No. 12/12 BYU men's basketball (22-2, 7-1 MWC) will look to maintain its hold on first-place in the MWC when it takes on second-place UNLV (18-4, 6-2 MWC) on Saturday, Feb. 6, at 1 p.m. PST. The game can be heard live on KSL Newsradio beginning with the pregame show at 12 p.m. PST on 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on Versus.

The Cougars return to the Marriott Center to play Air Force on Saturday, Feb. 13, at 4 p.m. MST. Listen to the game live on the radio beginning with the pregame show at 3 p.m. MST on KSL Newsradio 102.7 FM and 1160 AM or via the Internet at KSL.com. The game will be televised live on The Mtn.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

- Jimmer Fredette set BYU single-game records with 49 points and nine threes against Arizona in the Fiesta Bowl Classic in Tucson, Ariz., at the McKale Center. BYU handed Arizona its worst loss at the McKale Center, 99-69.
- BYU's 15-game winning streak, it's second-longest winning streak in school history ended on Jan. 27 at New Mexico, 76-72.
- Fredette is 21st all-time in scoring at BYU with 1,252 career points. He leads the conference in scoring at 21.5 points per game. He is also 14th at BYU in career assists with 303 and 12th in steals with 109.
- Two-time MWC Coach of the Year Dave Rose has guided BYU to three-straight MWC regular season titles and three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. Under Rose, BYU also has five-straight 20-win seasons and four-straight postseason appearances. At 119-36 (.768) overall, he is BYU's all-time leader in winning percentage.
- Senior forward Jonathan Tavernari became BYU's all-time leader in three-pointers with two treys vs. San Francisco to give him 214. He is now at 238 after hitting one three vs. TCU. He is also climbing the lists for points (14th with 1,386) and steals (3rd with 141).
- Since Jonathan Tavernari's freshman year BYU has won 99 games — the best four-year stretch in BYU basketball history — and he has played in 95. The only Cougar to have played in more wins in BYU history is Lee Cummond, who played in 97 victories.

LOOKING AT UNLV

UNLV is 18-4 overall and 6-2 in the Mountain West Conference. The Rebels (9-2 at home this season) have won four-straight, including wins at Colorado State (80-72) and TCU (79-70), at home against Air Force (60-50) and at Wyoming (78-50). BYU defeated UNLV 77-73 on Jan. 6, the conference opener for both teams. Tre'Von Willis leads the Rebels in scoring at 17.2 points per game while shooting .491 from the field and .857 from the free throw line. Chace Stanback adds 10.5 points per game and a team-best 5.4 boards per game. Oscar Bellfield is third in scoring at 9.3 points per game and leads in assists at 4.8 dimes per contest. Matt Shaw adds 7.1 points per game while Kendall Wallace and Derrick Jasper average 6.7 points apiece. Wallace leads the team with 38 threes while shooting .388 from downtown. As a team UNLV averages 75.4 points per game and shoots .457 from the field, .313 from three and .720 from the free throw line. The Rebels average 35.3 rebounds and 16.6 assists per game. UNLV opponents average 65.0 points, 35.5 rebounds and 10.0 assists per game. Rebel opponents shoot .395 from the field, .329 from three and .691 from the free throw line. Lon Kruger is in his sixth season at UNLV here he has a 130-67 record.

UNLV'S LAST OUTING — UNLV WHIPS WYOMING, 78-50

LARAMIE, Wyo. (AP) - Matt Shaw came off of the bench and tied his career-high with 16 points as UNLV ran past Wyoming 78-50 in Mountain West Conference play on Wednesday night.

The Runnin' Rebels (18-4,6-2) gave up a layup on the game's opening tip, but dominated action the rest of the way, leading by as many as 30 in the second half.

Ryan Dermody led the Cowboys (9-13, 2-6) with 12 points.

UNLV took control early in the game and opened up a double-digit lead on a pair of 3-pointers by Oscar Bellfield and baskets by Justin Hawkins and Chace Stanback. The Rebels led 40-27 at halftime.

Trailing 52-29, the Cowboys scored eight straight to cut the lead to 15, but could get no closer as UNLV outscored the Wyoming 26-13 the rest of the way.

UNLV dominated in the paint, outscoring Wyoming 32-16.

SERIES NOTES

BYU and UNLV play for the 31st time on Saturday with UNLV leading the overall series 16-14. The Cougars won 77-73 at home this season after losing twice to the Rebels in 2008-09. UNLV leads 12-4 in Las Vegas and has won the last six at home. The Cougars are 4-7 against UNLV under Dave Rose.

