Home Sweet Home For BYU Volleyball

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 23, 2007) – After playing on the road over the last two weeks, the BYU women's volleyball team will return home this weekend as the Cougars host Air Force on Friday and Wyoming on Saturday in the Smith Fieldhouse. At 13-6 overall and 5-4 in the Mountain West Conference, BYU will be looking to get on a roll heading into the crucial month of November.

"November is a very important month for us so we want to play well this weekend and hopefully get some momentum on our side," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "It will be nice to be back in the Fieldhouse. We have some of the best fans in the country and look forward to playing in a fun atmosphere."

The Cougars have played just seven matches at home this season, going 5-2 in those contests, while posting an 8-4 mark in 12 matches away from Provo, Utah. BYU is coming off a loss at league-leader and No. 21 Colorado State last Thursday.

Senior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman continues to play a large role in the Cougars' success as she ranks among the top 10 in the MWC in kills, points and digs. She broke the league's career double-double record with 20 kills and 16 digs at CSU, marking her 48th career double-double. Junior middle blocker Rachel Dyer has also been a consistent contributor for BYU as she ranks seventh in the nation in hitting percentage.

BYU will begin the weekend with a contest Friday night at 7 p.m. against Air Force, whom the Cougars swept earlier this season. The Falcons are 7-17 so far this year and 0-10 in the Mountain West Conference. Air Force is led by sophomore outside hitter Katie Batchelder with 2.78 kills and 2.49 digs per game.

The weekend will conclude with a match against Wyoming Saturday at 7 p.m., another one of BYU's eight three-game wins this year. The Cowgirls are 10-9 so far this year including a 4-6 mark in the Mountain West Conference coming off back-to-back wins against New Mexico and TCU. The Cowgirls are led by senior outside hitter Rachel Smith, who ranks second in the league with 4.60 kills per game while adding 2.44 digs per contest.

AIR FORCE IN 2007

The Falcons are 7-17 so far this year and 0-10 in the Mountain West Conference. Air Force began the year winning four of its first six matches to tie the second-best start in school history. With seven victories this year, the Falcons have more than doubled their win total from last year (3-25). Air Force is led by sophomore outside hitter Katie Batchelder with 2.78 kills and 2.49 digs per game. Batchelder also paces the team and is tied for sixth conference in aces with 0.33 per contest. She tied Air Force's single-match record with seven aces against Quinnipiac on Sept. 1. Freshman Caroline Kurtz, one of 14 Falcon freshmen, is second on the team with 2.24 kpg while adding 2.37 dpg. Freshman middle blocker Nichole Stilwell boasts a team-best .249 hitting mark and 0.76 blocks per contest. Senior setter Kim Kallabis is averaging 7.33 assists per game and recently moved into 10th place all-time at Air Force in career assists.

LAST OUTING

USAF ACADEMY, Colo. (Oct. 19, 2007) - Freshmen Caroline Kurtz and Nichole Stilwell each tallied a team-best seven kills, as the Air Force volleyball team dropped a three-game decision to New Mexico in Mountain West Conference play on Friday, Oct. 19, at the Academy's Clune Arena. The Falcons, who continue to search for that elusive conference victory, fell in straight 30-14, 30-15, 30-20 sets.

Growing up just minutes from the New Mexico campus, Kurtz not only tallied a team-high seven kills, but also tied for the team lead with five digs. Stilwell's seven kills came off of 20 attacks and four errors for a team-leading .150 hitting percentage. She also accounted for the team's lone solo block. Another freshman posted team-high numbers, as Jessica Hellmann came off the bench to tally 14 assists.

Senior Morgan Dolan matched Kurtz's dig total with five, while classmate Rebecca Gerton served up the Falcons' only ace of the night.

The first two matches saw the Falcons fall into early holes, but Air Force stayed close during the beginning of the third set. A kill by sophomore Jocelyn Booker kept the Falcons within one, until the Lobos were able to use a short scoring spurt to double-up the Falcons at 12-6. The teams traded points and serves, until New Mexico cemented the game with another run to take the set.

