### BYU AT ARIZONA IN FIESTA BOWL CLASSIC

BYU men's basketball (12-1) will take its seven-game winning streak on the road to play Arizona (6-5) in the Fiesta Bowl Classic at the the McKale Events Center on Monday, Dec. 28, at 7 p.m. MST. The game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 6 p.m. MST on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on Fox College Sports and online at CBS College Sports All-Access.

### UP NEXT

The Cougars return to the Marriott Center for the first time in two weeks for a matchup with Eastern New Mexico at 7 p.m. MST in the Marriott Center. Listen to the game live on the radio beginning with the pregame show at 6 p.m. MST on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com.

### COUGAR QUICK HITS

— Jimmer Fredette was named MVP of the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic after averaging 28.5 points, 5.0 assists and 2.0 steals in wins over Nevada and Nebraska. Jackson Emery (24.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 3.0 apg, 3.0 spg) and Tyler Haws (13.5 ppg, 3.5 rpg) earned all-tournament honors.

— Fredette's eclipsed 1,000 career points in the Nevada game and now has 1,034 career points — 39th all-time at BYU. He leads the conference in scoring at 19.5 points per game. He is also 17th at BYU in career assists with 266 and 11th in steals with 101.

— Since Rose took over as head coach of BYU basketball, the Cougars are 68-3 (.958) in the Marriott Center, including a 53-game winning streak from 2005 to 2008 — the longest in school history. With the win over Eastern Washington, the Cougars have a 13-game home winning streak.

— Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose has guided BYU to three-straight MWC regular season titles and three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Under Rose, BYU also has four-straight 20-win seasons and four-straight postseason appearances. At 109-35 (.757) overall, he reached 100 wins faster than any other coach in BYU history. Roger Reid held the previous record, reaching 100 wins in 143 games.

— Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari became BYU's all-time leader in three-pointers with two treys vs. San Francisco to give him 214. He is now at 219 after hitting one vs. Nebraska. He is also climbing the lists for points (20th with 1,280) and steals (6th with 130).

**LOOKING AT ARIZONA**

Arizona is 6-5 and coming off back-to-back home wins against Lipscomb (83-82 in overtime) and NC State (76-74). Senior guard Nic Wise hit a three with 0.1 second left to defeat Lipscomb and drove the length of the court for the game-winning layup against NC State with one second remaining. Wise leads the team in scoring (17.0 ppg) and assists (4.4 apg) and steals (1.9). He is followed by double-figure scorers Derrick Williams (14.8 ppg) and Jamelle Horne (11.2 ppg). Horne leads the team in rebounding at 8.1 boards per game and blocks with 1.7 while Williams owns the team's best field goal percentage (.561). Solomon Hill adds 8.9 points and 5.0 rebounds per game while Kyle Fogg contributes 7.1 points and shoots .615 (16-26) from downtown. The Wildcats average 72.6 points per game and shoot .442 as a team while their opponents score at a 72.2 points per game rate and shoot .425. Arizona has attempted 50 more free throws than its opponents and made 40 more. The Wildcats shoot .366 from downtown and hold opponents to .291 shooting from long range. Sean Miller is in his first season at Arizona after five seasons at Xavier where he led the Musketeers to four-straight 20-win seasons and four-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament.

**ARIZONA'S LAST OUTING — ARIZONA HOLDS OFF N.C. STATE**

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) -Nic Wise drove the length of the court for a layup with 1 second remaining, and Arizona defeated North Carolina State 76-74 on Wednesday night. The Wildcats (6-5) blew an 8-point lead in the final 37 seconds as the Wolfpack made two 3-pointers and converted on a three-point play. But after North Carolina State's Javier Gonzalez barreled into the lane to tie it at 74-74, Wise, who finished with 17 points, weaved through a sea of red jerseys and laid the ball in. Wise's big play came two nights after he hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer to defeat Lipscomb in overtime. He celebrated his latest heroics by leaping upon the press table and pointing to the exuberant McKale Center crowd. Gonzalez scored 18 points, including 10 in the final 30 seconds, for the Wolfpack (8-3).

