COUGARS OPEN CONFERENCE PLAY VS. UNLV

BYU men's basketball (14-1) begins its quest for a fourth-straight Mountain West Conference regular season title when it opens league play at home against UNLV on Wednesday, Jan. 6, at 8 p.m. The game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 7 p.m. MST on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. It will be televised live on The Mtn.

UP NEXT

The Cougars step out of MWC action when they head to El Paso, Texas, to take on UTEP on Saturday, Jan. 9, at 7 p.m. MST. Listen to the game live on the radio beginning with the pregame show at 7 p.m. MST on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on CBS C.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

— Jimmer Fredette set BYU single-game records with 49 points and nine threes against Arizona in the Fiesta Bowl Classic in Tucson, Ariz., at the McKale Center. BYU handed Arizona its worst loss at the McKale Center, 99-69.

— Jimmer Fredette was named MVP of the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic after averaging 28.5 points, 5.0 assists and 2.0 steals in wins over Nevada and Nebraska. Jackson Emery (24.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 3.0 apg, 3.0 spg) and Tyler Haws (13.5 ppg, 3.5 rpg) earned all-tournament honors.

— Fredette is now 37th all-time in scoring at BYU with 1,083 career points. He leads the conference in scoring at 21.6 points per game. He is also 15th at BYU in career assists with 275 and 12th in steals with 103.

— Since Rose took over as head coach of BYU basketball, the Cougars are 68-3 (.958) in the Marriott Center, including a 53-game home winning streak from 2005 to 2008 — the longest in school history. With the win over Eastern Washington, the Cougars have a 13-game home winning streak.

— Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose has guided BYU to three-straight MWC regular season titles and three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Under Rose, BYU also has four-straight 20-win seasons and four-straight postseason appearances. At 111-35 (.760) overall, he is the fastest BYU coach to reach 100 wins.

— Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari became BYU's all-time leader in three-pointers with two treys vs. San Francisco to give him 214. He is now at 222 after hitting three vs. Eastern New Mexico. He is also climbing the lists for points (19th with 1,297) and steals (6th with 130).

LOOKING AT UNLV

UNLV opens MWC action after going 12-2 in nonconference play. The Rebels opened the season with seven-straight wins before losing to Kansas State. UNLV then won five straight before losing in the championship game of the Diamond Head Classic to USC. The Rebels have been ranked as high as No. 20 this season. Tre'Von Willis, who has rotated between starting and coming off the bench, leads the team in scoring at 14.5 points per game while shooting .926 from the free throw line, first in the MWC. Oscar Bellfield is second in scoring (11.1 ppg) and three-point baskets (19) while leading the team in assists (3.9). Chace Stanback averages 8.6 points while leading the team in rebounding (4.9 per game), blocks (12) and steals (23). Five other players average five-plus points, including Derrick Jasper (7.6), Matt Shaw (7.0), Kendall Wallace (6.5), Darris Santee (5.6) and Anthony Marshall (5.6). Eleven different Rebels play at least 10 minutes per game with Bellfield leading the way at 26.5 minutes per game. As a team UNLV averages 76.4 points per game while shooting .445 from the field. Opponents average 64.9 points and shoot .396 from the field against the Rebels. Lon Kruger is in his sixth season at UNLV where he is 124-55.

UNLV'S LAST OUTING — UNLV FALLS TO USC

HONOLULU (AP) -Marcus Johnson had 19 points and nine rebounds to help USC beat UNLV 67-56 on Christmas night in the Diamond Head Classic final.

Johnson, a 6-foot-6, 210-pound senior forward, was 8-of-14 from the field. Dwight Lewis added 14 points for the Trojans (8-4), and tournament MVP Mike Gerrity had 13.

Oscar Bellfield led UNLV (12-2) with 17 points. The Rebels shot 34 percent (17-of-50) from the field, going 5-of-22 from 3-point range.

USC had a 12-0 run late in the half, capped by Lewis' layup, and the Trojans had a 39-25 lead at the break. The Trojans led by 19 late in the second half.

SERIES NOTES

BYU and UNLV will play for the 30th time in the history of the series on Wednesday. The Rebels have won the last three matchups and five of six. BYU has a 9-4 record in the Marriott Center against UNLV and had won three straight in Provo before a 76-70 loss last season.

