### NO. 23/24 BYU FACES SAN DIEGO STATE IN MWC SEMIFINALS

No. 23/24 BYU (26-6, 14-2 MWC) will continue its run in the 2008 Phillips 66 Mountain West Conference Championship with a semifinal matchup against fourth-seeded San Diego State (20-11, 9-7 MWC) on Friday at 6:30 PT (7:30 p.m. MT) at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas. BYU has won 14 of its last 15 games, including an 89-62 win over ninth-seeded Colorado State in the MWC Tournament quarterfinals on Thursday. Friday's game will be televised on CBS College Sports (formerly CSTV). The radio broadcast can be heard on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM / 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City and on the Internet at KSL.com beginning with the pregame show at 5:30 p.m. PT (6:30 MT).

#### UP NEXT

If BYU wins, the Cougars will advance to the MWC Tournament Championship game on Saturday. The game will begin at 4 p.m. PT (5 p.m. MT) and be televised nationally on VERSUS.

#### COUGAR QUICK HITS

- No. 23/24 BYU became the first MWC team to win two outright league titles with a 14-2 record in conference play. The Cougars also won the MWC crown outright last season.
- BYU won its second straight league title with a one-game improvement over last year's 13-3 record, setting a league record with 14 conference victories. The Cougars also improved their margin from last season to this year, winning the title by two games over UNLV this year after just a one-game margin last season.
- With a 25-6 overall regular-season record, the Cougars set a program record for regular-season victories.
- BYU was 6-2 on the road in conference play, winning four straight between losses at UNLV and San Diego State. Overall, BYU is 8-4 in away games this season and 2-2 on a neutral floor. BYU's road victory marks in overall and league play tie MWC records.
- Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose helped make BYU the second-most improved program in the nation in his first season with a 20-9 record and guided the Cougars to the outright MWC title and a top-25 ranking in his second campaign in Provo as the Cougars went 25-9 last season. With a 26-6 record this season, Rose helped BYU tie for the best 32-game mark in program history. The Cougars have also been nationally ranked in back-to-back seasons.
- Junior Lee Cummond became BYU's fourth MWC Player of the Year in the nine-year history of the league as he earned Co-Player of the Year honors this season along with New Mexico's J.R. Giddens. Cummond and junior Trent Plaisted were named to the All-MWC First Team while sophomore Jonathan Tavernari earned third-team honors.

**BYU IN THE TOURNAMENT**

With their quarterfinal win over Colorado State, the Cougars have a 10-7 Mountain West Conference Tournament record. BYU advanced to the finals in the first two years of the MWC Tournament, winning the title over UNM in 2001 after losing to host UNLV in 2000. BYU then went five years without a finals appearance until losing to host UNLV in the 2007 Championship game. BYU has won its quarterfinal game in six of the nine MWC Tournaments. BYU has a 3-2 semifinals record and 1-2 finals record in MWC Tournament play. During the five years the MWC Tournament has been played in Las Vegas (2000-03, 2007), BYU has posted a 9-4 tournament record, with three finals appearances and one title (2001). BYU had a 1-3 tournament record during the three years the championship was conducted in Denver (2004-06). Overall, BYU has a 22-20 record in conference tournament games, which includes a 12-13 record in WAC Tournament games. BYU has played every MWC team in the MWC Tournament.

**MWC TITLE GOES THROUGH BYU**

In seven of the first eight years of the Mountain West Tournament, BYU or the team that has knocked the Cougars out of the tournament won the title, including a championship game loss last season to host UNLV. 2006 was the first time that trend did not continue as San Diego State won the title after BYU was knocked out by Utah in the quarterfinals. After losing in the title game to host UNLV at the inaugural MWC Tournament in 2000, BYU won the title in 2001. The next four years the Cougars were knocked out by the eventual champion. BYU was defeated by San Diego State in the 2002 quarterfinals before back-to-back semifinal losses to 2003-champion Colorado State and 2004-champion Utah. In 2005, New Mexico went on to win the title after defeating BYU in the quarterfinals.

**EIGHT MWC TOURNAMENTS, SIX DIFFERENT CHAMPIONS**

San Diego State became the first team in the MWC to win the Tournament title twice with its victories in 2002 and 2006. UNLV became the second with victories in 2000 and 2007, both over BYU. New Mexico's win in 2005 marked the sixth Tournament winner in the first six years of the event. The only teams not to win an MWC title are Wyoming, Air Force and TCU, who made its MWC debut in 2005.

**BYU SEEDS AT MWC TOURNAMENT**

BYU has been the No. 1 seed at the MWC Tournament in each of the past two seasons after winning back-to-back outright MWC titles. The Cougars are 3-1 as the top seed including their quarterfinal win over Colorado State this year (finals appearance in 2007). BYU has been the second seed three times (5-2 combined record in 2001, 2003 and 2004, including 2001 title). The 2006 Tournament was the first time that the Cougars have been the No. 3 seed in the MWC Tournament (first-round loss to Utah). The Cougars have also been the fourth seed once (suffering a first-round exit with loss to eventual-champion San Diego State in 2002), the sixth seed once (advanced to the finals in 2000) and the No. 7 seed once (2005 first-round loss to eventual-champion New Mexico).

**FRUITS OF THE SEEDS**

In the first eight years of the MWC Tournament, the teams with the No. 2 seed boasts the best mark at 13-5 while the No. 1 seed has gone 12-6. The No. 6 seeds have a combined 8-7 record while their first-round opponent No. 3 seeds have a 6-7 record. No. 4 teams have gone 8-8. Fifth-seeded teams are 4-6. The No. 7 team won for the first time in 2006 and now has a 2-8 record. The No. 8 seed has a 2-0 record in first round games and a 3-7 record overall. The No. 9 seed is 0-2 in the first round game. 2006 marked the first time the No. 7 seed has advanced past the quarterfinals and the first time neither the No. 2 nor No. 3 seed advanced to the semifinals. The Tournament title has been won by the second seed three times (BYU in 2001, New Mexico in 2005 and UNLV in 2007); the top seed twice (UNLV in 2000 and San Diego State in 2006); the third seed once (Utah in 2004); the fifth seed once (San Diego State in 2002); and the sixth seed once (Colorado State in 2004).

**BYU TOURNAMENT TITLES**

BYU won the MWC Tournament title in 2001 over New Mexico. BYU won WAC Tournament titles in 1991 and 1992. The Cougars' Kevin Nixon hit a dramatic three-quarter-court shot at the buzzer to defeat UTEP, 73-71, in Fort Collins, Colo., for the 1992 title. BYU won its first WAC Tournament title in 1991 with an overtime win over Utah. The Cougars also won the postseason conference playoff series in the Rocky Mountain Conference in 1924 (defeated Colorado College, 2-1) and 1933 (defeated Wyoming, 2-1).

**AT THE THOMAS & MACK CENTER ...**

UNLV and BYU are the only teams with winning MWC Tournament records at the Thomas & Mack Center. UNLV has reached the championship game every year it has been eligible at the Thomas and Mack. Below are the win totals and records for the nine MWC teams in the five previous tournaments held at the Thomas and Mack Center (note: UNLV was ineligible for tournament play in 2001, and TCU has only played one tournament in Las Vegas) :

**MWC TEAMS IN THE NCAA**

In the previous eight years of the MWC, eight of the nine conference members have advanced to the NCAA Tournament at least once. TCU is the lone team not to advance, but the Horned Frogs have only been MWC members for three seasons. New Mexico became the last of the other MWC teams to earn a spot in the NCAA Tournament by winning the 2005 MWC Tournament. 2007 MWC Tournament Champion UNLV received the league's automatic bid last season while BYU was selected as an at-large team.

**BYU AND MWC IN POSTSEASON**

BYU has earned an invite to a postseason tournament in seven of the previous eight years of the MWC, leading all MWC teams. BYU is second to Utah in NCAA appearances since the formation of the MWC (BYU has made four NCAA and three NIT while Utah has made five NCAA and one NIT). UNLV has received five invites (two NCAA, four NIT). New Mexico has received four (one NCAA, three NIT) along with San Diego State (two NCAA, two NIT) and Air Force (two NCAA and two NIT). Wyoming has three (one NCAA, two NIT) while Colorado State has been to one NCAA Tournament.