WYOMING IN 2007

The Cowgirls are 10-9 so far this year including a 4-6 mark in the Mountain West Conference coming off back-to-back wins against New Mexico and TCU. The Cowgirls are led by senior outside hitter Rachel Smith, who ranks second in the league with 4.60 kills per game while adding 2.44 digs per contest. Senior Angie Hellbaum is right behind Smith with 4.08 kpg, seventh in the MWC, to go along with 2.48 dpg, second on the team. Junior setter Tasha Weishahn averages 12.44 assists per game while leading the Cowgirls and ranking second in the conference with 0.38 aces per game, one of four Cowgirls in the top 10 in the league in service winners. She also adds 2.44 dpg. Junior libero Carissa Lee paces the Cowgirls on the first ball with 4.01 dpg. As a team, Wyoming outperforms its opponents in kills (15.30-14.18), hitting percentage (.213-.201), assists (14.22-13.14) and aces (1.75-1.51).

LAST OUTING

LARAMIE, Wyo. (Oct. 19, 2007) - The Wyoming Cowgirl Volleyball team (10-9 overall, 4-6 in the MWC) earned their second win of the week with a four game victory (30-26, 30-22, 31-33, 30-23) against the TCU Horned Frogs (18-8 overall, 5-5 in the MWC) on Friday night in Laramie.

"This was a big time weekend for us," said UW head coach Pat Stangle. "These are two wins over two quality teams. You have to protect your home court and we did that. Tonight it was our passers, Rachel, Angie and Carissa, who had probably the best passing night all season. That really seemed to keep us in it when we went in to a bit of a lull and they took over the flow of the match. Our passing allowed us to stay in system and run our offense."

Wyoming had three players in double-figures in kills led by senior outside hitter Rachel Smith. She finished with a season high 29 kills, while adding eight digs and a .339 (29-9-59) hitting percentage. Angie Hellbaum followed with 18 kills and a career high 17 digs, while Lauren Whitney added 14 kills. Carissa Lee finished with a team high 20 digs and setter Tasha Weishahn had 62 assists. The Cowgirls hit .263 (77-30-179) for the match and recorded seven total blocks.

The score went back and forth in the fourth game until a 5-1 run by Wyoming gave them an 11-7 lead. The Frogs scored the next four of five to pull within one, 12-11, but the Cowgirls scored five straight to take a 17-11 advantage. TCU battled back with a 7-5 run to pull within four, 22-18. Once again, Wyoming held strong and closed out the game scoring eight of thirteen to win the game 30-23 and the match 3-1.

Sweep Goes to Cougars

The No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team recorded its first sweep of Mountain West Conference play Friday night with a 30-28, 31-29, 30-21 win at Wyoming to improve to 9-4 overall and 2-2 in league action.

"This was an impressive road win for us," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "I thought we got better as the match went on, which is always the goal for us."

Lott gave BYU its first lead of the match with one of her seven game-one kills to make it 6-5, which soon became 14-11. Wyoming scored three straight to tie the game at 14-14, but neither team would string together consecutive points again until the 24th and 25th tallies recorded by the Cougars, giving them a 25-22 lead. The Cowgirls pushed back to get within one at 27-26, but BYU picked up its play to record its first game-one victory since taking the first frame at No. 2 Stanford.

Wyoming gave the Cougars all they could handle in game two, going up early and running up to a 23-17 lead. However, just when it looked like Wyoming would run away with the win, BYU stormed back, going on an 8-2 run featuring three more rejections to tie the game at 25-25. A block from Goodman gave BYU a 28-27 lead, which soon turned into game point at 29-28. Lauren Scott staved off the Cougars with a kill down the middle, but Goodman again came up big with a kill down the line to give BYU another game-point opportunity. Erica Lott made quick work of the opportunity with another rejection, one of six Cougar blocks in the game.

BYU kept the momentum in its favor to start game three, building a 6-1 lead thanks in part to two more blocks and two kills from Dyer. Wyoming responded to cut the lead to one at 7-6, but the Cougars found another gear with four straight points to once again push the lead to five at 11-6. From there, it was all BYU as the Cougars put together a 7-0 run and led by as many as 12 points to record the win.