LAST YEAR VS. UNLV IN PROVO — COUGARS FALL TO REBELS AT HOME

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 21, 2009) — After leading at the half by 13 points, the Cougars were unable to stop a UNLV comeback at the Marriott Center Wednesday night, falling 76-70. The Cougars are now 14-4 on the season and 2-2 in the Mountain West Conference. "I thought we came out and got off to a good start," BYU head coach Dave Rose said. "They put more pressure on us in the second half and we started to rush in the second half." The game marks the first time the Cougars lost back-to-back regular season games since 2005, and the first time the team has suffered back-to-back conference losses under BYU head coach Dave Rose. Jonathan Tavernari posted his fifth-career double-double, leading the Cougars with 21 points and 13 rebounds. Jimmer Fredette added to the effort with 19 points. The Cougars trailed UNLV early in the game before a nine-point run put BYU up 15-11. The Cougar defense dominated the Rebels as they made defensive plays to both steal the ball and rebound, to push down court for fast breaks. Heading into half-time Fredette hit a last second three-pointer to put BYU up 43-30. Fredette led the Cougars with 15 points at the half, while Tavernari and Lee Cumard were both in double figures heading into the second period. UNLV came out of the second half strong, scoring eight unanswered points, on a 12-3 run. BYU's shots struggled to fall as the momentum continued to grow for the Rebels. UNLV fought back for the lead. BYU scored only five points during the first nine minutes of the second half, surrendering the lead to the Rebels. With as much as an eight-point deficit the Cougars managed to pull within three points of the Rebels, but the second half deficit proved too much to overcome. The Cougars shot only 25 percent during the second half, after shooting 51 percent in the first half. The Cougars fell short in rebounding also claiming only 12 rebounds in the second half to UNLV's 25.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

- "I thought we came out and got off to a good start. We had a nice lead at the half."
- "UNLV did a much better job at rebounding in the second half and getting second-chance shots."
- "They put more pressure on us in the second half, but for the most part it was a good game."
- "We started to rush in the second half."
- "They guarded Lee hard and ran at him. We didn't shoot the ball with a lot of confidence in the second half."
- "We need to do a better job at getting the ball inside and then kicking it out—once we do that we can settle down. We are more comfortable when we work the ball inside."
- "Wink is a tough cover. He played with a lot of confidence tonight. They were pretty clutched down at the end—we have to come together and regroup."

UNLV Head Coach Lon Kruger

- "Wink was terrific tonight. The shot Wink made before the shot clock went off was huge putting us up by six with just a few minutes left."
- "As a team, we really picked it up in the second half and came out with better results."
- "We came away with another good win tonight. Now we need to get ourselves ready for a good Utah team on Saturday."

NOTES FROM LAST SEASON IN PROVO

Player Notes

- Jonathan Tavernari posted his third double-double of the season with 21 points and 13 rebounds in the game. This is Tavernari's fifth career double-double. In the first half he tallied nine rebounds, 11 points and three steals to help put the Cougars up by 13 (43-30) points at the half. The 13 rebounds are a career high and he tied a career high with five steals.
- The Cougars had four players in double figures with Jonathan Tavernari leading with 21, Jimmer Fredette adding 19 points, Jackson Emery with 11 and Lee Cumard with 10.
- Tavernari led the team with a game total of 21 points, followed by Jimmer Fredette's 19 points.

Team Notes

- For the 17th-straight game, BYU head coach Dave Rose started Jimmer Fredette, Jackson Emery, Lee Cumard, Jonathan Tavernari and Chris Miles. The Cougars are 13-4 with that starting lineup.
- For the 10th time this season and for the third time in four games the Cougars shot 50 percent or better in the first half. They shot 51.4 percent in the first half against the Runnin' Rebels.

Record Watch

- Jonathan Tavernari hit three three-pointers against UNLV to bring his career total to 165. He passed Mike Rose (163) during Wednesday's game, putting him second in BYU history. He is now 49 threes from passing Mark Bigelow (213) for first. He has 48 threes this season.
- With 10 points against UNLV on Wednesday, Lee Cumard now has 307 points this season and 1,320 career points. During the game he passed Joe Nelson (1,317), putting him 16th in all-time scoring for BYU.
- Jonathan Tavernari scored 21 points against UNLV to bring his career total to 954. He needs 46 points to reach the 1,000-point mark for his career.