**SERIES NOTES**

Monday's game marks the 38th meeting between BYU and Arizona with the Wildcats holding a 20-17 advantage, including 15-3 in Tucson. The Cougars last defeated Arizona 87-86 on Jan. 19, 1978, in Provo. Arizona has won the last four meetings, including an 86-62 in on Dec. 1, 1999 in Tucson. The game is a reunion of old WAC opponents as both schools were members of the conference in the 1960s and 1970s.

**LAST TIME VS. ARIZONA: COUGARS STICK FOR 30 MINUTES WITH FOURTH-RANKED ARIZONA**

TUCSON, Ariz. (Dec. 1, 1999)- Fourth-ranked Arizona had a 30-minute battle Wednesday with BYU until it wore down the Cougars to claim an 86-62 victory. A double-down post defense and some solid play by Mekeli Wesley and Terrell Lyday kept the Cougars in the game until the Wildcat bench and fatigue took a toll on BYU. Wesley scored 24 points, while Lyday had 18 points before a sellout crowd of 14,345. The loss was the first for BYU, who is now 2-1 after its first road game, while Arizona is 5-0 and 3-0 at home. In the late-night Fox TV matchup, Coach Lute Olson secured his 400th victory in 17 years at Arizona as the Wildcats won their 35th consecutive game in the McKale Center-the fourth-longest current winning streak in the NCAA. Arizona is also number one in the latest USA Today Saragin ratings, while BYU was a respectable 42nd out of 319 teams. "The key for us was that we had guys come off the bench and play with emotion," said Olson. "Rick (Anderson) gave us a great performance on the boards. He made things happen offensively, and he really helped us with both offensive and defensive boards." Anderson scored 16 points in as many minutes, while teammate Michael Wright scored 19 and had a game-high 10 rebounds. "Our lack of a front line hurt us," said BYU Coach Steve Cleveland. "They wore us down and we were only good for 30 minutes. They are very good. He (Lute Olson) can go to his bench and they don't miss a beat. We were just spent." The Cougars led from the start of the game until just under eight minutes left in the half when Richard Jefferson's three-pointer broke a 19-all deadlock. One of the sparks in the first half was back-to-back dunks by Lyday which gave BYU an 18-10 lead. With Wesley and Michael Vranes getting in early foul trouble, the Wildcats took a 38-29 halftime lead. Nathan Cooper got in foul trouble for the Cougars in the second half. A technical foul on Olson with five minutes gone in the second half helped the Cougars get back in the game at 48-41 after Wesley hit a pair of free throws. The Cougars then closed the gap to 48-46. "This is one of the best ways to gauge our team and use it as a measuring stick," said Wesley. "They wore us down mentally and we started making mistakes. We were really prepared, so you have to give a lot of credit to Coach (Heath) Schroyer."