**CUMMARD, PLAISTED NAMED NABC ALL-DISTRICT**

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (March 4, 2008) – BYU juniors Lee Cummard and Trent Plaisted were honored Tuesday by the National Association of Basketball Coaches as both were named to the NABC All-District 13 First Team. The dual honors marks the first time since 1988 that two Cougars were selected to the First Team in the same season.

In all, 150 student-athletes representing 15 districts were recognized as the nation's best men's collegiate basketball players as voted on by members of the NABC.

"Both Lee and Trent are very deserving of this honor," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "They've worked really hard and greatly improved their respective games. They are a big part of the success of our team."

Cummard and Plaisted are two of seven student-athletes to represent the MWC and two of four players from a Utah university to earn all-district accolades this season.

Joining the pair on the District 13 First Team are New Mexico's J.R. Giddens, Nevada's Marcelus Kemp and Boise State's Reggie Larry. District 13 Second Team members include Lorenzo Wade of San Diego State, Stefon Jackson of UTEP, Kevin Bell of Fresno State, Brandon Ewing of Wyoming and Luke Nevill of Utah, both of whom also earned second-team honors last season. UNLV's Wink Adams was named to the District 15 Second Team, while Utah State's Jaycee Carroll was honored as a second-team member of District 14.

Student-athletes selected to the all-district teams are now eligible for the NABC Division I All-America teams to be announced at the conclusion of the 2007-08 NCAA regular season.

Located in Kansas City, Mo., the NABC was founded in 1927 by Phog Allen, the legendary basketball coach at the University of Kansas. Allen, a student of James Naismith, the inventor of basketball, organized coaches into this collective group to serve as Guardians of the Game. The NABC currently claims nearly 5,000 members consisting primarily of university and college men's basketball coaches.

BYU players have received all-district recognition 84 times by the NABC since 1950. Keena Young was the most recent addition to the list as he earned first-team honors last season. Prior to this year, BYU had not had two first-team selections since Michael Smith and Jeff Chatman were so honored in 1988.

**USBWA HONORS CUMMARD AND PLAISTED**

PROVO, Utah (March 11, 2008) – After leading the Cougars to their second straight outright Mountain West Conference title and the second-best record in program history, BYU's Lee Cummard and Trent Plaisted have been named to the U.S. Basketball Writers Association District VIII Team.

The USBWA announced men's all-district teams in nine regions from coast to coast, based on voting from its national membership. Each team consists of a coach of the year and 10 student-athletes, including the player of the year. District VIII represents the top players from teams in Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, Nevada, Idaho, Montana and Wyoming.

Honors have poured in this season for the pair. In addition to USBWA All-District recognition, both were named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District First Team. The Cougars' "dynamic duo" were selected All-MWC First Team.

Joining Cummard and Plaisted on the District VIII Team are New Mexico's J.R. Giddens, who was named the Player of the Year, along with fellow-MWC players Wink Adams of UNLV and Brandon Ewing of Wyoming. The team is rounded out by Utah State's Jaycee Carroll, New Mexico State's Justin Hawkins, Nevada's Marcelus Kemp, Boise State's Reggie Larry and Montana State's Carlos Taylor. UNLV head coach Lon Kruger received Coach of the Year honors.

With the selection of Cummard and Plaisted, BYU has had six USBWA all-district honorees in the last six years. Former Cougar forward Keena Young was so honored last season while Plaisted was selected in 2006, former center Rafael Araujo was honored in 2004 and former Cougar swingman Travis Hansen was named to the team in 2003.

**BYU'S SEES THREE HONORED WITH MWC ACCOLADES**

The Mountain West Conference announced its 2007-08 men's basketball awards Monday. The league's nine men's head coaches along with selected media picked the all-conference teams, as well as the coach, player, freshman and defensive awards. BYU's **Lee Cummard** was selected as the Co-Player of the Year along with New Mexico senior J.R. Giddens, marking the fourth time in MWC history that the top player award has gone to a Cougar. Overall, Cummard is the ninth BYU player to earn conference Player of the Year honors (John Fairchild, 1965, WAC; Danny Ainge, 1981, WAC; Devin Durrant, 1983, WAC; Timo Saarelainen, 1985, WAC; Michael Smith, 1988, WAC; Mekeli Wesley, 2001, MWC; Rafael Araujo, 2004, MWC; Keena Young, 2007, MWC). In addition to the major awards, three All-MWC teams were announced as Cummard and **Trent Plaisted** were named to the All-MWC First Team and **Jonathan Tavernari** was honored with a third-team selection. The last time BYU had two first-team all-conference honorees was in the 2000-01 season when Mekeli Wesley and Terrell Lyday were so honored.

# MWC Tourney in Las Vegas

**LOOKING AT SAN DIEGO STATE**

The San Diego State Aztecs finished the regular season 19-11 overall on the year and 9-7 in Mountain West Conference play, making them the fourth seed. SDSU improved to 20-11 overall this year with a 53-49 win over Air Force in the MWC Tournament quarterfinals on Thursday. The Aztecs return three starters among eight letterwinners from last year's team that finished 22-11 overall and tied for third in the MWC with a 10-6 record. Junior forward Lorenzo Wade leads the team with 15.1 points per game, seventh in the league, on 45.9 percent shooting from the field while adding 4.6 rebounds and 3.4 assists per game. Junior forward Ryan Amoroso paces the Aztecs with 6.7 rpg while adding 10.8 points per game, third on the team. True freshman Billy White has also come on strong lately for SDSU, earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors while posting 8.8 points and 6.6 rebounds per contests. The Aztecs have gotten solid production from true freshman D.J. Gay, who has started 24 games and is averaging 1.8 assists per contest. Gay led SDSU with 17 points at AFA. The Aztecs are without the services of junior forward Kyle Spain, who is second on the team scoring 13.2 ppg and third with 5.4 rpg in 20 contests but has been suspended for the remainder of the season. As a team, the Aztecs are averaging 68.3 points per game on 44.7 percent shooting from the field, including a 33.7 percent conversion rate from three-point range. SDSU is holding opponents to 63.5 ppg on 43.9 percent shooting from the field. The Aztecs rebound their foes, 34.6-31.1.

**SAN DIEGO STATE'S LAST OUTING — AZTECS HOLD OFF FALCONS**

LAS VEGAS (AP) - Lorenzo Wade sank four free throws and grabbed a critical rebound in the final seven seconds, allowing San Diego State to edge Air Force 53-49 Thursday in the Mountain West Conference tournament quarterfinals. The Aztecs (20-11) advanced to face No. 24 BYU in the semifinals despite making just two baskets in the final 16:07, both of them by Richie Williams. The Aztecs have three consecutive 20-win seasons for the first time since 1938-41. It appeared as though Wade might be lamenting a loss instead of celebrating a win after he charged into Andrew Henke with 20.1 seconds left and the Aztecs clinging to a 49-48 lead. Instead of playing for the last shot, however, the Falcons (16-14) broke San Diego State's press and Anwar Johnson, who didn't score any points, darted to the basket only to miss the layup. San Diego State got the ball and Wade was fouled and sank both free throws for a 51-48 lead with seven seconds left. Tim Anderson, who led Air Force with 17 points, was fouled before he could get off a game-tying 3-pointer. He sank his first free throw and missed his second. Wade skied above the outstretched arms of three Falcons to pull down the rebound and draw another foul. He sank both shots and finished with 12 points, including a career-best 10 of them from the stripe. Ryan Amoroso led the Aztecs with 15 points, including a career-high nine free throws. Overall, the Aztecs made 20-of-22 free throws - critically important against a deliberate, disciplined team like Air Force that makes every possession precious. San Diego State's three lowest-scoring outputs of the season all came against the Falcons, who beat them 46-43 Saturday. The Aztecs jumped out to a 16-point lead in the first half and took a 32-21 lead into the locker room before going cold. Williams' basket with 16:07 left made it 39-30 but the Aztecs wouldn't make another field goal until Williams, who scored 12 points, hit a floater with 2:20 remaining. That gave San Diego State a 47-46 lead after the Falcons had taken their first and only lead of the game on Anderson's three-point play with 2:45 left. Henke added 16 points for the Falcons, who fell to 0-9 all-time in the Mountain West Conference tournament and 4-22 in conference postseason play. They've lost 16 consecutive opening-round league tournament games, including the last seven by an average of not even five points.

