Previous game recap:

The No. 14 BYU women's soccer team (3-0) defeated in-state rival Weber State 5-1 Friday night, securing head coach Jennifer Rockwood's 250th career victory.

Sophomore Lindsy Lisonbee scored BYU's first goal of the match in the 28th minute following a ricochet off the post and an assist from junior Lauren Anderson.

The Cougars maintained possession for most of the game, holding the Wildcats to just two shots in the entire game. Weber State goalkeeper Ryann Waldmann, however, was kept busy all night with BYU taking 23 shots on goal for the night. Waldmann had a season-high 12 saves.

BYU headed into the locker room at halftime holding the Wildcats to zero shots with a 1-0 lead.

BYU added to the score early in the second half with junior Jennie Marshall scoring on a cross from sophomore Carlee Payne late in the 49th minute.

The Cougars continued their offensive dominance in the 60th minute with Jessica Ringwood sending a cross over to Marshall for her second goal of the night and third this season.

Senior Kassidy Shumway got into the action with a goal of her own when Payne sent a ball from near the corner for the assist to put the Cougars up 4-0 in minute 68. The goal was Shumway's third this season.

BYU's reserves were also able to contribute with junior Auna Janis-Doria adding her first goal of the season to put the home team up 5-0 late in the second half.

Weber State got on the board in the 82nd minute with Alyssa Amano netting the Wildcats only score on their first shot of game. Jessie Baddley added the Wildcat's second shot just moments later but it

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Katie Larkin, Aleisha Rose, Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading, Andrea Willis and Staci Reynolds. Rohbock, Hendershot, Reading and Reynolds each went on to play in the Women's United Soccer Association.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Ricks College (now BYU-Idaho) on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management. Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs and the high school level.

2009 Season Review

The BYU women's soccer team finished their 2009 season ranked No. 14 in the country with confidence and the knowledge that they could compete, and win, with other top-ranked teams in the nation. BYU's offense ranked No. 98 in the country with 38 goals in 24 games, their shutout percentage ranked No. 25 with a total of 13 shutouts and their The Cougars finished their season with an 18-4-2 overall record, going unbeaten in conference play and touting an all-time 245-73-23 record under head coach Jennifer Rockwood's 15-year tutelage.

The 2009 squad found themselves facing a talent-stricken schedule with teams around the country. The team started their season in Hawaii where they tied in double overtime. The following weekend, they knew a tie wouldn't cut it as they would be playing two top-25 ranked teams in the Penn State Invitational. The then-No.20 ranked Connecticut Huskies and the then-ranked No. 14 West Virginia Mountaineers were the first two ranked teams the Cougars would face in 2009. Both games ended in a 1-0 win for the Cougars as BYU realized it could compete with other top-20 ranked schools. After the two big wins, the Cougars found themselves constantly ranked in the top-25 in the nation.

BYU would face four ranked-schools during the season and would win each one, two of them coming on South Field in front of 3,628 fans. A total of 29,181 people saw the BYU women's soccer team play in 2009, 21,279 of those fans were from games played at South Field.

The 18 wins for BYU would tie the school's second-highest most wins. The Cougars led the Mountain West Conference all season for the total number of corner kicks they took that year. They finished the season also leading for the total number of points accumulated, the total number of goals scored and the number of shutouts recorded.

In conference play, the Cougars went for an undefeated 6-0-1 record, five of those games coming as shutout wins for BYU. The only tie came against the San Diego State Aztecs in San Diego.

The Cougars ended their regular season on a 14-game unbeaten streak.

BYU received its sixth first-place regular season finish and its eighth first-round bye for the MWC tournament. In its fourth time hosting the conference championships, the Cougars prepared to meet the fourth-seed New Mexico Lobos in the semifinals.

In a physical battle that would not soon be forgotten, the Cougars defeated the Lobos 1-0 to advance to the championship game where they would face San Diego State, the only team they did not defeat in the regular season.

A tired and recuperating BYU squad played hard against the Aztecs but eventually fell 0-1 after dominating the majority of the game.

NCAA Tournament

Without the automatic bid to the NCAA tournament, the Cougars learned what it was like to wait to hear where they would be playing for the first round. The announcement was made that BYU would play the UC Santa Barbara Gauchos, for the first time in school history, at Stanford for the first round of the 2009 NCAA women's soccer college cup.

This bid was BYU's fifth straight NCAA appearance, for a total of 11 in school history. Since becoming a MWC school in 1999, the Cougars have been invited to the NCAA tournament each year but one. In 2009, BYU and San Diego State were chosen to represent the MWC in the tournament.

The Cougars met the Gauchos in Palo Alto, Calif., where they defeated them 2-0 and out shot them 21-11. Freshman Carlee Payne scored first, recording her 13th goal of the season to lead the team. Senior Alyssa Vander Veur netted her third goal of the season, a bullet from just outside the box, for BYU's second goal in the win. The Cougars would now advance to play No. 1 seed Stanford at Stanford.