LAST YEAR AT UNLV — COMEBACK FALLS SHORT AT UNLV

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (Feb. 21, 2009) – In front of the largest UNLV crowd in 16 years, the Cougars (20-6, 8-4) fell to the Runnin' Rebels (20-7, 8-5) by one point Saturday, 75-74, in a fight to the finish at the Thomas and Mack Center. Senior Lee Cumnard led the Cougars in points with 20, also posting seven rebounds and four assists on the night. Jonathan Tavernari posted his fifth double-double of the season and seventh of his career with 19 points and 11 rebounds against the Rebels. The first three minutes of the game were scoreless for both teams, with UNLV making a 12-footer to put the first points on the board. The Cougars shot 0-for-7 from the field in the first four minutes of play. BYU was scoreless until Jonathan Tavernari put the Cougars on the board four minutes into the game. Shortly thereafter, the Cougars would post an 8-0 run and then a 7-0 run, the latter giving them a five-point lead at 19-14. Even though the Cougars only shot 32.3 percent in the first half, they still posted a higher percentage than the Runnin' Rebels, who shot only 29.6 percent. UNLV also gave up eight turnovers in the first half, to the Cougars' four. With a close battle the entire first half, the Cougars found themselves trailing 21-23 at the half as UNLV chalked-up a 7-0 run, finishing off with a layup by Rene Rougeau at the buzzer to put them up going into the locker rooms. Leading at the half in scoring was Cumnard, posting six points. Tavernari also chalked up five points in the first half, with Charles Abouo tallying four points. Fredette, Emery and Miles each had a bucket apiece at the half. Coming out of the half, BYU scored the first three points with Cumnard hitting his 24th free throw in a row (making the first and missing the second) and a layup by Miles gave the Cougars the lead once again at 24-23. Both teams would trade points until 37-37 when UNLV would pull away with an 8-2 run, taking the lead for the rest of the game. With everyone on their feet at the Thomas and Mack Center in the last minute, the Cougars never stopped their game. With two minutes left in the game, UNLV led BYU by 11 points. With 30 seconds left in the game, BYU was down 73-66. Hoping for a miracle, the Cougars kept on playing. The Cougars posted a 17-7 run to end the game, ending up one point short, falling to the Runnin' Rebels 74-75 in Las Vegas.

WHAT WAS SAID AFTER THE GAME ...

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

- "I thought it was a really hard-fought game by both teams. It was quite a defensive battle where both teams made a lot of good plays. Both teams rushed things in the first half but settled down offensively in the second." – "We battled hard but we weren't able to gain the lead back in time. We had some lapses where it got away from us."
- "The separation was just a little too much to overcome. The players got themselves in a position where their confidence level wasn't very high. After we were able to penetrate for a couple of shots we got more confidence built up, but we just weren't good enough tonight to win."
- "I think all of our players probably thought that they could've done more—when you're that close, everyone feels like they could've done more."

NOTES FROM LAST YEAR AT UNLV

Player Notes

- With 19 points and 11 rebounds Jonathan Tavernari posted his fifth double-double this season and seventh of his career. It marks his second double-double in four games.
- By hitting 5-of-9 from downtown at UNLV Jonathan Tavernari has hit 15-of-24 from long distance in his last four games. He now has 71 threes for the season and 188 for his career.
- Lee Cumnard hit the first of two free throws early in the second half to extend his streak of free throws without a miss to 24. The streak ended when he missed the second. He finished 3-of-4 from the line at UNLV.
- With four players in double figures (Cumnard-20, Tavernari-19, Fredette-13 and Miles-10), the Cougars fell 75-74 to UNLV. BYU is 7-3 overall and 4-3 in the MWC when four players score in double figures.

Team Notes

- For the 24th time in 26 games this season, BYU head coach Dave Rose started Jimmer Fredette, Jackson Emery, Lee Cumnard, Jonathan Tavernari and Chris Miles. The Cougars are 18-6 with that starting lineup. Lamont Morgan, Jr., started the first game of the season in place of Jimmer Fredette and Charles Abouo started the Wyoming game in Provo in place of Jackson Emery.
- After scoring just 21 points in the first half at UNLV — a season low for a half — the Cougars scored 53 in the second half while shooting 59.3 percent (16-27) from the field. The 53 points are the second most scored in a half this season behind the 61 scored in the second half against Boise State.