**SERIES NOTES**

BYU owns a 41-21 advantage over the Aztecs in a series that dates back to 1941 including a 59-56 win in Provo earlier this season and a 69-65 setback in San Diego in late February. The Cougars posted an 80-58 win in Provo and an 86-74 loss at SDSU last season. The Cougars are 26-3 in Provo, 15-17 in San Diego and 0-1 at a neutral site. BYU's last win in San Diego was on Jan. 2, 2003 with an 80-69 win. BYU has won 14 of the last 22 games and owns an 11-8 advantage since the inception of the MWC, but the Aztecs had won three straight before BYU's win in the 2006 season finale between the two teams in the Marriott Center. SDSU's three game victory streak matched its longest ever in the series when the Aztecs won the first three outings (two in 1941 and one in 1977). During the most recent three-game streak, SDSU swept the 2005 season series - the first season sweep over BYU since 1985. Dave Rose is 3-3 against the Aztecs.

**THIS YEAR AT BYU — COUGARS TOPPLE LEAGUE-LEADING AZTECS**

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 23, 2008) – With the second-longest active home winning streak on the line, the BYU men's basketball team did what it needed to do get a win over San Diego State at the Marriott Center on Wednesday night. The Cougars toppled the top team in the Mountain West Conference, 59-56, to run their homecourt streak to 41 straight victories. The Cougars continued their shooting struggles, hitting just 34 percent from the field and shooting just 12-of-22 from the line, but a double-double night from BYU junior Trent Plaisted and solid defense at the end of the game nudged the Cougars past the Aztecs. Plaisted finished with 17 points and 11 rebounds. BYU junior Lee Cummard followed his lead with 12 points and six boards. Junior forward Lorenzo Wade dominated the Aztec stat sheet with 21 points, eight rebounds and a 9-of-10 night from the free-throw line. With less than 40 seconds left in the game and BYU up 57-56, the six-foot-six Cummard posted up the five-foot-ten Richie Williams, but Cummard missed the shot off the glass. The Aztecs went to Spain on the ensuing possession, but his first shot was off the mark. Spain got his own rebound but missed that shot as well. The Cougars regained possession with less than seven seconds left. Sam Burgess got fouled and hit his two free throws to give the Cougars a 59-56 lead. The Aztecs got one more crack at it with 2.9 seconds left, heaving the inbounds pass the distance of the court. Aztec center Ryan Amoroso grabbed the pass and attempted a fade-away three-pointer but missed off the back of the rim. Despite an exciting finish for BYU, the Cougars got off to a sluggish start, shooting just 31 percent from the field in the first half. BYU has shot 40 percent or below in the first half of its past six games. Midway through the first half the Aztecs had a seven-point lead behind the solid play Wade, who scored 10 of the Aztecs' first 26 points. But as the half came to a close, Cummard nailed a fade-away jumper from the baseline to make the score 27-28. This was the first time the Cougars have been down at the half in the Marriott Center since Dec. 30, 2006 against Seton Hall. Cummard led the way for the Cougars at the break, scoring seven points and nabbing three rebounds. Plaisted and Tavernari were tied with six points apiece. Wade, who scored 10 points in the half, was the only player on either team with double-digit points. Plaisted got the first points of the second half, giving the Cougars a 29-28 lead. With 16:16 to go in the second half, a steal by Ben Murdock led to a layup at the other end of the court by Plaisted, giving BYU a 33-28 advantage. The Aztecs answered with two break-away dunks and a shot by Wade to grab the 33-35 lead. A back-and-forth battle ensued, with both teams exchanging buckets, until a Jimmer Fredette three-pointer gave the Cougars a 50-44 lead. But two quick baskets, one by Kyle Spain and the other by Wade, got the Aztecs to within two points. Unfortunately for the Aztecs, that was as close as they would get.

- "San Diego State is a good team. We knew that coming in. They are a talented, athletic, young team."

- Individual Career Highs: Ben Murdock – 5 rebounds (tied).
- With the win, BYU improved its Marriott Center win streak to 41 games, the second-longest active home court victory streak in the nation behind No. 1 Memphis at 42 wins.
- After beginning the year 0-4 when scoring less than 70 points, BYU has now won its last two games when coming short of the 70-point threshold, including a 59-56 win over SDSU and a 55-52 victory at Utah.
- The three-point margin of victory for BYU (59-56) is the closest game the Cougars have had in the Marriott Center since a 75-72 victory over UNLV on Feb. 11, 2006.
- The Cougars defeated the league-leading Aztecs despite recording their lowest shooting percentage (34.4) in the Marriott Center since shooting 30 percent in a 59-58 loss to Wyoming on Feb. 12, 2005.
- With a 28-27 advantage after the first 20 minutes of play, San Diego State became just the fourth team this season to post a halftime lead against the Cougars. Prior to the SDSU game, the Cougars had not trailed at the break at home since an eight-point (43-35) deficit against Seton Hall on Dec. 30, 2006, a game the Cougars won, 77-68. BYU is now 1-3 this season when trailing at halftime.
- After making just three three-pointers in each of the last two games, BYU hit three treys in the first 11 minutes of the first half against San Diego State, getting makes from Cummard, Murdock and Jimmer Fredette. Three of BYU's first five buckets in the game came from long range.
- Cummard has recorded a three-pointer in 17 of 19 games this year while Tavernari has done so in 16 games, Burgess has hit from behind the arc in 14 games and Jimmer Fredette has made a trey in 13 games this season.
- BYU is now 7-1 this season when at least four players score in double figures (Plaisted – 17, Cummard – 12, Fredette – 11, Tavernari – 10)
- Plaisted got back into the double-figure scoring column against the league-leading Aztecs with 17 points. After beginning the year scoring in double figures in the first 14 games, he had reached double-digits just once in the last four games prior to breaking out against SDSU. Plaisted scored the first six points of the second half to turn a 27-28 halftime deficit into a 33-28 Cougar lead. Now at 1,121 career points, Plaisted moved from 31st to 28th on BYU's all-time scoring list with his 17-point outing.
- Plaisted added 11 rebounds in the game for his fifth double-double of the season and 14th of his career.
- Cummard's free-throw miss at the 13:53 mark in the second half ended a streak of 21 straight free-throw makes for the junior. Cummard is still shooting 88.7 percent (47-of-53) from the line on the year after a 3-for-5 performance against the Aztecs.
- True freshman Jimmer Fredette provided a huge spark off the bench for BYU as he scored 11 points on 4-for-8 shooting from the field (3-for-5 from three-point range), the sixth time this season he has scored in double figures, including three of the last seven games.

**THIS YEAR AT SAN DIEGO STATE — BYU SUFFERS CLOSE LOSS AT SAN DIEGO STATE**

SAN DIEGO (Feb. 23, 2008) – Reminiscent of its defeat in San Diego last season, the BYU men's basketball team suffered a close 69-65 loss to San Diego State on Saturday, breaking its nine-game winning streak. With the loss the Cougars fall to 21-6 on the season and 10-2 in Mountain West Conference play. "We just needed a couple more plays to go our way and it would have been a different game," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "We got some good looks at the basket and had a chance in the second half to open things up a little bit, but things didn't go out way." Lee Cummard led BYU with 20 points, his fifth 20-point game in the last eight outings. Also scoring in double figures was Jonathan Tavernari with 12 points and Sam Burgess with 11 points. Cold shooting plagued the Cougars early, giving SDSU a 7-0 lead. Tavernari put BYU on the scoreboard with a running lay-in at the 15:45 mark. Burgess followed with a three-point make to quickly cut into BYU's deficit. Turnovers and the inability to secure rebounds allowed SDSU to reestablish its lead at 15-5. With 11:30 to play in the first half, Chris Collinsworth's three-point make helped spark BYU's own 10-2 run. Michael Loyd contributed to the run, scoring only his second field-goal this season against a MWC opponent. The Cougars found themselves down by only two points after a Cummard make from beyond-the-arc. "We got some good help off the bench and put ourselves in a position where we could get back in the game at the half," said Rose. "I thought those guys came in with good energy and focus." Poor free-throw shooting by SDSU opened things up for Cummard, as he scored back-to-back field goals to both tie and give the Cougars their first lead of the game with 3:29 remaining in the first half. Holding a two-point lead as the clock ran down, a dunk by SDSU's Billy White tied the game at 29-29, marking the first time BYU has been tied heading into the break this season. With the second half underway, neither team could miss a shot. A combination of four BYU three-pointers by Tavernari, Burgess and Cummard, and 10 points by the Aztecs' Lorenzo Wade, gave the Cougars a 46-41 advantage. Jimmer Fredette soon added a three of his own with 13:15 remaining. Chris Miles converted a big three-point play for BYU after he laid it in with the foul. A make from the charity stripe increased the Cougars' lead to 52-47. As SDSU continued to make shots, Tavernari was there to answer, scoring BYU's next five points. The Cougars had no defensive response for Wade, as he continued to makes shots, giving SDSU a one-point lead with 4:57 to play. Playing with four fouls, Cummard put BYU up 61-60 on a made jumper, cutting into the Aztecs' run. Untimely miscues and missed shots kept the Cougars from retaking the lead as the clock wound down to under four minutes. Down by four, Tavernari's running lay-in off a SDSU steal put the score at 65-63 in favor of the Aztecs. With one minute remaining in the game, Cummard went to the sidelines for good, receiving his fifth foul on the night.