**BYU'S LAST OUTING — COUGARS WIN LAS VEGAS CLASSIC, ROLL PAST NEBRASKA**

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (Dec. 23, 2009) – BYU had another great night shooting to claim the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic title with a win over Nebraska, 88-66 at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas on Wednesday. The Cougars' 12-1 record is their best mark through 13 games in the last 22 years. BYU won its first 17 games of the year to begin the 1987-88 season. One day removed from setting career highs, junior guards Jimmer Fredette and Jackson Emery gave a solid encore performance. Fredette took tournament MVP honors, scoring 24 points on 8-of-12 shooting. Emery followed up a 25-point effort against Nevada with 23 points including four treys and 7-of-7 shooting from the free throw line. Emery and Tyler Haws earned all-tournament honors. "I am really happy with how we played offensively here," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "The game against Eastern Washington and coming into these two games it seems like the guys are playing with confidence and sharing the ball." Freshman forward Brandon Davies came off the bench to score 14 points, the best output of his younger Cougar career, hitting 6-of-7. BYU scored 88 points and shot 61.2 percent on a Nebraska team that had kept opponents to averages of 55.0 ppg and 38.5 percent shooting in its previous 11 games. Jimmer Fredette hit two baseline jumpers to start the game for BYU. After a Cornhusker basket, the Cougars added seven points on two buckets by Chris Miles and three free throws from Jackson Emery after the junior was fouled on a three-point attempt. Emery stroked three treys to key a 33-5 run by BYU, which hit 13-of-15 shots to take a 38-5 lead. Haws and Fredette added five points apiece during the run. "Our coaches did a great job with a quick turnaround," Rose said. "We needed to trust each other and not worry about what they were doing. At the beginning of the game we were really flying up and down the court." The second period was a different half, same story, with Fredette and Emery leading on the offensive end. Fredette scored three field goals early while Emery followed with a quick four points and his fourth trey of the game to push the lead to 70-46.

**WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...****BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

– "I can't remember the last time we were double-teamed in the post. We got the ball out of the post and we were shooting too quickly. I said this a couple games ago – if teams want to double team us off the picks on our guards, that gives us a big advantage."  
– "I am really happy with how we played offensively here. The game against Eastern Washington and coming into these two games it seems like the guys are playing with confidence and sharing the ball."  
– "Our coaches did a great job with a quick turnaround. We needed to trust each other and not worry about what they were doing. At the beginning of the game we were really flying up and down the court."  
– "I think we're happy with how guys are coming along but I think there's so much room to improve. We can get so much better defensively and as a rebounding team."

**FREE THROW STREAKS**

Junior guard Jimmer Fredette set a BYU record with 39-consecutive made free throws from Nov. 17 to Dec. 12. Fredette broke the record when he hit his 33rd-consecutive free throw with 16:56 remaining in the second half against Arizona State. He had a streak of 13 straight in the first two games and reached 20-straight before missing after six-straight makes against Nebraska. For the season he is shooting .929 from the line and his career percentage is .875 — second in Cougar history. Tyler Haws is shooting .889 from the line and has hit his last 19 attempts over the last seven games. Jackson Emery has made 12-straight free throws in the last three games.

**100 VICTORIES AND COUNTING**

With BYU's 83-65 win over Hawai'i, Dave Rose earned his 100th career victory in his 134th game as BYU's head coach. He reached the 100-win plateau faster than any coach in BYU history. Roger Reid previously held the record, achieving the mark in 143 games. **TEAM/PLAYER NOTEBOOK**

— At 12-4 in the MWC in 2008-09, BYU shared the regular season title with Utah and New Mexico and became the first team to win three-straight league titles after winning the championship outright in 2007 and 2008. The titles mark the first stretch of three-straight titles for the Cougars since 1932-34. BYU is tied for seventh among all NCAA Division I programs for most regular-season titles won or shared with 28. BYU's 99 MWC wins in the 10-year history of the league leads all MWC teams.

— BYU won its first six home games in 2008-09 to extend its program record home winning streak to 53 games. The streak ended on Jan. 3, 2009 with a 94-87 loss to then-No. 6 Wake Forest. BYU is 440-118 (.789) all-time in the Marriott Center. Cougar head coach Dave Rose is 68-3 (.958) all-time in the Marriott Center. BYU is currently on a 13-game home win streak.

— Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari is BYU's 20th all-time leading scorer with 1,280 points. He joined the 1,000-point club on Feb. 3, 2009 when he scored 17 points at Air Force. With 219 threes Tavernari is first all-time in school history in career threes. He is sixth in steals with 130.

— Junior guard Jimmer Fredette earned first-team All-MWC honors in 2008-09 and was the only sophomore to receive first, second or third-team honors. He also became BYU's first point guard to earn all-conference honors since Marty Haws in 1990. Fredette became the 41st member of the BYU 1,000-point club with a 33-point effort vs. Nevada. He is the owner of an .875 (.230-263) career free throw shooting percentage, currently second all-time on BYU's career list, and owns the school record for consecutive free throws without a miss — 39.

