No. 25/23 BYU men's basketball (16-1, 1-0 MWC) will take its 11-game winning streak to Colorado to take on Air Force (8-7, 0-2 MWC) on Wednesday, Jan. 13, at 6 p.m. The game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 5 p.m. MST on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. It will be televised live on The Mtn.

The Cougars return home after back-to-back road games for an MWC meeting with Colorado State on Saturday, Jan. 16, at 4 p.m. MST. Listen to the game live on the radio beginning with the pregame show at 3 p.m. MST on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on The Mtn.

### COUGAR QUICK HITS

- Jimmer Fredette set BYU single-game records with 49 points and nine threes against Arizona in the Fiesta Bowl Classic in Tucson, Ariz., at the McKale Center. BYU handed Arizona its worst loss at the McKale Center, 99-69.
- Jimmer Fredette was named MVP of the HoopTV Las Vegas Classic after averaging 28.5 points, 5.0 assists and 2.0 steals in wins over Nevada and Nebraska. Jackson Emery (24.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 3.0 apg, 3.0 spg) and Tyler Haws (13.5 ppg, 3.5 rpg) earned all-tournament honors.
- Fredette is 35th all-time in scoring at BYU with 1,090 career points. He leads the conference in scoring at 20.7 points per game. He is also 15th at BYU in career assists with 275 and 12th in steals with 103.
- Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose has guided BYU to three-straight MWC regular season titles and three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Under Rose, BYU also has four-straight 20-win seasons and four-straight postseason appearances. At 113-35 (.764) overall, he is the fastest BYU coach to reach 100 wins.
- Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari became BYU's all-time leader in three-pointers with two treys vs. San Francisco to give him 214. He is now at 229 after hitting three at UTEP. He is also climbing the lists for points (17th with 1,333) and steals (5th with 132).
- Tavernari is on pace to become the BYU player with the most wins in a career. Since his freshman campaign, he has been a part of 89 Cougar wins, eight behind former teammate Lee Cummond (2005-09), who was a part of 97 BYU wins, and five behind Russell Larson, who was a part of 94 wins (1991-95).

**LOOKING AT AIR FORCE**

Air Force is 8-7 overall and 0-2 in Mountain West Conference action with losses coming at TCU (59-50) and at Colorado State (70-48). Grant Parker leads the team in scoring and rebounding at 17.1 points and 7.1 rebounds per game but has not played in the team's last eight games. Evan Washington is second on the team in both categories at 11.6 ppg and 5.1 rpg while Tom Fow is third in scoring (11.2 ppg) and fourth in rebounding (4.1 rpg). As a team Air Force averages 62.7 points per game while shooting .466 from the field. Falcon opponents average 61.5 points and shoot .407 from the field. Air Force coach Jeff Reynolds is in his third season with the Falcons where he is 34-42.

**AIR FORCE'S LAST OUTING — FALCONS FALL TO RAMS, 70-48**

FORT COLLINS, Colo. (AP) — Colorado State's defenders knew what to expect of Air Force. The Rams had seen it deliberate Princeton offense before. "We're experienced against that offense and defended the Princeton defense real well and we should have," said Rams forward Travis Franklin. "We saw that style against Denver, UC-Davis and Colorado." Andy Ogide scored 13 points and Colorado State defeated Air Force 70-48 Saturday night. Franklin added 11 points for Colorado State (11-5, 2-0 Mountain West), unbeaten after two conference games for the first time since 2002-03. The Rams have won three in a row overall. And their familiarity and their aggressive defensive play paid dividends. The Rams forced 18 turnovers and Air Force into its lowest scoring half of the season. Mike Fitzgerald had 11 points for the Falcons (8-7, 0-2), who have an 11-game conference road losing streak. Air Force's last conference road victory came Feb. 23, 2008 in Fort Collins. The loss was also their 18th consecutive conference setback overall. The Falcons were without three starters. Injuries sidelined leading scorer Grant Parker (groin strain), Sammy Schafer (concussion) and Taylor Stewart (broken hand). Air Force shot 26 percent in the first half, but made its first three shots of the second half, including a layup by Taylor Broekhuis with 16:11 to play to make it a 31-23 game. Broekhuis' short jumper pulled the Falcons to within 34-28 before Travis Busch's backdoor layup began a 12-3 run that pushed Colorado State's lead to 46-31 with 10:25 left. Michael Lyons' jumper ended the drought for the Falcons, but Colorado responded with a 14-4 run, including nine points by Ogide, that gave the Rams their biggest lead, 60-37 with 5:52 remaining. Colorado State began clearing its bench, and Air Force closed to within 60-43 on Evan Washington's basket but got no closer. Franklin had seven points at halftime, and the Rams led 26-15. Their lead could have been larger, but they made only 2-of-7 free throws in the last three minutes. Air Force was 6 of 23 from the field before halftime, and its point total was its lowest for a first half this season.