**BYU NOTES FROM THIS YEAR AT SAN DIEGO STATE**

– BYU's season-best nine-game victory streak ends at the hands of the Aztecs. Last year SDSU also halted a season-best string of eight straight Cougar wins with a win in San Diego.  
 – The Cougars' nine straight wins (@ Utah, San Diego State, New Mexico, @ Air Force, @ Wyoming, TCU, @ CSU, UNLV, Utah) is their longest winning streak since 2003-04 when BYU also recorded nine straight wins. BYU has won at least six straight MWC games in each of Dave Rose's three seasons at the helm.  
 – The 29-29 tie at the half marks the first time this year BYU has entered the break even on the scoreboard. The Cougars are 20-2 when leading at the half this year and 1-4 when trailing or tied.  
 – BYU has scored at least 30 points in the first half of 22 games while holding opponents under 30 points in the first half of 18 contests.  
 – Lee Cummard scored a team-high 20 points against SDSU. BYU has had at least one player top the 20-point mark in each of the last eight games and has had two players score at least 20 points in the same game in three of the last seven contests.  
 – Jonathan Tavernari made two triples against the Aztecs. He needs to make five more three-pointers to tie the single-season BYU record of 74 set by Andy Toolson in 1990.  
 – Tavernari has contributed more than just points for the Cougars as of late. Tavernari recorded 18 assists in the first 20 games of the season (0.9 apg) but has dished out 21 assists in the last seven contests (3.0 apg), including two against SDSU.  
 – Sam Burgess made 4-of-5 shots, including 3-for-4 from three-point range, against the Aztecs. He finished with 11 points, joining Cummard (20) and Tavernari (12) in double figures.  
 – Even with the loss, BYU is off to its best record since 1992-93 when the Cougars were 22-5 after 27 games. Only four teams at BYU have ever achieved a record better than the Cougars' current 21-6 record.  
 – San Diego State scored the first seven points of the game and the Cougars did not score their first point of the game until the 15:43 mark of the first half.  
 – Lorenzo Wade and Billy White combined to score San Diego State's first 15 points of the game. Wade finished with 28 points, the most points scored against the Cougars this season (previous was 26 points by Jeff Teague of Wake Forest).  
 – The Aztecs missed their first eight three-point field goal attempts of the game, until Kelvin Davis' three with about 13:45 to play in the second half.  
 – The game had two ties and eight lead changes. BYU's biggest lead was seven points at 46-39. The Cougars led 57-51, when the Aztecs used a 12-4 run to regain the lead. BYU lost for the first time in 22 games this year when leading at the five-minute mark of the second half.

**BYU'S LAST OUTING — CUMMARD AND CO. SET TOURNEY RECORDS**

LAS VEGAS (Mar. 13, 2008) – The No. 23 BYU men's basketball team (26-6, 14-2) earned a record-setting 89-62 win over Colorado State (6-25, 0-16) in the first quarterfinal game of the 2008 Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Championship Thursday. The regular-season champion Cougars garnered the victory in the Thomas & Mack Center thanks to double-digit performances from five different scorers. BYU set MWC Tournament records for largest margin of victory (27 points) and highest field-goal percentage (65.2 percent) in the contest. Co-MWC Player of the Year Lee Cummard led all scorers with 18 points in the game. He was followed by senior Sam Burgess with 13, sophomore Jonathan Tavernari and freshman Chris Collinsworth with 12 apiece, and senior Trent Plaisted with 11. Collinsworth added 10 rebounds for the first double-double game of his career while his 12 points and three assists were also personal bests. The first basket of the afternoon was a foreshadowing three-pointer from Tavernari from the left corner. He also scored the next Cougar bucket thanks to a smooth entry pass from Burgess. The No. 9-seeded Rams did not back down from the top-seeded Cougars in the first minutes, though. At the first media timeout CSU led 9-8 after the Rams drained their first shot of the game from behind the arc. At the second media timeout the Rams had a 17-12 advantage thanks to an active defense and great shooting from the perimeter. Still unshaken, BYU regained the lead at 20-19 at the 9:01 mark while tying the team record (256) for threes in the season when freshman Jimmer Fredette connected from beyond the arc. CSU's fourth three-pointer of the half then tipped the scales back in the Rams' direction at 22-20. The Cougars built their second three-point lead of the game at 25-22 on buckets from Burgess and Tavernari, but the Rams made their fifth triple of the game to knot the score at 25. Collinsworth returned the favor with only his fifth three-point make of the season to put BYU back on top and set a new BYU record for threes in a single season. After the initial onslaught from the Rams, BYU made its own run and took a 40-34 lead into the locker room at the break. The tale of the second half was told through Cummard's player-of-the-year performance. The half began with Plaisted's first bucket of the game. His shot was followed by senior Ben Murdock's first trey of the game, propelling BYU to its first double-digit lead of the contest at 45-34. But that was only the beginning. The two teams traded buckets, but turnovers hurt CSU and the confident Cougars continued their attack. Cummard reached double-digits with his second make from behind the arc in as many tries. He then hit a 10-foot fall-away jumper in the lane on the next play for his 14th point. He continued the run with a steal on the defensive end followed by an assist on the break away to Burgess, who made a layup and converted another point at the charity stripe for a three-point play. Cummard kept the drive alive with an assist on a skip pass to Tavernari, who drained his second three from the left wing to give BYU its first 20-point lead of the game at 60-40. He drained his third three-pointer in as many tries to push the lead to 63-40 and blocked a shot on the defensive end of the floor that led to another. With the advantage clearly in BYU's favor, the final 10 minutes saw both teams swapping buckets as the Cougars rested Cummard and his fellow starters.

**WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...****BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

– "It was a very competitive game, especially the first half. I thought that CSU came out and played with a lot of confidence. They ran good sets and were able to get themselves good looks at the basket. I thought we did a better job of getting to their shooters in the second half, which allowed us to contest shots. Then we were able to get out on the break and score some baskets in transition. We were able to play with a lot more confidence, I think in the second half."

– The Cougars are now 10-6 away from the Marriott Center this season, including an 8-4 road record and 2-2 mark on neutral floors. BYU has won seven of its last eight games away from home.  
– BYU is now 22-1 when scoring at least 70 points this year and 22-2 when holding opponents under the 70-point mark. The Cougars are also 10-0 when scoring over 80 points.  
– With 12 three-pointers against the Rams, the Cougars improved their season trey total to 266, setting a new program record (old was 256 set last year). Chris Collinsworth made the record-setting three with 6:12 left in the first half, just his fifth three-point make of the year. The game marked the 11th time this season BYU has posted double-digit triples.  
– Jonathan Tavernari added to his school and MWC sophomore record for threes in a season with two against the Rams, bringing his total to 80.  
– With 13 points against Colorado State, senior co-captain Burgess scored in double figures for the 15th time this season, including five of the last six games. Burgess is averaging 11.8 ppg during that stretch.  
– With a 40-34 advantage after the first 20 minutes of play, BYU recorded its 26th halftime lead of the season. The Cougars are now 24-2 when leading at the break. BYU has scored at least 30 points in the first half of 26 games and topped 40 points in 10 contests. The Cougars' 56.5 percent first-half shooting percentage marked the 10th game this year has shot above 50 percent in the first period of play.  
– CSU's 9-8 lead with 15:26 left in the first half marked the first time this season the Cougars have trailed the Rams.  
– Colorado State used the three-pointer to stay with the Cougars for much of the first half. Five of the Ram's first eight makes in the game came from behind the arc as CSU went 11:19 without making a two-point shot but made five treys during that span to keep the game tied at 25-25.  
– After making seven of their first 15 shots, the Cougars then made 14 of their next 16. Clinging to a 34-32 lead, BYU made 10 straight shots spanning halftime to open up a 60-40 advantage with 14:24 remaining. The Cougars finished the game shooting a season-high 65.2 percent.