Solid Team Effort Leads to Victory

In an all-around effort including some fresh faces, the No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team clipped the Air Force Falcons' wings Saturday night with its sixth sweep of the year, 30-17, 30-21, 30-27.

"This was a good conclusion to an important weekend for us," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "It enables us to return home next weekend and continue our hunt for the MWC Championship."

Air Force came out strong in game one to build a 7-5 lead, but the Cougars quickly took control with a 9-1 run that started with a kill and an ace from Goodman. The 14-8 BYU lead proved insurmountable as the Cougars sprinted to the 30-17 game-one victory. Goodman and Hansen each recorded five kills in the game while contributing to a .333 team hitting percentage. BYU also posted four team blocks in holding Air Force to a -.026 attack efficiency.

Watson called true freshman Christina Measom's name in game two, and she quickly made the most of the opportunity with back-to-back kills early. But the Falcons fought with the fire expected from future servicewomen and stayed with the Cougars every step of the way through the first third of the game. BYU was finally able to build a 13-11 lead after a 5-1 run, giving the Cougars the space they needed to keep the Falcons at bay. BYU rode the slim margin as the two teams traded points until closing out the game with a 12-5 run.

With the smell of victory strong, the Cougars came out firing in game three, running up an early 7-1 lead thanks in part to four kills from Goodman. But Air Force once again stormed back, earning a chance to tie things up at 18-17 after an 8-3 spurt. However, Measom continued to shine, sending a rocket straight down the middle of the court to thwart the Falcon comeback. The Falcons made another late run after trailing 26-20, but the Cougars hung on for the 30-27 win.

Weekly Notes:**Week #9 In Review:**

The Cougars only played one match last week, suffering a sweep (27-30, 29-31, 28-30) at the hands of No. 21 Colorado State in Fort Collins, Colo., on Thursday. Senior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman was the bright spot in the match for the Cougars as she recorded match highs of 20 kills and 16 digs, breaking the Mountain West Conference career double-double record with her 48th. Erica Lott also posted double-digit kills for BYU with 12 while Annie Pinegar contributed 12 digs. As a team, the Cougars hit just .188 as Goodman's .325 attack efficiency led the way while tallying 52 kills, 44 digs and 7.5 team blocks.

BYU Top Performer of the Week - Chelsea Goodman

Cougar outside hitter Chelsea Goodman broke the Mountain West Conference career double-double record last week with 20 kills and 16 digs in BYU's only match, marking her 48th career double-double and breaking the record of 47 set by Wyoming's Michele Rauter from 2000-03. Goodman's 20 kills and 16 digs were both match highs at No. 21 Colorado State as she averaged 6.7 kills and 5.3 digs per game. The totals also marked her sixth straight double-double and 14th of the year and the fourth time this season she has posted at least 20 winners. On the year, Goodman ranks among the top 10 in the conference in points (2nd), kills (4th) and digs (9th).

Winning With Watson

BYU head coach Jason Watson has compiled an impressive 63-16 (.797) record in his two-plus seasons at the Cougar helm, including a 32-9 mark in the Mountain West Conference. Watson coached his team to the league title in 2005 while earning Coach of the Year honors and has led BYU to back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths. After a three-year absence prior to his hiring, Watson's teams have been ranked in 33 of 39 weekly AVCA Top 25 Coaches Polls, including a No. 9 ranking this season, the program's highest since 1999.

Home Sweet Home

The Cougars have gone 5-2 in the Smith Fieldhouse this season and are averaging 1,574 fans, 20th in the nation, including the fourth-largest crowd in BYU women's volleyball history with 3,880 fans against No. 10 Wisconsin in the Cougars' home opener. The Cougars are now 465-84 (.848) all-time at home and 27-3 on Elaine Michaelis Court over the last three years.

Double the Fun

With 48 career double-doubles to date, Chelsea Goodman has set the Mountain West Conference record in that category, surpassing Wyoming's Michele Rauter (2000-03). Goodman has recorded 14 double-doubles this season, including one in each of the last six matches, after posting an MWC-leading 18 double-doubles last year out of 29 matches in which she played. BYU's Erica Lott also appears on the active list with 23 double-doubles in her Cougar career, including six so far in 2007.