**SERIES NOTES**

BYU and Air Force play for the 63rd time on Wednesday with the Cougars leading the overall series 50-12. BYU has won the last eight meetings, including three last season. The Cougars won 71-50 at Air Force, 54-49 at home and 80-69 in the MWC Tournament. BYU is 21-7 in Clune Arena including the last three.

**LAST YEAR AT AIR FORCE — STRONG FINISH LEADS TO BIG WIN AT AIR FORCE**

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (Feb. 3, 2009) – To end the first half of Mountain West Conference play, the BYU men's basketball team (17-5, 5-3) defeated the Air Force Falcons (9-12, 0-8) 71-50 with four Cougars in double figures on Tuesday. Junior Jonathan Tavernari became the 39th Cougar to score 1,000 career points against Air Force, bringing his all-time scoring to 1,006 points. The 1,000th point came on a free throw with 15:02 remaining in the game. Tavernari finished the game with 17 points, six rebounds, two assists and three steals. Jimmer Fredette hit 6-10 from the field, 4-4 from the stripe and 4-5 from the three-point line, leading the Cougars in points with 20 against the Falcons. Fredette has made 32 of his last 35 free throws this season. Lee Cummmard posted his third double-double of the season and the 10th of his career, putting up 12 points and 10 rebounds on the night. Chris Miles posted his third double-figure game in a row with 10 points on the night, posting some crucial points for the Cougars late in the second half. To start out the scoring for the Cougars, Tavernari and Cummmard posted the first seven points of the game. The Cougars went on two 7-1 runs broken up by a jumper from Air Force at the 13:24 mark to put them up 14-5. BYU posted its largest lead at the 7:53 mark with a pair of free throws from Jackson Emery, tallying a 6-0 BYU run and a 13-point lead at 23-10. To tie the lowest field goal percentage of the season, BYU hit only 37.5 percent of their shots in the first half. The Cougars didn't post any fast break points in the first half, while they normally averaging 6.3 more than their opponent. Leading the entire first half, the Cougars had some scares by the Falcons late in the first half. After their largest lead of the game at 13, the Cougars fell to two solid runs by the Falcons (8-2 and 13-4), shrinking the lead to four going into the locker rooms at 27-23. To continue their adrenaline in the second half, the Falcons obtained their first lead of the game at the 11:50 mark at 39-41. The Cougars would battle for the lead for two and a half minutes until a 10-0 run would put them up 53-45. With a team effort to get back on top of the Falcons, Tavernari, Cummmard, Emery and Fredette all posted points to give the Cougars their eight-point lead late in the second. The Cougars then proved unstoppable, posting a 26-3 run — that included a 16-0 spurt — to give them a 21-point victory over the Falcons at 71-50. BYU improved their shooting in the second half by 12.5 percent, shooting 50 percent from the field for the game. After finding themselves down 41-39 the Cougars hit 11-of-13 from the field to fuel the big run.

**BYU Head Coach Dave Rose**

- "It was a battle. I thought our guys responded well in a critical time. Air force had a lot of momentum and got their crowd into it, but when we got in our rhythm we pulled away."

