Cougars to host BYU Nike Classic

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 2, 2009) – PROVO, Utah (Sept. 3, 2009) – After having four road games the BYU Cougars (2-2) will come home to the Smith Fieldhouse Friday and Saturday to host the BYU Nike Classic. Kansas State, Weber State and Cal Poly are the featured teams for the 30th year of the tournament.

“We’re very excited to be playing on our home court,” said BYU head coach Shay Goulding. “The last two games were losses partially because of the other team’s home-court advantage. We’ve collected ourselves after the last couple games and we’re ready to play. We’ll be looking for a couple players to step up and lead this team this weekend.”

Preseason tournaments hosted by BYU have been a tradition since 1977. With the exception of two years (1993 and 1999), the Cougars have hosted at least one tournament each year. It is one of college volleyball’s longest running traditions, and although the name of the marquee tournament has evolved over the years from the BYU Preview to the BYU Invitational to the BYU Mizuno Classic to the BYU Molten Classic, to the current BYU Nike Classic, the premise has always been the same – to gather top teams from around the country for intense competition.

The Nike Classic will get started on Friday at 5 p.m. with Kansas State and Weber State facing off. BYU will then open its home season at 7 p.m. against Cal Poly. Saturday’s early action will feature Cal Poly vs. Kansas State at 10 a.m. followed by BYU vs. Weber State at 12 p.m. The tournament will conclude Saturday evening with a 5 p.m. match pitting Weber State against Cal Poly and a 7 p.m. contest between BYU and Kansas State.

Live stats will be available for all six matches while the BYU vs. Weber State contest will be available via Internet video streaming for BYU All-Access subscribers. For links to these options, visit the BYU women’s volleyball schedule page at www.byucougars.com/volleyball_w.

Because All-Sport passes have not yet been distributed, all students can get into the volleyball matches with a valid BYU student ID.

Last Time Out

MANHATTAN, Kan. - The Kansas State Wildcats rewarded their loyal fans with a win in the home opener over UMKC on Tuesday evening at Ahearn Field House by the score of 3-1. K-State overcame a sluggish second set to put the Kangaroos away in four sets while a number of freshmen helped play a key role in the win.

K-State (1-2) got the win 25-13, 16-25, 25-14, 25-16 while red-shirt freshman Kathleen Ludwig led the team in kills with 12. Ludwig tallied the first double-double of her career with 10 digs while hitting .320. Two true freshmen got starting nods as well from head coach Suzie Fritz and the tandem of Caitlyn Donahue and Audrey Horton contributed to the win over UMKC (2-3).

Donahue had seven kills and nine digs, and Horton shined during her first significant playing time of the season with eight kills on a .389 clip and three block assists. After the match, Fritz said Horton has progressed quickly in the Wildcat system and proved why she is wearing purple.

"I was excited about how Horton played," Fritz said. "I don't want to say 'surprise' because we wouldn't have brought her here if we didn't think she could play. Our expectations of

Audrey were that she may have needed a little time to adjust to the system, and we are pleasantly surprised she has come along so fast."

In addition to the youth movement, senior middle blocker Kelsey Chipman had a strong night at the net for K-State with eight kills on 18 swings with no errors to hit .444. She also added three block assists and a solo stuff.

The Wildcats were glad to be in their home gym after opening the season in Omaha at the Runza/AVCA Showcase. Fans poured into Ahearn Field House as 1,790 saw K-State get its first win of the season.

K-State pounced on the 'Roos early hitting .300 in the first set while the defense shutdown the UMKC's attack as the 'Roos hit negative to open the match. The Wildcats allowed UMKC to open a lead in the second set and the 'Roos coasted to a 25-16 turning a complete 180 hitting .382 and holding the Wildcats to just .108.

The Wildcats responded with a commanding win of their own in the third set and shut the door on UMKC in the fourth.

Last Time Out

Weber State finished off hosting rights of its own home tournament in a dramatic fashion with a 3-2 marathon win over Gonzaga Saturday night in the final match of the Best Western Canyon Pines Weber State Invitational. The 'Cats won the match 16-25, 25-18, 25-18, 15-25, 15-9 for their first win of the season.

