

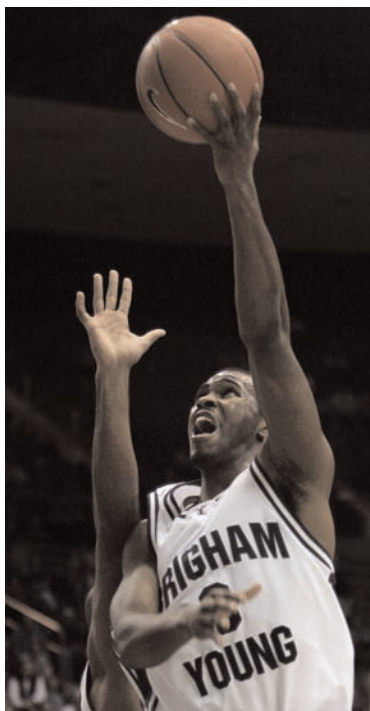

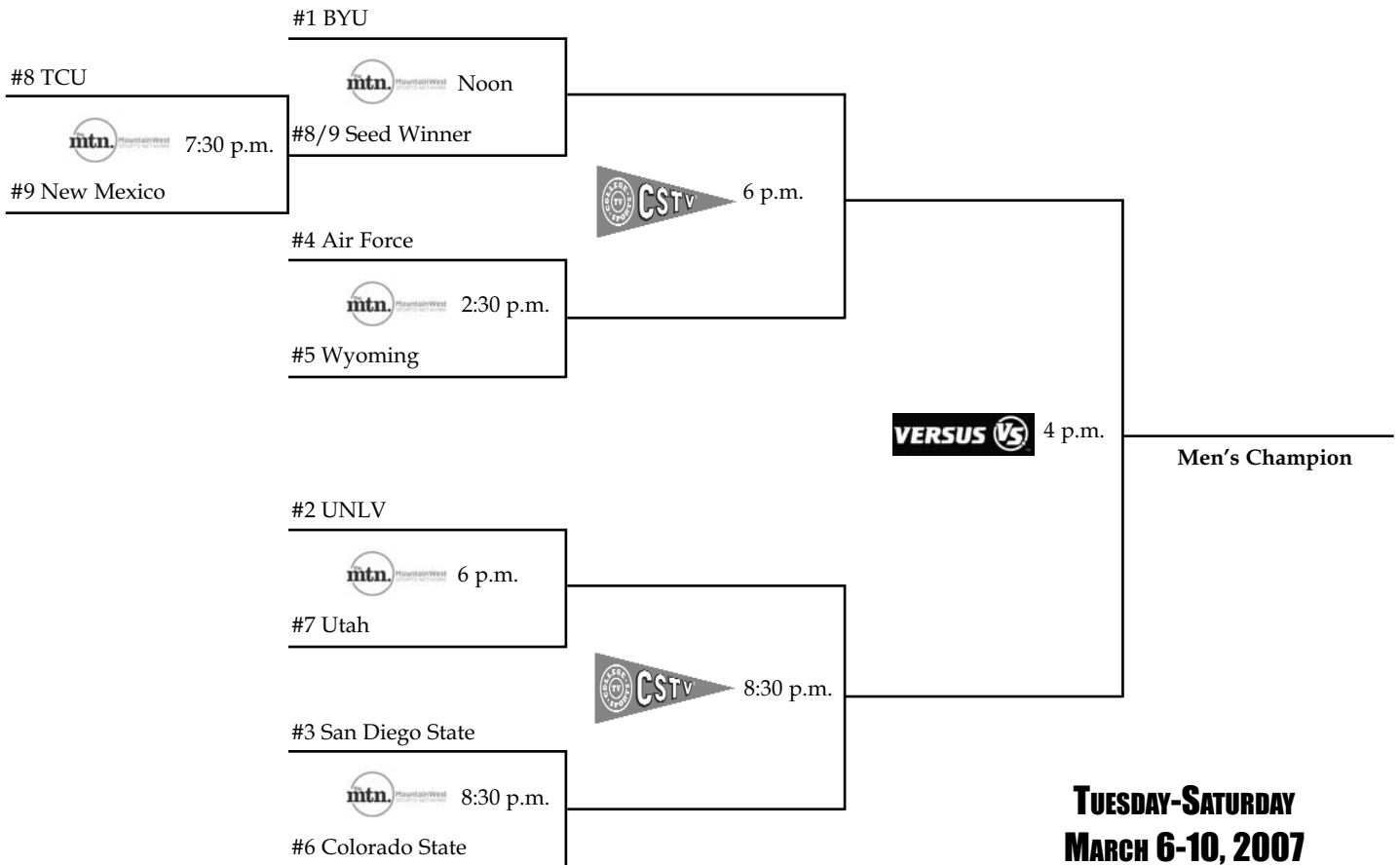

NO. 23 BYU OPENS MWC QUARTERFINALS THURSDAY AT NOON

As the No. 1 seed, No. 23 BYU (23-7, 13-3 MWC) will play in the Mountain West Conference quarterfinals on Thursday at noon PT (1 p.m. MT) against the winner of Tuesday's play-in game between No. 8-seed TCU (12-16, 4-12 MWC) and No. 9-seed New Mexico (15-16, 4-12 MWC) and The game, which will be played at UNLV's Thomas & Mack Center; will be televised on the mtn. and can be heard live on the radio beginning with the pregame show at 11 a.m. PT (12 p.m. MT) on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at KSL.com. The Cougars earned the top seed in the MWC Tournament after winning their first regular-season outright title since 1987-88. They have won 18 of their last 21 games and are coming off an 85-62 win over Utah on Saturday to conclude the regular season.

UP NEXT

If BYU wins, the Cougars will advance to the MWC semifinals and play the winner of Thursday's second quarterfinal between fourth-seeded Air Force and fifth-seeded Wyoming. BYU's semifinal game will be Friday at 6 p.m. and will be televised nationally on CSTV.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

- BYU won its first outright league title since 1987-88 with a 13-3 MWC record this season.
- Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose is 43-16 overall at BYU and 25-7 in MWC play.
- The Cougars are ranked No. 23 in both the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 Poll and the AP Top 25 Poll. BYU entered the national rankings on Feb. 19 for the first time since 1993 at No. 21 in the AP Top 25 rankings and No. 22 in the Coaches Poll. Previously, BYU was last ranked on March 8, 1993 at No. 25 (AP).
- Coming off a win over Utah on Saturday, BYU has won 10 of its last 11 games, including three wins over ranked teams. BYU currently owns the nation's longest active home winning streak (31 games).
- MWC Player of the Year Keena Young leads BYU this year in scoring (17.1) and rebounding (6.2). All-MWC Second Team selection Trent Plaisted is second on the boards (6.1) and in scoring (12.2), while All-MWC honorable mention recipient senior Austin Ainge leads BYU with 4.27 assists per game.
- The Cougars lead the MWC in scoring (77.8), rebounding average (37.0), rebounding margin (+5.8) and assists (16.2) in overall play. In league games, in addition to finishing first in the standings, BYU led the conference in scoring (78.9), scoring margin (+9.7), field-goal percentage (.516), three-point shooting (.457), assists (16.75) and assist/turnover ratio (1.32).
- BYU has an RPI rating of 20 in the various RPI rankings. BYU is ranked No. 8 in the nation in three-point shooting, No. 20 in field-goal percentage, No. 25 in rebound margin, No. 29 in scoring and No. 30 in scoring margin.
- The Cougars are 17-0 at home this season, 6-6 on the road and 0-1 on a neutral court.

MEDIA INTERVIEWS

All interviews with BYU players or coaches must be scheduled through a BYU Athletic Communications contact. Postgame interviews will take place as noted below. Other interview requests, such as live television shots after a game, should be arranged in advance through a BYU Athletic Communications contact.

WEDNESDAY MEDIA AVAILABILITY

BYU will be conducting interviews with the mtn./CSTV on Wednesday from 5:30-6 p.m. at the Thomas & Mack Center. Other interviews can be conducted after that time in the main tunnel opposite Cox Arena.

PRACTICE SESSIONS

Per MWC Tournament policy, all practices will be closed to the public and media (including print or electronic media that may be traveling with the team). The producer, director and on-air talent from the mtn., CSTV, VERSUS and the MWC radio network will be allowed to watch the closed practice sessions. BYU will not practice at Cox Arena on Wednesday.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

LIVE RIGHTSHOLDERS: If requested, the winning coach, losing coach and winning student-athletes shall grant postgame interviews, not to exceed three minutes, to the Mtn., CSTV, VERSUS and the MWC radio network provided the network is still providing live coverage from the facility. The media coordinator will be responsible for terminating the three-minute interview period, not the television or radio network. If television or radio does not terminate the interview on time, they will not be granted live postgame interviews for the remainder of the tournament. Coaches and student-athletes who are not being interviewed by the Mtn., CSTV, VERSUS or the MWC radio network may conduct interviews with the institution's radio network. These interviews may not exceed two minutes. The Mtn., CSTV, VERSUS will have the first choice of individuals to interview, then the MWC radio network, then the institution's network. Additionally, the head coach has the option of conducting an interview with the institution's radio network—at the network's court-side seating location—during a two-minute period after the conclusion of the initial three-minute period. The networks cannot inordinately delay the coaches' and student-athletes' return to the locker room. If the networks are not prepared to conduct live interviews immediately, it will be necessary for the interviews to be taped.

POSTGAME PRESS CONFERENCE: A minimum of two BYU players will attend the postgame press conference with BYU coach Dave Rose. The winning team's coach and players will be scheduled in the interview room first, then the losing team. After the championship game, the losing team will be scheduled first.

OPEN LOCKER ROOM: On game days, locker rooms will be open to the media for a minimum of 30 minutes after the cooling-off period ends, provided media representatives are present the entire time. Student-athletes who do not play in the game may depart earlier. All interviews at the facility must occur in the media interview room or locker room area. Regardless of any regular-season radio or television contracts, Coach Rose is first obligated to the entire media staffing the tournament and will report to the interview room for the postgame press conference as scheduled.

COOLING-OFF PERIOD: A "cooling-off period" has been established per NCAA rules for a coach to be with the student-athletes in the locker room after the game. The period begins when the coach enters the locker room immediately after the game or interview with the Mtn., CSTV, VERSUS, the MWC radio network and/or the institution's radio network. The period will be 10 minutes for the winning team before the locker room is open to media; 15 minutes for the losing team. A coach may shorten the cooling-off period, but may not extend it. If coaches or student-athletes conduct live postgame interviews, the waiting period could be extended from 15 up to 25 minutes for the losing team. In this instance, the losing team would have the option of opening the locker room sooner, keeping in mind that the press conference would take precedence and once the coach and student-athletes are requested to depart to the press conference, any current locker room interviews would be interrupted. Except for the Mtn., CSTV, VERSUS, MWC radio network and institutional radio personnel as noted above, no interviews may take place during the cooling-off period.

PHONE INTERVIEWS: Neither coaches nor student-athletes may conduct interviews via telephone until 30 minutes after the cooling-off period ends, or until after their postgame obligations to all media have been met, whichever comes later.

MEDIA SERVICES

Statistics, notes and quotes will be made available in the media work room after each game. Wireless internet will be provided free of charge to all accredited media. Updated cumulative statistics and a full notes update will be provided the day of the game for each game BYU advances in the MWC Tournament.

IN THE EIGHT YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had six 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. To date, Utah has had five, UNLV four; Air Force, Wyoming and San Diego State three and New Mexico two.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second twice (including current RPI ratings) and third on three occasions. The Cougars were third last year (67) behind Air Force (50) and San Diego State (56).
- BYU has played the toughest schedule on average of any team in the MWC (BYU's average strength of schedule rating the first seven years the MWC was 66, followed by Utah at 78). So far this year, BYU's schedule is rated third behind Utah and UNLV. BYU had the league's toughest schedule in two of the previous three seasons.
- BYU has the second-most overall wins (160, Utah leads at 166).
- BYU is also second in conference wins (73, Utah has 75).
- BYU has the second-most MWC regular-season titles (three). Utah leads with four.
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

BYU IN THE TOURNAMENT

The Cougars have a 7-6 Mountain West Conference Tournament record. BYU advanced to the finals in the first two years of the MWC Tournament, winning the title over UNM in 2001 after losing to host UNLV in 2000. BYU has won its quarterfinals game in four of the seven MWC Tournaments but has failed to advance to the semifinals in the past two seasons. BYU has a 2-2 semifinals record and 1-1 finals record in MWC Tournament play. During the four previous years the MWC Tournament was played in Las Vegas (2000-2003), BYU posted a 6-3 tournament record, with two finals appearances and one title (2001). The Cougars won their quarterfinals matchup every year but one, losing to eventual-champion San Diego State in 2002. BYU had a 1-3 tournament record during the past three years when the championship was conducted in Denver. Overall, BYU has a 19-19 record in conference tournament games, which includes a 12-13 record in WAC Tournament games. BYU has played every MWC team except second-year member TCU in the MWC Tournament. BYU did face TCU in the 1999 WAC Tournament, recording a 90-74 upset.

MWC TITLE GOES THROUGH BYU

If the first six years of the Mountain West Tournament, BYU or the team that has knocked the Cougars out of the tournament won the title. Last year was the first time that trend did not continue as San Diego State won the title after BYU was knocked out by Utah in the quarterfinals. After losing in the title game to host UNLV at the inaugural MWC Tournament in 2000, BYU won the title in 2001. The next four years the Cougars were knocked out by the eventual champion. BYU was defeated by San Diego State in the 2002 quarterfinals before back-to-back semifinal losses to 2003-champion Colorado State and 2004-champion Utah. In 2005, New Mexico went on to win the title after defeating BYU in the quarterfinals.

SEVEN MWC TOURNAMENTS, SIX DIFFERENT CHAMPIONS

San Diego State became the first team in the MWC to win the Tournament title twice with its victories in 2002 and 2006. New Mexico's win in 2005 marked the sixth Tournament winner in the first six years of the event. The only teams not to win an MWC title are Wyoming, Air Force and TCU, who made its MWC debut last season.

BYU SEEDS AT MWC TOURNAMENT

BYU is the MWC Tournament's No. 1 seed for the first time. BYU has been the second seed three times (5-2 combined record in 2001, 2003 and 2004, including 2001 title). The 2006 Tournament was the first time the Cougars have been the No. 3 seed in the MWC Tournament (first-round loss to Utah). The Cougars have also been the fourth seed once (suffering a first-round exit with loss to eventual-champion San Diego State in 2002), the sixth seed once (advanced to the finals in 2000) and the No. 7 seed once (2005 first-round loss to eventual-champion New Mexico).

