexico has taken the last two matches, including a four-game win in Provo earlier this season.

Double the Fun

With 49 career double-doubles to date, Chelsea Goodman has set the Mountain West Conference record in that category, surpassing Wyoming's Michele Rauter, who had 47 from 2000-03. Goodman has recorded 15 double-doubles this season, including one in seven of the last eight, after posting an MWC-leading 18 double-doubles last year out of 29 matches in which she played. BYU's Erica Lott also appears on the active list with 23 double-doubles in her Cougar career, including six so far in 2007.

On The Road Again

BYU has played 12 of 21 matches on the road so far this season, going 8-4 in matches away from the Smith Fieldhouse. The Cougars played 10 of their first 14 matches on the road before the end of September, the most since 1997.

Measure of Success

The Cougars will be looking to break one trend this week and keep another alive as BYU is 0-3 this season on Thursdays and 7-0 on Fridays. The Cougars are also 9-0 this season when winning the first two games and 10-0 when attacking over .300. BYU is 14-1 when outperforming its opponents in kills and hitting percentage.

Comeback Kids

BYU has played six five-game matches this season, going 5-1 in those matches. Before losing to Colorado State in five games on Sept. 22, the Cougars had won four straight matches when forcing a fifth game after being down including at Weber State (down 1-2), at San Diego State (down 0-2) and at Iowa (down 0-2) this season and against UC Santa Barbara (down 0-2) in the 2006 NCAA Tournament first round. BYU is now 15-3 in five-game matches under head coach Jason Watson.

BYU In the Polls

The Cougars have not appeared in the Top 25 Coaches Poll for the last four weeks after being ranked every week since Sept. 12, 2005 (regular season). BYU began this season ranked No. 17. BYU has a rich history of rankings in the AVCA Top 25 Poll. Among NCAA Division I programs entering the 2007 season, the Cougars are 10th all-time in total number of weeks ranked (279) and 11th in weeks ranked in the top 10 (122) and weeks ranked No. 1 (4). The Cougars have also traditionally finished strong, coming in 10th all-time in both weeks ranked in the final poll (20) and weeks ranked in the top five to end the year (3) and tied for sixth in weeks ranked No. 1 in the final poll (1).

Rivals in the Rankings

Four Cougar opponents appear in this week's rankings. Wisconsin, whom the Cougars defeated in the Molten Classic, is ranked No. 7 while Stanford comes in at No. 5 and Cal Poly is No. 23 this week (both teams beat BYU in the Stanford Invitational). MWC rival Colorado State is ranked No. 20 while UNLV is receiving votes and listed 26th. BYU is 1-3 this season against ranked opponents.

The Nation's Best ...

The Cougars' 1,008-280-5 all-time record entering the week makes them one of the best teams in the nation, ranking fourth in all-time wins through Sunday's matches. UCLA tops the list with 1,053 victories while Missouri State ranks second at 1,026 and Nebraska is third at 1,018. The Cornhuskers passed up the Cougars at the end of 2006 with their six-match run to the NCAA Tournament title. The top 10 is rounded out by Long Beach St. (989), Penn State (962), Hawai'i (953), Texas (926), Minnesota (911) and Texas-Arlington (911).

Home Sweet Home

The Cougars have gone 7-2 in the Smith Fieldhouse this season and are averaging 1,507 fans, 19th in the nation, including the fourth-largest crowd in BYU women's volleyball history with 3,880 fans against No. 10 Wisconsin in the Cougars' home opener. The Cougars are now 467-84 (.848) all-time at home and 29-3 on Elaine Michaelis Court over the last three years.

Block Party

The Cougars had a block party at Utah on Oct. 12 to record their first win in Salt Lake City since 2000. BYU had 26.0 team blocks, fourth all-time in program history and tied for fourth in MWC history, while posting 52 block assists, third all-time in Cougar matches. Three Cougars posted double-figure rejections including Ashton Hansen, who tied her career high with 13, Rachel Dyer, who tied her career high with 12, and Chelsea Goodman, who doubled her previous personal best with 12 as part of her triple-double. Setter Amy Schlauder also tied her career best with seven blocks on the night.

BYU Reaches 1,000-Victory Mark

The BYU women's volleyball team celebrated a significant milestone on Sept. 15 as the Cougars became just the fourth program in NCAA volleyball history to record 1,000 wins. BYU's landmark 1,000th victory, which came at San Diego State, puts the Cougars in elite company with UCLA, Nebraska and Missouri State as the only programs to reach the 1,000-win mark. In the world of collegiate volleyball, few schools have a volleyball tradition as successful as the history of the sport at BYU, whose all-time record is now 1,006-279-5 (.782). In the 38 seasons of its recorded history prior to this year, the Cougars have only suffered one losing season and have won 20 or more matches in 31 of the past 33 seasons.