WSU got off to a terrible start in the first set and even trailed 20-4 at one point before closing the set on a 12-5 run. The 'Cats hit .000 in the set, compared to .263 for Gonzaga.

Weber State came back with strong performances in the second and third set, posting 17 kills in the second set alone and never trailing in the set. The Bulldogs had 17 kills of their own in the fourth set and hit .429 to even the match at 2-2 but Weber State never trailed in set five in route to the win.

"We got off to a rough start but I liked what I saw after the first set," said WSU head coach Al Givens. "We executed well and did a much better job of passing and defending than we had done in our other matches. We stayed aggressive and had some players really step up and contribute when we needed them."

One of those players was senior Caitlyn Anderson who finished with 13 kills and nine digs while hitting .344 for the match.

Senior Chelsea Bair posted her first double-double of the season with team-highs of 15 kills and 16 digs, to go along with six service aces. Both Anderson and Bair were named to the All-Tournament Team.

Last Time Out

SALT LAKE CITY – The Cal Poly volleyball team’s quest for its first victory of the 2009 campaign was placed on hold Tuesday evening as the Mustangs, held to a .086 team hitting percentage by No. 17 Utah, dropped a 25-12, 25-14, 25-21 decision to the Utes on Crimson Court.

Cal Poly, 0-4 to begin a season for the first time in program history, led just twice against Utah (4-0), which compiled a .330 hitting percentage and eight aces. The Mustangs continue their season-opening, 10-match roadtrip at the BYU-hosted Molten Classic Sept. 4-5. Cal Poly opens the competition against the host Cougars in Provo on Friday at 6 p.m. PT.

Utah led set No. 1 wire-to-wire after recording four of the game’s initial five points. The first of freshman outside hitter Molly Pon’s team-high seven kills helped Cal Poly cut its gap to 5-3, but a 7-2 run by the Utes allowed the hosts to outdistance the Mustangs.

A pair of aces from sophomore outside hitter Catie Smith helped Cal Poly open the second set with its own 4-1 lead before a similar run by Utah deadlocked the game. The two squads matched scorelines four more times before a hitting error by Mustang freshman outside hitter Megan McConnell allowed Utah an unassailable 11-10 advantage.

Utah recorded the initial four points of set No. 3 and led by as much as eight points on four separate occasions. Trailing 20-12, Cal Poly responded with an 8-2 run that was capped by a Pon kill. Cal Poly, however, was held to a single point the remainder of the match.

Mustang junior libero Alison Mort recorded a match-best 13 digs.

Weekly Notes:

Series Information

BYU leads all three of the featured tournament teams in the all-time series. BYU holds a 9-5 record against Cal Poly, the last meeting in 2007 where Cal Poly won 3-1. The Weber State vs. BYU series goes back to the year 1970 with the Cougars commanding a 56-0 all-time record. The Cougars have also never lost to Kansas State, tallying a 2-0 record with the last meeting in 2000 when BYU won 3-1.

Last Time Out

Traveling to in-state-rival Utah State, the Cougars fell to the Aggies in five sets on Tuesday, Sept. 1 in front of 1,557 USU fans. Despite the loss, senior rightside hitter, Kayla Walker, posted a season-high 25 kills and nine digs. She hit at .288 percent. Christina Measom added 13 kills hitting at an impressive .440, also putting up three blocks. Christie Carpenter tallied 11 kills, two assists, one dig and two blocks. Nicole Warner also filled up the stat sheet, leading the team with five blocks, two service aces and also adding six kills on the night. Senior setter Kiana Rogers had 54 of 58 assists in the match, also adding three kills and eight digs. Morgan Lloyd Sorensen topped the dig list with 11, with one service ace.

BYU Second at the Tiger Invitational

The Cougars finished second in their season opener in Missouri, finishing off Ole Miss and Texas State in three sets and falling to host Missouri in four. Senior rightside hitter, Kayla Walker and junior middle blocker Christina Measom both earned all-tournament honors. Walker averaged 3.70 kills and 1.9 digs per set while Measom tallied 1.90 kills and 0.90 blocks while hitting .350.