Measure of Success

BYU is looking forward to Friday's match against Air Force as the Cougars are 6-0 this season on Friday. BYU is also 8-0 when winning the first two games and 9-0 when attacking over .300.

The Nation's Best ...

The Cougars' 1,006-280-5 all-time record entering the week makes them one of the best teams in the nation, ranking fourth in all-time wins through Sunday's matches. UCLA tops the list with 1,053 victories while Missouri State ranks second at 1,024 and Nebraska is third at 1,018. The Cornhuskers passed up the Cougars at the end of 2006 with their six-match run to the NCAA Tournament title. The top 10 is rounded out by Long Beach St. (987), Penn State (960), Hawai'i (951), Texas (924), Minnesota (911) and Texas-Arlington (908).

Octoberfest

BYU has traditionally played its best in October, going 19-3 (.864) all-time in the month in just over two years under head coach Jason Watson, including 3-2 this season. The Cougars are 27-6 (.818) in September and 11-5 (.688) in November since Watson took the helm prior to the 2005 season. BYU will close out the month hosting Air Force and Wyoming this weekend.

BYU In the Polls

The Cougars have not appeared in the Top 25 Coaches Poll for the last three weeks after being ranked every week since Sept. 12, 2005 (regular season). BYU began this season ranked No. 17. BYU has a rich history of rankings in the AVCA Top 25 Poll. Among NCAA Division I programs entering the 2007 season, the Cougars are 10th all-time in total number of weeks ranked (279) and 11th in weeks ranked in the top 10 (122) and weeks ranked No. 1 (4). The Cougars have also traditionally finished strong, coming in 10th all-time in both weeks ranked in the final poll (20) and weeks ranked in the top five to end the year (3) and tied for sixth in weeks ranked No. 1 in the final poll (1).

Rivals in the Rankings

Four Cougar opponents appear in this week's rankings. Wisconsin, whom the Cougars defeated in the Molten Classic, is ranked No. 8 while Stanford comes in at No. 3 and Cal Poly is No. 24 this week (both teams beat BYU in the Stanford Invitational). MWC rival Colorado State is ranked No. 18 while UNLV is receiving votes and listed 31st. BYU is 1-3 this season against ranked opponents after losing at No. 21 Colorado State last Thursday. The Cougars have also recorded a win over No. 10 Wisconsin on Aug. 31 and losses against No. 17 Cal Poly and at No. 2 Stanford at the Stanford Invitational. The Cougars were 1-3 in 2006 vs. ranked foes with the lone win coming against No. 4 Stanford.

On The Road Again

BYU has played 12 of 19 matches on the road so far this season, going 8-4 in matches away from the Smith Fieldhouse. The Cougars played 10 of their first 14 matches on the road before the end of September, the most since 1997.

Comeback Kids

BYU has played six five-game matches this season, going 5-1 in those matches. Before losing to Colorado State in five games on Sept. 22, the Cougars had won four straight matches when forcing a fifth game after being down including at Weber State (down 1-2), at San Diego State (down 0-2) and at Iowa (down 0-2) this season and against UC Santa Barbara (down 0-2) in the 2006 NCAA Tournament first round. BYU is now 15-3 in five-game matches under head coach Jason Watson.

Block Party

The Cougars had a block party at Utah to record their first win in Salt Lake City since 2000. BYU had 26.0 team blocks, fourth all-time in program history and tied for fourth in MWC history, while posting 52 block assists, third all-time in Cougar matches. Three Cougars posted double-figure rejections including Ashton Hansen, who tied her career high with 13, Rachel Dyer, who tied her career high with 12, and Chelsea Goodman, who doubled her previous personal best with 12 as part of her triple-double. Setter Amy Schlauder also tied her career best with seven blocks on the night.

