### COUGARS IN SOUTH PADRE TO FACE SOUTH FLORIDA

After starting the 2010-11 season with a 4-0 record at home, No. 23 BYU will head to South Padre Island, Texas, to face South Florida in the South Padre Invitational on Friday at 5 p.m. CT. The Cougars are 2-0 in the Invitational with a 109-60 victory over Chicago State and an 84-34 win over Mississippi Valley State. Jimmer Fredette leads BYU with 23.3 points and 5.3 assists per game while Noah Hartsock adds 13.3 points and Jackson Emery contributes 10.5 points and 2.8 steals. Augustus Gilchrist leads South Florida with 11.0 points and 5.8 boards. The Bulls are coached by Stan Heath. Friday's game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 4 p.m. CT on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on Fox College Sports.

### UP NEXT

No. 23 BYU will play either Saint Mary's or Texas Tech on Saturday, Nov. 27, in the final round of the South Padre Invitational. The loser between BYU and South Florida will play the loser of Saint Mary's and Texas Tech at 4:30 p.m. CT while the winners will play at 7 p.m. CT. The 7 p.m. game will be televised live on Fox College Sports. Follow the game live via GameTracker on [www.byucougars.com](http://www.byucougars.com) and listen live on the radio beginning with the pregame show one hour before tipoff on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM out of Salt Lake City or via the Internet at KSL.com.

### COUGAR QUICK HITS

— No. 23 BYU head coach Dave Rose is 131-40 in his six seasons at BYU and is the program's all-time leader in winning percentage at .766. From 2006 through last season, he led BYU to four-straight 25-win seasons, four-straight seasons ranked in the top 25 and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament.  
— The Cougars were ranked in the AP Preseason Poll for the first time since the 1980-81 season and are currently ranked No. 23.  
— BYU welcomes back its starting backcourt of seniors Jimmer Fredette and Jackson Emery. This marks the third-straight season the duo has started for Dave Rose.  
— Jimmer Fredette has been named to eight preseason All-America teams (AP, ESPN.com, Sporting News, SI.com/ Sports Illustrated, Basketball Times, Athlon Sports, Dick Vitale and Blue Ribbon Magazine). Fredette is averaging 23.3 points and 5.3 assists per game this season.  
— Jackson Emery and Kyle Collinsworth have contributed 20 steals through four games for a 5.0 combined average. Emery has 11 steals while Collinsworth has nine steals. Collinsworth has contributed at least two steals in each game while Emery has chipped in nine in the last two games.

**SOUTH FLORIDA'S LAST OUTING – BURWELL, ANDERSON JR. LEAD BULLS OVER LIBERTY, 60-43**

TAMPA - The University of South Florida men's basketball team, led by an unlikely starting duo, knocked off Liberty 60-43 on Tuesday night at the Sun Dome.

An injured left ankle kept starting point guard Anthony Crater on the bench, giving sophomore guard Mike Burwell his first career start for the Bulls. Alongside Burwell was junior forward Ron Anderson Jr. who also made his first USF career start in the victory.

Burwell picked up a game-high 15 points, along with Liberty guard Evan Gordan, brother of NBA star Eric Gordan of the L.A. Clippers, who also added 15 for the Flames.

Anderson was on the glass the entire night, picking up 15 rebounds in the opening period, and finishing with a career high 17 overall, the highest total of the year for USF. Anderson also added six points and three assists in his first start of the year.

The Bulls shot 43.8 percent from the field on the night, and 40 percent from beyond the arc, and held the Flames to just 29.2 percent from the field and 25 percent from long range.

Jawanza Poland put up eight points in 22 minutes, and Shaun Noriega and Hugh Robertson each added seven points apiece in the win.

Burwell electrified the crowd with a game opening three-pointer, his first shot attempt all season. He led the team with a career-high 15 points, going 5-for-7 beyond the arch.

After being tied at five early on, USF went on a pair 10-0 runs to close out the half, 35-20.

Anderson Jr. made his presence known with a career-high 15 rebounds going into the second period, out-rebounding the entire Liberty team in the first stanza.

