Gymnasts Travel to Texas for Triangular Meet Midseason Point for BYU

PROVO, Utah (Jan. 30, 2007) – Coming off its toughest meets of the season last weekend, the No. 25 BYU gymnastics team will be back in action in a triangular meet with Texas Woman's and Ball State Saturday night in Denton, Texas.

Saturday's meet will mark the midseason point for BYU. The Cougars have participated in six meets to this point and will compete in a total of thirteen meets on the year.

"The girls are coming along well," BYU coach Brad Cattermole said. "This is the time of the year when we need to turn things around and go perform better. We are looking forward to this meet."

Last weekend the Cougars competed twice in 24 hours. They faced No. 4 Utah, No. 16 Arkansas and Southern Utah in a quadrangular meet Friday night and then squared off with perennial-foe Boise State the next afternoon. Despite the short turnaround, several gymnasts recorded strong routines. Four freshmen tied or recorded career highs, including a career-best 9.775 from Jenna Kerbis on vault. Senior Kacie Capra-Callens tied season-high marks on beam with a 9.825 and on floor at 9.850. Alethea Boon notched a season-best mark on floor, and Dayna Smart recorded the second-best bars score of her career.

This weekend's meet with TWU will be the second of two meets between the two teams this season. In the first meet, both BYU and TWU counted some costly falls, but the Cougars prevailed 193.325-185.675.

The Pioneers come into Saturday's meet with a win in their last meet against Centenary and Illinois State. TWU's highest score of the season is a 191.275 against No. 9 Oklahoma. The Pioneers are led by Courtney Arno, Nicole Poling and Tonya Pipkorn.

This weekend will also mark the first time that BYU and Ball State have faced off in women's gymnastics. BSU is coming into its sixth meet of the season with a season-best score of 189.350 against No. 27 Kent State. The Cardinals' top performers are Megan Howard, Erica Gilkerson and Kelly Watson.

Start time is scheduled for 6 p.m. (MST) in the Kitty Magee Arena. Live stats will not be available.

Rankings

Season Record

With third place finishes in Cancun and Utah and four wins in dual meets, BYU now has a 6-4 record on the season.

Team Canada in Provo

Danielle Goldman, Melissa Hough and Jenna Kerbis have all represented their native Canada in international meets before coming to BYU. Kerbis is the most recent, having helped lead the Canadian National Team to a bronze medal at the 2006 Commonwealth Games in Melbourne, Australia. Goldman competed for Canada at the 2005 Maccabbi Games in Israel, finishing third in the all-around and helping team Canada to a Silver Medal. Hough was a member of the Canadian National Team as a novice and junior and finished second in the all-around at an international meet in Belgium in 2005.

Trading Uniforms

Redshirt-freshman Megan Perner came to BYU in 2005 on a track and field scholarship. However, her first love in sports as a child was gymnastics. After a series of tryouts and rigorous summer training, she walked on to the team. This season will be the first time in seven years she has competed in gymnastics.

She Can't Hear You

Junior Aimee Walker Pond is blind in her right eye and deaf in both ears. Many of the girls on the team and the coaches know at least some sign language to be able to communicate with her.

Cougars at Texas Woman's with Ball State

BYU will be in Denton, Texas, Saturday for a tri meet with TWU and Ball State. This is the second time this season the Cougars and Pioneers have faced off. The first time was on Jan. 12 when BYU recorded a 193.325 and won the meet.

Vault

The Cougars highest team score of the season is a 48.800 against Utah State. Dayna Smart and Alethea Boon have led the team in every meet this season. Boon posted a team-best 9.900 against Utah State. Five different freshmen have competed on the event to this point.

Bars

BYU's highest score of the season is a 48.775 and is ranked 25th nationally on the event. Senior Kacie Capra-Callens leads the team with a team-best 9.850. Junior Kylee Draper is close behind with a 9.825.

Beam

The Cougars beam squad is ranked 17th in the nation on the apparatus. They recorded a season-best 49.125 against Utah State on Jan. 22. Smart has the highest score of the season at 9.900. She is ranked 28th in the nation on the event. Six of the seven competitors that have been in the lineup this season have posted a 9.800 or better.