### COUGAR SEASON AMONG THE TOP IN SCHOOL HISTORY

BYU has a 26-6 record through 32 games this year. That marks ties the current Cougars with the 1987-88 squad for the best 32-game record in the 105-year history of the program (noting that 69 teams did not total 32 games during the season, including the 20-5 NIT Championship team in 1965-66). (SEE CHART AT LEFT)

### 20-WIN SEASONS

At 26-6 so far this season, BYU has achieved the program's 31st 20-win season, including three straight for Cougar head coach Dave Rose in his first three seasons at the helm. Last year, the Cougars finished 25-9 following a 20-9 campaign in 2005-06. BYU has averaged 20 wins every 2.6 years (BYU has played 80 seasons in which it has played at least 20 games in a season). Rose is the third Cougar head coach to win 20 games in each of his first three years, joining G. Ott Romney and Roger Reid. However, Rose is the first Cougar head coach to win 20 games in each of his first three years after taking over a program with less than 13 wins the prior year. BYU was 9-21 in 2004-05 before Rose turned the program into the second-most improved team in the nation in his first season.

Winning 20 or more games in the regular season has proven to be a significant indicator for receiving an invitation into the NCAA Tournament. Since the first NCAA Tournament in 1939, BYU has had 20 seasons with 20 regular-season wins, including last year's team. In those 20 years, BYU has earned a postseason invite each season, including 17 NCAA bids, three NIT berths (BYU played both NIT and NCAA in 1950-51) and one NAIB (1948-49) invite. In the modern era since the NCAA Tournament became the predominant championship over the NIT, BYU has had 15 seasons when it earned 20 or more wins during regular-season games (prior to starting the conference tournament). The Cougars have received an invite to play in the NCAA Tournament in 14 of those seasons, with the lone exception being the 2005-06 team that finished the regular season 20-7 and fell to 20-8 with a loss at the MWC Tournament before receiving an NIT invitation. Including last year, BYU has reached 21 regular-season wins during 11 of those 15 seasons and has been invited to play in the NCAA Tournament in each of those 11 years.

### COUGARS IN CONFERENCE

With their win against Wyoming, the Cougars secured their 27th regular-season league title. The outright Mountain West Conference crown is the second straight for BYU, making the Cougars the only team in league history to win two outright conference crowns, let alone back-to-back titles. Prior to their current run, the last time the Cougars won back-to-back outright league titles was in the 1978-79 and 1979-80 seasons. With four total MWC titles (two outright and two shared), BYU has tied Utah (one outright, three shared) for the most MWC crowns. BYU basketball boasts a remarkable record of conference success during its history. After earning its 27th regular-season conference championship in 2008, the Cougars are tied for ninth among all NCAA Division I programs for most regular-season league titles won (SEE CHART AT LEFT). Including conference tournaments, BYU has claimed a conference championship trophy during 28 seasons. The Cougars won the 1991 WAC Tournament after a second-place regular-season finish. Other conference tournament titles in 1992 (WAC) and 2001 (MWC) have followed up regular-season rings, as was the case with conference playoff wins in 1924 and 1933 in the Rocky Mountain Conference. BYU won six Rocky Mountain Conference titles in 20 years, earned five Skyline championships in 24 years, recorded 12 WAC crowns in 37 years and has garnered MWC honors in four of the league's first nine seasons. BYU won the in-state title against rivals Utah and Utah State during 10 of the 12 years before the Cougars first joined a conference in 1918.

### COACH ROSE OWNS TOP MWC MARK

With a 39-9 record in Mountain West Conference games since taking the helm of the BYU program for the 2005-06 season, Dave Rose is currently the winningest MWC coach in league play in the past three years. UNLV's Lon Kruger is 36-14 and SDSU's Steve Fisher is 32-16. In addition to this year's 14-2 MWC record, Rose coached the Cougars to a 13-3 league and 25-9 overall record last year, earning Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year honors for the second consecutive season. He was named the MWC and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year in his first season after coaching BYU to a second-place MWC finish at 12-4 while turning a 9-21 team into a 20-9 success—which proved to be the second-best improvement among all Division I programs.

### COUGARS SET RECORD FOR REGULAR-SEASON WINS

This year's BYU team set the program record for regular-season wins, becoming the first Cougar squad ever to achieve 25 victories prior to the start of postseason play. Three BYU teams reached the 24-win mark while last year's Cougars racked up 23 wins in the regular season. (SEE CHART AT LEFT)

**BYU AND THE NATIONAL RANKINGS**

The BYU men's basketball team has re-entered the top-25 rankings in the last three weeks, earning a No. 23 ranking in this week's ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll and a No. 24 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. The Cougars fell out of the top-25 polls released on Dec. 31 after a 73-70 road loss at Boise State. BYU appeared in the top-25 rankings the previous five weeks. In the Dec. 24 polls, BYU was ranked 20th in the AP Poll and 21st in the Coaches Poll. This season BYU first entered the national rankings on Nov. 26, earning the program's earliest appearance in the national polls since the 1980-81 season when the Cougars entered the rankings at No. 21 in the AP Poll and No. 23 in the Coaches Poll. In his third year guiding the program, Rose has seen his team earn the respect of the national voters for the second consecutive season. Last year, BYU entered the polls on Feb. 19 to receive the program's first national ranking since 1993. BYU finished last year ranked No. 24 in the final AP Poll, something a Cougar team had not accomplished since 1988. BYU has now been ranked in back-to-back season for the first time since 1980-81 and 1981-82. The Nov. 26 entry into the national rankings marks the earliest the Cougars have been included in the polls since receiving a No. 18 ranking in the 1980-81 AP preseason poll. It also marked the first time BYU's football and men's basketball teams have been nationally ranked the same week in the AP poll since Dec. 28, 1992. The Cougar basketball program has now been ranked in the AP Poll during 16 seasons since its first national ranking in 1950-51 (see list below).

**BYU AS A RANKED TEAM**

BYU owns a 141-57 record as a ranked team. The Cougars are 81-12 at home, 38-28 on the road and 22-17 at neutral sites when nationally ranked. BYU's victory at Portland on Dec. 1 marked the Cougars' first road win as a ranked team since an 84-63 victory at UTEP on March 4, 1993 when BYU was ranked No. 21. BYU is 14-5 as a ranked team under Dave Rose.

**VS. RANKED TEAMS**

BYU's victory over No. 6 Louisville on Nov. 23 marked the highest-ranked team the Cougars have defeated since beating No. 2 St. Joseph's, 103-83, on Dec. 21, 1965. BYU is now 50-111 all-time against teams ranked in the Associated Press Poll and 1-2 this season including a 73-63 loss to No. 1 North Carolina in the championship game of the Findlay Toyota Las Vegas Invitational on Nov. 24 and a 68-61 loss to No. 9 Michigan State at EnergySolutions Arena in Salt Lake City on Dec. 8. Prior to the UNC game, the Cougars had not faced the nation's top-ranked team since Dec. 23, 1992, an 89-66 loss to No. 1 Duke at the Maui Invitational. The Cougars were 3-3 in their games vs. ranked teams last year with a 78-70 loss at then-No. 25 and eventual Sweet-16 participant UNLV in the MWC Tournament Championship game, a 62-58 victory at then-No. 20 Air Force, a 90-63 win over then-No. 25 UNLV, a 61-52 win over then-No. 13 Air Force, an 82-69 loss at then-No. 5 UCLA and a 76-61 neutral court loss against then-No. 25 Michigan St.

**PLAYING THE BEST**

BYU's game against No. 9 Michigan State on Dec. 8 was its third game in three weeks against a top-10 opponent, including a victory over No. 6 Louisville on Nov. 23 and a loss to No. 1 North Carolina on Nov. 24. BYU has played at least three regular-season games against top-10 opponents in a season just six times previously in program history with the last coming in 1983-84. Only twice previously have the Cougars played three top-10 teams during a three-week stretch, once in 1990-91 with a loss to No. 9 Utah on March 2, a win over No. 8 Utah on March 9 in the WAC Tournament and a loss to No. 8 Arizona on March 16 in the NCAA Tournament and once in 1980-81 with a victory over No. 9 Utah on March 7 in the WAC Tournament, a win over No. 10 UCLA on March 14 in the NCAA Tournament, a victory over No. 7 Notre Dame on March 19 in the NCAA Tourney and a loss to No. 5 Virginia on March 21 in the NCAAs.