**ROAD SUCCESS**

In 2008-09, BYU set an MWC record for road wins in a season with nine. The Cougars were 9-3 overall in road games, their best record in road games since 1987-88 when they were 9-3. Nine road wins is tied for second most in a season at BYU behind the 1949-50 and 1979-80 teams that won 10 road games. In the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons combined, BYU is 17-8 on the road, including 11-5 in MWC games. The 17 road victories are the most in a two-year span since the Cougars won 18 in the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. BYU is 2-1 on the road this season with wins at Hawaii and Fresno State and a loss at Utah State.

**FREDETTE, EMERY AND HAWS EARN VEGAS CLASSIC HONORS**

LAS VEGAS (Dec. 23, 2009) – After leading the Cougars to the 2009 HoopTV Las Vegas Classic championship, BYU's Jimmer Fredette was named tournament MVP while Jackson Emery and Tyler Haws were named to the all-tournament team.

The guard trio led the Cougars' high-octane attack at the Orleans Arena as BYU defeated Nevada 110-104 and Nebraska 88-66. The combined for 132 points — 66.0 per game — and to shoot .705 (43-61) from the field, .545 (12-22) from three and .971 (34-35) from the free throw line.

Fredette posted averages of 28.5 points and 5.0 assists while shooting .679 (19-28) from the field and .944 (17-18) from the free throw line. Against Nevada he scored a career-high 33 points — including a 22-point second half — while dishing out six assists. He went for 24 points and four dimes against Nebraska in the championship game.

Emery accounted for 24.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals while shooting .667 (14-21) from the field, .692 (9-13) from three and 1.000 (11-11) from the free throw line. Emery set a career high with 25 points in the Nevada win and added 23 points against Nebraska.

Haws added 13.5 points and 3.5 rebounds per game in the Vegas Classic. He shot .833 (10-12) from the field and 1.000 (6-6) from the free throw line. He was perfect shooting the ball against Nebraska, hitting 7-of-7 from the field and 6-of-6 from the free throw line for a career-best 20 points.

**FREDETTE NAMED MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK (NOV. 16)**

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (Nov. 16, 2009) – BYU junior Jimmer Fredette has been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for games through November 15. This is the third weekly accolade of his career. A 6-2 guard from Glen Falls, N.Y., Fredette led the Cougars to a season-opening win over Bradley (70-60) last Friday, Nov. 13. He scored a game-high 25 points on 6-of-14 shooting, while also recording five rebounds and four assists in 37 minutes. Fredette scored 16 of his 25 points in the second half, while also dishing out three assists. He also went 12-of-14 from the charity stripe in the second half, including hitting his last 12 attempts, six of which came in the final five minutes of the contest. Fredette has 805 career points and earned first-team all-MWC honors in 2008-09. He averaged 16.2 points and 4.1 assists while shooting .382 from downtown and .847 from the free throw line. Fredette was voted the MWC Preseason Player of the Year by the media for the 2009-10 season.

**ROSE SIGNS NEW CONTRACT**

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 13, 2009) – BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe announced today that head men's basketball coach Dave Rose has signed a new five-year contract that will take him through the 2013-14 season. The current deal replaces the contract Rose signed in 2007. "I'm grateful to the university administration as well as Tom Holmoe and the athletic department for the opportunity they have provided for me and my family," Rose said. "BYU is a wonderful place to coach and I look forward to continued success. I have a great staff and players who are committed to this program." Since being named head coach on April 11, 2005, Rose has led the Cougars to at least 20 wins and a trip to the postseason in each of his four seasons. In the past three seasons Rose has guided the Cougars to three-consecutive Mountain West Conference regular season titles, three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament and 25-plus wins each year. At 97-34 and a .740 winning percentage, Rose is off to the best four-year start of any coach in BYU basketball history. His win total places him tied for 12th all-time for best career starts in NCAA history behind the likes of Roy Williams, Jim Boeheim, Mark Few and Jamie Dixon. In MWC play Rose has set a new standard with a career record of 51-13 (.797) that places him third all-time in conference victories and first in winning percentage. Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007 to become the first coach in BYU history to earn the annual league honor in back-to-back seasons. In his four seasons at the helm, Rose has helped BYU establish one of the best home court advantages in the nation. After dropping his first home game as a head coach, Rose led the Cougars to a school record 53-game winning streak in the Marriott Center. His overall home record stands at 61-3 (.953) and includes two undefeated seasons – 16-0 in 2007-08 and 17-0 in 2006-07.