Momentum was with the Bulls throughout the entire game, extending their second half lead to as many as 24 points. With the dominating lead, the Bulls' bench made their presence known, giving the entire team time on the floor, besides for the injured Crater.

Senior walk-on Alberto Damour got his first playing time of the year, entering to close out the game for USF.

USF's defense held the Flames under 30 percent shooting, and out rebounded them 37 to 28..

With the win, the Bulls improved to 3-2 on the year, and will hit the road, traveling to South Padre Island, Texas, to continue the South Padre Invitational, tipping off against BYU on Friday.

**LAST TIME OUT - TOUGH DEFENSE LEADS TO WIN**

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 23, 2010) – In the second game of the South Padre Island Invitational BYU (4-0) defeated the Mississippi Valley State Delta Devils (0-4) 86-36 on Tuesday in the Marriott Center. Sophomore Brandon Davies recorded his second career double-double, finishing with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Senior Jimmer Fredette contributed 16 points and six assists while fellow senior Jackson Emery added 15 points and five steals. Both teams struggled offensively to start the game, going a collective 1-15 from the field. BYU started the game 1-8 shooting and led 3-0 after four minutes of play. The score remained close until the 8:48 mark, when the Cougars led 8-5. Fredette had a hand in all five of the opening BYU baskets, scoring two and assisting the other three. Fredette also helped spark the Cougars with a three-point basket that was followed by a Noah Hartsock three-point play that extended the BYU lead to double digits, 18-7. Emery built on the momentum by nailing three consecutive three pointers. Nick Martineau also hit a trey that continued the Cougar run. After the slow start, BYU finished the half on a 25-3 run, with the three points from the Delta Devils not coming until the final minute of the half. The highlight of the first half was the Cougar defense that held Mississippi Valley State to 10 points, tied for the lowest point total in a half by an opponent in BYU's modern-era history. A fast start to the second half prevented any comeback by the Delta Devils. The Cougars took off on an 18-2 run to quickly extend the lead to 43 at 55-12. Mississippi Valley State saw their biggest offensive output in the game partway through the second half when they went on a 10-4 run that included two three pointers. Strong play off the bench helped the Cougars close the game. James Anderson finished with nine points while Martineau and Brock Zylstra both chipped in five points apiece.

**WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...****BYU HEAD COACH DAVE ROSE**

"I thought defensively it was about as good a performance as we've have had in a long time. I thought we were consistently challenging shots to make it difficult for them and when they drove I thought our posts were very active. On their attack penetration we made it really hard for them to get a good look at the basket. We rebounded very well and I was really pleased with our defense."

"Offensively, we played really well in spurts. We got off to a really slow start and we had six or seven turnovers in the first eight minutes of the game. But we did better later in the game of making easier plays and not turning the ball over. All-in-all I was pleased and I'm looking forward to the next game."

"I think we played more consistently defensively which is a good sign. I think rebounding-wise this team has shown in the first four games that we're capable. But we'll probably have a real tough test against South Florida, a Big East opponent. That's kind of where they make their living, is rebounding the basketball."

**BYU NOTES FROM LAST OUTING****PLAYER NOTES**

-Jimmer Fredette had a hand in BYU's first five field goals, scoring twice himself and assisting the other three baskets.  
-James Anderson provided a much-needed spark for the Cougars recording 3 points, 4 rebounds, a block and a drawn charge in 5 minutes of play in the first half. Anderson finished with 9 points, 5 rebounds and 1 block.  
-Four players scored in double-digits for BYU. Jimmer Fredette led the Cougars with 16 points but was followed closely by Jackson Emery with 15, Brandon Davies with 13 and Noah Hartsock with 12.  
-Kyle Collinsworth had 2 steals in the game making his fourth straight game with at least two steals.  
-Emery posted 5 steals in the victory. Emery has recorded 8 games over the course of his career with 5 steals or more.  
-Brandon Davies posted his first season and second career double-double and the team's first season double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Davies' 10 rebounds tied his career high posted against Air Force last year. Davies also recorded 3 blocks which ties a career high set at Air Force as well.  
-Charles Abouo set a new career high in rebounds with 10. Abouo had previously posted 8 rebounds three times.