BYU Reaches 1,000-Victory Mark

The BYU women's volleyball team celebrated a significant milestone on Sept. 15 as the Cougars became just the fourth program in NCAA volleyball history to record 1,000 wins. BYU's landmark 1,000th victory, which came at San Diego State, puts the Cougars in elite company with UCLA, Nebraska and Missouri State as the only programs to reach the 1,000-win mark. In the world of collegiate volleyball, few schools have a volleyball tradition as successful as the history of the sport at BYU, whose all-time record is now 1,006-279-5 (.782). In the 38 seasons of its recorded history prior to this year, the Cougars have only suffered one losing season and have won 20 or more matches in 31 of the past 33 seasons.

Record Night For Goodman Not Enough

(Oct. 18, 2007) – The BYU women's volleyball team played another tough road match Thursday night, falling 27-30, 29-31, 28-30 at No. 21 Colorado State in the Cougars' 12th road contest of the year. The loss drops BYU to 13-6 overall and 5-4 in the Mountain West Conference while the Rams improve to 13-5 on the year with an 8-1 league mark.

"We didn't take care of the details tonight," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "We definitely had our chances, but we didn't take care of details and Colorado State did. They put pressure on us, and we didn't respond."

Senior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman was the bright spot for the Cougars as she posted 20 kills and 16 digs, setting the MWC record for career double-doubles at 48. It was the fourth time this season she has tallied at least 20 winners. Senior Erica Lott also recorded double-digit kills with 12 while senior Annie Pinegar contributed 12 digs. Sophomore Ashton Hansen led BYU with five blocks on the night. Four Rams put down double-digit kills led by Mekana Barnes with 13.

The two teams traded points to start game three as neither squad was able to put together back-to-back scores. CSU finally did it in a big way with a 4-0 run to go up 12-9. Porter stopped the bleeding with a cross-court winner, but BYU found itself on the wrong side of the score in a must-win game. However, the Rams were feeling generous as they sent three balls long to give the lead back to BYU at 14-13. From there, the Cougars were able to maintain a slim edge until a 4-0 CSU spurt brought the score to 22-19 in favor of the Rams, which soon turned into match point at 29-25. BYU staved off the match-ender for three points until an errant Cougar serve sealed the CSU win at 30-28.

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars began 2007 with an 88-28 regular-season record in eight years of MWC play after finishing second in 2006 with a 13-3 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and won again in 2005 with a 14-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively while Colorado State captured the 2003 title in San Diego and the 2004 crown on its home court. Utah won the 2005 title, and Colorado State took home the crown in 2006, both in Las Vegas.

Six of the nine MWC programs have competed in postseason action in the seven years since the league was formed. In 2006, three MWC teams earned NCAA bids, including BYU (at-large), Colorado State (automatic) and Utah (at-large). Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU, Colorado State and Utah have represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament each season. Overall, BYU has made 23 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 18, SDSU with 13, Utah with nine, New Mexico with seven and Wyoming with four.

So far in 2007, BYU is the only MWC team currently ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll, coming in at No. 12. Utah began the season ranked but is now receiving votes along with Colorado State

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .812.

JASON WATSON

HEAD WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL COACH

Jason Watson was named the head coach of BYU's women's volleyball program on Feb. 17, 2005 after serving for three years as an assistant with the team.

In his two seasons at the helm, he has compiled a 50-10 (.833) overall record while leading the Cougars to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and a return to the national rankings. He was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after posting a 25-4 record in his first season as a head coach and leading the Cougars to their first MWC regular-season title since 1999.

Prior to his head-coaching debut, Watson had 11 years of collegiate coaching experience as an assistant at four universities, including two seasons with the BYU men's volleyball program and three with BYU's women's program. After an All-American playing career at BYU, Watson coached two seasons under former U.S. Olympic coach and two-time NCAA Coach of the Year Carl McGown with the Cougars' men's squad in 1995-96. He returned to BYU in 2002 as an assistant head coach for the women's team under Karen Lamb.

Watson also served as the associate head coach at Kansas State in 2001 and as an assistant coach in 2000, where he helped guide the Wildcats to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths.

Before that, Watson spent two years at Arkansas State during which the Lady Indians won consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles. Watson began his women's volleyball coaching career with a two-year stint at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to their best record in almost 15 years.