FRUITS OF THE SEEDS

In the first seven years of the MWC Tournament, the teams with the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds boast the best overall record as each has recorded a 10-5 mark. The No. 4 teams have gone 8-7. The No. 6 seeds have a combined 7-6 record while their first-round opponent No. 3 seeds have a 6-6 record. Fifth-seeded teams are 4-6. The No. 8 seed has a 1-0 record in play-in games and a 2-6 record overall. The No. 9 seed is 0-1 in the play-in game after the MWC's first season with nine teams. The No. 7 team won for the first time in 2006 and now has a 2-7 record. Last season marked the first time the No. 7 seed has advanced past the first round and the first time neither the No. 2 nor No. 3 seed advanced to the semifinals. The Tournament title has been won by the top seed twice (UNLV in 2000 and San Diego State in 2006); the second seed twice (BYU in 2001 and New Mexico in 2005); the third seed once (Utah in 2004); the fifth seed once (San Diego State in 2002); and the sixth seed once (Colorado State in 2004).

BYU TOURNAMENT TITLES

BYU won the MWC Tournament title in 2001. BYU won WAC Tournament titles in 1991 and 1992. The Cougars' Kevin Nixon hit a dramatic three-quarter-court shot at the buzzer to defeat UTEP, 73-71, in Fort Collins, Colo., for the 1992 title. BYU won its first WAC Tournament title in 1991 with an overtime win over Utah. The Cougars also won the postseason conference playoff series in the Rocky Mountain Conference in 1924 (defeated Colorado College, 2-1) and 1933 (defeated Wyoming, 2-1).

BYU'S SEES SIX HONORED WITH MWC ACCOLADES

The Mountain West Conference announced its 2006-07 men's basketball awards Monday. The league's nine men's head coaches along with selected media picked the all-conference teams, as well as the coach, player, freshman and defensive awards. BYU head coach **Dave Rose** captured Coach of the Year honors for the second straight year, while Cougar **Keena Young** was selected as the Player of the Year. BYU also brought home Freshman of the Year honors as **Jonathan Tavernari** earned the award, while UNLV's Joel Anthony was named Defensive Player of the Year. In addition to the four major awards, three All-MWC teams were announced as Young was named to the All-MWC First Team, **Trent Plaisted** received second-team honors and **Lee Cummard** was honored with a third-team selection. Cougar **Austin Ainge** received honorable mention. In all, BYU, Air Force and San Diego State each had four players recognized followed by UNLV and New Mexico with three and TCU, Utah, Wyoming and Colorado State with two.

DAVE ROSE — MWC COACH OF THE YEAR

- Became the first Cougar head coach to earn back-to-back league Coach of the Year honors including his selection last year
- Has guided BYU to consecutive 20-win seasons and the program's first national ranking since 1993
- With a 13-3 MWC record, BYU earned its first outright regular-season league championship since 1987-88
- The Cougars' current 23-7 overall record makes them just the sixth team in BYU history to record at least 23 regular-season wins
- With a 25-7 record in Mountain West Conference games since taking the helm of the BYU program for the 2005-06 season, Rose is currently the winningest MWC coach in league play in the past two years
- BYU set or tied eight different MWC records this season

KEENA YOUNG — MWC PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- Became just the seventh player in BYU history to earn conference player of the year honors, joining John Fairchild (1964-65), Danny Ainge (1980-81), Devin Durrant (1982-83), Timo Saarelainen (1984-85), Michael Smith (1987-88), Mekeli Wesley (2000-01) and Rafael Araujo (2003-04)
- BYU's leading scorer (17.5 ppg) and rebounder (5.5 rpg) in conference play
- MWC Co-Player of the Week (Feb. 12)
- Ranked among the top 10 in the MWC in three statistical categories including scoring (fourth - 17.5 ppg), field-goal percentage (seventh - .557) and free-throw percentage (ninth - .800)
- Topped the 20-point scoring mark six times in league play including 29-point outings in each of BYU's two games against Wyoming, the most points scored by a Cougar since Dec. 6, 2003 (Rafael Araujo - 32 pts)
- Led BYU in scoring seven times and rebounding five times in league action, including posting one double-double, while shooting above .600 from the field in conference play six times.

JONATHAN TAVERNARI — MWC FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

- Played in all 16 of BYU's league games, averaging 13.9 minutes per game, 8.3 ppg and 3.2 rpg while shooting .552 from the field, .451 on three-pointers and .737 from the free-throw line in MWC play
- Was the top-scoring freshman in the MWC
- Scored in double figures in five outings, including a career-high 18 points three times
- Shot .500 or above from the field nine times and from three-point range five times
- Made his first six three-point shots against TCU, tying the BYU record for most consecutive three-pointers made in a single game, before missing his final attempt while adding 18 points
- His .857 three-point percentage (6-for-7) against TCU set an MWC freshman record

TRENT PLAISTED — ALL-MWC SECOND TEAM

- As BYU's second-leading scorer (12.9 ppg) and rebounder (5.1 rpg) in conference play, Plaisted started all 16 conference games, scoring in double figures in 12 of them
- MWC Co-Player of the Week honoree (Jan. 29)
- Ranked among the top 15 in the MWC in four statistical categories in league play including field-goal percentage (sixth - .563), blocks (tied for fifth - 1.50), offensive rebounds (ninth - 2.25) and scoring (14th - 12.9 ppg)

LOOKING AT TCU

TCU (12-16, 4-12) is the No. 8 seed and will face No. 9-seed New Mexico Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. PT at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas. The Horned Frogs started league play 2-0 before suffering an 11-game losing skid started with a loss at BYU on Jan. 10. TCU rebounded to win two of its final three games with home wins over nationally ranked Air Force (71-66) and Wyoming (77-58) before a close road defeat at San Diego State (56-51) on Saturday. TCU has two starters and five letterwinners from last season's 6-25 team that won just two MWC games. Entering Tuesday's game, the Horned Frogs have two players scoring in double figures this year led by University of California transfer Kevin Langford at 13.1 points per game. The 6-foot-8 sophomore forward adds 5.7 rebounds per game, second on the team, and has posted 22 blocks on the year. Junior guard Brent Hackett also scores in double figures with 11.1 ppg to go along with 2.0 rpg and 1.8 assists per contest. The Horned Frog rebounding effort is paced by junior forward Alvarado Parker and junior guard Neiman Owens at 6.0 ppg. Parker also adds 9.1 ppg and is third in the MWC in blocked shots with 61 on the year; 2.1 per game. Senior Neil P. Dougherty, the son of TCU head coach Neil Dougherty, runs the point for the Horned Frogs and averages 2.6 assists per game. As a team, TCU averages 63.1 ppg on .413 shooting from the field, including a .332 mark from three-point range, while allowing opponents to score 66.9 ppg on .440 shooting from the floor. The Horned Frogs outrebound their opponents 34.2-33.9. Head coach Neil Dougherty is in his fifth year at the helm of the TCU program with a 60-91 overall record.

TCU'S LAST OUTING — TCU DROPS CLOSE FINALE AT SDSU

SAN DIEGO – Mohamed Abukar converted a 3-point play late in the game to lift San Diego State to a 56-51 victory over TCU on Saturday. San Diego State (21-9, 10-6 Mountain West) also got two big baskets on consecutive possessions from Brandon Heath and Richie Williams. Heath hit a 15-foot jumper and Williams followed with a 3-pointer for a 51-48 lead with 4:47 left in the game. Abukar's basket came after he rebounded an air ball by Heath, scored the putback, and was fouled. He made the free throw for a 54-51 lead with 1:38 remaining in the team's last regular season game. Abukar also made two free throws with 1.1 seconds left to secure the victory after Neil Dougherty missed an open 3-point shot with 4 seconds left that would have tied the game. San Diego State, the conference's defending regular-season and tournament champion, won despite shooting just 32.8 percent. Heath, the Aztecs' leading scorer at 19.4 points, made just 5 of 18 shots as he scored 12 points. Abukar, averaging 16.1 points, hit four of 17 from the field and also finished with 12 points. Brent Hackett, led TCU (12-16, 4-12) with 16 points, including four 3-pointers.

SERIES NOTES

The Cougars and Horned Frogs have met just 11 times in the history of the two programs with BYU owning an 8-3 series lead including an 89-65 win in Provo and 85-72 victory in Fort Worth this season. The series began with three straight Cougar victories, two in 1953 and one in 1960, before TCU was able to win three straight from 1985 to 1997. The two teams next met in the first round of the 1999 WAC Tournament in Las Vegas when BYU recorded a 90-74 win, the first of five straight for the Cougars. Last season, the two schools met as members of the Mountain West Conference for the first time with BYU coming away with an 89-80 overtime win in the Marriott Center and then winning 81-72 at TCU. The Cougars are 5-1 against the Horned Frogs in Provo, 2-1 in Fort Worth and 1-1 on a neutral court.

FIRST OUTING IN PROVO — HOT SHOOTING LIFTS COUGARS OVER HORNED FROGS

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 10, 2007) – The BYU men's basketball team tied a program record by hitting 14 three-pointers on the way to defeating TCU Wednesday night, 89-65. The Cougars improved to 12-4 (2-0 MWC) on the season while TCU falls to 10-5 (2-1 MWC). The win was BYU's 25th consecutive victory at home, which is tied for the second-longest streak active win streak in the nation. BYU was led by starting point guard Austin Ainge and freshman Jonathan Tavernari as they combined for 38 points and together shot 11-for-14 from three-point land. BYU set the up-tempo pace early on running TCU up and down the court. The Cougars converted on eight of their first 10 possessions and were led by Ainge's eight points during that run. BYU took a 17-5 advantage early on by forcing seven Horned Frog turnovers. TCU found out how difficult it is to win in Provo as the Horned Frogs trailed the Cougars 24-10 midway through the first half. Senior guard Mike Rose came off the bench to lift the Cougars by burying a deep three and nailing a mid-range jumper. Rose ended the night with 11 points. Aside from BYU's stellar shooting the Cougars' defensive pressure seemed to be too much for the Horned Frogs to handle as BYU held TCU to .241 shooting in the half. Tavernari gave the Cougars huge minutes off the bench blasting back-to-back triples to give BYU its biggest lead of the half, 33-17, with six minutes left. Rose ended the half with his hot shooting as he connected on a three-point play and hit a three as time expired to put BYU up 48-25. BYU came out of the locker room ready to end any sort of TCU comeback with a balanced offensive attack. Ainge and Jimmy Balderson hit from the outside while Trent Plaisted and Keena Young pounded the Horned Frogs down low. Though TCU allowed only one of the Cougar starters to score in double figures, the Horned Frogs had problems all night defending players that came off the BYU bench. Later in the second half Tavernari got all 10,806 fans in the Marriott Center screaming as he drilled back-to-back threes. His 18 points on 6-of-7 shooting was a career high. Ainge then decided to answer Tavernari's hot shooting by hitting back-to-back threes himself. Ainge's 20 points on the night was a season high and helped improve the Cougars' current win streak to seven games, the longest streak since the 2003-04 season.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

- "I think our guys responded really well to a unique style of play. We shot the ball really well."
- "We got started well. Austin (Ainge) got some big shots and gave us some confidence and a little bit of a lead early on."
- "The whole thing with Jonathan (Tavernari) is patience. He really gave our team a lift."
- "TCU was really physical, coming at us and contesting our shots. They're playing really well."
- "The whole situation in the last day or two was about opportunities, and I think Austin (Ainge) took advantage of his opportunity. I've got a lot of confidence in our players."
- "Now well go out and try to initiate some pressure during these next few games."

TCU Head Coach Neil Dougherty

- "My hat is off to what they did tonight. They had an unbelievable night offensively."
- "I like our guys. We had a lot going on over there on the bench with Kevin (Langford) in foul trouble and Alvarado Parker with the knee trouble combined with a very good BYU team to deal with."
- "I know that our team is better. The conference is better. What I don't know yet is if our team has grown as much as the conference, and that is what we are trying to figure out."
- "The way they shot we may have had seven fouls apiece and still been up the creek."
- "We missed a lot of shots that could have sustained us offensively in the first half. We missed four or five shots around the rim, and that extra eight or ten points would have given us a much-needed boost."

- BYU's win over TCU extended its home winning streak to 25 games, which is now tied for the second-longest active home victory streak in the nation combined with a Connecticut home loss on Wednesday night. The Cougars are 11-0 at home this season.
- With seven straight victories over Utah State, Western Oregon, Liberty, Oral Roberts, Seton Hall, SDSU and TCU, the Cougars are enjoying their longest winning streak since winning nine straight games during the 2003-04 season.
- BYU's 24-point win (89-65) marked its largest margin of victory in MWC play since a 29-point win (82-53) on Jan. 17, 2004 against Colorado State.

- Ainge made an immediate impact in his first start since Dec. 13, scoring eight of BYU's first 17 points on 3-for-3 shooting from the field, including two three-pointers, to help the Cougars jump out to a 17-5 lead. Ainge scored 11 first-half points on 4-for-5 shooting, the second time this season he has reached double digits before the half. Ainge finished the game with a season-high 20 points on 7-for-9 shooting from the field including a 5-for-7 mark from three-point range.
- Vuk Ivanovic's bucket at the 9:21 mark of the first half marked his first points since scoring 10 on Dec. 22 against Western Oregon.
- Ben Murdock also made the most out of his seven first-half minutes, scoring at the 3:28 mark for the first time since Western Oregon.