Record Watch

- With a three-pointer at the 8:17 mark in the first half, Jonathan Tavernari has hit a three in the last 21 games and in 25-of-26 games this season. Tavernari has tied Terrell Lyday (21) for the single-season record for consecutive games with a made three. Mark Bigelow holds the overall record with 22-consecutive games with a made three over two seasons.
- With 20 points at UNLV on Saturday, Lee Cumnard now has 446 points this season and 1,459 career points. He needs 54 points to pass Kresimir Cosic (1,512) for 10th all-time.
- Jonathan Tavernari scored 19 points against the Rebels to give him 1,087 points for his career. Tavernari broke a tie with Keena Young (1,068) and pass Mel Hutchins (1,084) during the UNLV game and is now 34th all-time. He needs 13 points to pass Mark Handy for 33rd.
- Jonathan Tavernari hit five threes at UNLV to bring his career total to 188. He is now 26 threes from passing Mark Bigelow (213) for first. He has 71 threes this season. Tavernari has now hit a three in 21-straight games this season, tied for the most consecutive games in a season with a made three in BYU history.

Game Trends

- BYU trailed 23-21 at the half at UNLV. With the 75-74 loss the Cougars are now 2-2 when trailing at the half.
- Trailing 72-64 with 40 seconds remaining the Cougars almost came all the way back. Lee Cumnard got a dunk, Jackson Emery a layup and Jonathan Tavernari and Cumnard each hit threes while UNLV went 3-of-6 from the free throw line. Cumnard's three came with five seconds remaining but BYU was unable to get a foul to stop the clock.

THIS YEAR VS. UNLV AT BYU — STRONG SECOND HALF PLAY LEADS COUGARS TO VICTORY

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 6, 2010) - The BYU men's basketball team opened conference play with an exciting 77-73 win over UNLV in the Marriott Center on Wednesday night. The win is the Cougars tenth straight this season. BYU was led by Noah Hartssock and Jonathan Tavernari with 17 points each while Hartssock and Cougar freshman Tyler Haws led the team in rebounds with six each. The Rebels took a 68-62 lead with less than six minutes remaining, but the Cougars continued to battle and four made baskets from the charity stripe, bring them within three points of UNLV. A layup by Michael Loyd, Jr., ignited the crowd and brought BYU within one. Tavernari continued to deliver from downtown, making his fourth three-pointer of the game to give the Cougars a 71-69 lead. Loyd proceeded to dazzle the crowd beating two defenders and making what appeared to be a nearly impossible lay-in, putting BYU ahead 73-71 with only a minute remaining. Loyd not only delivered offensively in the final minute but forced a turnover by UNLV, setting up a jumper by Jackson Emery as the shot clock was winding down to give the Cougars a 75-71 lead. UNLV did not score a field goal in the last 5:55 minutes of the game, much to the credit of BYU's intense defensive effort. Strong offensive rebounding and consistent free throw shooting were the highlights for the Cougars in an otherwise uneventful first half of play. BYU opened the game with a 4-0 lead after baskets by Chris Miles and Emery. After UNLV took a 22-19 lead with 6:13 left to play in the first half, two free throws from Haws and a trey from Tavernari again gave the Cougars the lead, 24-22. However, the Runnin' Rebels would not go down with a fight, hitting a three pointer of their own giving UNLV a 27-24 lead with 3:25 remaining before the break. BYU shot one hundred percent from the free throw line in the first half, shooting 9-of-9 from the charity stripe. The enthusiastic Marriott Center crowd found something to get excited about late in the first period when Hartssock completed a three-point play with a one-handed put-back and subsequent foul shot to give the Cougars a 33-30 lead, tying his career high of 13 points. Both teams made up for their lack of offense in the first half during the opening minutes of the second half. The Rebels made the first basket of the second half but Emery quickly responded with his first three-pointer of the game. Hartssock broke his career high with a baseline drive giving BYU a 38-34 lead.

BYU Head Coach Dave Rose

- "This was an exciting game between two great teams. What more could you ask for."
- "We struggled with some of our starters, but others stepped up and we really pulled together as a team."
- "Jonathan Tavernari, Michael Loyd and Noah Hartssock really pulled through for tonight and made some big plays."
- "Jonathan has really been practicing well lately. He is definitely committed to helping this team win however he can. Tonight, he came off the bench and really contributed and help lead this team to a victory."

UNLV Head Coach Lon Kruger

- "It was a tough ball game. We put ourselves in position to do what we needed to do to close the game the right way, but just didn't do it. But we do need to give BYU credit for playing a good game and finishing with a good win."
- "I'm disappointed for sure. We have got to be strong on the road, and tonight we just lost control at the end. We just didn't do what we needed to do for the win, while BYU did."
- "We gave them too many second chances. We just need to lock in there, use our size, and block out. Overall, we just really need to get more defensive rebounds and limit second and third opportunities."