**TEAM NOTES**

-Coach Dave Rose started the same starting five for the third-straight game with Fredette, Jackson Emery, Charles Abouo, Noah Hartsock and C. Collinsworth getting the call.  
-The 50-point victory was the first time BYU has won by 50 points since a 57-point victory over Eastern Washington on December 19, 2009.

**RECORD WATCH**

-With 7:56 remaining in the first half, Jimmer Fredette hit Brock Zylstra for an open layup and the assist moved Fredette from 8th to 7th in all-time assists history for the Cougars. Fredette has recorded 376 assists during his four years at BYU.  
-The Delta Devils' 10 first half points ties the BYU record for fewest points in a half. Air Force also scored 10 points against BYU during the 2002-2003 season. In that game Air Force made 4 field goals but the Cougars held Mississippi Valley State to 3 field goals in the first half.

**GAME TRENDS**

-With the score 19-7, Jackson Emery ignited the Cougar faithful hitting three consecutive three-pointers. Nick Martineau hit a trey of his own to give BYU a 31-7 lead.  
-From the 12:32 mark to the last second of the first half, Mississippi Valley State had three points while the Cougars went on a 31-3 run.  
-BYU defeated the Delta Devils by 50 points, their largest margin of victory this season.

PROVO, Utah (Aug. 4, 2010) – BYU basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2010-11 schedule today, which features matchups with Arizona and UCLA, a trip to the South Padre Island Invitational and a nationally televised game at San Diego State on CBS. The Mountain West Conference also announced the games that will be televised by broadcast partners CBS College Sports Network (CBS C), VERSUS and The Mtn. The nonconference schedule includes teams from 10 different leagues and seven teams that qualified for postseason play. Including conference foes, the Cougars will face 11 teams that qualified for postseason play — seven of which played in the NCAA Tournament. BYU's game at San Diego State on Feb. 26 will be televised live on CBS while CBS C (at UNLV on Jan. 5 and vs. San Diego State on Jan. 26) and VERSUS (at New Mexico on Jan. 29 and vs. UNLV on Feb. 5) will broadcast two conference games apiece. The Mtn. will broadcast the remaining conference games as well as the Nov. 17 home game against Utah State. The Cougars will open the season by welcoming former coach Steve Cleveland and Fresno State to the Marriott Center on Nov. 12. That will be followed by the Utah State tilt and home matchups with Chicago State and Mississippi Valley State as part of the South Padre Island Invitational on Nov. 20 and 23, respectively. The Cougars will travel to South Padre Island, Texas, for a pair of games on Nov. 26 and 27 with potential opponents St. Mary's, Texas Tech and South Florida. BYU will remain on the road for a Dec. 1 matchup with Creighton as part of the Mountain West-Missouri Valley Challenge. On Dec. 4 BYU will face Hawaii at EnergySolutions Arena followed by a meeting with Vermont in Glens Falls, N.Y., at the Glens Falls Civic Center on Dec. 8. The Cougars head back to EnergySolutions on Dec. 11 to face Arizona of the Pac 10. On Dec. 18, BYU faces its second-straight Pac 10 foe in UCLA at the John R. Wooden Classic in Anaheim, Calif., at the Honda Center. The Cougars then play at Weber State on Dec. 21 before returning home to play UTEP on Dec. 23. BYU will also play at Buffalo (Dec. 30) and at home vs. Fresno Pacific before opening conference play at UNLV on Jan. 5. Following the conference opener the Cougars finish January with home games against Air Force (Jan. 8), TCU (Jan. 18) and San Diego State (Jan. 26) and road games at Utah (Jan. 11), Colorado State (Jan. 22) and New Mexico (Jan. 29). February starts with a road game at Wyoming (Feb. 2) to conclude the first half of the MWC slate. The second half of the league schedule starts with UNLV at home (Feb. 5) followed by a trip to Air Force (Feb. 9). The Cougars also host Utah (Feb. 12), Colorado State (Feb. 23), New Mexico (March 2) and Wyoming (March 5) in the second half and play at TCU (Feb. 19) and San Diego State (Feb. 26).