THIS YEAR IN FORT WORTH — BYU CONTINUES WIN STREAK WITH VICTORY AT TCU

FORT WORTH, Texas (Feb. 10, 2007) – The Cougars maintained their hold on the top spot in the Mountain West Conference Saturday night with an 85-72 win over the TCU Horned Frogs in Fort Worth, Texas. The win, BYU's sixth straight overall and fourth consecutive on the road, improves the Cougars to 19-6 on the season and 9-2 in MWC play. BYU was led by Keena Young with 25 points, the third time in the last four games he has topped the 20-point mark. Lee Cummard and Trent Plaisted also scored in double figures with 16 and 11 points, respectively, while Cummard paced the Cougars on the boards with seven rebounds. Cummard's 7-for-9 shooting performance helped BYU shoot a season-high .615 (32-for-52) from the field. TCU scored the first bucket of the game with a three-pointer on the next possession, but Plaisted took control with back-to-back makes to spark a 9-0 Cougar run, including a jumper from Austin Ainge and a long-range bucket from Cummard. After falling behind 11-3, the Horned Frogs put together a 10-0 run to take a 13-11 lead. Cummard stopped the bleeding for the Cougars with a one-handed tip and then tied the game again off an assist from Ben Murdock after a TCU score. BYU got some bad news when Plaisted was forced to check out at the 13:03 mark with two fouls, but Young made up the difference in the post with three straight makes to put the Cougars up 21-15. TCU's Alvaro Parker ended the 6-0 Young run, but Mike Rose drained a three-pointer off a long pass from Jimmy Balderson to extend the BYU advantage to 24-17 with 9:51 left in the half. A three-point play from TCU followed by a layin on the next Horned Frog possession cut the lead to two at 24-22, but BYU's bench came up big with a drive and score from Jonathan Tavernari and a Vuk Ivanovic layin. Back-to-back makes from Cummard pushed the BYU advantage to 32-22. TCU's Brent Hackett ended the 8-0 Cougar run with a jumper at the 4:13 mark but was answered by Young, who reached double digits at 10 points with the layin. The Cougar dominance continued as they built a 41-29 half-time lead while holding the Horned Frogs to just three buckets in the last 8:32 of the period. Plaisted returned to the game in the second half to record a three-point play on the first Cougar possession, but a 5-0 TCU spurt cut the lead back to 10 points at 44-34. Cummard continued his hot shooting with his sixth make in seven tries. However, Plaisted's luck ran out just seconds later as he picked up his fourth foul at the 16:38 mark and was forced to once again ride the pine. The two teams traded scores to a 49-38 Cougar lead until Murdock took a pass from Cummard and drained an open three-pointer and then answered a TCU score with a layin to put BYU up 54-40. Despite shooting percentages hovering around or above 50 percent for both teams, neither could find the basket from the floor over the next two minutes as TCU settled for two points from the free-throw line and BYU recorded three. Tavernari finally ended the drought with a three-point make at the 12:43 mark to give the Cougars a 59-42 lead. BYU continued to maintain a double-digit advantage over the next several minutes thanks in part to its bench play and despite continual pressure from TCU, who refused to go without a fight. The Horned Frogs kept the Cougars shy of a blowout with clutch free-throw shooting, making six of seven over a two-minute period despite being held without a bucket from the field to keep the BYU lead at 12 points, 65-53. After withstanding the TCU spurt, the Cougars put together a 10-4 run of their own to take a 75-57 lead and all but put the game away with just over four minutes remaining. A flurry of three-pointers from the Horned Frogs proved too little too late as BYU recorded the 85-72 win.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

- "I'm really proud of our guys. This is a tough team to play against, especially here in this building. They get so many runs going. All the games that have been played in here have been close."
- "We recognized the defense they were in and spread the ball and took good shots. We shot well and played at a good pace. Anytime you shoot 60 percent, especially on the road, is a great night."
- "Right now, offensively, Keena (Young) is really, really consistent for us. I really think as good as Keena is, the fact that he's got Trent in that other post with guys that have to stay on him is really opening a lot of opportunities for Keena. Other teammates are doing a good job of giving him the ball where he can really operate and do a lot of good things."

- With the 85-72 win at TCU, the Cougars improved to 9-2 in the Mountain West Conference, maintaining their first-place standing. BYU is alone atop the conference leader board in the second half of league play for the first time ever in the MWC.
- BYU has now won its last six straight games, coming just one win off their longest winning streak of the season.
- After losing five of their first six true road games this season, BYU has now won its last four games away from the Marriott Center, compiling a 5-5 road record. The Cougars are 4-2 on the road in conference play, the only team in the MWC with three road wins. With two games away from the Marriott Center left on the schedule (at SDSU, at Air Force), BYU has a chance to post a winning road record for the first time since 2002-03 when the Cougars went 6-5 overall on the road. Last season, BYU was 6-8 overall and 4-4 away from the Marriott Center.
- The Cougars have shot above 50 percent in their last five road games and in six of their last seven games overall, including a season-high .615 (32-for-52) mark against the Horned Frogs. BYU has also shot above 40 percent from three-point range in 10 of its last 12 games, with a .455 (5-for-11) mark at TCU
- BYU is now 18-3 when scoring at least 70 points and 4-6 when allowing opponents to reach the 70-point threshold. The Cougars have scored at least 80 points nine times this season, going 9-0 in those games.
- With a 30-25 rebounding advantage against the Horned Frogs, the Cougars are now 18-0 when winning the battle of the boards.
- With a 41-29 advantage at the break, the Cougars enjoyed their 19th halftime lead of the season and their ninth in double figures, including a 48-25 first-half lead in the first meeting between the two teams. BYU has held opponents under 30 first-half points 14 times this year while topping the 40-point mark six times. Overall, the Cougars are 17-2 when leading at the break, 2-3 when trailing and 0-1 when tied this season.

LOOKING AT NEW MEXICO

New Mexico (15-16, 4-12) is the No. 9 seed and will face No. 8-seed TCU Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. PT at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas. The Lobos began the season 9-2 but have since gone 6-14, including losses in their last four outings. Two of those defeats went to overtime as the Lobos are 1-3 in overtime games this year. Entering Tuesday's game vs. TCU, junior guard J.R. Giddens, a transfer from Kansas, leads the team and ranks eighth in the MWC in scoring at 16.1 points per game despite being hampered by injury. Giddens also adds 6.3 rebounds per contest, second on the team and tied for fourth in the league, and 2.3 assists. Junior forward Tony Danridge is second on the team in scoring at 12.7 ppg on .516 shooting from the field and is the only Lobo who has started in all 31 games this season. Senior forward Aaron Johnson paces the Lobos on the boards with 7.5 rpg, third in the MWC, and from the floor on .549 shooting from the field while contributing 6.5 ppg. Junior guard Darren Prentice is UNM's leading assist man with 3.3 apg to go along with 9.0 points and 2.1 rebounds per contest. Sophomore guard Chad Toppert averages 9.7 ppg on .474 shooting from the field, including a team-best .469 mark from three-point range. As a team, the Lobos are averaging 76.0 ppg on .461 shooting from the field, including a .378 mark from behind the arc, while holding opponents to 73.6 ppg on .466 shooting. UNM opponents hold a 34.9-33.7 rebounding edge over the Lobos. New Mexico head coach Ritchie McKay is 82-68 in his fifth season with the Lobos and 165-157 in his 11th year overall.

NEW MEXICO'S LAST OUTING — LOBOS FALL AT WYOMING TO END REGULAR SEASON

LARAMIE, Wyo. -- Brandon Ewing scored 20 points in leading Wyoming over New Mexico 76-67 Saturday in a rematch of two teams that were involved in a brawl during their first meeting in January. Wyoming (16-14, 7-9 Mountain West Conference) got well ahead in the first half and New Mexico (15-16, 4-12) came no closer than nine points after that. Ewing hit all nine of his free throws, including four in the final minute to help keep the Lobos out of reach despite baskets by Tony Danridge and David Kanyinda. The Cowboys used an 18-4 run to go up 26-14 in the first half. The run began on a 3-pointer by Eric Platt that put the Cowboys ahead 11-10. In the final minutes of the first half, Ewing made two baskets and three free throws to give Wyoming a 37-24 lead at intermission. Early in the second half, Ewing scored another basket and two free throws for the Cowboys' widest lead of the game, 43-26. After Ewing, Platt scored 14 points and James Spencer had 13. Ike Okoye had eight rebounds. New Mexico was led by J.R. Giddens' 15 points. Giddens also had nine rebounds. Danridge had 13 points and Kanyinda 10 points. The Cowboys out-shot the Lobos 57 percent to 49 percent. A brawl broke out the last time the teams played, on Jan. 31 at New Mexico, and players from both teams were suspended for the game in Laramie: Wyoming's Brad Jones, as well as New Mexico's Jamaal Smith and Darren Prentice.

SERIES NOTES

This will be the 122nd game in the series that started in the 1949-50 season. The Cougars lead the series 71-50 after winning 70-49 at The Pit and 96-83 in Provo this season. BYU has won the last four games vs. the Lobos. The Cougars have won seven straight over UNM in the Marriott Center. New Mexico's last win in Provo was a 78-74 win in 2000, which was BYU's last loss in the Marriott Center prior to starting its school-record 44-game nation-leading homecourt victory string that was ended in 2003 by Utah. The Cougars are 16-26 in The Pit. Last year, BYU won 77-71 at The Pit to end the Lobos' 21-game home win streak and 76-68 in the Marriott Center. BYU had a four-game winning streak in the series halted with a season series split in 2004. The Cougars swept the season series in 2003 and defeated the Lobos in the opening round of the 2003 MWC Tournament. BYU has won 14 of the last 18 games in the series after New Mexico had won eight of the prior nine contests.

THIS YEAR AT NEW MEXICO — COUGARS WIN BIG AT NEW MEXICO

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (Jan. 24, 2007) – The Cougars put an end to their road woes Wednesday night with a resounding 70-49 win over the New Mexico Lobos at The Pit. The victory is BYU's first Mountain West Conference road win of the season and improves the Cougars to 14-6 overall and 4-2 in league play. The Lobos, who entered the game averaging 87 points per game at home, fell to 12-9 overall and 1-5 in conference action. BYU was led by true freshman Jonathan Tavernari, who tied his career high with 18 points on 7-for-10 shooting from the field to go along with four rebounds and three steals. Trent Plaisted and Jimmy Balderson also scored in double figures with 11 and 10 points, respectively. Lee Cumnard paced the Cougars on the boards with five rebounds, and Austin Ainge tied his career high with eight assists. As a team, the Cougars shot 52 percent from the field and 50 percent from three-point range, marking the seventh straight game BYU has topped the 40 percent mark from long range. New Mexico shot just 38 percent from the floor and 25 percent from behind the arc. The Cougars also outrebounded the Lobos, 30-29, improving to 13-0 when winning the battle of the boards. New Mexico's Tony Dandridge scored the Lobos' first eight points of the game and finished with a game-high 21, but BYU's guard play kept the game tight as Cumnard, Balderson and Ainge answered each UNM score. After trading scores to a 10-9 Lobo lead, UNM got a steal and a score to take its largest lead of the game to that point at 12-9. Ainge finally ended a 4:25 Cougar drought as he jumped a three-pointer in transition to knot the score with 11:30 left to play. Vuk Ivanovic gave BYU the lead with an 18-footer to make it 14-12 but the advantage was short-lived as the Lobos answered on their next possession and the two teams traded buckets from there. With the Cougars trailing 19-18, Ivanovic added to the BYU highlight reel as he sent a behind-the-back pass to an open Tavernari who put up the easy layin underneath. The see-saw battle continued as the first half neared completion with both teams draining shots at will. Trailing 26-25, the Lobos drained a three-pointer to push the lead for either team past one point for the first time in almost six minutes, but Tavernari answered on the other end with a long-range make of his own to make the score 29-28 with 3:11 left to play in the half. The bucket proved big as the Cougars used it to spark an 11-0 run in the final three minutes of the half, taking a 37-28 lead into the locker room. After an opening bucket from the Lobos, BYU scored the next six points, including a three from Balderson to take a 43-30 lead. However, the Lobos answered with a 7-0 scoring run to cut the lead to just six points at 43-37 with 13:27 left to play. Tavernari, who provided a huge spark off the bench for BYU in the first half, did so again as he scored back-to-back buckets to end a 3:45 Cougar drought and push the lead back to double digits at 47-37. A New Mexico score had the Lobos thinking comeback but BYU was not about to let it happen as the Cougars went on an 8-0 run to take a 55-39 lead. Two minutes later, Mike Rose put the nail in the coffin with a three-point make to give the Cougars a 60-42 lead. New Mexico got no closer as BYU cruised to the 70-49 win.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

- "This was very much a team win from the starters to the guys who came off the bench. We did a lot of things really well. We got a nice run at the end of the first half to give us some confidence. They gave us a nice run back but we kept it going."
- "Austin (Ainge) was terrific tonight. He got involved scoring early and had eight assists with just one turnover. He was really able to run our offense. We knew that being able to get the ball into the post and play off the post men was going to be key, and he did that for us."
- "Tonight we had to guard the three-point line because that's their success. Our guys did a good job of staying out on them and making it tough for them. I thought we contested shots well."
- "Give a lot of credit to all the players that came in and really helped us. Jonathan (Tavernari) was terrific. The matchup was really well for him tonight defensively at the small forward spot. He came in for defensive purposes to get a bigger body in there and ended up hitting some shots."

BYU NOTES FROM THIS YEAR AT NEW MEXICO

- Team Season Highs: Fewest points allowed against a Div. I opponent - 49
- BYU's win at New Mexico ended a four-game Cougar losing streak away from the Marriott Center. The Cougars have won two straight at UNM and have had success at The Pit in the past as BYU has ended three Lobo home win streaks during the all-time series. The Cougars have more wins at The Pit than any other UNM opponent.
- With a 21-point (70-49) win over the Lobos, the Cougars have now won three of their six Mountain West Conference games by at least 20 points, including a 24-point win over TCU (89-65) and a 22-point victory over San Diego State (80-58). BYU has won just nine games by 20 points or more in MWC play since the formation of the league prior to the 1999-2000 season.
- The Cougars are now 14-3 when scoring at least 70 points and 2-6 when allowing opponents to surpass the 70-point threshold. The Cougars have scored at least 70 points in 12 straight games. New Mexico entered the game scoring 87 points per game at home but recorded a season-low 49 points against BYU.
- With a .500 (9-for-18) three-point shooting mark at UNM, BYU has now shot above .400 from behind the arc in seven straight games and 11 on the season. The Cougars have shot above .500 in seven games.
- With a 30-29 rebounding advantage against the Lobos, the Cougars are now 13-0 when winning the battle of the boards.
- With the win at UNM coming after a loss at Colorado State, BYU has now bounced back from five of its six losses this season with wins. The Cougars have suffered back-to-back losses only twice in the last two years - once this season (vs. Michigan State, at Lamar) and once last season (vs. Utah at MWC Tournament and at Houston in the NIT).
- Leading 37-28 at UNM, BYU went into the locker room with a halftime lead for the 15th time this season. The Cougars have held opponents under 30 points in the first half 11 times this season and are now 13-2 when leading at the break. BYU is also 13-0 when leading at the five-minute mark and 13-0 when leading at the one-minute mark.
- The Cougars have put together incredible first-half shooting performances in their three MWC road games, including a .520 mark from the field and a .600 mark from three-point range against the Lobos. Including its games at UNLV and at Colorado State, BYU is shooting .551 from the floor and .727 from three-point range in the first half of play in league road contests. The Cougars have led at the break in two of those games and been tied in one.
- After getting just six points off the bench against Colorado State in their last game, the Cougars posted a 31-9 advantage off the bench over the Lobos. BYU has outscored its opponents from the bench in 14 games this season and been outscored in just six.