Game Trends

- The first 27 points of the game for BYU were scored by only three players; Jonathan Tavernari (nine), Lee Cumard (eight) and Jimmer Fredette (10). Those three Cougars posted double figures in the first half to lead the Runnin' Rebels 43-30 at the break (Tavernari 11, Cumard 10, Fredette, 15).
- Jimmer Fredette hit a three at the halftime buzzer to put the Cougars up 13 points going into the locker room. He posted 15 points in the first half and 19 total points on the night.
- For the 10th game this season, the Cougars have scored 40 or more points in the first half. They scored 43 points going into the locker room.
- A 9-0 run starting at the 17:07 mark of the first half put the Cougars up 15-9, maintaining that lead for the remainder of the first half.

LAST YEAR AT UNLV — COMEBACK FALLS SHORT AT UNLV

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (Feb. 21, 2009) – In front of the largest UNLV crowd in 16 years, the Cougars (20-6, 8-4) fell to the Runnin' Rebels (20-7, 8-5) by one point Saturday, 75-74, in a fight to the finish at the Thomas and Mack Center. Senior Lee Cumnard led the Cougars in points with 20, also posting seven rebounds and four assists on the night. Jonathan Tavernari posted his fifth double-double of the season and seventh of his career with 19 points and 11 rebounds against the Rebels. The first three minutes of the game were scoreless for both teams, with UNLV making a 12-footer to put the first points on the board. The Cougars shot 0-for-7 from the field in the first four minutes of play. BYU was scoreless until Jonathan Tavernari put the Cougars on the board four minutes into the game. Shortly thereafter, the Cougars would post an 8-0 run and then a 7-0 run, the latter giving them a five-point lead at 19-14. Even though the Cougars only shot 32.3 percent in the first half, they still posted a higher percentage than the Runnin' Rebels, who shot only 29.6 percent. UNLV also gave up eight turnovers in the first half, to the Cougars' four. With a close battle the entire first half, the Cougars found themselves trailing 21-23 at the half as UNLV chalked-up a 7-0 run, finishing off with a layup by Rene Rougeau at the buzzer to put them up going into the locker rooms. Leading at the half in scoring was Cumnard, posting six points. Tavernari also chalked up five points in the first half, with Charles Abouo tallying four points. Fredette, Emery and Miles each had a bucket apiece at the half. Coming out of the half, BYU scored the first three points with Cumnard hitting his 24th free throw in a row (making the first and missing the second) and a layup by Miles gave the Cougars the lead once again at 24-23. Both teams would trade points until 37-37 when UNLV would pull away with an 8-2 run, taking the lead for the rest of the game. With everyone on their feet at the Thomas and Mack Center in the last minute, the Cougars never stopped their game. With two minutes left in the game, UNLV led BYU by 11 points. With 30 seconds left in the game, BYU was down 73-66. Hoping for a miracle, the Cougars kept on playing. The Cougars posted a 17-7 run to end the game, ending up one point short, falling to the Runnin' Rebels 74-75 in Las Vegas.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

- "I thought it was a really hard-fought game by both teams. It was quite a defensive battle where both teams made a lot of good plays. Both teams rushed things in the first half but settled down offensively in the second." – "We battled hard but we weren't able to gain the lead back in time. We had some lapses where it got away from us."
- "The separation was just a little too much to overcome. The players got themselves in a position where their confidence level wasn't very high. After we were able to penetrate for a couple of shots we got more confidence built up, but we just weren't good enough tonight to win."
- "I think all of our players probably thought that they could've done more—when you're that close, everyone feels like they could've done more."

NOTES FROM LAST YEAR AT UNLV

Player Notes

- With 19 points and 11 rebounds Jonathan Tavernari posted his fifth double-double this season and seventh of his career. It marks his second double-double in four games.
- By hitting 5-of-9 from downtown at UNLV Jonathan Tavernari has hit 15-of-24 from long distance in his last four games. He now has 71 threes for the season and 188 for his career.
- Lee Cumnard hit the first of two free throws early in the second half to extend his streak of free throws without a miss to 24. The streak ended when he missed the second. He finished 3-of-4 from the line at UNLV.
- With four players in double figures (Cumnard-20, Tavernari-19, Fredette-13 and Miles-10), the Cougars fell 75-74 to UNLV. BYU is 7-3 overall and 4-3 in the MWC when four players score in double figures.