BYU'S LAST OUTING — BYU 7-1 AFTER FIRST HALF OF MWC PLAY

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 2, 2010) – The BYU men's basketball team hit the ground running against TCU, opening the game with a 10-0 lead over the Horned Frogs thanks to strong team play and never looking back, beating TCU 76-56. BYU was lead by Jimmer Fredette with 26 points. Noah Hartsock also contributed 14 points for the Cougars while Jackson Emery chipped in 12 points. Senior Chris Miles led the BYU effort on the boards with a career-high 11 rebounds. The offensive success that BYU found in Saturday's game against Utah continued into the opening minutes of the contest versus TCU. Emery led the offensive explosion with two threes in the first five minutes of the game while also leading BYU on the defensive end with two early steals. With seven minutes to play, BYU led 21-13 and had assisted on each of their first seven field goals with Emery leading the Cougars with three assists. With a relatively comfortable lead, Rose began to showcase the depth of his bench which scored 13 points in the first half, including two treys by Lamont Morgan, Jr., and a three-pointer by Jonathan Tavernari. Morgan is currently 9-for-12 from long range on the year. With 2:45 left to play in the first half Emery hit a three-point bucket of his own to give BYU their largest lead of the half at 33-19. The Cougars held onto their 14-point lead to go into the break ahead, 35-21. TCU came out of the locker room revitalized, scoring five unanswered to open the half. BYU was unable to make a field goal for the first 3:36 of the half until turning to their post players. Hartsock made a jumper to end the drought and give the Cougars a 38-26 lead. During the subsequent play, Chris Miles made a turnaround jumper to extend the BYU lead. The Cougars' 40-28 lead was too close for comfort for Fredette. The junior guard, who had scored six points in the first half, went to work, making a layup followed by a three-point basket. The Horned Frogs cut the BYU lead to 10 with 8:14 remaining but Fredette responded, making a trey and extending the lead to 13. TCU answered with a three-pointer of their own with seven minutes left to play. The Horned Frogs would cut the lead to eight but once again Fredette answered hitting yet another three-point basket. In the final minute of the game Fredette hit an NBA-range three-pointer for his 20th point of the half, sealing the 20-point victory.

- "It was a good win for our team. We had a quick turnaround from Saturday and I was happy with the way we played defense and challenged shots."
- "We were ready to play. We played good defense in the beginning of the game and had good offensive drives to close it out."
- "TCU did a terrific job of controlling the tempo. They did a great job of getting back in transition. It was tough to get good looks in transition but we got a lead and kept it."
- "The way they guarded Jimmer left Noah with chances to catch the ball and get clean looks. He was confident and took shots."

ROAD SUCCESS

In 2008-09, BYU set an MWC record for road wins in a season with nine. The Cougars were 9-3 overall in road games, their best record in road games since 1987-88 when they were 9-3. Nine road wins is tied for second most in a season at BYU behind the 1949-50 and 1979-80 teams that won 10 road games. In the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons combined, BYU was 17-8 on the road, including 11-5 in MWC games. The 17 road victories are the most in a two-year span since the Cougars won 18 in the 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons. BYU is 6-2 on the road this season — including 2-1 in MWC play — with five road games to play.

100 VICTORIES AND COUNTING

With BYU's 83-65 win over Hawaii, Dave Rose earned his 100th career victory in his 134th game as BYU's head coach. He reached the 100-win plateau faster than any coach in BYU history. Roger Reid previously held the record, achieving the mark in 143 games. FREE THROW STREAKS

Junior guard Jimmer Fredette set a BYU record with 39-consecutive made free throws from Nov. 17 to Dec. 12. Fredette broke the record when he hit his 33rd-consecutive free throw with 16:56 remaining in the second half against Arizona State. He's also had streaks of 13, 13, 15 and 20 this season. For the season he is shooting .901 from the line and his career percentage is .872 (279-320) — second in Cougar history. Tyler Haws is shooting .873 from the line and had a streak of 20-straight made free throws end against Eastern New Mexico. Jackson Emery had a streak of 14-straight free throws end at UTEP and is shooting .760 for the season.

MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – BYU junior Jimmer Fredette has been named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for games through January 31. This is the fourth weekly accolade of the season for Fredette and the sixth of his career overall. A 6-2 guard from Glens Falls, N.Y., Fredette averaged 31.5 points and 4.5 assists per game while leading BYU to a 1-1 mark in MWC action last week. In a 76-72 loss at then-No. 23 New Mexico, Fredette hit 4-of-6 from 3-point range and was 7-of-7 from the free throw line en route to a game-high 27 points. He also dished out seven assists. Fredette followed that performance with a game-high 36 points in an 82-69 win over in-state rival Utah at home, marking the most points scored by a BYU player in the history of the rivalry. He netted 23 of his points in the second half, including 20 in the final 10:26, to help the Cougars hold off a late Ute rally. With BYU holding a 66-61 edge with 5:31 left to play, Fredette scored 12 straight points to give the Cougars a 78-65 lead. He shot 4-of-5 from beyond the arc and 10-of-12 from the charity stripe. For the week, Fredette shot 72.7 percent (8-of-11) from 3-point range and 89.5 percent (17-of-19) from the free throw line.

ROSE NAMED WINNER OF USBWA MOST COURAGEOUS AWARD

The U.S. Basketball Writers Association named both men's and women's winners of the Most Courageous Award for the first time this season, with the men's honor going to Brigham Young coach Dave Rose and the women's to Farmingdale State point guard Tiffara Steward. Rose nearly lost his life last June to pancreatic cancer – a form of cancer that few beat – but was back on the recruiting circuit the following month and is back coaching a BYU team that had won all but one of its games through mid-January. The 4-foot-6 Steward is believed to be the smallest player in college-basketball history. She was born three months premature, weighing just 2 1/2 pounds and measuring eight inches, and she underwent three surgeries by the time she was 3 years old. She has been a starter and team captain the past two seasons at Farmingdale State, a Division III school on Long Island, N.Y., though she is blind in her right eye, has over a 50-percent hearing loss, has one leg that is shorter than the other and battles severe scoliosis.

After becoming severely ill while on a flight to Las Vegas for a family reunion, according to a story by Andy Katz on espn.com, Rose was diagnosed with a pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor, one of the deadliest forms of cancer. When the plane landed, Rose was removed from by emergency medical personnel. Rose was vomiting blood by the time he reached a Spring Valley area hospital. The tumor and lower part of his pancreas were removed during emergency surgery. Rose met with his team a few days after being released from his six-day stay in the hospital, much skinnier and his hair turned gray. His players fasted for one day, praying for their coach. By July 22, Rose was even allowed to recruit in Las Vegas. Rose was declared cancer-free last September, making him of the few to beat the deadly disease. He must continue to receive scans every six months for the next two years and, if he clears those, every year after that. "I'm honored to be chosen," Rose said. "I feel extremely fortunate to overcome the situation I had this past summer. I'm so grateful to the staff at Spring Valley Hospital in Las Vegas and the Huntsman Medical Center in Salt Lake City for their care." "There's so much uncertainty when cancer strikes. But, I had great family support and our players and coaches were unbelievable throughout this entire ordeal. This group of players will always be special to me." Through mid-January, Rose's Cougars were 16-1 and had risen to No. 19 in the AP poll.

FREDETTE, EMERY AND HAWS EARN VEGAS CLASSIC HONORS

LAS VEGAS (Dec. 23, 2009) – After leading the Cougars to the 2009 HoopTV Las Vegas Classic championship, BYU's Jimmer Fredette was named tournament MVP while Jackson Emery and Tyler Haws were named to the all-tournament team. The guard trio led the Cougars' high-octane attack at the Orleans Arena as BYU defeated Nevada 110-104 and Nebraska 88-66. The combined for 132 points – 66.0 per game – and to shoot .705 (43-61) from the field, .545 (12-22) from three and .971 (34-35) from the free throw line. Fredette posted averages of 28.5 points and 5.0 assists while shooting .679 (19-28) from the field and .944 (17-18) from the free throw line. Against Nevada he scored a career-high 33 points – including a 22-point second half – while dishing out six assists. He went for 24 points and four dimes against Nebraska in the championship game. Emery accounted for 24.0 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals while shooting .667 (14-21) from the field, .692 (9-13) from three and 1.000 (11-11) from the free throw line. Emery set a career high with 25 points in the Nevada win and added 23 points against Nebraska. Haws added 13.5 points and 3.5 rebounds per game in the Vegas Classic. He shot .833 (10-12) from the field and 1.000 (6-6) from the free throw line. He was perfect shooting the ball against Nebraska, hitting 7-of-7 from the field and 6-of-6 from the free throw line for a career-best 20 points.