THIS YEAR IN PROVO — YOUNG LEADS FIVE COUGARS IN DOUBLE FIGURES AGAINST LOBOS

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 14, 2007) – The BYU Cougars improved on their home court winning streak by beating the New Mexico Lobos, 96-83, on Wednesday in front of a Marriott Center crowd of 11,112. The Cougars are currently tied for the nation's longest home winning streak. This was also BYU's seventh straight victory beginning with a victory at New Mexico on Jan. 24th. The Cougars improved to 20-6 overall and 10-2 in Mountain West Conference play. Five Cougars scored in double figures, led by Keena Young with 23 points, Austin Ainge with 15 points, Trent Plaisted with 14 points, Jimmy Balderson with 13 points and Mike Rose with 12 points. Young, the MWC Co-Player of the Week, started strong, scoring six of BYU's first eight points. Plaisted recorded his first block of the game with the score tied at 10-10. He went on to go one-for-two from the charity strip, with just under 15 minutes to play. With 13:48 left in the first half Balderson and Ainge hit back-to-back three-pointers giving the Cougars a 17-10 lead before New Mexico's Kellen Walter got one of his own. Ainge recorded his first block of the season with BYU leading 25-19. With just under 10 minutes to play in the first half, Young scored his 10th point of the game, marking the 22nd time he has scored in double figures this season. Rose made his first points of the game from behind the arc with 6:18 to play in the half. After a trip to the free-throw line for the Lobos and a three-pointer from Jamaal Smith, BYU still led 34-28. Rose hit his second three of the night with 4:53 to play in the first half. Less than a minute later, his third three-pointer went down. A jumper by Young with 1:28 to play in the first half brought the score to 47-36. Going into the half the Cougars led 51-41. BYU began the second half with a three-pointer by Ainge, his third of the game. A one-handed dunk by J.R. Giddens brought the Lobos to within nine with 18:03 to play in the second half. With just over 15 minutes to play in the second half, New Mexico's Walter scored his team's ninth three-pointer of the game. The Lobos went on an 8-0 run before Plaisted capitalized on a three-point play and a dunk on the ensuing drive, giving the Cougars a 10-point lead. A pass from Lee Cummard resulted in a fast break lay-up by Sam Burgess with 10:14 to play in the game. Young went 1-for-2 from the free-throw line to put the Cougars up by 13. Cummard made his first bucket from behind the arc with 8:30 left in the second half, soon followed by his first blocked shot of the game. Young secured the rebound off of Plaisted's missed free throw to give the Cougars two points with under five minutes to play in the game. BYU's 20-point lead, the largest of the game, came with 4:20 on the clock. A saved turnover by Jonathan Tavernari resulted in a lay-up by Burgess. Giddens led New Mexico with 19 points, and Chad Toppert led the team with six rebounds. The Lobos had a .538 three-point shooting percentage, and each player who received playing time scored.

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

– "We did a good job attacking the ball, adjusting to the defenses they threw at us and sharing the ball. That was the key to the win tonight."
– "It's a good team win against a tough team. They all seem like big accomplishments to us."
– "I thought we got good balance tonight, especially scoring with five guys in double figures."

New Mexico Head Coach Ritchie McKay

– "I wasn't pleased with the way we defended. I wanted to see if we could wear them out and destroy their rhythm. It didn't work."
– "You will be hard pressed to find another team like this. That team doesn't have many weaknesses if any. I have a lot of respect for their program. I like their chances [at the MWAC Tournament]."
– "I have a lot of respect for Keena [Young]. He is a good player."

- BYU's win over New Mexico extended its home winning streak to 29 games, which is currently tied for the longest active home victory streak in the nation. The Cougars are 15-0 at home this season and 401-116 (.776) all-time in the Marriott Center.
- With the win, BYU improved to 20-6 overall, the 30th 20-win season in program history. BYU head coach Dave Rose became the fourth Cougar head coach to win 20 games in each of his first two years (BYU finished 20-9 last season in Rose's first season at the helm, also recording the 20th win at home against New Mexico). However, Rose is the first Cougar head coach to win 20 games in each of his first two years after taking over a program with less than 13 wins the prior year. BYU was 9-21 in 2004-05 before Rose turned the program into the second-most improved team in the nation last year.
- BYU has now won its last seven straight games, tying its longest winning streak of the season.
- The Cougars have shot above 50 percent in seven of their last eight games overall, including a .559 (38-for-68) mark against the Lobos.
- BYU is now 19-3 when scoring at least 70 points and 5-6 when allowing opponents to reach the 70-point threshold. The Cougars have scored at least 80 points 10 times this season, going 10-0 in those games.
- With a 41-27 rebounding advantage against the Lobos, the Cougars are now 19-0 when winning the battle of the boards, including a double-digit advantage eight times.
- Three-pointers have been key to the Cougars' success off the bench as Mike Rose has hit at least three from long range in five games this season including four against the Lobos. Austin Ainge has come off the bench and drained three shots from downtown twice, Jonathan Tavernari has done it three times and Sam Burgess has done it twice.
- With a 51-41 advantage at the break, the Cougars enjoyed their 20th halftime lead of the season and their 10th in double figures. BYU's 51-point first half tied its highest first-half scoring output of the year (also vs. Western Oregon). Overall, the Cougars are 18-2 when leading at the break.
- Five Cougars scored in double figures against New Mexico, led by Keena Young's 23 points. BYU is 9-2 when led by Young and 3-0 when five players score in double figures. The Cougars are also 17-5 when Young scores in double figures, 7-1 when Austin Ainge scores in double digits (15 points), 8-3 when Jimmy Balderson reaches double digits (13 points), 13-3 when Trent Plaisted scores in double figures (14 points) and 4-2 when Mike Rose reaches double digits (12 points).

LOOKING AT AIR FORCE

Air Force (23-7, 10-6) enters the MWC Tournament as the No. 4 seed. The Falcons have been ranked as high as No. 11 nationally this year but just dropped out of both polls this week after suffering three straight defeats. The Falcons had their nation-leading (along with BYU) home victory streak come to an end in their last outing with a loss to BYU in Clune Arena. AFA registered nonconference wins this year over Stanford, Texas Tech and Wake Forest. Entering Wednesday's quarterfinal matchup with Wyoming, senior forward Dan Nwaelele leads AFA with 14.5 points per game on 53 percent shooting from the floor. Nwaelele, who is one of four Falcons who has started all 30 games for the Academy, shoots .472 from three-point range while making a team-best 67 triples. Senior forward Jacob Burtschi contributes 13.3 ppg on .498 shooting to go along with a team-best 5.6 rpg. Senior guard Matt McCraw is AFA's leading assist man at 2.9 apg while adding 11.0 ppg, third on the team, and 3.5 rpg. Senior center Nick Welch adds 9.8 ppg. Junior guard Tim Anderson tallies 9.1 ppg. As a team, the Falcons are averaging 69.2 ppg on .493 shooting from the field, including a .409 mark from three-point range, while holding opponents to 55.7 ppg on .426 shooting, including a .317 percentage from behind the arc. Falcon head coach Jeff Bzdelik is 47-14 in his second season at Air Force and 72-45 in his fourth year overall.

SERIES NOTES

BYU and Air Force have met 57 times, with BYU leading the series 45-12, including a 61-52 win over then-No. 13 Air Force in Provo this season and a 62-58 victory over the then 20th-ranked Falcons at Clune Arena - ending their nation-leading 30 game home winning streak the Cougars shared at the time (BYU now leads with 31 straight home wins). BYU has won the last three games in the series. The Cougars are 23-4 in Provo, 19-7 at Air Force and 3-1 at a neutral site. BYU owns a 3-1 advantage when the two teams have met in the conference tournament (1-0 in MWC Tournament with win in 2001). The Cougars have won three straight in conference tournament meetings since falling at home to the Falcons in the 1985 WAC Tournament preliminary-round game, 82-79. BYU has won 11 of the 17 games in the series since the inception of the Mountain West Conference, but the two teams have split the last eight outings. BYU has won 12 of the last 19 outings since winning a series-best 15 straight over the Falcons from 1990-96. Before their win this year, the Cougars had lost three straight in Clune Arena with their prior win coming March 1, 2003, the same year BYU last won the conference title (tied with Utah). AFA's three-point win at the Marriott Center in 2005 ended 13 straight Cougar wins in the Marriott Center since a 79-78 Falcon win in 1989.

LOOKING AT WYOMING

The Cowboys (16-14, 7-9) enter Wednesday's game vs. Air Force as the No. 5 seed. Wyoming has nonconference wins over two teams who defeated BYU this year in Boise State and Lamar. The Cowboys are led by sophomore guard Brandon Ewing, who paces the team and the league in scoring overall at 19.8 points per game. He adds 3.3 rebounds and 3.0 assists per contest. Junior guard Brad Jones is second on the team and third among MWC players in scoring at 17.6 ppg, while adding 5.0 rpg and a team-leading 4.5 assists per game (which ranks fourth overall among MWC players just ahead of Austin Ainge). Senior forward Daaron Brown paces the Cowboys on the boards at 7.0 per game while shooting a team-best .611 field-goal percentage toward his 9.8 scoring average. Junior guard James Spencer joins fellow perimeter players Ewing and Jones in double-digit scoring with an 11.0 ppg average. As a team, the Cowboys average 73.8 ppg on .460 shooting from the field, including a .336 mark from three-point range, while holding opponents to 74.5 ppg on .452 shooting from the field. Wyoming has been slightly outrebounded (34.9-34.3) this year. Cowboy head coach Steve McClain is 156-114 in his ninth season at the helm.

SERIES NOTES

BYU and Wyoming have met 165 times. BYU leads the series 96-69. Wyoming has a 53-29 advantage in Laramie while BYU boasts a 63-14 record in Provo. BYU has a 4-2 edge on a neutral floor, including a 2-0 advantage in conference tournament play (MWC Tournament wins in 2001 and 2004). The Cougars have won the last four games and nine of the last 11 outings. Since the formation of the Mountain West Conference, BYU has won 13 of the 18 meetings. After Utah (244 games) and Utah State (224 games), BYU has faced Wyoming the third-most times in its history.

BYU'S LAST OUTING — BYU WIN OVER UTAH EARNS MWC TITLE

PROVO, Utah (March 3, 2007) – Playing before a sellout crowd of 22,812, the BYU Cougars secured their position as the Mountain West Conference Champions on Saturday evening with an 85-62 victory against in-state rival, University of Utah. With this win, the Cougars improved to 23-7 overall and 13-3 in conference play, winning their first outright MWC regular-season title. Six seniors were honored before the last home game of their careers, including Austin Ainge, Jimmy Balderson, Derek Dawes, Fernando Malaman, Mike Rose and Keena Young. BYU was led in scoring by Young and Sam Burgess with 15 points each. Also scoring in double figures was Trent Plaisted with 13 points and Ainge with 11 points. Young also led the team with nine rebounds. Utah got out to an early 6-1 lead before Young earned his first two points on the Cougars' possession following a Luke Nevill traveling call. A blocked shot by Plaisted was soon followed by a three-point play by Young with 16:28 to play in the first half, evening the score at 6-6. With 14:03 to play in the first half, the Cougars took their first lead of the game after a dunk by Plaisted. Lee Cummond increased BYU's lead to 13-9 by hitting his first three-pointer of the night. Utah's Johnnie Bryant hit a three-pointer, giving his team a one-point lead, before Balderson made one of his own with 10:15 left in the first half. A pass from Ainge to Burgess gave the Cougars a 21-20 lead. Burgess' make from behind the arc with just under seven minutes to play in the first half was soon followed by the same from Ainge. Young's make off the glass gave the Cougars a 29-21 lead. A three-pointer by Balderson with a minute to play in the half brought the score to 34-24. The fans were then brought to their feet when Ainge's fast break lay-up resulted in a three-point play. BYU held a 37-26 advantage to close the first half, which consisted of five lead changes. To open the second half of play, Plaisted went to 2-for-2 from the line after Nevill was called for his fourth foul. Plaisted recorded his second dunk of the night with 17:30 in the second half. After a missed jumper, Young pulled down his own rebound to bring the score to 44-29. Mike Rose scored his first points of the game on a three-pointer with 15:30 to go in the second half. Jonathan Tavernari increased the Cougar lead to 14 points when he made a lay-up on a pass from Young. Ainge followed with a three-pointer on the next possession. Balderson hit a three-pointer of his own with 13:30 in the second half. After a Balderson miss, Tavernari scored the rebound and laid it in, bringing the score to 57-35. Mike Rose capitalized on a three-point play with 10:46 to play in the second half. The Cougars' 15-0 run ended on a Utah free throw by Daniel Deane. With 8:40 to go in the second half Mike Rose found his second basket from behind the arc, bringing the score to 69-40, BYU's largest lead of the game. On Utah's next possession, Burgess recorded his first block of the season. A lay-in by Tavernari brought the Cougar lead to 73-49. A pair of free throws by Utah's Ricky Johns with just under five minutes to play in the game was followed by a score from Plaisted. A successful trip to the free-throw line put the Cougars up two more points, bringing the lead to 81-57. Utah's Johns hit a late three-pointer with under two minutes to play. After a second trip to the free-throw line for Burgess, BYU was up 85-60 with 41 seconds to play in the game.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

– "Obviously it was a well played game. I thought our team was really together tonight. There was balanced scoring, but I really thought we were able to handle the emotions of the night and stay together."
– "One thing I do know is they deserve it. They've worked pretty hard. We got help from our bench. We got help from our starters. It was a team victory, and it's been that way all year."

Utah Head Coach Ray Giacoletti

– "This has been a great rivalry. BYU is very deserving. Their group of seniors have come together and, with a few additions, they have all the pieces."
– "We just need to go and regroup for the Mountain West Conference Tournament."