## BYU TEAM RECORDS/MILESTONES

**Homecourt Win Streak** – BYU's current 47-game home winning streak is a new program record, surpassing the mark of 44 straight home wins set from Feb. 19, 2000 to Jan. 16, 2003.

**Regular-Season Victories** – With a 25-6 overall record, this year's Cougar team is the first BYU team in program history to win 25 games prior to postseason play.

**Scoring Margin/Season** – With a +11.8 scoring margin this season, the Cougars are on pace to post their largest scoring margin since recording a +12.6 mark in 1966 and the third-highest margin in program history.

**3-Pointers Made/Season** – With 266 three-pointers made this year, BYU has set a new program record in that category, surpassing the old record of 256 three-pointers set last year.

**Assist to FG Ratio/Season** – 65.8 percent of BYU's field goals this season have been assisted, a mark which would surpass the Cougar record of 64.7 percent set in 1992-93.

**3FG Percentage/Game** – BYU's 81.3 percent (13-of-16) three-point shooting against New Mexico established a new Cougar record with a minimum of 10 treys made. The mark is sixth all-time in program history overall.

## MWC TEAM RECORDS/MILESTONES

**Scoring Margin/Season** – With a +11.8 scoring margin in overall play, BYU could rank third all-time in that category including New Mexico's +12.3 mark this year. The 2006-07 Air Force squad holds the record at +13.0. The Cougars' +8.6 scoring margin in league play is fifth all-time in MWC history in that category. The 2004-05 Utah squad holds the record at +12.1.

**3-Pointers/MWC Season** – The Cougars' 124 treys in league play ranks fourth all-time in conference history.

**Rebounds/Season** – With 1,266 rebounds overall this season, BYU currently ranks fourth in league history in that category. The Cougars could have a chance to break the record of 1,302 rebounds set by UNLV in 1999-2000.

**Rebounds/MWC Season** – The Cougars set a new MWC record with 618 rebounds in league play this season, surpassing the mark of 604 set by Wyoming in 2005-06.

**Assists/Season** – BYU has recorded 553 assists this season, currently second all-time in league history. The Cougars could have a chance to set the league record of 623 assists held by the 1999-00 UNLV team.

**Assists/MWC Season** – BYU's 259 assists in league play is third all-time in league history.

**Road Wins/Season** – With an 8-4 road record this year, BYU has tied the league record for road wins, which is also held by UNLV (2006-07) and Air Force (2003-04) at eight wins. The Cougars' win at TCU on Saturday also tied them for the most road wins in league play with six.

## BYU INDIVIDUAL RECORDS/MILESTONES

**3-Pointers Made/Season** – Jonathan Tavernari set the single-season BYU three-point record with 80 treys this year. Tavernari also set the BYU record for three-point attempts in a season with 214.

## MWC INDIVIDUAL RECORDS

**3FG Made/ Season (Sophomore)** – With 80 treys this season, Jonathan Tavernari set the MWC sophomore record for three-pointers in a season.

## COUGARS BY THE NUMBERS

**1** Rank of BYU coach Dave Rose's 71 wins and .747 winning percentage among the 18 head coaches who began their first season as a head coach at the Division I level along with Rose in 2005-06. Rose ranks second to only Tennessee's Bruce Pearl (75-22 record) among all coaches who started at a new school in 2005-06.

**7** Number of points Trent Plaisted needs to surpass Marty Haws to move to 14th on BYU's all-time career scoring list. Plaisted currently has 1,331 career points.

**7** Number of overall season statistical categories in which a BYU player ranks among the top three in the MWC out of the 12 categories tracked by the league.

**7** Number of overall season statistical categories in which Lee Cummard ranks among the top 10 in the MWC including field-goal percentage (1st), scoring (5th), free-throw percentage (2nd), offensive rebounds (7th), total rebounds (5th), assists (6th) and defensive rebounds (5th).

**12** Number of games in which Lee Cummard has been perfect from the free-throw line out of 25 games in which he taken free throws. Cummard made a career-best 21 straight free throws before missing on his first attempt against San Diego State. He also had a streak of 19 straight earlier this year prior to a miss against Southern Utah.

**17.2** The Cougars' average margin of victory in their 26 wins this season. BYU has won nine games by more than 20 points, including two by more than 30. The Cougars' 40-point win at Long Beach State to begin the year was BYU's largest margin of victory over a Division I opponent since defeating Morgan State by 41 points (110-69) on Dec. 28, 1995.

**21** Number of times this season BYU has held its opponents under 30 points in the first half. The Cougars have scored at least 30 first-half points in 26 of 32 games this season while racking up halftime leads in 26 of 32 games, including 15 by double digits.

**24** Number of games in which BYU has led by double digits. The Cougars have also led by at least 20 points in 16 contests and 30 points in five. BYU has led wire-to-wire in 14 games this year.

**29** Number of games this season Lee Cummard and Jonathan Tavernari have each made a three-pointer. Sam Burgess has made a trey in 26 of 32 outings this year while Jimmer Fredette has done so in 23 games.

**32** Number of starts made this season by Sam Burgess after the senior made just one start in his two prior seasons as a Cougar. Fellow senior Ben Murdock has also started all 32 games after not starting last year in his first season in Provo.

**50** This year marks the first time in program history a BYU team has had three players hit at least 50 three-pointers. Jonathan Tavernari (80), Lee Cummard (55) and Sam Burgess (54) have all surpassed that mark this year.

**65.8** Percent of BYU field goals created by an assist. The program record is 64.7 percent achieved in 1992-93.

**80** Number of treys Jonathan Tavernari has hit this season, a new BYU single-season record. Tavernari's 80 treys have also set the sophomore MWC record.

**87** Number of MWC games BYU has won since the formation of the league prior to the 1999-2000 season, leading all MWC teams. The Cougars also lead the league in most overall wins (188).

**96.2** Percent of games BYU has won this year when leading with five minutes remaining. The Cougars are 25-1 when ahead on the scoreboard at the 5-minute mark. BYU held a one-point lead at SDSU when the clock ticked 5:00 to go before Lorenzo Wade hit a jumper 3 seconds later to give the Aztecs the advantage. SDSU held on for the win.

**DEFENDING THE HOME COURT**

BYU has won a school-record 47 straight games in the Marriott Center. The Cougars set the record with their 67-59 win over Utah in the Marriott Center on Feb. 20, their 45th straight home win. The streak also ranks first nationally. The Cougars are 16-0 at home this year and won 17 home games last season after going 14-1 at home in 2005-06. BYU's last home loss was in the 2005-06 season opener against Loyola Marymount. BYU has since won 23 straight over nonconference opponents and 24 consecutive over MWC foes. BYU's last league loss at home was its season finale in 2005 to UNLV. BYU is 419-116 (.783) all-time in the Marriott Center, and Cougar head coach Dave Rose is 47-1. Prior to the current streak, BYU's longest homecourt victory streak was 44 games from Feb 19, 2000 to Jan 16, 2003.

**ON THE ROAD**

The Cougars are 8-4 in true road games this year with a 6-2 record in Mountain West Conference play, tying league records in both categories. With a 2-2 record on neutral courts, BYU is 10-6 this season away from home. The Cougars have won seven of their last eight contests away from the Marriott Center. BYU won five of its last seven games on the road last season including a win at then-No. 20 Air Force (62-58), snapping the Falcons' 30-game home winning streak. BYU was 6-7 on the road last year and 5-3 in conference play, becoming the only MWC team with a winning record on the road in league play last year.

**BOUNCEBACK COUGARS**

With the Cougars' 70-69 win at New Mexico coming on the heels of a loss at San Diego State, BYU has bounced back from all six of its losses this season with wins. BYU recovered from a setback against No. 1 North Carolina with a victory at Portland, a loss vs. then-No. 9 Michigan State with a win over Lamar, a loss at Boise State with a triumph against Loyola Marymount, a defeat at Wake Forest with a victory over Colorado State and a loss at UNLV with a win at Utah. The Cougars have won their bounceback games by an average margin of 16.3 points. BYU head coach Dave Rose has only lost back-to-back regular-season games once in his Cougar career (vs. then-No. 25 Michigan State and at Lamar in 2006-07).