DENVER (Oct. 12, 2010) – BYU guard Jimmer Fredette received Mountain West Conference Preseason Player of the Year honors at the league's media day being held today at The MountainWest Sports Network studios. Kyle Collinsworth was also named the Preseason Freshman of the Year and the Cougars were picked to finish second in the MWC by the league's media.

Fredette, a preseason first-team All-American and national player-of-the-year candidate, repeats as the league's preseason player of the year. Also named to the preseason all-conference team, Fredette is a two-time All-MWC First Team honoree and last season led the league in scoring at 22.1 points per game while adding 4.7 assists.

Collinsworth is a versatile guard out of Provo High School who was named Utah's Mr. Basketball and the state's Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior. At Provo he helped the Bulldogs win two state titles and was a three-time first-team all-state honoree.

San Diego State was picked to finish first in the league and garnered 21 first-place votes compared to five for the Cougars. Last season, BYU was picked to finish first in the league and finished the season second in the regular season standings while setting a program record with 30 wins and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

This marks the third time the Cougars were picked to finish second in the preseason media poll — the other years being the 2006-07 and 2008-09 seasons. BYU finished first in the MWC regular season in 2007 and tied for first in 2009.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

With a 129-40 record, Rose has produced a five-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His five-year resume ranks among the best in the history of NCAA Division I basketball. His 129 victories place him fifth for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, ahead of the likes of Jerry Tarkanian, Jim Boeheim and Thad Matta. He currently holds the school record for winning percentage (.763) and the MWC record for winning percentage in league games (.800).

Equally committed to excellence off the court, Rose was honored on April 6, 2008, by the National

Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. While Rose has never sought such attention, his actions and accomplishments — both on the court and in the community — have commanded the praises of faithful followers and casual observers alike. In April 2008 Rose became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award, given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA honored BYU with Public Recognition awards for three-straight seasons (2007 to 2010) for their high academic achievement. BYU is the only program in the nation to earn public recognition from the NCAA and an NCAA Tournament bid in each of the last four seasons.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. A tireless worker, gifted motivator and talented strategist, Rose has returned BYU to the national stage with four-straight seasons appearing in the top-25 polls and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament — both firsts in program history. In his first season, Rose and his staff produced the nation's second-most improved team by turning a 9-21 squad that finished tied for last with three wins in the Mountain West Conference into a 20-9 NIT qualifier and 12-4 second-place MWC finisher. Under his tutelage from 2007 to 2009, the Cougars achieved the MWC's first two-time outright league championships (2007 and 2008) while adding to the streak with a share of the regular season title in 2009 to make it three-consecutive. In 2010, BYU set a program record with 30 victories and defeated Florida in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the programs first tournament victory since 1993. In addition to the record-setting win total, the 2009-10 Cougar squad set program records for winning percentage, scoring margin, field goals, three-point field goals, turnover margin and steals. Nationally, BYU finished the season first in free throw percentage, second in scoring offense, scoring margin and three-point field goal percentage.

The only BYU men's basketball coach to ever win top conference coaching honors in back-to-back seasons, Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007. In his second season, Rose coached the 2006-07 Cougars to a 25-9 overall record and NCAA berth after winning the MWC regular-season title with a 13-3 mark. In his first season, Rose received conference and USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year accolades as well as honorable mention for National Coach of the Year by Scout.com.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program after a 1-25 season. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as Associate Head Coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job just two days after Cleveland announced his departure. Rose fulfilled a variety of responsibilities under Coach Cleveland, including defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. His efforts earned notice, such as being named the top assistant in the Mountain West Conference by Street & Smith in the 2004-05 College Basketball Preview.