Team Notes

- For the 24th time in 26 games this season, BYU head coach Dave Rose started Jimmer Fredette, Jackson Emery, Lee Cumnard, Jonathan Tavernari and Chris Miles. The Cougars are 18-6 with that starting lineup. Lamont Morgan, Jr., started the first game of the season in place of Jimmer Fredette and Charles Abouo started the Wyoming game in Provo in place of Jackson Emery.
- After scoring just 21 points in the first half at UNLV — a season low for a half — the Cougars scored 53 in the second half while shooting 59.3 percent (16-27) from the field. The 53 points are the second most scored in a half this season behind the 61 scored in the second half against Boise State.

Record Watch

- With a three-pointer at the 8:17 mark in the first half, Jonathan Tavernari has hit a three in the last 21 games and in 25-of-26 games this season. Tavernari has tied Terrell Lyday (21) for the single-season record for consecutive games with a made three. Mark Bigelow holds the overall record with 22-consecutive games with a made three over two seasons.
- With 20 points at UNLV on Saturday, Lee Cumnard now has 446 points this season and 1,459 career points. He needs 54 points to pass Kresimir Cosic (1,512) for 10th all-time.
- Jonathan Tavernari scored 19 points against the Rebels to give him 1,087 points for his career. Tavernari broke a tie with Keena Young (1,068) and pass Mel Hutchins (1,084) during the UNLV game and is now 34th all-time. He needs 13 points to pass Mark Handy for 33rd.
- Jonathan Tavernari hit five threes at UNLV to bring his career total to 188. He is now 26 threes from passing Mark Bigelow (213) for first. He has 71 threes this season. BYU'S LAST OUTING — COUGARS RACE PAST GREYHOUNDS

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 2, 2010) – The BYU men's basketball team started off the new year by extending its winning streak to nine games Saturday, defeating Eastern New Mexico 95-49 in the Marriott Center. Michael Loyd, Jr., led the Cougars with a career-high 17 points on the night, adding two steals. Jonathan Tavernari hit 6-of-7 from the field, tallying 15 points, seven rebounds and two assists. Charles Abouo and Noah Hartssock led the team on the boards with eight rebounds apiece; Hartssock also added 12 points, shooting a perfect 6-of-6 from the field. Hartssock (12), Tavernari (15), Chris Miles (13) and Loyd (17) all scored in double figures as the Cougars improved to 7-0 this season when four players score at least ten points. BYU (14-1) started the scoring with Noah Hartssock posting up to drain the first bucket. After being fouled at 18:53, Chris Miles made 2-of-2 from the charity stripe to put the Cougars up 4-0 to start the first half. The Greyhounds followed suit by following the next two missed shots to lay them in for two points each to knot the score at four. The teams traded baskets again to tie the score at six, the Cougars then posting a 14-2 run to put them up 20-8 at the 13:12 mark. In that run, Jonathan Tavernari posted two threes while Hartssock, Miles and Davies added points as well. With 9:22 left in the first half, Loyd was on the run to complete a fast break play, receiving a down-the-court pass from Lamont Morgan, Jr., and laying the ball in to bring the score to 32-14. Tavernari followed with a fadeaway at the 8:15 mark to bring the score to 34-18. The Cougars went on another run, this one a 16-2 stretch to end the half as the teams went into the locker rooms with the Cougars leading by 30 at 57-27. Posting the best field goal percentage in a half this season, the Cougars boasted a 73.3 shooting percentage. That is the best percentage for a half since BYU shot .739 in the second half against Colorado State in the 2008 Mountain West Conference Tournament.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...**BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

– "I was pleased with the way these guys stepped up and played without Jackson and Jimmer. I thought Mike, Noah and Jonathan played well and got some good shots. We managed the game really well. It was nice to see the boys play well to get ready for next week."

– "I think the last three or four weeks, we've given Jonathan some minutes at the three spot; it's nice to have him rebound the ball and get some good match-ups. He took seven really good shots and made six of them tonight."

– "This is a great time of the year, you see all the preseason games and see what all your league opponents have. What comes next is even better, so we're excited."

Arizona Head Coach Sean Miller

– "They were really, really good. I think we got a little tired at the end and missed our shots. They're very well coached and very good."

– "It was a good trip for us to come here. It's a nice place to go and it helps us to see what we need to work on. It's a chance for us to work on things."

– "I think we're pretty good for our level but I don't think we defended as well as we could, and that's what I told them at halftime."