ROSE SIGNS NEW CONTRACT

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 13, 2009) – BYU Director of Athletics Tom Holmoe announced today that head men's basketball coach Dave Rose has signed a new five-year contract that will take him through the 2013-14 season. The current deal replaces the contract Rose signed in 2007. "I'm grateful to the university administration as well as Tom Holmoe and the athletic department for the opportunity they have provided for me and my family," Rose said. "BYU is a wonderful place to coach and I look forward to continued success. I have a great staff and players who are committed to this program." Since being named head coach on April 11, 2005, Rose has led the Cougars to at least 20 wins and a trip to the postseason in each of his four seasons. In the past three seasons Rose has guided the Cougars to three-consecutive Mountain West Conference regular season titles, three-straight trips to the NCAA Tournament and 25-plus wins each year. At 97-34 and a .740 winning percentage, Rose is off to the best four-year start of any coach in BYU basketball history. His win total places him tied for 12th all-time for best career starts in NCAA history behind the likes of Roy Williams, Jim Boeheim, Mark Few and Jamie Dixon. In MWC play Rose has set a new standard with a career record of 51-13 (.797) that places him third all-time in conference victories and first in winning percentage. Rose was named MWC Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2007 to become the first coach in BYU history to earn the annual league honor in back-to-back seasons.

ROSE ANNOUNCES 2010-11 RECRUITING CLASS

PROVO, Utah (Nov. 12, 2009) – BYU men's basketball coach Dave Rose has announced the commitment of four players who will join the Cougars for the 2010-11 season. Kyle Collinsworth of Provo High School and Anson Winder of Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas have signed national letters of intent while Chris Collinsworth and Nick Martineau will return to BYU after completing two-year missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Kyle Collinsworth, is a 6-foot-6 guard and a gifted ball handler and passer, will join the three-time defending Mountain West conference champions for the 2010-11 season. Last season, Collinsworth led Provo to a 24-1 record while averaging 18.4 points, 7.0 assists and 5.4 rebounds per game as a junior. After leading the Bulldogs to a second-place finish in the state tournament he was named the 4A MVP by the Deseret News and Salt Lake Tribune. Collinsworth also earned 4A tournament MVP honors and All-Valley honors from the Daily Herald. Collinsworth helped lead Provo to state titles his freshman and sophomore seasons. Winder, a 6-foot-3 combo guard, follows senior Jonathan Tavernari as the second player to join BYU from Bishop Gorman. Under the direction of Rice, Winder helped lead Bishop Gorman to a 28-5 record, the 4A Nevada state title, the Sunset Regional title and the Sunset Southwest League title his junior season. He posted averaged of 13.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 3.0 assists and earned all-Southwest Sunset League honors and Bishop Gorman's 2009 Sportsmanship Award. At the High Energy Classic in Gillette, Wyo., Winder earned all-tournament honors. Winder plays for the Triple Double Elite AAU team. Nevada, Portland, UC Riverside and Idaho also recruited Winder. This past summer he posted games with 40 and 36 points.

SELLOUT IN THE MARRIOTT CENTER

The attendance for BYU's 82-69 win over Utah was 22,644, the first sellout in the Marriott Center since March 7, 2009 when the Cougars defeated Air Force 54-49 to earn a share of the 2008-09 regular season conference title. BYU was close to a sellout against Colorado State on Jan. 16 as 20,155 packed the seats in the Marriott Center.

INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT BYU

- Including sophomore Charles Abouo and senior Jonathan Tavernari, 28 international players have played basketball at BYU.
- The Cougars have had an international player on their varsity roster in 38 of the past 58 years.
- Foreign players at BYU have received 10 all-conference citations, two conference player of the year awards (Timo Saarelainen - 1985, Rafael Araujo - 2004), one conference freshman of the year award (Jonathan Tavernari - 2007) and eight All-America citations (Kresimir Cosic - 1972 and 1973, Rafael Araujo - 2004).
- According to a book about basketball in Finland by Mikko Simon, BYU has the distinction of being the first NCAA Division I school to have an overseas player on its roster when Timo Lampen, a native of Lahti, Finland, took the court for the Cougars in 1960-61.
- BYU also boasts the first foreign All-American in Kresimir Cosic, whose BYU jersey was retired on March 4, 2006. The Zadar, Yugoslavia, native played on the Cougar varsity team from 1971-73 and earned six All-America citations and three first-team All-Western Athletic Conference awards. He is the only BYU player to be inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame. Cosic passed away in 1995.
- During the 2005 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, CBS Television analyst Billy Packer singled out Cosic during a discussion of the quality of international players now playing college basketball. Said Packer, "Kresimir Cosic, who played for BYU, was really the first great international player to play basketball in the United States."