Sister Act

Balanced Effort Leads to Ninth Sweep

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 26, 2007) – The BYU women's volleyball team made quick work of Air Force Friday night as the Cougars recorded their ninth sweep of the season with a 30-19, 30-13, 30-15 victory in the Smith Fieldhouse. The win improves BYU's record to 14-6, including a 6-4 mark in the Mountain West Conference.

Goodman got the Cougars started to begin the match with a kill that found the back corner, the first of four straight BYU points. Air Force finally got on the board with a Cougar service error but did not record its first offensive point until putting down a kill to get to within six at 5-11. True freshmen Christina Measom and Christy Carpenter, who both received the starting nod from Watson, got on the board with kills for BYU's 16th and 17th points, respectively, helping the Cougars run out to a 20-11 lead. BYU eventually took the game, 30-19, with three of its last five points coming off the arm of Erica Lott.

Air Force kept it close early in game two until the serving of Cougar senior Jenna Judkins sparked a 5-0 BYU run to a 9-3 lead. A Cougar hitting error ended Judkins' stay at the service line, but then it was Lau's turn as she posted two aces during four straight BYU points to push the lead to 13-4. From there, it was all Cougars as they tied their most lopsided game victory of the season with a 30-13 win.

With their backs against the wall in game three, the Falcons came out firing and took their first lead of the match at 2-0 and again at 5-3. But a 6-0 run the other way sparked by two kills from senior Catherine Parker quickly had BYU up 9-5 and thinking sweep. Air Force stormed back to cut the lead to two points at 11-9, but the Cougars responded with a 10-2 spurt to go up 21-11. BYU never looked back while posting the 30-15 win.

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 27, 2007) -- BYU recorded its second victory in the Smith Fieldhouse in as many days as the Cougars defeated the Wyoming Cowgirls 24-30, 30-20, 20-28, 30-24 Saturday night. With the win, BYU improves to 15-6 overall and 7-4 in Mountain West Conference play.

The Cougars came out strong in game one, getting out to an early 12-7 lead before Wyoming scored five consecutive points to tie the score. Both teams struggled to string together back-to-back points, and Dyer's eight kills, including three consecutive scores, were not enough to give BYU the victory.

Game two was short and sweet, as the Cougars never trailed. Two early aces by Porter gave BYU a five-point lead, and later, Hansen's three kills put the Cougars up 24-17. A Wyoming blocking error gave the Cougars the win and tied the match.

In a third game that was tied 11 times, neither team was able to create a comfortable lead. The Cowgirls dominated the beginning of game three, scoring five consecutive points, bringing the score to 1-7. A Porter kill ended the BYU scoring drought and sparked a run that would tie the game, 8-8. The match was kept close by good offensive play from both teams, but the Cougars were able to clinch the win with yet another kill by Goodman.

The momentum continued to build for BYU in game four as the Cougars jumped out to an early 5-0 lead. However, the Cowgirls refused to give up and battled back to tie the score at 5-5. The Cougars steadily began to build a lead with growing support from the crowd. Fans roared when the 23rd BYU point came on an unconventional kick-assist from Annie Pinegar to Goodman.

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars began 2007 with an 88-28 regular-season record in eight years of MWC play after finishing second in 2006 with a 13-3 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and won again in 2005 with a 14-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively while Colorado State captured the 2003 title in San Diego and the 2004 crown on its home court. Utah won the 2005 title, and Colorado State took home the crown in 2006, both in Las Vegas.

Six of the nine MWC programs have competed in postseason action in the seven years since the league was formed. In 2006, three MWC teams earned NCAA bids, including BYU (at-large), Colorado State (automatic) and Utah (at-large). Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU, Colorado State and Utah have represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament each season. Overall, BYU has made 23 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 18, SDSU with 13, Utah with nine, New Mexico with seven and Wyoming with four.

So far in 2007, BYU is the only MWC team currently ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll, coming in at No. 12. Utah began the season ranked but is now receiving votes along with Colorado State

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .812.

JASON WATSON

HEAD WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL COACH

Jason Watson was named the head coach of BYU's women's volleyball program on Feb. 17, 2005 after serving for three years as an assistant with the team.

In his two seasons at the helm, he has compiled a 50-10 (.833) overall record while leading the Cougars to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and a return to the national rankings. He was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after posting a 25-4 record in his first season as a head coach and leading the Cougars to their first MWC regular-season title since 1999.