– Michael Loyd, Jr. scored a career-high 17 points, shooting 7-of-11 while also tying a career high with 2 steals. In the first half, Loyd hit all six shots he took, including three treys (also a career-high), to match his previous career high of 15 points.

FREE THROW STREAKS

Junior guard Jimmer Fredette set a BYU record with 39-consecutive made free throws from Nov. 17 to Dec. 12. Fredette broke the record when he hit his 33rd-consecutive free throw with 16:56 remaining in the second half against Arizona State. He had a streak of 13 straight in the first two games and reached 20-straight before missing after six-straight makes against Nebraska. For the season he is shooting .926 from the line and his career percentage is .875 — second in Cougar history. Tyler Haws is shooting .872 from the line and had a streak of 20-straight made free throws end against Eastern New Mexico. Jackson Emery has made 12-straight free throws and is shooting .824 for the season.

ROAD SUCCESS

In 2008-09, BYU set an MWC record for road wins in a season with nine. The Cougars were 9-3 overall in road games, their best record in road games since 1987-88 when they were 9-3. Nine road wins is tied for second most in a season at BYU behind the 1949-50 and 1979-80 teams that won 10 road games. In the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons combined, BYU is 17-8 on the road, including 11-5 in MWC games. The 17 road victories are the most in a two-year span since the Cougars won 18 in the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. BYU is 3-1 on the road this season with wins at Hawai'i, Fresno State and Arizona and a loss at Utah State.

MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

BYU junior Jimmer Fredette has been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for games through January 2. This is the third weekly accolade of the season — and second consecutive after earning the award on Dec. 28 — for Fredette and the fifth of his career overall. A 6-2 guard from Glens Falls, N.Y., Fredette led the Cougars to a 99-69 win at Arizona on December 28 in the Fiesta Bowl Classic. He set a BYU, McKale Center and Fiesta Bowl Classic record, while tying the all-time MWC single-game mark with 49 points. He shot 16-for 23 from the field, including 9-of-13 from beyond the arc and 8-of-9 from the charity stripe. His point total currently ranks as the second highest in the nation this season. Fredette also set the all-time league mark for points by a junior, and tied the Conference record for field goals and three-pointers in a single game. His nine three's are also a BYU record. Fredette added nine assists, seven rebounds and two steals in 36 minutes of action.

FREDETTE, EMERY AND HAWS EARN VEGAS CLASSIC HONORS

LAS VEGAS (Dec. 23, 2009) - After leading the Cougars to the 2009 HoopTV Las Vegas Classic championship, BYU's Jimmer Fredette was named tournament MVP while Jackson Emery and Tyler Haws were named to the all-tournament team. The guard trio led the Cougars' high-octane attack at the Orleans Arena as BYU defeated Nevada 110-104 and Nebraska 88-66. The combined for 132 points — 66.0 per game — and to shoot .705 (43-61) from the field, .545 (12-22) from three and .971 (34-35) from the free throw line. Fredette posted averages of 28.5 points and 5.0 assists while shooting .679 (19-28) from the field and .944 (17-18) from the free throw line. Against Nevada he scored a career-high 33 points — including a 22-point second half — while dishing out six assists. He went for 24 points and four dimes against Nebraska in the championship game. Emery accounted for 24.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals while shooting .667 (14-21) from the field, .692 (9-13) from three and 1.000 (11-11) from the free throw line. Emery set a career high with 25 points in the Nevada win and added 23 points against Nebraska. Haws added 13.5 points and 3.5 rebounds per game in the Vegas Classic. He shot .833 (10-12) from the field and 1.000 (6-6) from the free throw line. He was perfect shooting the ball against Nebraska, hitting 7-of-7 from the field and 6-of-6 from the free throw line for a career-best 20 points.