**LAST YEAR VS. AIR FORCE AT BYU — THREE-STRAIGHT MWC TITLES**

PROVO, Utah (March 7, 2009) — The BYU men's basketball team secured a piece of the Mountain West conference regular season championship for the third-straight season, by pulling ahead in the final minute of play against the Air Force Falcons for a 54-49 win at the Marriott Center Saturday night. Lee Cummard led the team with 17 points, going a perfect 10-for-10 from the line. The total places Cummard in 10th place on the BYU all-time leading scorers list. Sophomore Jackson Emery added 15 points, with a career-best six steals. BYU was forced to comeback after struggling offensively in the first half, shooting 25 percent from the field. Finding themselves trailing by as many as eight points early, the team rallied around Emery who put up five points in the last five minutes of the first half. The Cougars came out strong in the second half. Emery forced a turnover and pushed the ball down court to sophomore Jimmer Fredette who put up a three-point play. Fredette scored another two points off another Falcon turnover that gave BYU its first lead of the game at 27-25. After the Cougars lost the lead at the hands of a three pointer and a dunk, Cummard tied the score 30-30 when he made his first three of the night with 15 minutes remaining. The play sparked a 9-3 Cougar run. After letting go of the lead, junior Jonathan Tavernari made three straight shots after going 0-for-10 from the field. Tavernari's sudden hot streak yielded a 45-42 lead for the Cougars. In a last ditch effort, Air Force came back to tie the game at 47-47 with barely a minute remaining. Fouls shots proved to be the demise of Air Force as BYU made seven free throws in the final 1:05 of the game. Cummard made both ends of a one-and-one situation to put BYU ahead and followed through scoring the final shots of the night for a 54-49 win.

**BYU'S LAST OUTING — BYU TAKES TOUGH GAME AT UTEP**

EL PASO, Texas (Jan. 9, 2010) - Tyler Haws led No. 25/23 BYU with his second career double-double as the Cougars won at old Western Athletic Conference foe UTEP, 83-77, on Saturday in El Paso. With the victory the Cougars are 16-1 overall and have won 11 straight, their longest win streak since the 1992-93 season. Haws matched two career highs, scoring 20 points and hauling in 11 rebounds, the freshman shot 5-of-9 from the field and 9-of-10 from the charity stripe while adding two assists and a steal. "Tyler hit big baskets early in the game," said BYU head coach Dave Rose. "It was a great team win. You turn it over 22 times and still find a way to win the game, it says a lot about your determination and competitiveness." Senior Jonathan Tavernari added a season-high 19 points off the bench, shooting 7-of-12 with six boards. With five minutes remaining in the game and BYU holding on to a slim 64-62 lead, freshman Brandon Davies scored six-straight points. Davies hit two free throws and two layups as the Cougars held the Miners on the defensive end, pushing the lead to 70-62 and maintaining the Cougar lead. "You don't really know where the scoring is going to come from," Rose said after BYU's leading scorer, Jimmer Fredette, sat out the game due to illness. "You look at Tyler and Brandon and they were a combined 10-for-15 with 34 points. That is a great performance from young guys stepping up and being oblivious to how difficult it really is." Davies and Tavernari led a BYU bench that posted 40 points. Jackson Emery recorded his fourth game with at least four steals, finishing with four steals, eight points, two rebounds and nine assists, tying his career high for most assists in a game. The Cougars shot 54.9% for the field as opposed to 36.2% for UTEP. After taking a 31-30 lead with 1:57 remaining in the first half, BYU never trailed again the rest of the game.

The BYU men's basketball team entered the top-25 rankings for the first time this season on Jan. 4 at No. 25 in the AP Poll and No. 23 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The Cougars are currently ranked No. 18 in the AP Poll and No. 17 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll, their highest rankings in both polls since 1987-88. Rose has led his teams to the rankings in the each of the last four seasons to become the first Cougar coach to lead BYU into the rankings in four-straight seasons. The Cougar basketball program has now been ranked in the AP Poll during 18 seasons since its first national ranking in 1950-51.

**BYU AS A RANKED TEAM**

BYU owns a 139-58 record as a ranked team, including 2-0 this season. The Cougars are 80-12 at home, 37-28 on the road and 22-18 at neutral sites when nationally ranked. BYU is 11-6 as a ranked team under Dave Rose.