BYU NOTES FROM LAST OUTING

– Individual Career Highs: Sam Burgess – 15 points, 4 rebounds (tied); Austin Ainge – 1 block (tied); Keena Young – 4 assists (tied).
– BYU's win over Utah extended its home winning streak to 31 games, which is currently the longest active home victory streak in the nation. The Cougars went 17-0 at home this season and are 403-116 (.776) all-time in the Marriott Center.
– With the victory, BYU has secured its first outright MWC regular-season title and its first outright league crown since 1987-88. The Cougars have won 27 conference titles. This year marks the first time since 1978-79 that the men's basketball, women's basketball and football teams have all won outright league crowns in the same season.
– BYU's season-high crowd of 22,812 vs. Utah marked the Cougars' second sellout this season (22,700 vs. then-No. 13 Air Force). Prior to this year, BYU had not sold out two games in a season since 1981-82 (vs. UNLV, vs. Utah). The attendance mark was also the 21st largest in Marriott Center history and the seventh largest for a BYU vs. Utah game. It was the largest crowd in MWC history.
– With a record of 23-7 in the regular season, BYU became just the sixth team in program history to reach 23 wins prior to postseason play. No Cougar team had reached the 23-win mark in the regular season since 1992-93.
– The Cougars set a Mountain West Conference record in their final league game, finishing conference play with 1,263 total points to surpass SDSU's mark of 1,246 points set last season. BYU entered the game needing 69 points to set the record and finished with 85. The record was actually set on a three-point make from Mike Rose with 8:38 left in the game.
– The Cougars have also won the Old Quirrh Bucket and the in-state basketball bragging rights that go along with it for the first time since 2000-01 with a 5-0 record this season against in-state teams. BYU, which actually secured the Bucket with a win at Utah earlier this season, has claimed the Bucket eight times since 1975.
– With the 85-62 (+23) win over Utah, BYU won five MWC games this season by more than 20 points, including a +27 (90-63) margin of victory against UNLV on Feb. 3, a 21-point (70-49) win at New Mexico on Jan. 24, a 24-point (89-65) win over TCU on Jan. 10 and a 22-point victory (80-58) over San Diego State to open MWC play. BYU has won just 11 games by 20 points or more in MWC play since the formation of the league prior to the 1999-2000 season. The Cougars had not beaten Utah by at least 20 points since March 10, 1994, a 96-65 win in the WAC Tournament. The last time BYU recorded a margin of victory that large over the Utes in Provo was Jan. 15, 1982 with a 74-51 win.
– BYU is now 21-4 when scoring over 70 points and 19-0 when holding opponents under the 70-point threshold. The Cougars are also 11-0 this year when scoring at least 80 points.
– With a 36-24 rebounding advantage against the Utes, the Cougars are now 22-1 when winning the battle of the boards.
– With a 37-26 advantage at the break, BYU enjoyed its 22nd halftime lead of the season and their 11th in double figures. Overall, BYU is 20-2 when leading at the break, 3-4 when trailing and 0-1 when tied.
– With 15 points against Utah, Young has now scored in double figures in 26 of 30 games this season, helping BYU go 20-6 in those games. Young scored 11 points on 5-for-5 shooting from the field in the first half.
– After Plaisted began the game with a free-throw make, Young scored seven straight points for BYU to spark a 13-3 run that gave the Cougars a 13-9 lead.

BYU IN NATIONAL RANKINGS

BYU is ranked No. 23 in this week's ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll and AP Top 25 Poll. BYU entered the national rankings on Feb. 19 for the first time since 1993 as the Cougars were ranked No. 21 in the AP Top 25 Poll and No. 22 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Poll. BYU was last ranked in the top 25 on March 8, 1993 when the Cougars were No. 25 in the AP Poll. BYU's No. 21 ranking equaled its highest ranking achieved during the 1992-93 season. BYU was ranked as high as No. 2 (UPI) and No. 4 (AP) in the 1987-88 season. BYU has been nationally ranked in the AP Poll during 15 seasons starting in 1950-51 when the Cougars won the national title as NIT Champions (unable to determine other seasons when BYU could also have been ranked in other polls due to incomplete in-season historical listings). Four BYU opponents appear in this week's polls as UCLA is ranked No. 3 in the Coaches Poll and No. 4 in the AP Poll. UNLV is ranked No. 25 in both polls while Air Force is listed 29th (Coaches) and 35th (AP) and Michigan State is listed 39th in both polls.

COUGAR RECORD AMONG THE TOP IN SCHOOL HISTORY

BYU has a 23-7 record through 30 games this year. In the 105-year history of BYU men's basketball, only three teams of the 41 that played at least 30 games during a season earned a better record than this year's Cougar squad (noting that 64 teams did not total 30 games during the season, including the 20-5 NIT Championship team in 1965-66). Five other BYU teams have equaled the current Cougars' 23-7 start. (SEE CHART AT LEFT).

THE TOP OF THE MOUNTAIN

With a 13-3 Mountain West Conference record, BYU secured its first MWC title and its first outright league crown since 1987-88. The Cougars have won 27 conference titles. This year marks the first time since 1978-79 that the men's basketball, women's basketball and football teams have all won outright league crowns in the same season.

COACH ROSE OWNS TOP MWC MARK IN HIS TWO SEASONS

With a 25-7 record in Mountain West Conference games since taking the helm of the BYU program for the 2005-06 season, Dave Rose is currently the winningest MWC coach in league play in the past two years. UNLV's Lon Kruger is 24-10 and SDSU's Steve Fisher is 23-9 while fellow second-year coach Jeff Bzdelik follows with a 22-10 conference record in his two seasons with the Falcons. In addition to a 13-3 league and 23-7 overall record this year, Rose was named the Mountain West Conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year last season after coaching his team to a second-place MWC finish at 12-4 — one game behind league-champion San Diego State — while turning a 9-21 team into a 20-9 success that proved to be the second-best improvement among all Division I programs.

20-WIN SEASONS

At 23-7 so far this season, BYU has achieved the program's 30th 20-win season, including two straight for Cougar head coach Dave Rose in his first two seasons at the helm. Last year, the Cougars finished 20-9. BYU has averaged 20 wins every 2.6 years (BYU has played 79 seasons in which it has played at least 20 games in a season). Rose became the fourth Cougar head coach to win 20 games in each of his first two years, joining G. Ott Romney, Stan Watts and Roger Reid. However, Rose is the first Cougar head coach to win 20 games in each of his first two years after taking over a program with less than 13 wins the prior year: BYU was 9-21 in 2004-05 before Rose turned the program into the second-most improved team in the nation last year.

CURRENT COUGARS RANK AMONG BEST EVER IN REGULAR-SEASON WINS

This year's BYU team is just the sixth Cougar squad to record its 23rd win prior to the end of the regular season, making it one of the best BYU teams in program history. The Cougar record for wins in the regular season is 24 achieved three times (SEE CHART AT LEFT)

REGULAR-SEASON BENCHMARKS FOR NCAA INVITES

Winning 20 or more games in the regular season has proven to be a significant indicator for receiving an invitation into the NCAA Tournament. Since the first NCAA Tournament in 1939, BYU has had 20 seasons with 20 regular-season wins, including this year's team. In the prior 19 seasons when this occurred, BYU earned a postseason invite each season, including 16 NCAA bids, three NIT berths (BYU played both NIT and NCAA in 1950-51) and one NAIB (1948-49) invite. In the modern era since the NCAA Tournament became the predominant championship over the NIT, BYU has had 15 seasons when it earned 20 or more wins during regular-season games (prior to starting the conference tournament). The Cougars have received an invite to play in the NCAA Tournament in 13 of those seasons (not including this year), with the lone exception being last year's 20-7 regular-season team that fell to 20-8 with a loss at the MWC Tournament before receiving an NIT invitation. Including this year, BYU has reached 21 regular-season wins during 11 of those 15 seasons and has been invited to play in the NCAA Tournament in each of the prior 10 years.

VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

The Cougars are 3-2 in their games vs. ranked teams this year with a 62-58 victory at No. 20 Air Force, a 90-63 win over then-No. 25 UNLV, a 61-52 win over then-No. 13 Air Force, an 82-69 loss at then-No. 5 UCLA and a 76-61 neutral court loss against then-No. 25 Michigan State. The win at No. 20 Air Force was BYU's first win over a ranked team on the road since a win at No. 12 New Mexico on Feb. 26, 1998. The Cougars' victory over then-No. 25 UNLV marked the second consecutive BYU win over a ranked team in the Marriott Center, including a win over then-No. 13 Air Force the week before. Prior to that, BYU had not defeated a ranked opponent since beating then-No. 25 Oklahoma State 76-71 on Dec. 6, 2003 in Salt Lake City. BYU hadn't beaten a ranked team in the Marriott Center since Feb. 1, 1992 with an 80-63 win over No. 19 UTEP. BYU is 49-108 all-time against ranked opponents.

WINNING BIG

BYU has won five MWC games this season by more than 20 points, including a 23-point (85-62) victory over in-state rival Utah on Saturday, a +27 (90-63) margin of victory against UNLV on Feb. 3, a 21-point (70-49) win at New Mexico on Jan. 24, a 24-point (89-65) win over TCU on Jan. 10 and a 22-point victory (80-58) over San Diego State to open MWC play. The UNLV win marked BYU's largest margin of victory in MWC play since a 29-point win (82-53) on Jan. 17, 2004 against Colorado State. BYU has won just 11 games by 20 points or more in MWC play since the formation of the league prior to the 1999-2000 season.

CLOSE CALLS

BYU is the only MWC team that has not had a game decided by three points or less this season. The Cougars have had some close games, however, as three games have required overtime this year: BYU is 2-1 in overtime with an 86-77 loss at Lamar on Dec. 13 and an 84-78 win against Idaho State on Nov. 18 and a 73-69 victory at Weber State on Dec. 2. This is the first season since 2001-02 that BYU has played multiple extra period games in one year (BYU was 0-3 in overtime that season). The Cougars' loss at Lamar ended a five-game overtime winning streak dating back to March 14, 2003, an 86-80 setback against Colorado State at the MWC Tournament. BYU is 50-45 (.526) all-time when playing past regulation.

DEFENDING THE HOME COURT

With 31 straight wins in the Marriott Center, the Cougars currently own the nation's longest active home victory streak thanks to their win at Air Force last Tuesday, snapping the Falcons' 30-game home win streak. BYU won 17 home games this season after going 14-1 at home last year: BYU's last home loss was in last year's season opener against Loyola Marymount. BYU has since won 15 straight over nonconference opponents and has won 16 consecutive over MWC foes since losing its season finale in 2005 to UNLV. BYU is 403-116 (.776) all-time in the Marriott Center. The Cougars' longest home winning streak came from Feb. 19, 2000 to Jan. 16, 2003 when BYU won 44 straight in the Marriott Center.

ON THE ROAD

BYU has won five of its last six games on the road including wins at No. 20 Air Force (62-58), at TCU (85-72), at New Mexico (70-49), at Utah (76-66) and at Wyoming (77-73) and a loss at San Diego State (86-74). The Cougars' win in the Huntsman Center was their first since 1994, and their win at Air Force snapped the Falcons' 30-game home winning streak. BYU is 6-6 on the road this year and 5-3 in conference play with a season-opening loss at then-No. 5 UCLA, a Nov. 29 setback at Boise State, an overtime win at Weber State, an overtime defeat at Lamar and league losses at UNLV and at CSU. BYU was the only Mountain West Conference team with a winning record on the road in league play this year. The Cougars lost their only neutral court game so far this season with a loss against then-No. 25 Michigan State at The Palace of Auburn Hills in Auburn Hills, Mich. BYU finished last year 6-8 away from home, including a 4-4 mark during MWC play.

VICTORY STREAK

BYU has won 10 of its last 11 games overall with victories over New Mexico (twice), Air Force (twice), Utah (twice), UNLV, Wyoming, TCU and Colorado State and a loss at SDSU. The Cougars had won eight straight prior to the SDSU loss, marking their longest victory streak since winning nine straight during the 2003-04 season and ranking tied for 10th nationally. The Cougars also won seven straight this year over Utah State, Western Oregon, Liberty, Oral Roberts, Seton Hall, San Diego State and TCU. Before coming to an end with a loss at UNLV on Jan. 13, that streak was tied for the 12th-longest active victory streak in the nation.

TRUE BLUE FANS

BYU averaged 12,703 fans this season, including the largest crowd in MWC history with 22,812 fans against Utah and another sellout crowd of 22,700 fans against then-No. 13 Air Force, marking the first time since 1981-82 that BYU has had multiple sellouts in the same year. The Cougars were second in the MWC in attendance behind New Mexico's 12,853 average. BYU has consistently ranked among the national attendance leaders. The Cougars averaged 11,069 fans in 2005-06, outdrawing the regular-season conference champions of 27 out of 31 conferences as well as over half of the teams in the Atlantic Coast, Big 12, Big East and Southeastern Conferences and all but Arizona in the Pacific-10 Conference. BYU also averaged more fans than 12 of the 16 NCAA Sweet Sixteen participants, including all of the Final Four teams.

FOR STARTERS

Coach Rose has used four different starting lineups this year but has gone with the same starting five in the last 15 games. Sophomore Lee Cummond and senior Keena Young have started every game this season, while sophomore Trent Plaisted has missed just one start because of injury. Jimmy Balderson has made 27 starts. Rashaun Broadus started 11 of 15 games before being suspended for the season. Austin Ainge has started 22 games.

FROM DOWNTOWN

With 228 three-pointers made this season, BYU has set a new program record in that category, surpassing the mark of 214 set in 1992. The Cougars also set a school record with 15 three-pointers against UNLV on .682 (15-for-22) shooting from long range, the third time this season the Cougars have shot above .600 from downtown. BYU has shot above 40 percent from behind the arc 16 times on the season, including 10 of the last 12 games, and has made a least 10 treys in a game on seven occasions. The Cougars rank eighth nationally in three-point shooting (.409) and led the league in three-point percentage (.457) in MWC play. Cougar players rank first (Austin Ainge - .525) and second (Mike Rose - .471) in the league in three-point shooting percentage in MWC action. Rose tied the BYU individual record he set in 2003 with eight triples against UNLV.

BOUNCE BACK COUGARS

With the win at Air Force coming after a loss at San Diego State, BYU has now bounced back from six of its seven losses this year with wins, suffering back-to-back defeats only once (vs. then-No. 25 Michigan State, at Lamar). BYU won eight straight games after losing to Colorado State on Jan. 20, its longest win streak since the 2003-04 season. After suffering its first back-to-back regular-season losses of the Dave Rose era with defeats against the Spartans and Cardinals, BYU responded with seven straight wins. Last year with its 20-9 overall record, BYU suffered consecutive defeats only once – against Utah in the Mountain West Conference Tournament and at Houston in the NIT in the last two games of the year, having bounced back from each prior loss with a victory.

MAGIC NUMBER: 70

This year the Cougars are scoring an MWC-leading 77.8 points and allowing 68.1 points. BYU is 19-0 when opponents score less than 70 points and 4-7 when they score 70 or more. BYU is 21-4 when it scores 70 or more points (exception at Lamar; at UNLV, at CSU and at SDSU) and 2-3 when scoring less than 70 with both wins coming against nationally ranked Air Force. The Cougars are also 11-0 this season when scoring at least 80 points. With its current scoring output, BYU is on pace to have its highest scoring average since 1996 (82.3 ppg) and highest scoring margin since 1992 (+10.6).

CLEANING THE GLASS

BYU is 22-1 this season when outrebounding its opponents and 1-6 when losing the battle of the boards. The Cougars lead the MWC in rebounding average (37.0) and rebounding margin (+5.8). BYU posted its largest margin of the season with a +22 (42-20) mark against then-No. 13 Air Force. Senior Keena Young is tied for sixth at 6.2 rpg while sophomore Trent Plaisted is ninth on the glass at 6.1 rpg. The Cougars recorded back-to-back season-high efforts of 52 rebounds vs. Oral Roberts and 55 against Seton Hall in the BYU Holiday Classic. BYU outrebounded the Pirates 55-34 as four Cougars had nine or more rebounds (Cumnard 12, Young, Plaisted and Ainge 9).

