**Previous Game against Arizona:**

TUCSON, Ariz. (September 19, 2009) – After a scoreless 85 minutes of play on Saturday, No. 18 BYU found its winning goal with only five minutes left in a 1-0 victory over Arizona.

Senior Kassidy Christensen-Shumway entered the game in the second half and found the back of the net with five minutes left to play. A pass from teammate Carlee Payne put the ball in Shumway's possession right in front of the net where she was able to get it past the Arizona goalie. Payne now leads the team with three assists this season.

The Cougars ended the game with 14 shots compared to Arizona's eight. BYU's Jessica Ringwood and Alyssa Vander Veur led with three shots each.

Nine Cougar players took at least one shot against Arizona compared to the four players from Arizona who took shots.

BYU now holds an overall 8-1-1 record against Arizona.

This is BYU's third shutout win of the season. Sophomore goalie McKinzie Olson has now played every minute of every game for the Cougars this year.

Many attempts on goal were made by the Wildcats but any offensive efforts were halted by the Cougar defense led by Senior Hermann Trophy Candidate Andrea Willis. Willis ended the game with two shots of her own and helped the Cougars defense to only allow eight shots from the Wildcats.

The Cougars (6-2-1) are now on a three-game winning streak as they return home next week to play at South Field on Wednesday against Southern Utah and Saturday against Utah State.

**Hermann Trophy Candidate**

Andrea Willis, a 5-foot-7-inch senior from Riverside, Calif., who attended Riverside Poly High School, was chosen among 45 of the top collegiate women's soccer athletes and is the only player from the Mountain West Conference on this year's list.

Willis is the fourth Cougar to be a candidate for this award. Aleisha Cramer Rose, now an assistant coach at BYU, was a two-time candidate in 2003 and 2004. Jessica Carter was nominated in 2007 and Katie Larkin became a two-time candidate after being nominated in 2007 and 2008.

15 semifinalists are to be selected in November with three finalists announced in early December. The final winner will be announced Jan. 8, 2010.

Two opponents for the Cougars this season also have players nominated to the Watch List. Oklahoma State's Kasey Langdon and West Virginia's Carolyn Blank. The Cougars will host Oklahoma State on Sept. 7th and will travel to Pennsylvania to play West Virginia on Aug. 31st.

**Preseason All-America**

Since BYU's first game against Hawaii, Senior defender Andrea Willis was recognized as a Preseason All-American by Soccer America.

Willis played and started in all 32 games for the Cougars last season and will lead the defense again this year.

Soccer America released the first and second team preseason picks for 2009 and named Willis, a defender, to the Second Team.

**August 31 Player-of-the-Week**

Senior Andrea Willis was been named Mountain West Conference Defensive Player-of-the-Week. Willis, a Riverside, Calif., native, anchored the BYU defense in the Cougar's 1-0 win over Connecticut, a team receiving votes in the NSCAA Top-25 Poll.

Willis played all 90 minutes of the game, holding the Huskies without a shot on goal for the entire contest. BYU has not allowed a goal in all three contests played so far this season.

**September 14 Player-of-the-Week and National Team**

Freshman Carlee Payne was named Offensive Mountain West Conference Player-of-the-Week by the league office, Monday, and to TopDrawerSoccer.com's National Team-of-the-Week, Saturday.

Against No. 20 Oklahoma State, Payne scored the tying goal in a 2-1 overtime win. She also added an assist on the game-winning goal. Despite losing to Washington State, 2-1, the forward scored the Cougars' only goal of the game just nine minutes into the match. Payne also scored the tying goal in BYU's 2-1 win at Montana.

The freshman has started every game this year for the Cougars and scored a goal in five out of the seven.

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Katie Larkin, Aleisha Rose, Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading and Staci Reynolds. Rohbock, Hendershot, Reading and Reynolds each went on to play in the Women's United Soccer Association.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Ricks College (now BYU-Idaho) on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management. Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs and the high school level.

### 2008 Season Review

The BYU women's soccer team finished the 2008 season as one of the best teams in the program's storied history. The Cougars finished as undefeated MWC Regular Season and Tournament Champions and ranked as high as No. 19 in the nation at the end of the season. Advancing past the first round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003, the team benefited from stellar play from its veteran leaders and also enjoyed significant contributions from some newcomers as well.

Strong play on both sides of the ball continued for the Cougars as they advanced as the number one seed into the MWC Tournament. After a first-round bye, the Cougars defeated host UNLV 4-0 before topping in-state rival Utah 1-0 in the championship game of the tournament. The Cougars had previously beaten Utah 5-0 in Salt Lake during the regular season.

The record-setting 2008 squad finished 18-5-1, and dominated their conference and home schedules in a way that few other Cougar teams have. The 18 wins are the most for the program since the team won 19 games in 2000. BYU finished a perfect 8-0 at home, and outscored opponents 15-1 at South Field. The team entertained 15,010 fans at home (1,876/game avg.), who enjoyed an enhanced experience with bleacher and lighting upgrades made to the field. The team had similar success in going undefeated (7-0) in MWC play for the first time since 2002, outscoring league opponents 15-1.

Catching fire midway through the season, the Cougars had winning streaks of three and 12 games during the season. During the 12-game winning streak the team outscored their opponents 25-1. Tough defense frustrated opposing teams, and BYU had shutout streaks of three, five and six games during 2008. The team finished the season without a loss in its last 13 games, and did not lose after Sept. 25. Cougar keepers had a goals-against-average of only 0.74 per game, and only allowed 18 goals the entire season.

The team never lost a game in which they scored first, finishing 17-0 in 2008. BYU only trailed in six games the entire year. The Cougars defeated two ranked opponents, No. 19 Georgia (at home, 4-1) and No. 19 Miami (on the road, 1-0, the loss was Miami's first of the season) and also handed 8-0 Michigan State its first loss (2-0) of the year.

The 2008 edition of the BYU women's soccer team was extremely successful as a team, but many individual players were also honored for their success, hard work and skill both on and off the field. For the third time in her BYU career, senior forward Katie Larkin finished the season with 00 goals, 00 points and 00 shots was named an All-American by the NSCAA/adidas. She was also named to the prestigious Hermann Trophy Award watchlist for the second consecutive year. Larkin was also nominated as a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS award, and was named the MWC Offensive Player of the Year as well as the 2008 MWC Tournament MVP. She was also named First Team All-MWC.

Junior defender Andrea Willis was also named All-MWC First Team, and was selected as the 2008 MWC Defensive Player of the Year. Freshman forward Lauren Anderson, who had 00 points, 00 assists and 00 goals was also named All-MWC First Team along with defender Jessica Carter. Sophomore forward Cassidy Carter had 00 shots, 00 goals and 00 points and was named to the All-MWC Second Team. For the third time in her tenure as a coach at BYU, head coach Jennifer Rockwood was named MWC Coach of the Year.