**FREE THROW STREAKS**

Junior guard Jimmer Fredette set a BYU record with 39-consecutive made free throws from Nov. 17 to Dec. 12. Fredette broke the record when he hit his 33rd-consecutive free throw with 16:56 remaining in the second half against Arizona State. He had a streak of 13 straight in the first two games and reached 20-straight before missing after six-straight makes against Nebraska. For the season he is shooting .927 from the line and his career percentage is .876 — second in Cougar history. Tyler Haws is shooting .873 from the line and had a streak of 20-straight made free throws end against Eastern New Mexico. Jackson Emery had a streak of 14-straight free throws end at UTEP and is shooting .816 for the season.

**1,000-POINT SCORERS**

With 19 points at UTEP, Jonathan Tavernari has 1,333 career points and is ranked 17th all-time in scoring at BYU. He is five points from passing Marty Haws for 16th all-time.

BYU is 15-2 when Fredette scores 20 or more and has won the last 14 games in which he has reached the 20-point mark.

With BYU's 83-65 win over Hawai'i, Dave Rose earned his 100th career victory in his 134th game as BYU's head coach. He reached the 100-win plateau faster than any coach in BYU history. Roger Reid previously held the record, achieving the mark in 143 games. In 2008-09, BYU set an MWC record for road wins in a season with nine. The Cougars were 9-3 overall in road games, their best record in road games since 1987-88 when they were 9-3. Nine road wins is tied for second most in a season at BYU behind the 1949-50 and 1979-80 teams that won 10 road games. In the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons combined, BYU is 17-8 on the road, including 11-5 in MWC games. The 17 road victories are the most in a two-year span since the Cougars won 18 in the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. BYU is 4-1 on the road this season with wins at Hawai'i, Fresno State, Arizona and UTEP and a loss at Utah State.

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU senior Jonathan Tavernari and Colorado State junior Andy Ogide have been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Co-Players of the Week for games through January 10. This is the first career weekly accolade for both recipients. A 6-6 guard/forward from Sao Bernardo, Brazil, Tavernari led BYU to a Conference home win over UNLV (77-73) and a non-conference road win at UTEP (83-77) last week. Against UNLV, he came off the bench to score 17 points on 4-of-9 shooting from the field, including 4-of-8 from beyond the arc, and pull down a season-high nine rebounds. Tavernari scored 14 of his 17 points in the second half, shooting 3-for-5 from three-point range and knocking down 5-of-6 attempts from the charity stripe. He added three assists, two blocks and one steal in 30 minutes vs. the Runnin' Rebels. Tavernari followed with a season-high 19 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including 3-of-6 from beyond the arc, vs. UTEP. He scored 11 of his points in the second half, while collecting five of his six total rebounds. Tavernari also tallied two assists and one steal in 19 minutes off the bench. On the week, he averaged 18.0 points, 7.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game, while shooting 11-for-21 from the floor (.524%), 7-for-14 from three-point range (.500%) and 7-for-8 from the charity stripe (.875%).

**FREDETTE, EMERY AND HAWS EARN VEGAS CLASSIC HONORS**

LAS VEGAS (Dec. 23, 2009) – After leading the Cougars to the 2009 HoopTV Las Vegas Classic championship, BYU's Jimmer Fredette was named tournament MVP while Jackson Emery and Tyler Haws were named to the all-tournament team. The guard trio led the Cougars' high-octane attack at the Orleans Arena as BYU defeated Nevada 110-104 and Nebraska 88-66. The combined for 132 points — 66.0 per game — and to shoot .705 (43-61) from the field, .545 (12-22) from three and .971 (34-35) from the free throw line. Fredette posted averages of 28.5 points and 5.0 assists while shooting .679 (19-28) from the field and .944 (17-18) from the free throw line. Against Nevada he scored a career-high 33 points — including a 22-point second half — while dishing out six assists. He went for 24 points and four dimes against Nebraska in the championship game. Emery accounted for 24.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals while shooting .667 (14-21) from the field, .692 (9-13) from three and 1.000 (11-11) from the free throw line. Emery set a career high with 25 points in the Nevada win and added 23 points against Nebraska. Haws added 13.5 points and 3.5 rebounds per game in the Vegas Classic. He shot .833 (10-12) from the field and 1.000 (6-6) from the free throw line. He was perfect shooting the ball against Nebraska, hitting 7-of-7 from the field and 6-of-6 from the free throw line for a career-best 20 points.