NATIONAL TEAM EXPERIENCE

Senior Jonathan Tavernari (Brazil) and Charles Abouo (Cote d'Ivoire) gained valuable experience during the summer of 2009 playing for their respective country's national team. Tavernari helped Brazil win the 2009 FIBA Americas Championship to claim a spot in the 2010 World Championships. Abouo and Cote d'Ivoire booked their tickets to the World Championships by taking second at the FIBA AfroBasket Tournament.

FIRST HALF LEADS, MARGIN OF VICTORY

BYU has led at the half in all but one game this season and has held double-digit halftime leads in 13 games. The Cougars held their biggest halftime lead of 41 against Eastern Washington (55-14). BYU has won by at least 10 points in 17 of the team's 22 wins, 20-plus nine times and 30-plus six times.

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 26, 2010) – BYU men's basketball coaches and players will participate in the annual Coaches vs. Cancer Suits and Sneakers Awareness Weekend during Saturday's home game against Utah. BYU coaches and members of the basketball staff will wear sneakers instead of dress shoes with their suits and Cougar players will wear white uniforms with navy blue and pink trim and pink shoes.

"We feel privileged that Nike has chosen us to help bring awareness to the Coaches vs. Cancer Suits and Sneakers cause," BYU head coach Dave Rose said. "We'll do anything we can to aide in the fight against this terrible disease."

BYU is one of four teams across the country selected by Nike to wear the uniforms with pink accents during the Coaches vs. Cancer Suits and Sneakers Awareness Weekend. The event is a collaborative initiative of the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) to increase cancer awareness and promote the American Cancer Society.

Coach Rose has participated in the Suits and Sneakers weekend since coaching at Dixie College in the 1990s. This season the cause hits closer to home for Rose as he battled a rare form of pancreatic cancer during the summer following the 2008-09 season. Results from his cancer scan in September 2009 came back normal.

Rose is currently leading the Cougars to one of their best seasons in program history. At 20-1 overall, BYU has matched the best start in program history and the Cougars have climbed to No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 12 in the AP Poll.

IN THE 10 YEARS OF THE MWC ...

- BYU has had eight 20-win seasons, leading all MWC schools. Utah has had six, UNLV six, San Diego State five and Air Force, Wyoming and New Mexico three.
- BYU has had the league's top RPI three times, been second three times and third on four occasions. The Cougars were third in 2008-09 (37) behind Utah (14) and San Diego State (31).
- BYU has the most overall wins (232).
- BYU also has the most conference wins (102).
- BYU is tied for the most MWC regular-season titles (five).
- BYU is one of six MWC teams to win the MWC Tournament title.

PRESEASON MWC POLL

Mountain West Conference media members overwhelmingly selected three-time defending conference champion BYU as the preseason favorite to win the 2009-10 MWC regular season championship at the conference's annual media day in Denver on Tuesday. The Cougars took 23 of the 24 first place votes to finish with 215 points in the poll. BYU returns four starters this season after finishing 12-4 in MWC play and 25-8 overall, including a third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. This is the second year BYU has been tabbed the top conference team in the preseason poll. Two years ago the Cougars were also placed first and would eventually win the MWC title, going 14-2 in conference play. BYU junior guard Jimmer Fredette was also named Preseason Player of the Year in addition to joining senior forward Jonathan Tavernari in representing BYU on the Preseason All-Conference Team. The Cougars are the only team to have two players on the pre-season squad. Fredette was a first-team all-MWC and MWC All-Tournament Team selection in 2008-09 while also being named to the USBWA All-District team. The junior is the returning leader in scoring (16.2 ppg) and assists (1.35) for the Cougars, having scored in double digits 29 times in 2008-09, including eight games with 20 or more points. Tavernari returns for his final season after earning MWC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006-07 and garnering two All-Conference selections. He is the Cougars' top returning rebounder (7.2 rpg) and ranked among league leaders in 3-point field goals (2nd/85), steals (3rd/49), rebounding (4th), scoring (6th/15.7 ppg) and 3-point percentage (8th/.381) last season. San Diego State collected the remaining first-place vote and 166 points to finish in second in the poll, followed closely by UNLV in third with 161 points. Utah and New Mexico landed in the fourth- and fifth-place spots, respectively, with the Utes tallying 143 points to the Lobos' 141 points. Wyoming received 89 points to finish sixth, followed by TCU (82 points) in seventh, Colorado State (58 points) in eighth and Air Force (25 points) in ninth. San Diego State junior Billy White, TCU senior Zvonko Buljan and UNLV junior TreVon Willis were also selected to the All-Conference Team.