Proving that Rose has excelled in recruiting and developing players, 11 recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 13 years Rose has been in Provo. Seven BYU players have been singled out as either the conference newcomer or freshman of the year. Most recently, Jonathan Tavernari was named the 2007 MWC Freshman of the Year after fellow Cougar and second-team Freshman All-American Trent Plaisted received the same honor in 2006. In 2010 Tyler Haws was named third-team All-MWC as a freshman and set the BYU record with 48-consecutive free throws without a miss.

With 27 years of coaching experience including 15 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college, and high school levels, Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah) while guiding six of his seven teams to top-20 rankings, including a national ranking as high as No. 2. He earned three conference titles and was honored by his peers as the 1993 Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. While at Dixie, Rose coached three NJCAA All-Americans as well as long-time NBA player Keon Clark. At BYU, Rose has coached six players who have received All-America recognition—Mekeli Wesley (2001 AP honorable mention), Rafael Araujo (2004 Basketball Times Second Team, AP honorable mention), Trent Plaisted (2006 Scout.com Freshman Second Team), Keena Young (2007 AP honorable mention), Lee Cummar (2008 AP honorable mention, FOXSports.com Fourth Team) and Jimmer Fredette (2010 third-team Sporting News and NABC, AP Honorable Mention and Lute

Olson All-America team)—and two players who have been selected in the NBA Draft—Travis Hansen (2003) and Araujo (2004).

Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie. He was the head basketball coach at Millard for three years from 1983-86. Rose is the 17th person to guide the Cougar basketball program since its first season in 1903. He follows the coaching pedigree of Basketball Hall of Fame coach Stan Watts, who is BYU's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 371-254 record from 1949-72. Watts also coached at Millard High School and Dixie State College before coming to BYU.

**PLAYING CAREER**

Rose was a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before the Texas native returned to his hometown, transferring to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up after suffering a buzzer-beating defeat to North Carolina State in the NCAA Championship game. Rose spent three years at Houston, playing in 1980-81, redshirting in 1981-82 and concluding his career in 1982-83.

**PERSONAL**

Rose is of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Rose followed Steve Cleveland as the second BYU head coach to have served a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Rose served in Manchester, England, from 1977-79 between his two years as a player at Dixie State College.

**COMMUNITY SERVICE**

Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. The National Association of Basketball Coaches honored Rose with its Game Pillar Award for Service in April 2008. While at Dixie State College, Rose became the first coach in the State of Utah to participate in the American Cancer Society's nationwide Coaches vs. Cancer campaign and served on the Academic Excellence Committee at Dixie. He has also been a volunteer coach for youth groups. Dave and Cheryl were Chamber of Commerce Citizens of the Year in St. George. Cheryl is extremely committed to serving in the community, receiving the Beacon of Hope Award in 2005.

The fight against cancer became more personal for the family when Dave was diagnosed with pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor cancer in June 2009. Since the emergency surgery to remove the tumor, no other cancer has been found. Scans since the surgery by doctors at the Huntsman Cancer Institute have all come back clear. The United States Basketball Writers Association recognized Rose for his efforts with its Most Courageous Award.

**LAST GAME:** Had 15 points, 6 boards, 2 assists and 5 steals vs. Mississippi Valley State.

**SUMMARY:** Known for his competitiveness and clutch play, Jackson Emery is a quick player and solid defender with outstanding leaping ability. A good shooter from long range, he also has the athleticism and creativity to convert inside when going to the basket. In 2008-09 as a sophomore, Emery started 32 of 33 games and was named to the MWC All-Defensive Team. He averaged 7.8 points, 3.8 rebounds and 3.0 assists while adding 49 steals. Emery helped BYU win a share of the MWC regular season title and a spot in the NCAA Tournament. As a junior Emery established himself as one of the top defensive players and long distance shooters in the MWC as he set a BYU record and tied an MWC record with 91 steals and hit 85 threes, tied for second in BYU history. He averaged 12.5 points, 4.5 boards and 2.7 steals per game.

**EMERY IN 2010-11:** Recorded 3 assists, 4 rebounds and 7 points against Fresno State ... scored all of his 10 points in the second half against Utah State, grabbing 3 rebounds and recording 1 steal ... posted 10 points, 2 boards and 4 steals vs. Chicago State.