**ROSE SIGNS NEW CONTRACT**

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 13, 2009) – BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe announced today that head men's basketball coach Dave Rose has signed a new five-year contract that will take him through the 2013-14 season. The current deal replaces the contract Rose signed in 2007. "I'm grateful to the university administration as well as Tom Holmoe and the athletic department for the opportunity they have provided for me and my family," Rose said. "BYU is a wonderful place to coach and I look forward to continued success. I have a great staff and players who are committed to this program." Since being named head coach on April 11, 2005, Rose has led the Cougars to at least 20 wins and a trip to the postseason in each of his four seasons. In the past three seasons Rose has guided the Cougars to three-consecutive Mountain West Conference regular season titles, three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament and 25-plus wins each year. At 97-34 and a .740 winning percentage, Rose is off to the best four-year start of any coach in BYU basketball history. His win total places him tied for 12th all-time for best career starts in NCAA history behind the likes of Roy Williams, Jim Boeheim, Mark Few and Jamie Dixon. In MWC play Rose has set a new standard with a career record of 51-13 (.797) that places him third all-time in conference victories and first in winning percentage. Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007 to become the first coach in BYU history to earn the annual league honor in back-to-back seasons.

**ROSE ANNOUNCES 2010-11 RECRUITING CLASS**

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 12, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose has announced the commitment of four players who will join the Cougars for the 2010-11 season. Kyle Collinsworth of Provo High School and Anson Winder of Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas have signed national letters of intent while Chris Collinsworth and Nick Martineau will return to BYU after completing two-year missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Kyle Collinsworth, is a 6-foot-6 guard and a gifted ball handler and passer, will join the three-time defending Mountain West conference champions for the 2010-11 season. Last season, Collinsworth led Provo to a 24-1 record while averaging 18.4 points, 7.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds per game as a junior. After leading the Bulldogs to a second-place finish in the state tournament he was named the 4A MVP by the Deseret News and Salt Lake Tribune. Collinsworth also earned 4A tournament MVP honors and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Collinsworth helped lead Provo to state titles his freshman and sophomore seasons. As a sophomore Collinsworth averaged 14.7 points, 3.0 assists and 4.8 rebounds and earned first-team all-state honors from the Deseret News and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Winder, a 6-foot-3 combo guard, follows senior Jonathan Tavernari as the second player to join BYU from Bishop Gorman. Under the direction of Rice, Winder helped lead Bishop Gorman to a 28-5 record, the 4A Nevada state title, the Sunset Regional title and the Sunset Southwest League title his junior season. He posted averaged of 13.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.0 assists and earned all-Southwest Sunset League honors and Bishop Gorman's 2009 Sportsmanship Award. At the High Energy Classic in Gillette, Wyo., Winder earned all-tournament honors. Winder plays for the Triple Double Elite AAU team. Nevada, Portland, UC Riverside and Idaho also recruited Winder. This past summer he posted games with 40 and 36 points. A 6-foot-9 forward with the skills to play at both the small and power forward positions, Chris Collinsworth helped lead BYU to 27-8 record and an outright regular season MWC title while averaging 3.2 points and 4.8 rebounds and chipping in 14 blocks, 19 assists and nine steals. He led the Cougars in rebounding seven times while posting double-digit boards on three occasions. Martineau, a 5-11 point guard out of Fruit Heights, Utah, played in 20 games as a true freshman. He averaged 5.8 minutes per game and totaled 13 points, 14 assists and eight rebounds. Martineau posted career highs of six points and four assists against Loyola Marymount.

**EMERY AND MORGAN NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS**

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 20, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced Tuesday that senior Lamont Morgan, Jr., and junior Jackson Emery have been named captains for this year's team. "Jackson and Lamont are team players," Rose said. "They are proven leaders and have the respect of their teammates. They are willing to do whatever it takes to make this team better. Their teammates voted them as captains and I couldn't ask for better leaders." Morgan enters his third year in the program after redshirting in 2007-08 and playing a key role off the bench last season. The 5-foot-10 senior guard averaged 3.6 points, 1.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists while shooting .461 from the field and .412 from downtown. In his first season back from a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Mexico, Emery started 32 of 33 games while posting averages of 7.8 points, 3.8 rebounds and 3.0 assists. He was third on the team with 47 steals and shot .480 from the field, .377 from downtown and .738 from the free throw line. Known for his hustle and defensive play, Emery earned a spot on the 2009 MWC All-Defensive Team.