**ROSE ANNOUNCES 2010-11 RECRUITING CLASS**

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 12, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose has announced the commitment of four players who will join the Cougars for the 2010-11 season. Kyle Collinsworth of Provo High School and Anson Winder of Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas have signed national letters of intent while Chris Collinsworth and Nick Martineau will return to BYU after completing two-year missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Kyle Collinsworth, is a 6-foot-6 guard and a gifted ball handler and passer, will join the three-time defending Mountain West conference champions for the 2010-11 season. Last season, Collinsworth led Provo to a 24-1 record while averaging 18.4 points, 7.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds per game as a junior. After leading the Bulldogs to a second-place finish in the state tournament he was named the 4A MVP by the Deseret News and Salt Lake Tribune. Collinsworth also earned 4A tournament MVP honors and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Collinsworth helped lead Provo to state titles his freshman and sophomore seasons. As a sophomore Collinsworth averaged 14.7 points, 3.0 assists and 4.8 rebounds and earned first-team all-state honors from the Deseret News and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Winder, a 6-foot-3 combo guard, follows senior Jonathan Tavernari as the second player to join BYU from Bishop Gorman. Under the direction of Rice, Winder helped lead Bishop Gorman to a 28-5 record, the 4A Nevada state title, the Sunset Regional title and the Sunset Southwest League title his junior season. He posted averaged of 13.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.0 assists and earned all-Southwest Sunset League honors and Bishop Gorman's 2009 Sportsmanship Award. At the High Energy Classic in Gillette, Wyo., Winder earned all-tournament honors. Winder plays for the Triple Double Elite AAU team. Nevada, Portland, UC Riverside and Idaho also recruited Winder. This past summer he posted games with 40 and 36 points. A 6-foot-9 forward with the skills to play at both the small and power forward positions, Chris Collinsworth helped lead BYU to 27-8 record and an outright regular season MWC title while averaging 3.2 points and 4.8 rebounds and chipping in 14 blocks, 19 assists and nine steals. He led the Cougars in rebounding seven times while posting double-digit boards on three occasions. Martineau, a 5-11 point guard out of Fruit Heights, Utah, played in 20 games as a true freshman. He averaged 5.8 minutes per game and totaled 13 points, 14 assists and eight rebounds. Martineau posted career highs of six points and four assists against Loyola Marymount.

**EMERY AND MORGAN NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS**

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 20, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced Tuesday that senior Lamont Morgan, Jr., and junior Jackson Emery have been named captains for this year's team. "Jackson and Lamont are team players," Rose said. "They are proven leaders and have the respect of their teammates. They are willing to do whatever it takes to make this team better. Their teammates voted them as captains and I couldn't ask for better leaders." Morgan enters his third year in the program after redshirting in 2007-08 and playing a key role off the bench last season. The 5-foot-10 senior guard averaged 3.6 points, 1.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists while shooting .461 from the field and .412 from downtown. In his first season back from a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Mexico, Emery started 32 of 33 games while posting averages of 7.8 points, 3.8 rebounds and 3.0 assists. He was third on the team with 47 steals and shot .480 from the field, .377 from downtown and .738 from the free throw line. Known for his hustle and defensive play, Emery earned a spot on the 2009 MWC All-Defensive Team.