Overall, Watson has directed or assisted in taking teams to the NCAA Tournament in six of the last eight seasons. In addition to his 50-10 (.833) head-coaching record, Watson's team's compiled a 185-97 (.656) record in his nine years as an NCAA women's volleyball assistant coach. Watson is only the fourth head coach in BYU women's volleyball history, joining JoAnn Calderwood (1956-61), Hall of Fame coach Elaine Michaelis (1962-2001) and Lamb (2002-04).

COACHING CAREER

Watson was honored as the 2005 MWC Coach of the Year in his first season as a head coach, becoming the first BYU women's volleyball head coach to win a league coaching award since Elaine Michaelis won Western Athletic Conference Mountain Division honors in 1997. Under Watson, the Cougars won the league regular-season title for the first time since 1999. BYU's 25-4 overall record in Watson's first year was its best since 1998, and the Cougars' 20-0 start to the season was the second-best in school history. The winning trend continued in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second-round NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cougars finished the year ranked No. 20 in the nation, their first final national ranking since 2001.

Watson's Cougars were ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation during the 2005 season, finishing listed No. 26, and were invited to their 22nd NCAA Tournament. The MWC regular-season champions led the league and were 17th in the nation in hitting percentage (.274) as well as pacing the conference in kills with 16.09 per game.

In Watson's offense, three-time All-MWC setter Lauren Richards Evans finished 19th in the nation and third all-time at BYU with 13.12 assists per game while middle blocker and MWC Player of the Year Lindsay Hartssock was second in the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark. Both received AVCA All-America Honorable Mention recognition.



In his three years as an assistant at BYU in charge of the Cougar defense, Watson quickly established BYU as a top defensive squad. The Cougars led the MWC and were 13th and fifth in the nation in blocks per game in 2003 and 2004, respectively. BYU also led the MWC in digs in 2003 with 1,729, the most the Cougars had put up since 1997. Hartssock was named the 2004 Blocker of the Year by Collegiate Volleyball Update and finished second in the nation averaging 1.86 blocks per game in 2004 while libero Uila Crabbe set BYU and MWC single-season records in digs with 435 in 2003 under Watson's direction.

At Kansas State, Watson helped the Wildcats earn back-to-back top-three finishes in the Big 12 Conference and consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament while achieving a 42-17 (.712) overall record and 29-11 (.725) mark in the Big 12. Coaching the setters and coordinating the offense, Watson established a powerful attack that produced several team and individual records.

Also in 2001, with Watson serving as associate head coach, KSU broke the school record for conference wins with a 15-5 mark and swept the season series with a school-best six league opponents. Two players earned All-Big 12 honors and one honorable-mention All-America recognition as school records were broken for kills, total attacks and 20-kill matches. KSU also earned the right to host the NCAA first and second rounds for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams and for only the second time in the school's history. In 2000, Watson helped guide an offense that set the school record with 2,024 kills and totaled 1,828 assists (No. 2 in school history at the time), 4,864 total attacks (No. 3 in school history) and a .245 team hitting percentage (No. 4 in school history). Under Watson's tutelage, setter Disney Bronnenberg finished second nationally in assists, averaging 15.01 assists per game.

Prior to his time at KSU, Watson helped Arkansas State advance to the NCAA Tournament in 1999 after winning consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles in 1998 and 1999. He helped the Lady Indians post a 51-18 (.739) record and coached a number of all-league performers, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Jessica Barney, who led the league in assists with 1,457 in 1999. Watson was responsible for the team's offensive schemes and setter training while coordinating the program's recruiting efforts. Watson spent two seasons as an assistant at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to a 35-24 (.593) record. In 1997, the Bobcats finished 19-12, the program's best mark since 1983. In 1996, the team went 16-12 and made its first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance.

PLAYING CAREER

As a player, Watson was a four-year starter and two-time captain from 1990-94 as the BYU men's program grew from its infancy to a national power. After a 2-25 season in the program's second year as an NCAA sport, the Cougars achieved a 21-6 record and No. 2 national ranking in Watson's senior season in 1994. Watson is still BYU's all-time assist leader with 4,649 and single-game assist record holder with 128 against Hawai'i on March 27, 1993. He was named a second-team American Volleyball Coaches Association All-American, Volleyball Magazine honorable-mention All-American and a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Third Team in 1994. He was a member of the Australian Men's National Team from 1990-91 and a member of the Junior National Team from 1987-90.