Floor

Despite counting falls on floor the first three meets of the season, BYU is ranked 24th nationally on the event. Smart and Capra-Callens have posted the team's highest marks at 9.850. Boon is close behind with a 9.825. Three freshmen have competed on the event this year.

All-Around

Smart has competed in the all-around in BYU's last four meets and has taken first-place honors twice. She recorded a career-best 39.375 against Utah State.

Injury Update

Draper and Sophomore Hayley Jensen are both likely out this week with foot injuries.

No. 22 Gymnasts Finish Weekend with Win

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 3, 2007) -- Competing for the second time in less than 24 hours, the No. 22 BYU gymnastics team recorded a solid 193.725 to 191.100 victory over the visiting Boise State Broncos.

After the first rotation, BYU led over the Boise State Broncos with a team total of 48.450 points on the vault compared to Boise States' 47.275 on the bars. Alethea Boon led the Cougars with her 9.825 performance. Freshman Kiki Berrett had a career-tying high score with at 9.700. Jenna Kerbis also recorded a 9.725 on the event, a personal best. Boise State closely won the event with a score of 48.500 behind a boost from Deavera Todd with a score of 9.800.

The second rotation put BYU on the bars. Dayna Smart and Kacie Capra-Callens both recorded a 9.775 on the event, the highest score on bars. The 9.775 was also Smart's second-highest score on the event. Melissa Hough was close behind the event leaders with a 9.700, tying a career-high. Yvette Leizorek led the Broncos with a 9.700 on the bars. After the second event, the Cougars led the Broncos 97.00 to 95.775.

With a 9.825, Smart led the Cougars on beam in their third rotation. Boon recorded a 9.725 on the event. Tara Oberg of Boise State also recorded a 9.725 on the beam. At the end of the third rotation, BYU maintained a strong lead with 145.125 points over the Bronco's 144.050.

Boon once again led the Cougars with her top performance on the floor. The 9.825 was the top score of the event as well as a career high for the New Zealand native. Capra-Callens also recorded an impressive finish with a 9.800 on the floor routine along with Leizorek of Boise State.

Late Falls Result in Third-Place Finish

SALT LAKE CITY (Feb. 2, 2007) -- In a four-team meet featuring three nationally ranked squads, No. 22 BYU (192.600) finished third at the Huntsman Center Friday night behind No. 3 Utah (196.150) and No. 13 Arkansas (193.625). Southern Utah placed fourth at 190.650.

The Cougars competed well over the first two rotations but suffered season lows on bars and beam to conclude the night, resulting in BYU's second-lowest team score of the season.

In the first rotation, BYU scored 48.750 on floor exercise as senior Kacie Capra-Callens tied her season high with a 9.850 performance to build upon junior Dayna Smart's 9.800 score. Freshman Heidi Poulson started the Cougars off in the event with a career-best 9.725.

The Cougars maintained their second-place standing after a 48.600 effort on vault. Smart and Boon each recorded a 9.825 to pace the Cougars while freshman Jenna Kerbis posted a career-high 9.775 score.

Competing without regular bars worker Kylee Draper for the third straight meet, BYU suffered a season-low 47.650 bars total in the third rotation. Capra-Callens led BYU with a 9.775 effort while Aimee Walker-Pond finished off the rotation with a season-high 9.700 performance.

BYU suffered its low score of the night with a 47.600 total on beam to end the meet. Capra-Callens tied her season high with a 9.825 to start BYU off well but none of the other five Cougars who followed her were able to top her routine, including Smart, who as the No. 8-ranked beam worker in the nation had never scored below a 9.8 this season before recording 9.625 Friday.

Smart finished the meet in seventh place in the all-around competition with a 38.425. Utah senior Nicolle Ford won the all-around at 39.600 with Southern Utah freshman Elise Wheeler finished second with a career-best 39.050.

Capra-Callens provided BYU with its top event finishes of the night, placing fourth on floor, fifth on beam and sixth on bars. Smart and Boon tied for seventh on vault to lead the Cougars.