ROSE SIGNS NEW CONTRACT

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 13, 2009) – BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe announced today that head men's basketball coach Dave Rose has signed a new five-year contract that will take him through the 2013-14 season. The current deal replaces the contract Rose signed in 2007. "I'm grateful to the university administration as well as Tom Holmoe and the athletic department for the opportunity they have provided for me and my family," Rose said. "BYU is a wonderful place to coach and I look forward to continued success. I have a great staff and players who are committed to this program." Since being named head coach on April 11, 2005, Rose has led the Cougars to at least 20 wins and a trip to the postseason in each of his four seasons. In the past three seasons Rose has guided the Cougars to three-consecutive Mountain West Conference regular season titles, three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament and 25-plus wins each year. At 97-34 and a .740 winning percentage, Rose is off to the best four-year start of any coach in BYU basketball history. His win total places him tied for 12th all-time for best career starts in NCAA history behind the likes of Roy Williams, Jim Boeheim, Mark Few and Jamie Dixon. In MWC play Rose has set a new standard with a career record of 51-13 (.797) that places him third all-time in conference victories and first in winning percentage. Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007 to become the first coach in BYU history to earn the annual league honor in back-to-back seasons. In his four seasons at the helm, Rose has helped BYU establish one of the best home court advantages in the nation. After dropping his first home game as a head coach, Rose led the Cougars to a school record 53-game winning streak in the Marriott Center. His overall home record stands at 61-3 (.953) and includes two undefeated seasons – 16-0 in 2007-08 and 17-0 in 2006-07.

ROSE ANNOUNCES 2010-11 RECRUITING CLASS

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 12, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose has announced the commitment of four players who will join the Cougars for the 2010-11 season. Kyle Collinsworth of Provo High School and Anson Winder of Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas have signed national letters of intent while Chris Collinsworth and Nick Martineau will return to BYU after completing two-year missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Kyle Collinsworth, is a 6-foot-6 guard and a gifted ball handler and passer, will join the three-time defending Mountain West conference champions for the 2010-11 season. Last season, Collinsworth led Provo to a 24-1 record while averaging 18.4 points, 7.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds per game as a junior. After leading the Bulldogs to a second-place finish in the state tournament he was named the 4A MVP by the Deseret News and Salt Lake Tribune. Collinsworth also earned 4A tournament MVP honors and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Collinsworth helped lead Provo to state titles his freshman and sophomore seasons. As a sophomore Collinsworth averaged 14.7 points, 3.0 assists and 4.8 rebounds and earned first-team all-state honors from the Deseret News and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Winder, a 6-foot-3 combo guard, follows senior Jonathan Tavernari as the second player to join BYU from Bishop Gorman. Under the direction of Rice, Winder helped lead Bishop Gorman to a 28-5 record, the 4A Nevada state title, the Sunset Regional title and the Sunset Southwest League title his junior season. He posted averaged of 13.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.0 assists and earned all-Southwest Sunset League honors and Bishop Gorman's 2009 Sportsmanship Award. At the High Energy Classic in Gillette, Wyo., Winder earned all-tournament honors. Winder plays for the Triple Double Elite AAU team. Nevada, Portland, UC Riverside and Idaho also recruited Winder. This past summer he posted games with 40 and 36 points. A 6-foot-9 forward with the skills to play at both the small and power forward positions, Chris Collinsworth helped lead BYU to 27-8 record and an outright regular season MWC title while averaging 3.2 points and 4.8 rebounds and chipping in 14 blocks, 19 assists and nine steals. He led the Cougars in rebounding seven times while posting double-digit boards on three occasions. Martineau, a 5-11 point guard out of Fruit Heights, Utah, played in 20 games as a true freshman. He averaged 5.8 minutes per game and totaled 13 points, 14 assists and eight rebounds. Martineau posted career highs of six points and four assists against Loyola Marymount.

EMERY AND MORGAN NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 20, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced Tuesday that senior Lamont Morgan, Jr., and junior Jackson Emery have been named captains for this year's team. "Jackson and Lamont are team players," Rose said. "They are proven leaders and have the respect of their teammates. They are willing to do whatever it takes to make this team better. Their teammates voted them as captains and I couldn't ask for better leaders." Morgan enters his third year in the program after redshirting in 2007-08 and playing a key role off the bench last season. The 5-foot-10 senior guard averaged 3.6 points, 1.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists while shooting .461 from the field and .412 from downtown. In his first season back from a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Mexico, Emery started 32 of 33 games while posting averages of 7.8 points, 3.8 rebounds and 3.0 assists. He was third on the team with 47 steals and shot .480 from the field, .377 from downtown and .738 from the free throw line. Known for his hustle and defensive play, Emery earned a spot on the 2009 MWC All-Defensive Team.