**MAGIC NUMBER: 70**

BYU is 22-1 when scoring at least 70 points this year and 22-2 when holding opponents under the 70-point mark. The Cougars' 55-52 win at Utah marked the first time this season BYU has won a game when scoring less than 70 points. The Cougars have scored 90 or more points in five games this season, reaching 100 against Jackson State, and are 10-0 when scoring over 80 points on the year.

**CLEANING THE GLASS**

BYU has won the battle of the boards in 22 games this year, going 20-2 in those contests. The Cougars have tied an opponent on the boards twice this year, both times against SDSU. BYU is besting opponents by an average of 5.2 boards per contest, leading the league in rebounding margin and rebound average (39.6). The Cougars posted a season-high +19 rebounding margin (38-19) against Hartford as four Cougars pulled down at least five rebounds. BYU began the season with a 55-40 rebounding advantage at Long Beach State, matching last year's season high of 55 boards against Seton Hall. Five Cougars posted at least six rebounds in BYU's win over Lamar, marking the first time since Jan. 8, 2005 that feat has been done.

**BALANCED SCORING**

BYU has had five players score in double figures in a game five times this season, surpassing last year's total of three games in which at least five players reached double digits. Five different Cougars have led the team in scoring with Lee Cummond pacing BYU a team-best 15 times.

**FOUR FRESHMEN**

Four Cougar freshman are making an impact this year as Chris Collinsworth, Jimmer Fredette, Michael Loyd, Jr. and Nick Martineau have all made a difference for BYU. **Collinsworth** is fourth for BYU with 5.0 rebounds per game while ranking tied for 13th among MWC players in conference play at 5.3 rpg. He has started six games. **Fredette** is fifth on the team in scoring with 6.8 ppg and tied for third in steals with 26. **Loyd** is averaging 8.9 minutes per game and has posted 37 assists on the year. **Martineau** has 14 assists to 9 turnovers in his 20 games played.

**2007-08 COUGAR GAME LEADERS/HIGHS**

**TOP OF THE HEAP**

Lee Cummard has done as much for his team in the most variety of ways this season than any other player in the MWC. In conference play, Cummard ranked in the top 10 in nine of the 12 MWC statistical categories. New Mexico's J.R. Giddens ranked in the top 10 in eight categories and Utah's Luke Nevill ranked among the top 10 in seven categories. BYU's Trent Plaisted is joined by two other players—Lorenzo Wade (SDSU) and Brandon Ewing (Wyo)—with six top-10 rankings. Cummard not only produces more numbers across the stat sheet than anyone in the conference but also does so more efficiently, averaging less playing time per game than Giddens, Wade and Ewing.

**FROM DOWNTOWN**

With 266 three-pointers this season, the Cougars have set a new program record, surpassing the old mark of 256 treys set last year. BYU has posted double-digit triples in a game 11 times this year and has made at least five three-pointers in 30 of 32 games this season. The Cougars recorded the sixth-best three-point shooting percentage in program history with 81.3 percent accuracy (13-of-16) against New Mexico, which is also an MWC record in league games. Individually, Lee Cummard and Jonathan Tavernari have each made a three-pointer in 29 of 32 games this season while Sam Burgess has done so in 26 contests and Jimmer Fredette in 22. Tavernari broke the Cougars' single-season three-point record of 74 with 80 treys so far this season. The mark is also a Mountain West Conference sophomore record. Including 80 from Tavernari, 55 from Cummard and 54 from Burgess, this season marks the first time in program history that a Cougar basketball team has had three players with at least 50 threes in the same season.

**FOR STARTERS**

Seniors Ben Murdock and Sam Burgess along with juniors Lee Cummard and Trent Plaisted have started all 32 games this year while sophomore Jonathan Tavernari has made 26 starts and freshman Chris Collinworth has started six contests.

**BYU PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

**JONATHAN TAVERNARI (MARCH 9)** — Junior forward Jonathan Tavernari averaged a team-best 17.5 points and 3.5 steals last week and set BYU and MWC records for three-pointers while helping the Cougars win the 2008 Mountain West Conference regular-season title. The Sao Bernardo, Brazil, native added 4.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists without committing a turnover in BYU's wins over Wyoming and TCU. He made six treys on a team-leading 46.2 percent (6-of-13) three-point shooting to become BYU's single-season three-point record-holder (78) and set a new standard for triples by MWC sophomores. Helping BYU secure the MWC regular-season title outright with a win over Wyoming on Wednesday, Tavernari scored 18 points and had a career-high five steals along with five rebounds and two assists. He made his first four shots from the field and first three treys to help BYU get off to a strong start against the Cowboys. His first triple of the game set the new MWC mark for sophomores (previously set by Utah's Nick Jacobsen in 2001-02) and his third three at the 12:07 mark in the first half set the all-time BYU single-season record. He finished the game with four treys and 76 for the season. Tavernari added his 77th and 78th threes of the year while scoring a game-high 17 points in BYU's road win at TCU on Saturday. He added four rebounds, two assists, two steals and one blocked shot to help the Cougars achieve an MWC record with its 14th conference win and tie MWC for conference road wins (6) and overall road wins (8).

**PLAISTED IN 1,000 POINT CLUB**

With 22 points against Lamar, junior Trent Plaisted became the 37th member of BYU's elite 1,000 Point Club, joining such Cougar greats as Danny Ainge, Michael Smith, Devin Durrant, Fred Roberts, Kresimir Cosic and Andy Toolson to score at least 1,000 points in their Cougar careers. Plaisted now has 1,331 career points, 15th on BYU's all-time scoring list. Before Plaisted, Keena Young was the most recent addition to the club as he posted 1,068 points during his three-year BYU stint from 2005-07. Of four-year players, Plaisted is just the 10th Cougar to reach the 1,000-point milestone as a junior. The last four-year player to reach 1,000 points as a junior was Mark Bigelow with 1,312 following the 2002-03 season. Plaisted also has 668 career rebounds, making him just the 11th player overall to record at least 1,000 career points and 600 career rebounds.

**BURGESS COMIN' UP BIG**

Senior co-captain Sam Burgess is making the most of his final BYU campaign as he is fourth on the team in scoring (8.9), fourth in field-goal shooting among players with at least 60 attempts (.446) and third in assists (2.0) while ranking second on the team in three-point shooting (.425). He has increased his scoring total from last season by 5.3 ppg while averaging 17.1 more minutes per game. His 15 double-figure scoring games this year has more than doubled last year's mark of four double-digit scoring outings. Burgess has started all 32 games this season after starting just one game in his two prior seasons as a Cougar. He is averaging 11.8 points and 5.0 rebounds per game in the last six contests.

**.800 CLUB**

BYU boasts four players who are making 80 percent or more of their free-throw attempts this year (Jimmer Fredette, .853; Jonathan Tavernari, .867; Lee Cummond, .843; Sam Burgess, .825). Lee Cummond made a career- and team-season-high 21 straight free throws before missing his first attempt vs. SDSU. He earlier had made 19 straight before a miss against Southern Utah, meaning he had made 40 of 41 attempts (97.6 percent) over that stretch. He has been perfect at the line in 13 of 25 games he has gone to the line this year.

**WINNING BIG**

The Cougars' 26 victories this year have come by an average margin of 17.2 points, including a season-opening 40-point road win at Long Beach State [74-34], one of 20 double-digit wins for BYU this season and one of nine victories by over 20 points. The win over the 49ers marked BYU's largest margin of victory over a Division I opponent since defeating Morgan State by 41 points [110-69] on Dec. 28, 1995. Including BYU's five losses, the Cougars still boast a scoring margin of 11.8 points this year. With that mark, the Cougars are on pace to record their highest margin of victory since 1966 (+12.6) and the third-highest in program history. BYU won 17 games by double-digits last year, including seven by 20 or more points, and was the only team in the Mountain West Conference to not have a regular-season game decided by less than four points.

**VICTORY STREAK**

BYU had a season-best nine-game win streak end with a loss at SDSU. The victories were at Utah, vs. San Diego State, vs. New Mexico, at Air Force, at Wyoming, vs. TCU, at Colorado State, against UNLV and vs. Utah. That mark was tied for seventh nationally and is the Cougars' longest victory string since also winning nine straight in the 2003-04 season. Since the loss, BYU has won five straight games.