**HOME OPENER ATTENDANCE MARKS**

The 16,276 on hand to witness BYU's 70-60 season-opening win over Bradley in the Marriott Center was the largest crowd for a home opener since 1994-95 when there were 17,654 in the stands for BYU's 96-80 win over Nevada. The attendance for home openers has increased each year since 2006-07, when 8,854 were on hand to see BYU outlast Idaho State 84-78 in overtime. In 2007-08 the Cougars got the best of Idaho State again, winning 90-69 with 12,153 in the Marriott Center. Last season 15,753 seats were full as BYU defeated Long Beach State 75-65 in the season/home opener.

**INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU**

- Including sophomore Charles Abouo and senior Jonathan Tavernari, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 38 of the past 58 years.
- Foreign players at BYU have received 10 all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004), one conference freshman of the year award (Jonathan Tavernari - 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

**NATIONAL TEAM EXPERIENCE**

Senior Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil) and Charles Abouo (Cote d'Ivoire) gained valuable experience during the summer of 2009 playing for their respective country's national team. Tavernari helped Brazil win the 2009 FIBA Americas Championship to claim a spot in the 2010 World Championships. Abouo and Cote d'Ivoire booked their tickets to the World Championships by taking second at the FIBA Afrobasket Tournament.

**FIRST HALF LEADS, MARGIN OF VICTORY**

BYU has led at the half in all but one game this season and has held double-digit halftime leads in 10 games. The Cougars held their biggest halftime lead of 41 against Eastern Washington (55-14). BYU has won by at least 10 points in 12 of the team's 15 wins and 20-plus seven times.

**NONCONFERENCE HOOPS SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED**

PROVO, Utah (July 16, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose announced the 2009-10 nonconference schedule Thursday, which features matchups with Arizona, Arizona State and Utah State as well as a trip to the Las Vegas Classic. The 16-game nonconference slate includes teams from nine different conferences and nine teams that qualified for postseason play in 2009. The Mountain West Conference schedule will be announced at a later date. On Nov. 17 BYU will host Idaho State, a team the Cougars have defeated in five-straight contests including 85-65 in 2008. Three days later BYU will head to the Aloha State to play Western Athletic Conference member Hawai'i. The two teams last played in 1999, the Cougars' final season as members of the WAC. After the Hawai'i game the blue and white will host Southern University (Nov. 24) and Weber State (Nov. 27). BYU will look to protect its unbeaten home record (17-0) against the Wildcats. The Cougars will open the month of December with instate rival Utah State. BYU owns a 135-90 record against the Aggies but has lost four-straight in Logan. The game is scheduled for Dec. 2. On Dec. 5 the Cougars will play at Energy Solutions Arena for the fifth time since 2003 when they host San Francisco. BYU defeated Utah State 68-63 in 2008 at Energy Solutions where the Cougars are 2-2 all-time. BYU will remain in Utah and host Arizona State on Dec. 8 at the Marriott Center. The Cougars will be looking to avenge last season's one-point loss at the Stadium Shootout at the University of Phoenix Stadium. BYU will head to southern California to take on Fresno State at the Galen Center in Los Angeles on Dec. 12. Former Cougar head coach Steve Cleveland is at the helm of the Bulldog program. BYU returns to the Marriott Center following the neutral tilt at the Galen Center to host Wagner (Dec. 17) and Eastern Washington (Dec. 19) for its first two games of the Las Vegas Classic. The final two games of the Classic will be at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas on Dec. 22 and 23. Nebraska, Nevada and Tulsa will also compete in the Classic. Matchups will be announced at a later date. BYU's last game of the 2009 calendar year will be at Arizona on Dec. 28. The Cougars and Wildcats were conference rivals in the 1960s and 70s when both teams were members of the WAC. The final home nonconference game will be against Eastern New Mexico on Jan. 2 and the nonconference schedule will conclude at UTEP on Jan. 9.