HOME OPENER ATTENDANCE MARKS

The 16,276 on hand to witness BYU's 70-60 season-opening win over Bradley in the Marriott Center was the largest crowd for a home opener since 1994-95 when there were 17,654 in the stands for BYU's 96-80 win over Nevada. The attendance for home openers has increased each year since 2006-07, when 8,854 were on hand to see BYU outlast Idaho State 84-78 in overtime. In 2007-08 the Cougars got the best of Idaho State again, winning 90-69 with 12,153 in the Marriott Center. Last season 15,753 seats were full as BYU defeated Long Beach State 75-65 in the season/home opener.

INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU

- Including sophomore Charles Abouo and senior Jonathan Tavernari, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 38 of the past 58 years.
- Foreign players at BYU have received 10 all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004), one conference freshman of the year award (Jonathan Tavernari - 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

NATIONAL TEAM EXPERIENCE

Senior Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil) and Charles Abouo (Cote d'Ivoire) gained valuable experience during the summer of 2009 playing for their respective country's national team. Tavernari helped Brazil win the 2009 FIBA Americas Championship to claim a spot in the 2010 World Championships. Abouo and Cote d'Ivoire booked their tickets to the World Championships by taking second at the FIBA Afrobasket Tournament.

FIRST HALF LEADS, MARGIN OF VICTORY

BYU has led at the half in all but one game this season and has held double-digit halftime leads in 10 games. The Cougars held their biggest halftime lead of 41 against Eastern Washington (55-14). BYU has won by at least 10 points in 12 of the team's 14 wins and 20-plus seven times.

NONCONFERENCE HOOPS SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

PROVO, Utah (July 16, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2009-10 nonconference schedule Thursday, which features matchups with Arizona, Arizona State and Utah State as well as a trip to the Las Vegas Classic. The 16-game nonconference slate includes teams from nine different conferences and nine teams that qualified for postseason play in 2009. The Mountain West Conference schedule will be announced at a later date. On Nov. 17 BYU will host Idaho State, a team the Cougars have defeated in five-straight contests including 85-65 in 2008. Three days later BYU will head to the Aloha State to play Western Athletic Conference member Hawai'i. The two teams last played in 1999, the Cougars' final season as members of the WAC. After the Hawai'i game the blue and white will host Southern University (Nov. 24) and Weber State (Nov. 27). BYU will look to protect its unbeaten home record (17-0) against the Wildcats. The Cougars will open the month of December with instate rival Utah State. BYU owns a 135-90 record against the Aggies but has lost four-straight in Logan. The game is scheduled for Dec. 2. On Dec. 5 the Cougars will play at Energy Solutions Arena for the fifth time since 2003 when they host San Francisco. BYU defeated Utah State 68-63 in 2008 at Energy Solutions where the Cougars are 2-2 all-time. BYU will remain in Utah and host Arizona State on Dec. 8 at the Marriott Center. The Cougars will be looking to avenge last season's one-point loss at the Stadium Shootout at the University of Phoenix Stadium. BYU will head to southern California to take on Fresno State at the Galen Center in Los Angeles on Dec. 12. Former Cougar head coach Steve Cleveland is at the helm of the Bulldog program. BYU returns to the Marriott Center following the neutral tilt at the Galen Center to host Wagner (Dec. 17) and Eastern Washington (Dec. 19) for its first two games of the Las Vegas Classic. The final two games of the Classic will be at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas on Dec. 22 and 23. Nebraska, Nevada and Tulsa will also compete in the Classic. Matchups will be announced at a later date. BYU's last game of the 2009 calendar year will be at Arizona on Dec. 28. The Cougars and Wildcats were conference rivals in the 1960s and 70s when both teams were members of the WAC. The final home nonconference game will be against Eastern New Mexico on Jan. 2 and the nonconference schedule will conclude at UTEP on Jan. 9.

IMPROVED DEPTH

BYU's bench has scored at least 21 points 10 times and in double figures in all 15 games this season, including 21 against Bradley, 30 vs. Idaho State, 23 at Hawai'i, a season-high of 46 vs. Southern, 25 vs. Weber State, 23 vs. San Francisco, 32 vs. Wagner, 34 vs. Eastern Washington, 26 vs. Nebraska and 41 vs. Eastern New Mexico. Last season the BYU bench scored 20-plus points just eight times all season. The 46 bench points vs. Southern are the most bench points by a BYU team since the reserves scored 59 vs. Western Oregon on Dec. 22, 2006.