PLAYER OF THE YEAR - KEENA YOUNG

Senior forward Keena Young has made noise this season for BYU as he proved to be the Cougars' go-to guy while earning Mountain West Conference Player of the Year honors. A consistent scoring threat and solid all-around performer for the Cougars, he finished fourth in the MWC in scoring (17.5) in league games while ranking seventh in field-goal percentage (.557) and ninth in free-throw percentage (.800). He has scored in double figures in 26 out of 30 games this year. He leads BYU in scoring overall (171), which ranks fourth among MWC players, and in rebounding (6.2), tied for sixth in the MWC. He is also fifth in the league in field-goal percentage (.560) and 10th in free-throw percentage (.806). The senior co-captain has led BYU in scoring 13 times and rebounding 12 times. He posted a career-high 29 points in each of his games against Wyoming this season (most since Dec. 6, 2003; Araujo - 32). He has scored at least 20 points in eight games, including five of the last nine.

VETERAN LEADERSHIP AT THE POINT - AUSTIN AINGE

Senior Austin Ainge is averaging a team-best 4.27 assists, fifth in the MWC, while ranking third in the conference with a 1.83 assist/turnover ratio. He averaged 4.88 apg in league play (4th) while leading the conference with .525 shooting from three-point range and ranking third with a 1.81 assist/turnover ratio. Ainge scored 17 points on 6-for-7 shooting from the field, including 3-for-4 from three-point range, against then-No. 25 UNLV while adding four assists and four rebounds. He posted a season-high 20 points on 7-for-9 shooting from the field, including a 5-for-7 mark from three-point range, to go along with six assists against TCU. He totaled 16 points with a career-best nine rebounds off the bench against Seton Hall. His 14 points – all in the second half – against Boise State fueled BYU's furious comeback attempt. He has tied his career high with eight assists three times in the last 11 games (at UNM, at Utah, vs. CSU).

DEFENSE, OFFENSE, DOING IT ALL - LEE CUMNARD

Sophomore Lee Cumnard contributes across the box score and on the defensive end of the floor for BYU. On the year, Cumnard averages 9.2 points, 5.4 rebounds, 2.9 assists, 1.5 steals and 0.9 blocks while shooting .551 from the floor, .450 on threes and .811 from the line. He ranks among the top 15 in the MWC in six statistical categories overall. In conference action, he was eighth in steals (1.44), tied for ninth in assists (2.88), 11th in blocks (1.25) and tied for 12th in defensive rebounds (3.56). He has had at least one steal in 23 of 30 games, including a career-high 5 steals against UNLV, and his hit a three-pointer in 23 of 30 games, including a string of 13 straight. He guards the opponent's top perimeter player. **Among his defensive highlights** was excelling in the tough assignment to guard the MWC's all-time scoring leader and reigning MVP Brandon Heath of San Diego State. He held Heath to season-low-tying 13 points – well below his MWC No. 2-ranked 20.3 scoring average entering the game – helping end Heath's string of four straight games with 20 or more points. He held Wyoming's Brandon Ewing, the league's top scorer, to 8 points on 2-of-12 shooting and TCU's Brent Hackett to 6 points on 2-of-7 shooting, while Cumnard averaged 13.0 ppg on 77 percent shooting, 6.5 rpg, 3.0 apg, 3.0 bpk and 2.0 spg in those back-to-back road games. He also helped hold Utah State's leading shooter Jaycee Carroll, who ranked 22nd in the nation shooting .629, to just .308 shooting (4-for-13) and 7 points below his average.

SUPER SOPHOMORE - TRENT PLAISTED

Just one year removed from his Freshman All-American campaign, sophomore Trent Plaisted is once again contributing solid play for the Cougars. He is currently second on the team with 12.2 points per game on .538 shooting from the field, eighth in the MWC. He also ranks second for BYU and is ninth in the league with 6.1 rebounds per game while adding 1.33 blocks per game, eighth in the conference. Plaisted has scored in double figures in 19 games, helping the Cougars go 15-4 in those contests, while scoring at least 20 points in four outings. He has also reached double-digits on the boards in two games, posting two double-doubles on the year. He has led BYU in rebounds 10 times, scoring six times and assists twice. In league play, Plaisted was sixth in the MWC in field-goal percentage (.563), tied for fifth in blocks (1.55), ninth in offensive rebounds (2.25) and 14th in scoring (12.9).

IT'S A TEAM GAME

BYU has shown balanced play in all aspects of the game this season as nine different Cougars have led the team in scoring and eight different players have led the team in rebounding and assists in its 30 games. Keena Young has led BYU the most in scoring and rebounding as he has paced the Cougars in points 13 times and rebounds 12 times. Austin Ainge is the Cougars' leading assist man with 20 games at the top of the assist category.

ROSE BECOMES EIGHTH COUGAR TO LEAD TEAM IN SCORING

Mike Rose became the eighth Cougar this year to lead the team in scoring during a game when he topped all scorers in BYU's win over then-No. 25 UNLV. Rose scored a career-high 27 points in 21 minutes off the bench to help BYU defeat the nationally ranked Rebels in the Marriott Center. He tied his own school record and equaled the season high by an MWC player this year (UNLV's Kevin Kruger) by making eight treys on 8-of-10 accuracy. His eighth triple also set a new BYU team record of 15 threes in a game.

SCORING PRODUCTION/MARGINS

On the year, BYU averages 36.3 points in the first half and 40.4 points in the second half (and adds another 1.1 to its overall scoring average with overtime points to total 77.8 ppg). BYU outscores its opponents by 5.1 points in the first half, 4.6 points in the second half and 9.7 points overall.

TOPPING 50

BYU scored more than 50 points in a half for the fourth time this year with its 51-point first half against New Mexico. BYU equaled its highest first-half production with the outburst, matching the 51 points it scored against Western Oregon. The Cougars also scored 51 points in the second half against Western Oregon to total a season-high 102 points for the game. BYU's top scoring half of the year was a 52-point tally in the second half against Wyoming. All four 50-plus point scoring totals have come at home in the Marriott Center. BYU has allowed a 50-point half just once this year when Colorado State outscored the Cougars 53-39 in the second half in Fort Collins to give BYU its last defeat, 90-78, on Jan. 20.

40 OR MORE

BYU has scored 40 or more points in the first half seven times and reached 40 points during the second half of 17 games.

SCORING ON THE ROAD

BYU's top scoring first half on the road this year is 41 points at TCU, followed by 39 points in the first 20 minutes at nationally ranked UCLA and at Colorado State. BYU's top scoring second half on the road is 49 points at San Diego State followed by 46 points at Wyoming and 44 points at TCU. BYU also topped 40 points in the second half at Boise State (43), at Lamar (42) and at Utah (42). BYU's largest overall output on the road is its 85 points at TCU, followed by 78 points at Colorado State and 76 at Utah.

LEADING/TRAILING AT THE BREAK

BYU has led at the half in 22 of the team's first 30 games, including a double-digit lead 11 times. The Cougars outscore their opponents by an average of 5.1 points in the first period of play. BYU's win over Seton Hall marked the first time the Cougars have won this year after trailing at the break. The second breakthrough after trailing at the break came at Wyoming. The Cougars also won at AFA after trailing at the half. BYU's 82-69 loss at UCLA after leading 39-36 at the half marked the first time since the 2004-05 season that BYU has lost when leading at the half. BYU also lost at CSU after leading 39-37 at the break. The Cougars are 20-2 when leading at the half, 3-4 when trailing and 0-1 when tied this season.

THE DAVE ROSE SHOW

BYU coach Dave Rose's television show airs on Sunday evenings at 11 p.m. on KSL-TV, channel 5 in Salt Lake City and will be rebroadcast on Tuesdays at 5:30 p.m. and 10 p.m. MT on the mtn.

INSIDE GAME

Including a season-high 58 points in the paint against New Mexico (BYU outscored the Lobos 58-22 inside), BYU has won the points-in-the-paint statistic in 17 games this year, going a perfect 17-0 in those games. Including BYU's wins over Colorado State and Idaho State when the Cougars and their opponents scored the same number of points inside, BYU is 19-0 when not getting outscored in the key. The Cougars have a 4-7 record when they are outproduced in the paint. Thanks to the inside play of Keena Young and Trent Plaisted, BYU is outscoring its opponents by 4.3 points inside on average.

CREATING SCORING OPPORTUNITIES

BYU is 18-1 when creating more points off of turnovers than its opponents. The lone loss in those games was vs. Michigan State when BYU held a 9-6 points-off-of-turnovers advantage. BYU on average is scoring 2.4 more points off of miscues than its opposition. BYU is averaging 13.5 turnovers to its opponents' 14.0.

PUT BACKS

BYU owns a 20-1 record when generating more second-chance points in a game this year with the lone loss being at SDSU. BYU is 2-5 when it doesn't and 1-1 when the two teams have equaled each other in the category. BYU averages 11.8 offensive rebounds to its opponents' combined 10.1 average and has scored 4.6 more points per game off the offensive glass. Trent Plaisted leads BYU with 2.6 offensive boards per game, followed by Keena Young (2.3).

TRANSITION PLAY

With its uptempo philosophy, BYU has scored more fastbreak points than its opponents in 20 of 30 games and shared the same tally in four more. The Cougars are 18-2 when scoring more in transition (losses were back-to-back defeats vs. Michigan State and at Lamar) and 3-1 when tying the category. BYU is 2-4 when it has been outpaced on the break.

MOMENTUM OFF THE BENCH

Three-point shooting off the bench has often given BYU momentum this season. Several different Cougars have come off the bench and hit three or more treys in Cougar wins this year: Austin Ainge made three treys against Idaho State and Seton Hall while coming off the bench. Sam Burgess nailed three triples in a win over Portland. Jonathan Tavernari connected six times from long range against TCU and three times at Utah and against Western Oregon to help fuel BYU victories. Mike Rose tied his school record with eight bombs against then-No. 25 UNLV to allow BYU to pull away. He then added four threes at Wyoming for 12 more points off the bench and four threes against New Mexico. BYU's bench has outscored opposing reserves 710-520 this year, giving BYU 6.3 more points of production per game from its second unit. BYU's bench has outscored the opponent bench in 22 of 30 games, going 18-4 in those games.

TAKING COMMAND

BYU has enjoyed a double-digit lead in 20 of 30 games this year, including a 20-plus point advantage during 10 of those games. The Cougars are 19-1 in games when they have led by 10 or more points with the lone loss being at UNLV where BYU led by 11 in the first half before falling. BYU has trailed by double figures in 10 games, including a season-high deficit of 24 points at Boise State. The Cougars fought back and had a chance to win against the Broncos before losing by four points. BYU is 4-7 in games it has trailed by 10 or more points, coming back to gain wins over Oral Roberts, Seton Hall, Wyoming and then-No. 20 Air Force. BYU has led the entire game in five contests (Portland, Southern Utah, Liberty, UNLV in Provo and Colorado State in Provo.)

KEENA YOUNG NAMED TO NABC DISTRICT 13 FIRST TEAM

KANSAS CITY, Mo. [Feb. 28, 2007] – Senior forward Keena Young became the first BYU men's basketball player since Rafael Araujo in 2004 to be honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches as one of the best players in the country. The NABC announced Wednesday its 2007 Division I All-District teams, naming Young to the District 13 First Team. In all, 150 student-athletes representing 15 districts were recognized as the nation's best men's collegiate basketball players as voted on by members of the NABC. Young leads Mountain West Conference regular-season champion BYU [22-7, 12-3 MWC] in scoring this season at 17.1 points per game while adding 6.1 rebounds per contest. He has scored in double figures in 25 of 29 games while topping 20 or more points on nine occasions and recording five double-doubles. He has posted season highs of 29 points, 16 rebounds, and three assists. Young is one of eight student-athletes to represent the MWC and one of three players from a Utah university to earn all-district accolades this season. Joining Young on the District 13 First Team are Nevada's Nick Fazekas and San Diego State's Brandon Heath, who both earned first-team honors last year, along with Colorado State's Jason Smith and Air Force's Dan Nwaelele. District 13 Second Team members include Coby Karl of Boise State, Rodney Stuckey of Eastern Washington, Jacob Burtschi of Air Force, Brandon Ewing of Wyoming and Luke Nevill of Utah. UNLV's Wendell White was named to the District 15 Second Team, while Utah State's Jaycee Carroll was honored as a second-team member of District 14. Student-athletes selected to the all-district teams are now eligible for the NABC Division I All-America teams to be announced at the conclusion of the 2006-07 NCAA regular season. BYU players have received all-district recognition 82 times by the NABC since 1950.



YOUNG NAMED BYU HOLIDAY CLASSIC MVP

After leading the Cougars to an undefeated 3-0 record in the BYU Holiday Classic, senior co-captain Keena Young was named the Holiday Classic Most Valuable Player. Young led the Cougars to the title with victories over Liberty [73-59], Oral Roberts [72-62] and Seton Hall [77-68]. He scored 17 points on 6-of-12 shooting against Liberty to open the Classic and followed with a career-high and team season-best 16 rebounds to go along with 21 points versus Oral

Roberts. In the tournament finale against Seton Hall, he scored 18 of his 26 points in the second half, helping BYU overcome an eight-point halftime deficit to claim the tournament crown. For the tournament, Young averaged 21.3 points and 9.7 rebounds per game, while shooting 60.5 percent (26-for-43) from the field and 75.0 percent (12-for-16) from the charity stripe.

CUMNARD NAMED TO BYU HOLIDAY CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Lee Cumnard was named to the BYU Holiday Classic All-Tournament Team after recording his first career double-double with career highs of 16 points and 12 rebounds in 34 minutes vs. Seton Hall. He was also 6-of-9 from the floor, 2-for-2 on threes and 2-for-2 from the line. He came one rebound away from the first double-double of his career against Oral Roberts with 13 points and a then career-high 9 rebounds to go along with 5 assists. Cumnard also dished out 5 assists against Liberty to open the Classic while adding 6 rebounds, 5 points and 1 steal. He averaged 11.3 points, 9.0 rebounds and 3.3 assists for the tournament while shooting .542 from the floor, .444 on threes and a perfect 4-for-4 from the line.