**IMPROVED DEPTH**

BYU's bench has scored at least 21 points 10 times and in double figures in all 15 games this season, including 21 against Bradley, 30 vs. Idaho State, 23 at Hawai'i, a season-high of 46 vs. Southern, 25 vs. Weber State, 23 vs. San Francisco, 32 vs. Wagner, 34 vs. Eastern Washington, 26 vs. Nebraska, 41 vs. Eastern New Mexico and 28 vs. UNLV. Last season the BYU bench scored 20-plus points just eight times all season. The 46 bench points vs. Southern are the most bench points by a BYU team since the reserves scored 59 vs. Western Oregon on Dec. 22, 2006.

**IN THE 10 YEARS OF THE MWC ...**

- BYU has had eight 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had six, UNLV six, San Diego State five and Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico three.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second three times and third on four occasions. The Cougars were third in 2008-09 (37) behind Utah (14) and San Diego State (31).
- BYU has the most overall wins (229).
- BYU also has the most conference wins (100).
- BYU is tied for the most MWC regular-season titles (five).
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

**PRESEASON MWC POLL**

Mountain West Conference media members overwhelmingly selected three-time defending conference champion BYU as the preseason favorite to win the 2009-10 MWC regular season championship at the conference's annual media day in Denver on Tuesday. The Cougars took 23 of the 24 first place votes to finish with 215 points in the poll. BYU returns four starters this season after finishing 12-4 in MWC play and 25-8 overall, including a third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. This is the second year BYU has been tabbed the top conference team in the preseason poll. Two years ago the Cougars were also placed first and would eventually win the MWC title, going 14-2 in conference play. BYU junior guard Jimmer Fredette was also named Preseason Player of the Year in addition to joining senior forward Jonathan Tavernari in representing BYU on the Preseason All-Conference Team. The Cougars are the only team to have two players on the pre-season squad. Fredette was a first-team all-MWC and MWC All-Tournament Team selection in 2008-09 while also being named to the USBWA All-District team. The junior is the returning leader in scoring (16.2 ppg) and assists (1.35) for the Cougars, having scored in double digits 29 times in 2008-09, including eight games with 20 or more points. Tavernari returns for his final season after earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006-07 and garnering two All-Conference selections. He is the Cougars' top returning rebounder (7.2 rpg) and ranked among league leaders in 3-point field goals (2nd/85), steals (3rd/49), rebounding (4th), scoring (6th/15.7 ppg) and 3-point percentage (8th/.381) last season. San Diego State collected the remaining first-place vote and 166 points to finish in second in the poll, followed closely by UNLV in third with 161 points. Utah and New Mexico landed in the fourth- and fifth-place spots, respectively, with the Utes tallying 143 points to the Lobos' 141 points. Wyoming received 89 points to finish sixth, followed by TCU (82 points) in seventh, Colorado State (58 points) in eighth and Air Force (25 points) in ninth. San Diego State junior Billy White, TCU senior Zvonko Buljan and UNLV junior Tre'Von Willis were also selected to the All-Conference Team.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a four-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His 97 victories place him tied for 12th for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, behind the likes of Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, Roy Williams and Jim Boeheim. Rose has returned BYU to the

national stage with three-straight appearances in the top-25 polls and three-straight NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships while adding a third in 2009 (shared with Utah and New Mexico). Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past three seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as associate head coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in nine of the past 10 seasons, including six NCAA bids, while claiming five MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Ten recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 12 years Rose has been in Provo.

With 26 years of coaching experience—including 14 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college and high school levels—Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas

Dave and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.

**SUMMARY:** A prolific scorer, guard Jimmer Fredette is a tough, hard-nosed competitor who was ranked by ESPN.com among the nation's top 75 high school shooting guards. Known for his shooting touch, Fredette set the league scoring record at Glens Falls High School (Glens Falls, N.Y.) with 2,404 career points. He was a significant contributor as a freshman, averaging 7.0 points off the bench. In 2008-09 he became BYU's first point guard to earn first-team all-conference honors since Marty Haws in 1990. Tavernari repeated as a third-team selection in 2009 and posted averages of 15.7 points and 7.2 rebounds per game.