IN THE 10 YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had eight 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had six, UNLV six, San Diego State five and Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico three.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second three times and third on four occasions. The Cougars were third in 2008-09 (37) behind Utah (14) and San Diego State (31).
- BYU has the most overall wins (214).
- BYU also has the most conference wins (99).
- BYU is tied for the most MWC regular-season titles (five).
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

PRESEASON MWC POLL

Mountain West Conference media members overwhelmingly selected three-time defending conference champion BYU as the preseason favorite to win the 2009-10 MWC regular season championship at the conference's annual media day in Denver on Tuesday. The Cougars took 23 of the 24 first place votes to finish with 215 points in the poll. BYU returns four starters this season after finishing 12-4 in MWC play and 25-8 overall, including a third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. This is the second year BYU has been tabbed the top conference team in the preseason poll. Two years ago the Cougars were also placed first and would eventually win the MWC title, going 14-2 in conference play. BYU junior guard Jimmer Fredette was also named Preseason Player of the Year in addition to joining senior forward Jonathan Tavernari in representing BYU on the Preseason All-Conference Team. The Cougars are the only team to have two players on the pre-season squad. Fredette was a first-team all-MWC and MWC All-Tournament Team selection in 2008-09 while also being named to the USBWA All-District team. The junior is the returning leader in scoring (16.2 ppg) and assists (1.35) for the Cougars, having scored in double digits 29 times in 2008-09, including eight games with 20 or more points. Tavernari returns for his final season after earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006-07 and garnering two All-Conference selections. He is the Cougars' top returning rebounder (7.2 rpg) and ranked among league leaders in 3-point field goals (2nd/85), steals (3rd/49), rebounding (4th), scoring (6th/15.7 ppg) and 3-point percentage (8th/.381) last season. San Diego State collected the remaining first-place vote and 166 points to finish in second in the poll, followed closely by UNLV in third with 161 points. Utah and New Mexico landed in the fourth- and fifth-place spots, respectively, with the Utes tallying 143 points to the Lobos' 141 points. Wyoming received 89 points to finish sixth, followed by TCU (82 points) in seventh, Colorado State (58 points) in eighth and Air Force (25 points) in ninth. San Diego State junior Billy White, TCU senior Zvonko Buljan and UNLV junior Tre'Von Willis were also selected to the All-Conference Team.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a four-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His 97 victories place him tied for 12th for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, behind the likes of Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, Roy Williams and Jim Boeheim. Rose has returned BYU to the

national stage with three-straight appearances in the top-25 polls and three-straight NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships while adding a third in 2009 (shared with Utah and New Mexico). Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past three seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as associate head coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in nine of the past 10 seasons, including six NCAA bids, while claiming five MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Ten recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 12 years Rose has been in Provo.

With 26 years of coaching experience—including 14 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college and high school levels—Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas

Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Dave and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.

SUMMARY: A prolific scorer, guard Jimmer Fredette is a tough, hard-nosed competitor who was ranked by ESPN.com among the nation's top 75 high school shooting guards. Known for his shooting touch, Fredette set the league scoring record at Glens Falls High School (Glens Falls, N.Y.) with 2,404 career points. He was a significant contributor as a freshman, averaging 7.0 points off the bench. In 2008-09 he became BYU's first point guard to earn first-team all-conference honors since Marty Haws in 1990. Fredette averaged 16.2 points and 4.1 assists while contributing a team-best 50 steals. He also shot 48.0 percent from the field, 38.2 percent on threes and 84.7 percent from the free throw line. 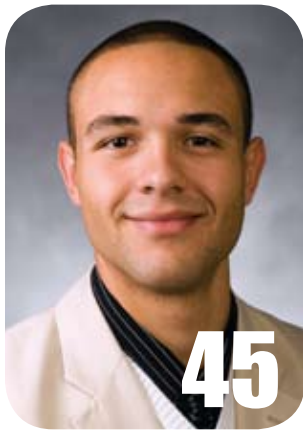

SUMMARY: The 2007 Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year, Jonathan Tavernari followed a standout season in his first year with the Cougars with a record-setting sophomore campaign. He earned All-MWC Third Team honors and set the BYU single-season and sophomore MWC three-point record with 88 triples. Tavernari repeated as a third-team selection in 2009 and posted averages of 15.7 points and 7.2 rebounds per game. The 6-foot-6 forward was the lone non-professional to earn a spot on the 2008 Brazilian Senior National Team, playing in the Olympic Qualifying Tournament in Athens.