Prior to his head-coaching debut, Watson had 11 years of collegiate coaching experience as an assistant at four universities, including two seasons with the BYU men's volleyball program and three with BYU's women's program. After an All-American playing career at BYU, Watson coached two seasons under former U.S. Olympic coach and two-time NCAA Coach of the Year Carl McGown with the Cougars' men's squad in 1995-96. He returned to BYU in 2002 as an assistant head coach for the women's team under Karen Lamb.

Watson also served as the associate head coach at Kansas State in 2001 and as an assistant coach in 2000, where he helped guide the Wildcats to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths.

Before that, Watson spent two years at Arkansas State during which the Lady Indians won consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles. Watson began his women's volleyball coaching career with a two-year stint at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to their best record in almost 15 years.

Overall, Watson has directed or assisted in taking teams to the NCAA Tournament in six of the last eight seasons. In addition to his 50-10 (.833) head-coaching record, Watson's team's compiled a 185-97 (.656) record in his nine years as an NCAA women's volleyball assistant coach. Watson is only the fourth head coach in BYU women's volleyball history, joining JoAnn Calderwood (1956-61), Hall of Fame coach Elaine Michaelis (1962-2001) and Lamb (2002-04).

COACHING CAREER

Watson was honored as the 2005 MWC Coach of the Year in his first season as a head coach, becoming the first BYU women's volleyball head coach to win a league coaching award since Elaine Michaelis won Western Athletic Conference Mountain Division honors in 1997. Under Watson, the Cougars won the league regular-season title for the first time since 1999. BYU's 25-4 overall record in Watson's first year was its best since 1998, and the Cougars' 20-0 start to the season was the second-best in school history. The winning trend continued in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second-round NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cougars finished the year ranked No. 20 in the nation, their first final national ranking since 2001.

Watson's Cougars were ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation during the 2005 season, finishing listed No. 26, and were invited to their 22nd NCAA Tournament. The MWC regular-season champions led the league and were 17th in the nation in hitting percentage (.274) as well as pacing the conference in kills with 16.09 per game.

In Watson's offense, three-time All-MWC setter Lauren Richards Evans finished 19th in the nation and third all-time at BYU with 13.12 assists per game while middle blocker and MWC Player of the Year Lindsay Hartssock was second in the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark. Both received AVCA All-America Honorable Mention recognition.



In his three years as an assistant at BYU in charge of the Cougar defense, Watson quickly established BYU as a top defensive squad. The Cougars led the MWC and were 13th and fifth in the nation in blocks per game in 2003 and 2004, respectively. BYU also led the MWC in digs in 2003 with 1,729, the most the Cougars had put up since 1997. Hartssock was named the 2004 Blocker of the Year by Collegiate Volleyball Update and finished second in the nation averaging 1.86 blocks per game in 2004 while libero Uila Crabbe set BYU and MWC single-season records in digs with 435 in 2003 under Watson's direction.

At Kansas State, Watson helped the Wildcats earn back-to-back top-three finishes in the Big 12 Conference and consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament while achieving a 42-17 (.712) overall record and 29-11 (.725) mark in the Big 12. Coaching the setters and coordinating the offense, Watson established a powerful attack that produced several team and individual records.

Also in 2001, with Watson serving as associate head coach, KSU broke the school record for conference wins with a 15-5 mark and swept the season series with a school-best six league opponents. Two players earned All-Big 12 honors and one honorable-mention All-America recognition as school records were broken for kills, total attacks and 20-kill matches. KSU also earned the right to host the NCAA first and second rounds for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams and for only the second time in the school's history. In 2000, Watson helped guide an offense that set the school record with 2,024 kills and totaled 1,828 assists (No. 2 in school history at the time), 4,864 total attacks (No. 3 in school history) and a .245 team hitting percentage (No. 4 in school history). Under Watson's tutelage, setter Disney Bronnenberg finished second nationally in assists, averaging 15.01 assists per game.

Prior to his time at KSU, Watson helped Arkansas State advance to the NCAA Tournament in 1999 after winning consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles in 1998 and 1999. He helped the Lady Indians post a 51-18 (.739) record and coached a number of all-league performers, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Jessica Barney, who led the league in assists with 1,457 in 1999. Watson was responsible for the team's offensive schemes and setter training while coordinating the program's recruiting efforts. Watson spent two seasons as an assistant at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to a 35-24 (.593) record. In 1997, the Bobcats finished 19-12, the program's best mark since 1983. In 1996, the team went 16-12 and made its first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance.