PERSONAL

A physical education and sports business management graduate of BYU in 1995, Watson is a native of Homebush, Australia. He and his wife, Larissa, have two sons and one daughter.

2006 SEASON REVIEW

The No. 20 BYU women's volleyball team continued its tradition of excellence in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second round NCAA Tournament appearance.

"I'm pleased with the progress we made this year," said BYU head coach Jason Watson, whose teams have gone 50-10 in his two years at the helm. "The season we were able to put together this year was representative of the direction we want the program to go. We feel like we have work to do, but we are going to get better."

The Cougars finished in second place in the Mountain West Conference with a 13-3 league record and spent the season ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Poll, ending the year at No. 20 after making their 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance in the 26-year history of the Championship. The Smith Fieldhouse once again proved to be a dominant homecourt advantage as BYU went 12-1 on Elaine Michaelis Court during 2006 while setting a program attendance record with an average crowd of 1,902.

Injuries plagued the Cougars throughout the year as the team played 13 matches without the services of all of their starters. Sophomore setter Amy Schlauder sat out eight matches with a broken finger while junior rightside hitter Erica Lott missed two contests and sophomore middle blocker Rachel Dyer was unavailable on five occasions due to injury. However, despite going more than a month without their full starting rotation, the Cougars rallied around their teammates as several players stepped up and made the most of their playing opportunities, ensuring continued success.

BYU began the year taking consecutive tournament titles with three sweeps at the UCF Fall Invitational followed by a win over then-No. 4 Stanford, the eventual national runner-up, in Provo the next weekend in front of a record crowd of 4,050 while earning the BYU Molten Classic crown. The Cougars then took their 6-0 record on the road to the Jayhawk Invitational where they suffered their first defeat of the season against host Kansas after Schlauder broke her finger in the first game. But BYU bounced back the next day to beat Arkansas behind the play of back-up setter Jenna Judkins, who paced the Cougars to a 7-1 record in Schlauder's absence while leading the MWC in assists during her stint at the net.

After going 8-1 prior to starting league play, BYU won its first four conference matches, including its first home win over Colorado State since 2000. Without the services of Schlauder or Lott, however, the Cougars then suffered their only home loss of the year to in-state rival Utah in front of another record-breaking crowd of 4,455. But the loss was quickly forgotten with a seven-match winning streak, including four sweeps, that saw the Cougars improve to 19-2 overall and rise as high as No. 16 in the nation.

Unfortunately, BYU's winning streak came to an end when the Cougars suffered their only back-to-back defeats of the year at then-No. 9 Utah and at New Mexico. But BYU rebounded with five straight wins to end the regular season. As part of the run, the Cougars beat the Rams in Fort Collins, Colo., to complete the season sweep of CSU for the first time since 1995.

Postseason play did not begin as the Cougars hoped with an early exit from the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas, but the time off prepared BYU for a tough first round NCAA Tournament matchup against UC Santa Barbara in Los Angeles. The Cougars completed an incredible comeback from two games down to earn the five-game win behind the strength of Annie Kemp Pinegar's record-setting 42 digs, breaking the 22-year-old BYU mark. However, BYU could overcome host USC the following night, falling to the No. 6 Trojans to end the season with a 25-6 record.

In addition to being ranked No. 20 in the nation as a team to end the year, the Cougars finished 16th nationally in hitting percentage (.269), 24th in win/loss percentage (.806) and 33rd in blocks per game (2.96). Several individuals also excelled as Cougars led the MWC in four of the seven statistical categories tracked by the league including hitting percentage (Lindsay Hartsock), kills (Chelsea Goodman), assists (Schlauder) and points (Goodman). Hartsock ranked 17th nationally in hitting with a .389 mark while Schlauder ranked 24th in assists per game at 13.15 and Goodman was 43rd in the nation with 4.49 kills per game.