Since becoming head coach of the BYU men's basketball program on April 11, 2005, Dave Rose has guided the Cougars to an impressive array of on-the-court awards and accolades while his unassuming approach to service and the community has been recognized at the top of his profession.

Cougar fans have had plenty to "Rise and Shout" about with Rose at the helm. He has produced a four-year resume that is nearly unmatched. His 97 victories place him tied for 12th for best career starts by wins in NCAA history, behind the likes of Mark Few, Jamie Dixon, Roy Williams and Jim Boeheim. Rose has returned BYU to the

national stage with three-straight appearances in the top-25 polls and three-straight NCAA Tournament berths. Under his tutelage, Rose's teams have not only broken into the top-25 rankings but also achieved the MWC's first-ever two-time outright league championships while adding a third in 2009 (shared with Utah and New Mexico). Rose is the only BYU men's basketball coach to win conference coach-of-the-year honors in back-to-back seasons. He has also received district coach of the year accolades and honorable mention for national coach of the year. Another evidence of Rose's commitment to excellence is that his basketball program ranks in the top 10 percent nationally in multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate scores. As a result, the NCAA has honored BYU with Public Recognition awards in each of the past three seasons for their high academic achievement.

Rose first came to BYU as an assistant in 1997 to help newly hired head coach Steve Cleveland rebuild the Cougar program. Rose served eight seasons with Cleveland, including the last five as associate head coach, before being promoted to BYU's head job. Rose played a vital role in rebuilding BYU's program from an inherited 1-25 team into a regular NCAA Tournament participant and 20-game winner. BYU has qualified for postseason play in nine of the past 10 seasons, including six NCAA bids, while claiming five MWC titles. A strong evaluator of talent with a vast network of coaching connections across the country, Rose has a proven record as a top recruiter. He has been recognized as one of college basketball's top-25 recruiters as BYU has had multiple top-20 recruiting classes with Rose overseeing or coordinating its efforts. Ten recruits have earned conference newcomer honors or a major league award in their first season as a Cougar in the 12 years Rose has been in Provo.

With 26 years of coaching experience—including 14 seasons as a head coach at the Division I, junior college and high school levels—Rose has a proven record of constant success. Prior to coming to BYU as an assistant in 1997, Rose compiled a 167-57 record at Dixie State College (St. George, Utah). Before being promoted to the head coaching position at Dixie, Rose served as a Rebel assistant coach under Ken Wagner for three seasons. Rose coached multiple sports at Millard and Pine View high schools in Utah before joining the staff at Dixie.

Rose excelled in both baseball and basketball as a two-sport athlete at Dixie State College in St. George, Utah, before serving a full-time mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manchester, England, from 1977-79. Upon returning home, he transferred to the University of Houston where he completed his degree and was a shooting guard and co-captain of the famous "Phi Slamma Jamma" team featuring Hakeem Olajuwon and Clyde Drexler. In 1983 his Houston team was ranked No. 1 nationally and finished as the national runner-up.

A native of Houston, Texas, Rose and his wife Cheryl have three children and two grandchildren. Currently the Honorary Chairman of the Children with Cancer Christmas

Foundation, Rose works with his wife, Cheryl, and the team to annually serve and comfort local families who endure the challenges of raising a child who has cancer. Dave and Cheryl are also actively involved in a variety of other service and community initiatives. In 2008, Rose was honored by the National Association of Basketball Coaches with its Game Pillar Award for Service, one of only four Pillar Awards (Education, Leadership, Service and Advocacy) that the Association annually bestows on the most deserving among its vast membership. In 2008, Rose also became the 63rd recipient of the Dale Rex Memorial Award given annually to the person who has done the most for amateur athletics in the state of Utah.

SUMMARY: A prolific scorer, guard Jimmer Fredette is a tough, hard-nosed competitor who was ranked by ESPN.com among the nation's top 75 high school shooting guards. Known for his shooting touch, Fredette set the league scoring record at Glens Falls High School (Glens Falls, N.Y.) with 2,404 career points. He was a significant contributor as a freshman, averaging 7.0 points off the bench. In 2008-09 he became BYU's first point guard to earn first-team all-conference honors since Marty Haws in 1990. SUMMARY: The 2007 Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year, Jonathan Tavernari followed a standout season in his first year with the Cougars with a record-setting sophomore campaign. He earned All-MWC Third Team honors and set the BYU single-season and sophomore MWC three-point record with 88 triples.