**HOME OPENER ATTENDANCE MARKS**

The 16,276 on hand to witness BYU's 70-60 season-opening win over Bradley in the Marriott Center was the largest crowd for a home opener since 1994-95 when there were 17,654 in the stands for BYU's 96-80 win over Nevada. The attendance for home openers has increased each year since 2006-07, when 8,854 were on hand to see BYU outlast Idaho State 84-78 in overtime. In 2007-08 the Cougars got the best of Idaho State again, winning 90-69 with 12,153 in the Marriott Center. Last season 15,753 seats were full as BYU defeated Long Beach State 75-65 in the season/home opener.

**INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU**

- Including sophomore Charles Abouo and senior Jonathan Tavernari, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 38 of the past 58 years.
- Foreign players at BYU have received 10 all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004), one conference freshman of the year award (Jonathan Tavernari - 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

**NATIONAL TEAM EXPERIENCE**

Senior Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil) and Charles Abouo (Cote d'Ivoire) gained valuable experience during the summer of 2009 playing for their respective country's national team. Tavernari helped Brazil win the 2009 FIBA Americas Championship to claim a spot in the 2010 World Championships. Abouo and Cote d'Ivoire booked their tickets to the World Championships by taking second at the FIBA Afrobasket Tournament.

**FIRST HALF LEADS, MARGIN OF VICTORY**

BYU has led at the half in all but on game this season and has held double-digit halftime leads in eight games. The Cougars led by 19 vs. Idaho State, 10 at Hawai'i, 35 vs. Southern, 11 vs. San Francisco, 16 vs. Arizona State, 18 vs. Wagner, 41 vs. Eastern Washington and 14 vs. Nebraska. BYU has won by at least 10 points in 10 of the team's 12 wins and 20-plus five times.

**NONCONFERENCE HOOPS SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED**

PROVO, Utah (July 16, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2009-10 nonconference schedule Thursday, which features matchups with Arizona, Arizona State and Utah State as well as a trip to the Las Vegas Classic. The 16-game nonconference slate includes teams from nine different conferences and nine teams that qualified for postseason play in 2009. The Mountain West Conference schedule will be announced at a later date. On Nov. 17 BYU will host Idaho State, a team the Cougars have defeated in five-straight contests including 85-65 in 2008. Three days later BYU will head to the Aloha State to play Western Athletic Conference member Hawai'i. The two teams last played in 1999, the Cougars' final season as members of the WAC. After the Hawai'i game the blue and white will host Southern University (Nov. 24) and Weber State (Nov. 27). BYU will look to protect its unbeaten home record (17-0) against the Wildcats. The Cougars will open the month of December with instate rival Utah State. BYU owns a 135-90 record against the Aggies but has lost four-straight in Logan. The game is scheduled for Dec. 2. On Dec. 5 the Cougars will play at Energy Solutions Arena for the fifth time since 2003 when they host San Francisco. BYU defeated Utah State 68-63 in 2008 at Energy Solutions where the Cougars are 2-2 all-time. BYU will remain in Utah and host Arizona State on Dec. 8 at the Marriott Center. The Cougars will be looking to avenge last season's one-point loss at the Stadium Shootout at the University of Phoenix Stadium. BYU will head to southern California to take on Fresno State at the Galen Center in Los Angeles on Dec. 12. Former Cougar head coach Steve Cleveland is at the helm of the Bulldog program. BYU returns to the Marriott Center following the neutral tilt at the Galen Center to host Wagner (Dec. 17) and Eastern Washington (Dec. 19) for its first two games of the Las Vegas Classic. The final two games of the Classic will be at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas on Dec. 22 and 23. Nebraska, Nevada and Tulsa will also compete in the Classic. Matchups will be announced at a later date. BYU's last game of the 2009 calendar year will be at Arizona on Dec. 28. The Cougars and Wildcats were conference rivals in the 1960s and 70s when both teams were members of the WAC. The final home nonconference game will be against Eastern New Mexico on Jan. 2 and the nonconference schedule will conclude at UTEP on Jan. 9.