PLAYING CAREER

As a player, Watson was a four-year starter and two-time captain from 1990-94 as the BYU men's program grew from its infancy to a national power. After a 2-25 season in the program's second year as an NCAA sport, the Cougars achieved a 21-6 record and No. 2 national ranking in Watson's senior season in 1994. Watson is still BYU's all-time assist leader with 4,649 and single-game assist record holder with 128 against Hawai'i on March 27, 1993. He was named a second-team American Volleyball Coaches Association All-American, Volleyball Magazine honorable-mention All-American and a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Third Team in 1994. He was a member of the Australian Men's National Team from 1990-91 and a member of the Junior National Team from 1987-90.

PERSONAL

A physical education and sports business management graduate of BYU in 1995, Watson is a native of Homebush, Australia. He and his wife, Larissa, have two sons and one daughter.

2006 SEASON REVIEW

The No. 20 BYU women's volleyball team continued its tradition of excellence in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second round NCAA Tournament appearance.

"I'm pleased with the progress we made this year," said BYU head coach Jason Watson, whose teams have gone 50-10 in his two years at the helm. "The season we were able to put together this year was representative of the direction we want the program to go. We feel like we have work to do, but we are going to get better."

The Cougars finished in second place in the Mountain West Conference with a 13-3 league record and spent the season ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Poll, ending the year at No. 20 after making their 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance in the 26-year history of the Championship. The Smith Fieldhouse once again proved to be a dominant homecourt advantage as BYU went 12-1 on Elaine Michaelis Court during 2006 while setting a program attendance record with an average crowd of 1,902.

Injuries plagued the Cougars throughout the year as the team played 13 matches without the services of all of their starters. Sophomore setter Amy Schlauder sat out eight matches with a broken finger while junior rightside hitter Erica Lott missed two contests and sophomore middle blocker Rachel Dyer was unavailable on five occasions due to injury. However, despite going more than a month without their full starting rotation, the Cougars rallied around their teammates as several players stepped up and made the most of their playing opportunities, ensuring continued success.

BYU began the year taking consecutive tournament titles with three sweeps at the UCF Fall Invitational followed by a win over then-No. 4 Stanford, the eventual national runner-up, in Provo the next weekend in front of a record crowd of 4,050 while earning the BYU Molten Classic crown. The Cougars then took their 6-0 record on the road to the Jayhawk Invitational where they suffered their first defeat of the season against host Kansas after Schlauder broke her finger in the first game. But BYU bounced back the next day to beat Arkansas behind the play of back-up setter Jenna Judkins, who paced the Cougars to a 7-1 record in Schlauder's absence while leading the MWC in assists during her stint at the net.

After going 8-1 prior to starting league play, BYU won its first four conference matches, including its first home win over Colorado State since 2000. Without the services of Schlauder or Lott, however, the Cougars then suffered their only home loss of the year to in-state rival Utah in front of another record-breaking crowd of 4,455. But the loss was quickly forgotten with a seven-match winning streak, including four sweeps, that saw the Cougars improve to 19-2 overall and rise as high as No. 16 in the nation.

Unfortunately, BYU's winning streak came to an end when the Cougars suffered their only back-to-back defeats of the year at then-No. 9 Utah and at New Mexico. But BYU rebounded with five straight wins to end the regular season. As part of the run, the Cougars beat the Rams in Fort Collins, Colo., to complete the season sweep of CSU for the first time since 1995.

Postseason play did not begin as the Cougars hoped with an early exit from the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas, but the time off prepared BYU for a tough first round NCAA Tournament matchup against UC Santa Barbara in Los Angeles. The Cougars completed an incredible comeback from two games down to earn the five-game win behind the strength of Annie Kemp Pinegar's record-setting 42 digs, breaking the 22-year-old BYU mark. However, BYU could overcome host USC the following night, falling to the No. 6 Trojans to end the season with a 25-6 record.

In addition to being ranked No. 20 in the nation as a team to end the year, the Cougars finished 16th nationally in hitting percentage (.269), 24th in win/loss percentage (.806) and 33rd in blocks per game (2.96). Several individuals also excelled as Cougars led the MWC in four of the seven statistical categories tracked by the league including hitting percentage (Lindsay Hartsock), kills (Chelsea Goodman), assists (Schlauder) and points (Goodman). Hartsock ranked 17th nationally in hitting with a .389 mark while Schlauder ranked 24th in assists per game at 13.15 and Goodman was 43rd in the nation with 4.49 kills per game.