KEENA YOUNG NAMED MWC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK (FEB 12)

BYU senior Keena Young and UNLV senior Joel Anthony were named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Co-Players of the Week. Young, a 6-6 forward from Beaumont, Texas, led the Cougars to conference road wins at Wyoming (77-73) and TCU (85-72), helping BYU take sole possession of first place in the MWC standings. At Wyoming, Young tied his career-high with 29 points on 10-of-14 shooting from the field, leading all scorers. He scored 19 of his 29 points in the second half, as BYU earned its first road win of the season when trailing at halftime. He also grabbed six rebounds in 32 minutes of action. He followed with a game-high 25 points (8-for-13 from the field) to go along with six boards against the Horned Frogs. He also collected a steal, while shooting 9-of-11 (81.8 percent) from the charity stripe. For the week, Young averaged 27.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game, while shooting 66.7 percent from the floor (18-for-27).

TRENT PLAISTED NAMED MWC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK (JAN 29)

BYU sophomore Trent Plaisted and UNLV sophomore Wink Adams were named the MWC Co-Players of the Week. Plaisted, a native of San Antonio, Texas, led BYU to a 2-0 conference record, including a road win at New Mexico (70-49) and an upset victory over No. 16 Air Force (61-52). At New Mexico, he scored 11 points on 5-for-6 shooting from the field, while also grabbing four rebounds, dishing out three assists and blocking one shot. Against the 16th-ranked Falcons, Plaisted scored a game-high 22 points (9-for-12 from the field) with seven rebounds (six offensive). With 34 seconds remaining in the game and the Cougars up by three points, he knocked down two free throws to put the game away. On the week, Plaisted averaged 16.5 points on 77.8 percent shooting from the field (14-for-18), 5.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game.

YOUNG NAMED MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (JAN 2)

BYU senior Keena Young was named the MWC Player of the Week, marking his first career weekly honor. A 6-6 forward from Beaumont, Texas, Young was named tournament MVP at the BYU Holiday Classic as he led the Cougars to the title with victories over Liberty (73-59), Oral Roberts (72-62) and Seton Hall (77-68). He scored 17 points on 6-of-12 shooting against Liberty to open the Classic and followed with a career-high 16 rebounds to go along with 21 points scored versus Oral Roberts. Against the Golden Eagles, Young sank nine of his 13 shots from the floor, while his 16 rebounds is a team season-best. In the tournament finale against Seton Hall, he scored 18 of his season-high 26 points in the second half, helping BYU overcome an eight-point halftime deficit to claim the tournament crown. Young also added nine rebounds, a season-best tying three assists, while shooting 11-for-18 from the field and hitting all four of his free throw attempts. For the week, Young averaged 21.3 points and 9.7 rebounds per game, while shooting 60.5 percent (26-for-43) from the field and 75.0 percent (12-for-16) from the charity stripe.

BYU TEAM RECORDS/MILESTONES

Homecourt Win Streak – BYU's current 31-game home winning streak ranks second all-time in program history behind the Cougars' 44-game home victory streak set from Feb. 19, 2000 to Jan. 16, 2003.

3-Pointers Made/Season – With 228 three-pointers made to date this year, BYU has set a new school record in that category, surpassing the old record of 214 three-pointers made in a season set in 1991-92.

3-Pointers Made/Game – With 15 three-pointers made against then-No. 25 UNLV, the Cougars set a new team record for threes made in a single game, surpassing the old mark of 14 set in 2003 and tied this season.

Largest Margin of Victory – BYU's 62-point (102-40) win over Western Oregon marked the Cougars' largest margin of victory, eclipsing the old record of 51 points set in 1967.

MWC TEAM RECORDS/MILESTONES

Total Points/Season – The Cougars set a Mountain West Conference record in their final league game, finishing conference play with 1,263 total points to surpass SDSU's mark of 1,246 points set last season.

Scoring Average/Season – BYU's current 77.8 scoring average in overall play is fourth all-time in MWC history behind the 2001-02 UNLV squad's 78.3 ppg average. Wyoming's 1999-00 team holds the record at 82.8 ppg while the 1999-2000 UNLV team's 82.2 ppg is second. BYU also finished league play tied for third all-time in MWC history for scoring average in conference games. The Cougars' 78.9 ppg tied Wyoming's 2000-01 average and trailed only UNLV's 1999-2000 mark of 80.9 ppg and the Cowboys' 2000-01 tally of 80.1 ppg.

Scoring Margin/Season – With a +9.7 scoring margin in overall play, BYU could rank fifth all-time in that category including Air Force's +13.5 mark this year, which would set the MWC record. The Cougars' +9.7 scoring margin in league play ranks second all-time in MWC history in that category. The 2004-05 Utah squad holds the record at +12.1.

Field-Goal Percentage/Season – The Cougars are currently shooting .492 from the field overall and are on pace to record BYU's best mark since 1994 and the fourth-best mark in MWC history behind New Mexico's .493 percentage set in 2004-05. In league play, BYU's .516 shooting percentage ranks second all-time only to Utah's .526 mark in 2004-05.

3-Point Field-Goal Percentage/Season – The Cougars are currently shooting .414 from three-point range overall and are on pace to record the second-best mark in MWC history behind Colorado State's .440 percentage set in 1999-2000. In league play, BYU's final .457 shooting percentage set a new MWC record, surpassing CSU's 1999-2000 mark of .436.

Field Goals Made/MWC Season – BYU's 459 made field goals in league play this season are a new MWC record, surpassing the old mark of 422 set by San Diego State last year.

3-Point Field Goals Made/MWC Season – The Cougars' 132 three-pointers made this year in league play is second all-time in MWC history. The record is 136 set by the Falcons in 2005-06.

Assists/MWC Season – BYU's 268 assists in league play tied the MWC record for dishes set by UNLV in 1999-2000.

BYU INDIVIDUAL RECORDS/MILESTONES

Games/Career – Jimmy Balderson has a chance to make a mark in the Cougar record books as he has played in 111 career games for BYU. Only 18 Cougars have played at least 115 games for BYU. With at least two games guaranteed (one regular season, one MWC Tournament), Balderson could add his name to that list depending on how BYU fares in tournament play.

Points/Career – Keena Young could become a member of the Cougars' elite 1000 Point Club. Young has scored 990 points in his three years at BYU and is 10 points away from becoming just the 36th Cougar to record at least 1000 career points. Young is averaging 171 ppg this year.

3-Pointers Made/Career – Mike Rose recently surpassed Andy Toolson for second place on BYU's all-time list of career three-pointers made. Rose has made 149 shots from long range in his four-year Cougar career, including 47 this season, surpassing Toolson's mark of 141.

Consecutive Games With a 3-Pointer/Season – Lee Cummand put together a streak of 13 straight games with a made three-pointer this season, tying for fifth on BYU's all-time list. Teammate Jimmy Balderson also recorded 13 consecutive games with a make from long range last season.

3-Pointers Made/Game – Mike Rose tied his own BYU record for three-pointers made in a game with eight bombs from downtown against then-No. 25 UNLV. Rose also hit eight three-pointers against Southern Utah in 2003 in his Cougar debut. Rose's performance against UNLV helped BYU set the team record for three-point makes in a game with 15.

Consecutive 3-Pointers Made/Game – True freshman Jonathan Tavernari had a spectacular night off the bench for BYU against TCU as he made his first six three-point attempts to tie the Cougar record of six consecutive three-point makes set by Nathan Call in 1991. Tavernari missed his last attempt to finish the night 6-of-7 (.857) from three-point range and score 18 points.

Free-Throw Percentage/Game – Lee Cummand's 10-for-10 performance from the free-throw line against Colorado State made him one of only 16 Cougars to go perfect from the charity stripe with a minimum of 10 attempts. Andy Toolson holds the highest number with a 14-for-14 night in 1989.

MWC INDIVIDUAL RECORDS

3FG Percentage/ Game (Freshman) – With a .857 (6-for-7) three-point shooting night against TCU, Jonathan Tavernari set the MWC freshman record for three-point efficiency in a game. Tavernari made his first six attempts, tying a BYU record, before missing his final shot from downtown to finish with 18 points.

Blocks/MWC Game (Sophomore) – Trent Plaisted's six blocked shots against San Diego State to open league play set an MWC sophomore record for blocks in a league game. UNLV's Joel Anthony set the MWC record this season with 13 blocks against TCU.

MWC TEAMS IN THE NCAA

In the first seven years of the MWC, eight of the nine conference members have advanced to the NCAA Tournament at least once. TCU is the lone team not to advance but the Horned Frogs played in the MWC for the first time last season. New Mexico became the last of the other MWC teams to earn a spot in the NCAA Tournament by winning the 2005 MWC Tournament. 2006 MWC-Champion San Diego State received the league's automatic bid last season while Air Force was selected as an at-large team (BYU was the other postseason MWC team last year, advancing to the NIT).

BYU AND MWC IN POSTSEASON

BYU has earned an invite to a postseason tournament in six of the seven years of the MWC, joining Utah in leading all MWC teams. BYU is second to Utah in NCAA appearances since the formation of the MWC (BYU has made three NCAA and three NIT while Utah has made five NCAA and one NIT). UNLV has received five invites (one NCAA, four NIT). New Mexico has received four (one NCAA, three NIT) while Wyoming has three (one NCAA, two NIT). San Diego State has three (two NCAA, one NIT) and Air Force has three (two NCAA and one NIT). Colorado State has been to one NCAA Tournament. TCU's first year was last season.

SENIOR NIGHT

Six Cougar seniors were honored prior to the start of their final home game on Saturday against Utah as Austin Ainge, Jimmy Balderson, Mike Rose, Fernando Malaman, Derek Dawes and Keena Young each received senior blankets. "This is a wonderful class of seniors whose hard work and dedication have led us to a regular-season conference championship this year," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "I want to thank them for their friendship, and I want them to know that they will always be a part of this Cougar basketball program."

COUGARS HELP CHILDREN WITH CANCER

For the eighth year, the BYU men's basketball team joined the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation in an effort to raise money for families who have children with cancer and participate in the Foundation's annual Christmas party for those families. The Foundation collected monetary donations and any unwrapped toys to go directly towards a Christmas party for more than 90 families who have children with cancer living primarily in Utah County. A large portion of the money donated purchased hundreds of toys that enabled these parents to have gifts under the Christmas tree for their children. In addition to all of these toys, the party included free food and entertainment, such as games and ornament decorating, and local celebrities including Santa, Cosmo and the BYU men's basketball team. This is the eighth year BYU coaches, players and their families have volunteered for the Christmas party. BYU head coach Dave Rose served as honorary chairman for the second year. "This has always been a cause I feel strongly about," said BYU coach Dave Rose. "It has been such a positive experience for the coaches, players and families and is a tremendous opportunity for community members to be involved in brightening the holiday season for these children."

BREAKING THE LANGUAGE BARRIER

The presence of returned missionaries and international players on BYU's roster leads to a variety of languages that can be heard on the Cougar bench. Six players speak a language in addition to English, including Austin Ainge (Spanish), Fernando Malaman (Portuguese), Jimmy Balderson (Marshallese), Jonathan Tavernari (Portuguese), Vuk Ivanovic (Serbian) and Gavin MacGregor (Dutch). Two BYU assistant coaches also speak other languages as Walter Reese speaks Portuguese, and John Wardenburg speaks Dutch.

AINGE, BALDERSON, YOUNG SERVE AS TEAM CAPTAINS

Coach Rose and the Cougar coaching staff have announced this year's team captains, calling upon seniors Austin Ainge, Jimmy Balderson and Keena Young to lead this year's team. "I'm proud of the way these three players have developed and of their dedication to our team," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "They are totally committed to this program and have earned the respect and confidence of their teammates. They will provide us with good leadership as we work together as a team to achieve our goals." Ainge, a co-captain of last season's team, proved a valuable asset off the bench in 2005-06 after starting at the point guard spot and receiving All-Mountain West Conference honorable mention as a sophomore. Last season he ranked 11th in the MWC in assists while helping BYU lead the league in both scoring and assists. Balderson also provided a spark off the bench for the Cougars last season as he scored in double figures in 11 of the last 13 games and was the only player in the conference averaging more than 10 points per game off the bench with a 10.2 scoring average. Young led BYU in rebounding as a sophomore before becoming an All-MWC Third Team pick last year after starting the last 14 games of the year and ranking second on the team in rebounding (5.8 rpg) and third in scoring (10.3 ppg).

REDSHIRTS

Freshmen swingmen Jordan Cameron and Brock Zylstra are expected to redshirt this season. Fellow freshman Jonathan Tavernari sat out of BYU's first three games while a BYU-requested NCAA review of his two years of high school in the United States was being concluded. After the review was completed, Coach Rose announced the 6-foot-6 freshman forward from Sao Bernardo, Brazil, would not redshirt this season. He played in his first game on Nov. 24 when the Cougars hosted Southern Utah in the Marriott Center.

BROADUS SUSPENDED FOR THE SEASON

On Jan. 8, BYU men's basketball head coach Dave Rose suspended senior point guard Rashaun Broadus from the team for the remainder of the season. Broadus started in 11 of 15 games this season, averaging 6.1 points and 2.2 assists. Senior Austin Ainge replaced him in the starting lineup while junior transfer Ben Murdock will see more time in a reserve role. "Our basketball program at BYU has expectations of behavior and high standards that we've set for ourselves," Rose said. "Unfortunately, Rashaun Broadus made some decisions not in keeping with these standards, and I've decided to suspend him for the remainder of the season. He will not be playing or practicing with the team. The whole thing is very unfortunate. We have great confidence in the point guards we have. Austin (Ainge) has played very well and continues to play well. He is a very aggressive player who has a lot of experience. Ben (Murdock) will get more minutes than he's been getting. He's very competitive and has competed well in practice."

INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU

— With the addition of freshman Jonathan Tavernari, 26 international players have played basketball at BYU.
 — The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 35 of the past 55 years.
 — Another international player, Jean Carlos Otero from Colombia, signed with BYU in November.
 — In the last five years, BYU has rostered six international players, including four on this season's team – Jimmy Balderson (Canada), Vuk Ivanovic (Serbia) and Fernando Malaman and Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil).
 — Foreign players at BYU have received eight all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen – 1985, Rafael Araujo – 2004) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic – 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo – 2004).
 — According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
 — BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
 — During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

FOUR RECRUITS COMMIT TO BYU DURING NOVEMBER SIGNING PERIOD

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 19, 2006) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose today announced that four players – two from the high school ranks and two from junior colleges – have committed to attend BYU next season by signing national letters of intent during November's early signing period. Joining the Cougar program for the 2007-08 season will be 6-foot-9 forward Chris Collinsworth out of Provo (Utah) High School; 6-foot-2 combo guard Jimmer Fredette from Glens Falls (N.Y.) High School; 5-foot-10 point guard Lamont Morgan out of Saddleback Community College (Mission Viejo, Calif.); and 6-foot-7 forward Jean Carlos Otero out of Miami-Dade College (Miami, Fla.). "We are excited about the early class," Rose said. "The common denominator is that all these guys come from winning programs and they are a key to that success. Since we are losing six seniors as well as others to missions after this year, it is important for us to address those changes, especially on the perimeter. This gives us a great start as we work toward completing our recruiting in the spring."