**IMPROVED DEPTH**

BYU's bench has scored at least 21 points nine times and in double figures in all 13 games this season, including 21 against Bradley, 30 vs. Idaho State, 23 at Hawai'i, a season-high of 46 vs. Southern, 25 vs. Weber State, 23 vs. San Francisco, 32 vs. Wagner, 34 vs. Eastern Washington and 26 vs. Nebraska. Last season the BYU bench scored 20-plus points just eight times all season. The 46 bench points vs. Southern are the most bench points by a BYU team since the reserves scored 59 vs. Western Oregon on Dec. 22, 2006.

IN THE 10 YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had eight 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had six, UNLV six, San Diego State five and Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico three.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second three times and third on four occasions. The Cougars were third in 2008-09 (37) behind Utah (14) and San Diego State (31).
- BYU has the most overall wins (214).
- BYU also has the most conference wins (99).
- BYU is tied for the most MWC regular-season titles (five).
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

PRESEASON MWC POLL

Mountain West Conference media members overwhelmingly selected three-time defending conference champion BYU as the preseason favorite to win the 2009-10 MWC regular season championship at the conference's annual media day in Denver on Tuesday. The Cougars took 23 of the 24 first place votes to finish with 215 points in the poll. BYU returns four starters this season after finishing 12-4 in MWC play and 25-8 overall, including a third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. This is the second year BYU has been tabbed the top conference team in the preseason poll. Two years ago the Cougars were also placed first and would eventually win the MWC title, going 14-2 in conference play. BYU junior guard Jimmer Fredette was also named Preseason Player of the Year in addition to joining senior forward Jonathan Tavernari in representing BYU on the Preseason All-Conference Team. The Cougars are the only team to have two players on the pre-season squad. Fredette was a first-team all-MWC and MWC All-Tournament Team selection in 2008-09 while also being named to the USBWA All-District team. The junior is the returning leader in scoring (16.2 ppg) and assists (135) for the Cougars, having scored in double digits 29 times in 2008-09, including eight games with 20 or more points. Tavernari returns for his final season after earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006-07 and garnering two All-Conference selections. He is the Cougars' top returning rebounder (7.2 rpg) and ranked among league leaders in 3-point field goals (2nd/85), steals (3rd/49), rebounding (4th), scoring (6th/15.7 ppg) and 3-point percentage (8th/.381) last season. San Diego State collected the remaining first-place vote and 166 points to finish in second in the poll, followed closely by UNLV in third with 161 points. Utah and New Mexico landed in the fourth- and fifth-place spots, respectively, with the Utes tallying 143 points to the Lobos' 141 points. Wyoming received 89 points to finish sixth, followed by TCU (82 points) in seventh, Colorado State (58 points) in eighth and Air Force (25 points) in ninth. San Diego State junior Billy White, TCU senior Zvonko Buljan and UNLV junior Tre'Von Willis were also selected to the All-Conference Team.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a four-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His 97 victories place him tied for 12th for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, behind the likes of Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, Roy Williams and Jim Boeheim. Rose has returned BYU to the

national stage with three-straight appearances in the top-25 polls and three-straight NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships while adding a third in 2009 (shared with Utah and New Mexico). Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past three seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as associate head coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in nine of the past 10 seasons, including six NCAA bids, while claiming five MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Ten recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 12 years Rose has been in Provo.

With 26 years of coaching experience—including 14 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college and high school levels—Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas

Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Dave and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.

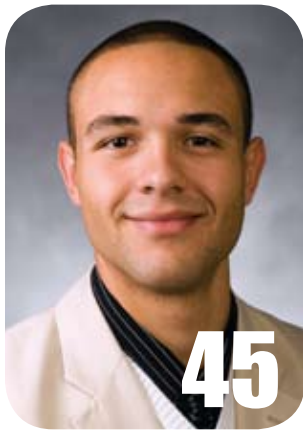