**THIS YEAR'S LOSSES**

BYU's six losses this year have come on neutral floors against then-No. 1 North Carolina and then-No. 9 Michigan State and on the road at Boise State, at Wake Forest, at UNLV and at SDSU. BYU held double-digit leads over both Michigan State and Boise State and battled the top-rated Tar Heels through six second-half lead changes. North Carolina [29-2], Michigan State [24-7], Boise State [22-8], Wake Forest [17-12], UNLV [23-7] and San Diego State [19-11] have a combined 134-47 record for a .740 winning percentage as of games played March 8.

**FROM THE FIELD**

BYU is shooting 46.1 percent from the field this season while allowing opponents to shoot just 38.4 percent from the floor (No. 1 in the MWC). Overall, the Cougars have shot above 50 percent in 11 games this year. BYU has shot above 50 percent in the first half of 10 games this season and in the second half of 14 contests, totaling 24 halves of play with a shooting percentage of 50 percent higher, including seven above 60 percent. The Cougars posted a season-high 62.5 percent efficiency against Colorado State in the MWC Tournament bolstered by 73.9 percent shooting (17-for-23) in the second half. Individually, Lee Cummard and Trent Plaisted rank No. 1 and No. 3, respectively, among MWC players in field-goal percentage at 56.7 and 54.0 percent and 33rd and 54th, respectively, in the national rankings as of March 6.

**HALFTIME REPORT**

The Cougars are 24-2 this season when leading at the half with 15 of the 26 advantages coming by double digits. No. 1 North Carolina, Wake Forest, UNLV, San Diego State and New Mexico are the only teams this season to post a halftime lead against BYU. The Cougars are besting opponents by an average of 7.5 points in the first period of play while scoring at least 40 points in the first half of 10 of 32 games this season. BYU has scored at least 30 points in the first half of 26 of 32 games while holding opponents under 30 points 21 times. The Cougars' 36-12 lead at the break at Long Beach State marked their largest halftime advantage since being up by 28 points (51-23) against Western Oregon on Dec. 22, 2006. The 12 points given up by BYU in the first 20 minutes of the game at LBSU marked the fewest points allowed in a half by the Cougars since allowing a record-low 10 points against Air Force in 2003. BYU has topped 40 points in the second half of 14 games this year while surpassing the 50-point mark in the second half four times.

**PAINTING THE TOWN**

The Cougars have outscored their opponents in the paint in 17 games and equaled them in one other this year, recording a +3.3 margin in that category. BYU has posted a double-digit margin in 11 games, including a season-best +38 margin (54-16) against Jackson State. The Cougars are 17-0 when besting opponents in the paint while all six of BYU's losses on the season have come when the Cougars have been outscored in the paint.

**MAKING THE MOST OF THE MISCUE**

Despite recording a -0.4 turnover margin with their opponents on the year, the Cougars have outscored foes in points off of turnovers in 21 games this season, posting a +3.8 scoring margin in that category. BYU scored a season-best 26 points off of turnovers against Loyola Marymount and equaled that mark in its win over Colorado State in the MWC Tournament quarterfinals.

**FAST AND FURIOUS**

BYU has outscored opponents in transition in 23 games, equaled them three times and been outpaced only six times. The Cougars average 4.4 more fastbreak points than their opponents. The Cougars scored a season-best 20 fastbreak points against Jackson State while tying their season high with a +16 margin. BYU's five deficits in that category came in losses against No. 1 North Carolina (0-4), against No. 9 Michigan State (0-4) and at Wake Forest (0-8) and wins at Air Force (0-2) and at New Mexico (2-6).

**FROM THE BENCH**

BYU's reserves have outscored the opposition's bench only 12 times this year, but they have done it in 10 of the last 21 games after seven straight contests with a scoring deficit off the bench. On the whole, the BYU bench is tallying 597 points or 18.7 points per game. BYU's leading scorer off the bench is freshman guard Jimmer Fredette, who is averaging 6.8 points per game. He had 14 points against Utah, his highest scoring output in conference play. He stepped up at Wake Forest, tying for team-high honors with 15 points off the bench. Chris Collinsworth had a career-high 12 points off the bench in BYU's win over Colorado State in the MWC Tournament quarterfinals.

**LEADERS OF THE PACK**

Including a game-high lead of 28 points against Colorado State, the Cougars have posted a double-digit lead in 24 of 32 games and have led by more than 20 points in 16 games and more than 30 points in five contests. The Cougars have led wire-to-wire in 14 games this season.

A tireless worker, gifted motivator and strong strategist, Dave Rose has guided BYU to consecutive 20-win seasons and the program's first national ranking since 1993 after succeeding Steve Cleveland as BYU Men's Basketball Head Coach on April 11, 2005.

Rose coached last year's team to a 25-9 overall record and the MWC regular-season title (13-3) while earning his second consecutive MWC Coach of the Year award. He was district and conference coach of the year in his first season at the Cougar helm in 2005-06. Taking over a 9-21 team, Rose's Cougar squad was picked to finish last in his first season in the Mountain West Conference (preseason poll of MWC media members) but BYU instead earned a 20-9 record and NIT bid in 2005-06.

06 under Rose's tutelage, including a 12-4 conference mark to tie for second place. His team ranked second nationally for the most improvement over the year before.

Rose was named the USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year and received honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com. He was named MWC Coach of the Year by the league's media and coaches and by CollegeInsider.com. In a column on ESPN.com, Pat Forde listed Rose as one of the top first-year coaches in the nation, ranking Rose No. 3 among the nearly 40 first-year coaches in college basketball in 2005-06.

Rose, who served the prior eight seasons as Cleveland's lead assistant in Provo, was promoted to BYU's head job two days after Cleveland announced his resignation to take the head-coaching position at Fresno State. Rose served as BYU's associate head coach for five seasons and took over the Cougar program with 22 years of coaching experience, including 10 seasons as a head coach at the junior college and high school levels.

Since coming to Provo in 1997 with Cleveland, Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in seven of the past eight seasons, including four NCAA bids, while claiming three MWC titles. As associate head coach, Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, and his efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Rose was the team's defensive coordinator and worked with the post players. He possesses a complete knowledge of the game and worked hard in developing the team's defensive game plans. An outstanding teacher, he coached defensive skill development and implemented the defensive game plan. BYU was the top defensive team in the Mountain West Conference two of the four seasons Rose oversaw the defense.

A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose managed BYU's recruiting efforts during his eight seasons as an assistant. Rose's success as a recruiter was evidenced by his being named one of the top 25 college basketball recruiters in 2004 by Rivals.com. The 2004 class was rated No. 17 nationally and No. 3 in the West by Rivals.com. The 2000 recruiting class also ranked in the top 20 nationally. Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, 10 recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 10 years Rose has been in Provo. Including Rafael Araujo being named the league's top newcomer by the MWC media members in 2003 (the MWC discontinued the newcomer award that year), seven BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Jonathan Tavernari was named the 2007 MWC Freshman of the Year. Rose has also worked closely with scheduling. BYU has played many of the nation's top teams over the past several years thanks in part to relationships Rose has developed with programs across the country. His efforts have helped the Cougars receive invitations to tournaments like the 2004 EA SPORTS Maui Invitational where BYU faced that season's NCAA Champion North Carolina.

Prior to coming to BYU, Rose was head coach at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, where he compiled a 167-57 record in seven seasons. Rose guided six of his seven teams to national top-20 rankings, including a ranking as high as No. 2, while earning three conference titles. His peers honored him as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as longtime NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU he has recruited and coached two NBA Draft picks in Rafael Araujo and Travis Hansen.

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86. Rose becomes the 17th

person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

**PLAYING CAREER**

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie College before transferring to Houston, where he was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished second in the NCAA Tournament. At Houston, Rose played in 1980-81, redshirted in 1981-82 and played his final year in 1982-83.

At Dixie, Rose was first-team all-league in both basketball and baseball. Rose was also the Region 18 batting champion, hitting .421 as a center fielder. While playing basketball for Houston's Northbrook High School, he led the District 16AAAA in scoring, was selected first-team all-district and All-Greater Houston and was named team MVP.

**PERSONAL**

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Daughter Chanell played forward on the BYU women's basketball team from 2000-03 and is married to Brock Reichner. Rose's wife Cheryl is actively involved in helping families who have children with cancer as vice chairperson of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation. Rose served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie College. 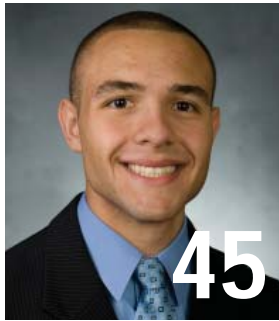