CHRIS COLLINSWORTH

An athletic player known for his versatility and soft shooting touch, Collinsworth earned first-team all-state honors last season after averaging 14.1 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game for the 4A state runner-up Provo Bulldogs. He shot 56 percent from the field to help himself earn All-Valley Co-MVP honors by the Deseret Morning News, All-Valley First Team recognition by the Provo Daily Herald and first-team Region 7 accolades from a vote of area coaches. Showing his versatility, the 6-foot-9 forward has also played the point guard position. His inside-outside game has drawn comparisons to former BYU great Kresimir Cosic. Collinsworth received recruiting attention from schools such as North Carolina, Arizona State, West Virginia, USC and Oregon State in addition to several Mountain West Conference schools. "Chris has the ability to score in the post and on the perimeter," Rose said. "He is a tireless worker who brings a skill level that will be important to our transition offense. He's from right here in our backyard, and we are excited to have him join our program."

JIMMER FREDETTE

A talented scorer, Fredette averaged 29.3 points per game as a junior while leading Glens Falls High School to a 21-2 overall record and the state title game. A first-team all-state selection and the 2006 Times Union Player of the Year, Fredette is known for his outside shooting and playmaking ability. He made a team-leading 76 three-pointers last season while shooting 83 percent from the free-throw line and scoring more than 30 points in 12 of 23 games. The athletic combo guard also averaged 25 points for the Albany City Rocks AAU team over the summer, leading the squad to a third-place finish at AAU Nationals. An all-around athlete, he earned all-state honors as a wide receiver during his junior year before electing not to play football as a senior to concentrate on basketball. Utah, Syracuse, Wake Forest, Seton Hall, Marshall, Siena, George Mason, West Virginia, Virginia Tech and Penn State also recruited Fredette. "Jimmer is a terrific shooter who also has the ability to run a team," Rose said. "He is a very unselfish player and is very committed to hard work and getting better. He's a great addition to our team."

LAMONT MORGAN

A sophomore this year at Saddleback Community College, Morgan is an extremely quick point guard and strong team leader. He is averaging 8.7 points, 4.7 assists and 3.0 steals per game so far this season after playing in all 31 games as a freshman to help the Gauchos to a 22-9 record. Morgan has excellent defensive abilities and shot 81 percent from the free-throw line last year. As a freshman he recorded season highs of 13 points and seven rebounds while leading the team in assists 11 times. Prior to playing at Saddleback, Morgan prepped at Diamond Ranch High School in Pomona, Calif., earning first-team all-league honors. "Lamont is a winner," Rose said. "He is a team-oriented point guard who provides great leadership and is very competitive. He is extremely quick with the ball. One of the things we really like about Lamont is his ability to defend. His experience will be counted on."

JEAN CARLOS OTERO

Otero is an athletic perimeter player with excellent size and strength. Known for his ability to penetrate, he is currently averaging 15.4 points, 5.2 rebounds and 2.0 assists while shooting 62 percent from the floor in his second year at Miami-Dade College. The 6-foot-7 swingman is also an excellent perimeter defender, often drawing the assignment to guard the opponent's top scorer. As a freshman at Miami-Dade, Otero averaged 8.4 points and 6.5 rebounds per game while shooting 48 percent from the floor. A native of Barranquilla, Colombia, Otero will be the 27th international player to play men's basketball at BYU. "Jean Carlos is an athletic wing player who can beat people off the dribble, penetrate and finish," Rose said. "He has good size and strength for a wing player. His perimeter defense is going to be counted on heavily."





A tireless worker, gifted motivator and strong strategist, Dave Rose has guided BYU to consecutive 20-win seasons and the program's first national ranking since 1993 after succeeding Steve Cleveland as BYU Men's Basketball Head Coach on April 11, 2005.

Rose earned 2007 MWC Coach of the Year honors and was district and conference coach-of-the-year in his first season at the Cougar helm in 2005-06. Taking over a 9-21 team, Rose's Cougar squad was picked to finish last in his first season in the Mountain West Conference (preseason poll of MWC media members) but BYU instead earned a 20-9 record and NIT bid in 2005-06 under Rose's tutelage, including a 12-4 conference mark to tie for second place. His team ranked second nationally for the most improvement over the year before.

nationally for the most improvement over the year before.

Rose was named the USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year and received honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com. He was named MWC Coach of the Year by the league's media and coaches and by CollegelInsider.com. ESPN analyst Bob Valvano called BYU "one of the great surprise teams in the country." In a column on ESPN.com, Pat Forde listed Rose as one of the top first-year coaches in the nation, ranking Rose No. 3 overall among the nearly 40 first-year coaches in college basketball in 2005-06.

Rose, who served the prior eight seasons as Cleveland's lead assistant in Provo, was promoted to BYU's head job two days after Cleveland announced his resignation to take the head-coaching position at Fresno State. Rose served as BYU's associate head coach for five seasons and took over the Cougar program with 22 years of coaching experience, including 10 seasons as a head coach at the junior college and high school levels.

Since coming to Provo in 1997 with Cleveland, Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in six of the past seven seasons, including three NCAA bids, while claiming two MWC titles. As associate head coach, Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, and his efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Rose was the team's defensive coordinator and worked with the post players. He possesses a complete knowledge of the game and worked hard in developing the team's defensive game plans. An outstanding teacher, he coached defensive skill development and implemented the defensive game plan. BYU was the top defensive team in the Mountain West Conference two of the four seasons Rose oversaw the defense.

A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose managed BYU's recruiting efforts during his eight seasons as an assistant. Rose's success as a recruiter was evidenced by his being named one of the top 25 college basketball recruiters in 2004 by Rivals.com. Each year the Cougars have brought in talented newcomers to contribute to the BYU program. The 2004 class was rated No. 17 nationally and No. 3 in the West by Rivals.com. The 2000 recruiting class also ranked in the top 20 nationally.

Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, nine recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major conference award in their first season as a Cougar in the nine years Rose has been in Provo. Including Rafael Araujo being named the league's top newcomer by the MWC media members in 2003 (the MWC discontinued the newcomer award that year), six BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Trent Plaisted was named the 2006 MWC Freshman of the Year. The following is the list of player honors earned the last nine seasons by Cougar recruits in their first seasons in Provo.

Rose has also worked closely with scheduling. BYU has played many of the nation's top teams over the past several years thanks in part to relationships Rose has developed with programs across the country. His efforts have helped the Cougars receive invitations to tournaments like the 2004 EA SPORTS Maui Invitational where BYU faced that season's NCAA Champion North Carolina.

Prior to coming to BYU, Rose was head coach at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, where he compiled a 167-57 record in seven seasons. Rose guided six of his seven teams to national top-20 rankings, including a ranking as high as No. 2, while earning three conference titles. His peers honored him as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as longtime NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU he has recruited and coached two NBA Draft picks in Rafael Araujo and Travis Hansen.

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at

Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86. Rose becomes the 17th person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

PLAYING CAREER

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie College before transferring to Houston, where he was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished second in the NCAA Tournament. At Houston, Rose played in 1980-81, redshirted in 1981-82 and played his final year in 1982-83.

At Dixie, Rose was first-team all-league in both basketball and baseball. Rose was also the Region 18 batting champion, hitting .421 as a center fielder. While playing basketball for Houston's Northbrook High School, he led the District 16AAAAA in scoring, was selected first-team all-district and All-Greater Houston and was named team MVP.

PERSONAL

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Daughter Chanell played forward on the BYU women's basketball team from 2000-03 and is married to Brock Reichner, last year's lone senior on the BYU team. Rose's wife Cheryl is actively involved in helping families who have children with cancer as vice chairperson of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation. Rose follows Cleveland as the second returned missionary to serve as BYU men's basketball head coach. Rose served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie College. His son Garrett returned in August 2005 from a two-year mission in Little Rock, Ark., and married his wife Brooke in November 2006. Rose also has a daughter, Taylor, who is a sixth grader at Wasatch Elementary.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Dave Rose was one of the first coaches in Utah to become involved with Coaches vs. Cancer while at Dixie State College. He helps the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation and has been a volunteer coach for youth groups. He served on the Academic Excellence Committee at Dixie. Dave and his wife Cheryl were Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year in St. George. Cheryl is extremely committed to serving in the community. She received the Beacon of Hope Award in 2005. After Dave got her involved, she now serves as the Vice Chairperson for the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation.

DAVE RICE

2nd year (UNLV 1991)

Dave Rice joined the BYU coaching staff in May 2005. Rice has 16 years of coaching experience, including 14 seasons at the Division I level at BYU, UNLV and Utah State. As a player, Rice was a member of UNLV's 1989-90 National Championship and 1990-91 Final Four teams that won a school-record 45 consecutive games.



In his first season at BYU, he helped the Cougars become the nation's second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record. BYU also led the Mountain West Conference in scoring and assists.

Rice came to BYU from Utah State University where he helped Coach Stew Morrill and the Aggies earn a 24-8 record, Big West Conference Tournament title and an NCAA Tournament bid in 2004-05. In his one season at Utah State, Rice's coaching duties included working with the offense and coaching the guards. In 2004-05, the Aggies led the nation in field-goal percentage (school-record .525) and ranked fourth nationally in scoring margin (+14.6), 10th in assists (17.2) and 20th in three-point field goal percentage (.391).

Rice spent 11 seasons as an assistant coach at UNLV, which is the second-longest tenure ever for an assistant in that program. During his time at UNLV as both a player and a coach, the Rebels had 12 players go on to play in the National Basketball Association, eight of whom were drafted in the first round, including six lottery picks. While in Las Vegas, Rice worked under four head coaches in Jerry Tarkanian, Tim Grgurich, Bill Bayno and Charlie Spoonhour. In his last eight seasons at UNLV, the Runnin' Rebels received seven postseason invitations and averaged 20 wins per year.

In addition to his Division I experience, Rice served as an assistant coach for one season at Chaffey (Calif.) College in 1994, helping the Panthers to a 32-6 record and an appearance in the California State Final Four. He also spent one season at Claremont (Calif.) High School, where he was an assistant coach under his father Lowell, a long-time high school coach. That team went 21-7, winning the Baseline League Championship and reaching the CIF quarterfinals. Rice earned his bachelor's degree in political science from UNLV in 1991 and his MBA in 1993. He was also a two-time UNLV Scholar-Athlete of the Year and a Rhodes Scholar candidate.

Prior to playing at UNLV, Rice began his college career at Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut, Calif., where he earned All-South Coast Conference honors as a sophomore and was chosen from among more than 13,000 student-athletes as the 1989 California Junior College Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He graduated from Claremont High School. A native of Claremont, Calif., Rice and his wife Mindy have two sons, Travis (9) and Dylan (4).

JOHN WARDENBURG

6th year (BYU 1986)

John Wardenburg joined the BYU coaching staff as an assistant coach in May 2001 and served four seasons under former BYU coach Steve Cleveland before being retained on the staff by current BYU head coach Dave Rose.



In 2005, he helped the Cougars become the nation's second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record. BYU also led the Mountain West Conference in scoring and assists.

Wardenburg has 21 years of coaching experience. He came to BYU with 15 years of coaching experience at the high school and junior college levels. His primary responsibilities have included defensive skill development, game film preparation, summer basketball camp director, recruiting and assisting Coach Rose with defensive game plan preparation.

Wardenburg compiled a 105-62 record in seven years as a head coach at Payson High School (1988-93) and Pine View High School (1999-01) while guiding his teams to five league titles and seven state tournament berths. In those seven years, his teams earned three fifth-place state tournament finishes, one third-place finish and a 3A Utah State Championship with his 2001 Pine View team.

After Wardenburg's Payson teams claimed three league titles and posted a 76-43 overall record, he served as an assistant coach from 1993-97 at Dixie State College under current BYU head coach Dave Rose and helped the Rebels to a 95-31 record and a national ranking as high as No. 2. Wardenburg left coaching for two years to serve as Dixie's Director of Athletics. He returned to coaching as the head coach at Pine View High School in St. George where he recorded two highly successful seasons before joining BYU's staff in 2001.

Wardenburg's Pine View teams won the league title both seasons he was the coach while achieving a 29-19 record. Wardenburg earned 3A Coach of the Year honors in 2000 after coaching his team to a third-place state finish and was named Championship Coach of the Year in 2001 after guiding his team to the state title.

Born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Wardenburg was a multi-sport athlete at Kiel High School in Kiel, Wis. He served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to The Netherlands from 1977-79 and earned a BA in political science from BYU in 1986 and an MA in health, physical education and recreation from Utah State in 1992.

Wardenburg and his wife Pam have four sons, Scott, Jonathan, Adam and Barrett, and one granddaughter.

WALTER ROESE

2nd year (BYU-Hawaii 1994)

Walter Roese was hired in June 2005 as an assistant coach under Coach Dave Rose, becoming the first Brazilian full-time assistant coach in NCAA Division I Men's Basketball.



With his outstanding knowledge of the game and large international recruiting network, Roese is a valuable addition to the BYU coaching staff.

In 2005, he helped the Cougars become the nation's second-most improved team with a 20-9 overall record. BYU also led the Mountain West Conference in scoring and assists.

A 1994 Cum Laude graduate in International Business Administration from BYU-Hawaii, Roese earned an MBA at BYU in 2003 before serving as BYU's director of basketball operations under former Cougar coach Steve Cleveland for two years.

Roese coached the Brazilian Junior National Team this past summer, helping his native country qualify for the 2007 World Cup. He also previously served as a volunteer assistant at BYU-Hawaii under Ken Wagner after finishing his professional playing career.

A native of Novo Hamburgo in southern Brazil, Roese played seven years professionally in Brazil and Italy after graduating from BYU-Hawaii. He still holds the Brazilian professional league record with 23 assists in a single game. He has represented the Brazilian National Team and professional clubs at four World Cup tournaments and several international championships in Europe, Asia and South and North America, winning state, national and South American championships. In 1986, he was Brazil's top-rated junior player. Roese has continued to excel as an athlete. In August of 2003, he hit a three-quarter-court shot at the buzzer to give Brazil a one-point victory in the semifinals of the Masters World Basketball Championships (ages 35-40) in Orlando, Fla., before leading Brazil to the title win over Russia.

Roese has experience at nearly every level of the college game. Roese attended the University of Houston, West Texas A&M and BYU-Hawaii while playing at the Division I, Division II and NAIA levels.