Cougars Picked To Finish Fourth In MWC

A voting panel including the nine Mountain West Conference head coaches and selected media has picked the BYU women's volleyball team to finish fourth in the MWC this season with a total of 96 points and two first-place votes. Defending league-champion Utah was tabbed as the favorite to win the 2009 regular-season title while Colorado State was selected a close second and New Mexico was slotted just above BYU in third.

Transfer Players

With Shay Goulding at the helm of the program, four players decided to put on a Cougar uniform. Morgan Lloyd Sorensen and Camilla Phillips transferred from Salt Lake Community College while Chelsea Goodsell joins us from Sacramento State and Kayla Walker from Pepperdine. Goodsell and Phillips joined the Cougars this season.

Preseason All-MWC

Senior rightside hitter Kayla Walker was named to the Preseason All-MWC Team representing the Cougars. "Without a doubt, Kayla will be the athlete to watch this year in the Mountain West Conference," said Goulding. "She was a tremendous addition to our team last season, and I know she's only going to get better this year."

COUGARS PREPARE FOR 2009

Continuing its tradition of competitive scheduling, BYU will play seven teams that qualified for the 2008 NCAA Tournament, including five that were ranked in the final CSTV/AVCA Top 25 Poll.

"We have worked extremely hard in the off-season and will start well ahead of where we were last year at this time," said Goulding. "Our preconference schedule is challenging, but we are excited for the high level of competition. I expect that it will season our young squad early, prepare us well for a successful Mountain West campaign and put us in a good position for postseason play. I anticipate a great year for Cougar volleyball."

In addition to a full slate of Mountain West Conference action, the Cougars will play in three pre-season tournaments. BYU will open the year at a tournament hosted by the University of Missouri and will face the Tigers, Ole Miss and Texas State, as well as traveling to Utah State on Sept. 1 before returning to the Smith Fieldhouse for its own annual event on Sept. 4 and 5. This year's Nike Classic will feature in-state rival Weber State, Cal Poly and 2008 NCAA Tournament-qualifier Kansas State, who finished last season ranked No. 20. The Cougars will then travel to women's volleyball haven Lincoln, Neb., to compete in a tournament hosted by the Cornhuskers. In a power-packed weekend, the Cougars will take on perennial powerhouse UCLA and host Nebraska as well as Virginia in what will be the first meeting between the two squads. The Bruins finished the 2008 campaign ranked No. 8 nationally after advancing to the Regional Semifinals of the NCAA Tournament while the Cornhuskers reached the Final Four and were ranked No. 3 in the nation to end the year. After starting the 16-match Mountain West Conference schedule on Sept. 17, BYU will step out of league play on Sept. 29 for a match against North Dakota State, winner of the Summit League last year and Utah Valley University in Provo on Oct. 27 amidst a competitive MWC slate and then complete the regular season on Nov. 28 at St. Mary's, another 2008 NCAA Tournament qualifier. BYU has a winning record against 16 of its 2009 opponents with first meetings against Texas State, Virginia and North Dakota State set for this season. The Cougars' all-time record versus this year's competition is a dominating 461-132-2 (.776).

2009 SEASON OUTLOOK

With 40 years of storied volleyball tradition providing the background, the 2009 BYU women's volleyball team looks to challenge for the Mountain West Conference title in 2009 and return to the NCAA Tournament for the 25th time in Cougar history. After experiencing a year of transition with a new coaching staff, the Cougars are ready for a challenging and rewarding 2009 campaign.

"I love the direction that BYU volleyball is going," said Cougar head coach Shay Goulding. "We have some great athletes returning, and with the addition of several key newcomers the future looks extremely bright. Without a doubt, we will be back on track to the winning traditions established here at BYU."

With four starters among eight letterwinners returning, BYU will have talent and experience to draw on throughout the year as the Cougars overcome the challenge of losing three starters, including the standout middle-blocking duo of Rachel Dyer and Ashton Hansen Hosford. Returning All-Mountain West Conference honoree Kayla Walker is back for her senior season after making a tremendous impact last year for BYU. The Pepperdine transfer began the season on the outside but finished on the rightside with fantastic success, which she plans to continue this year. A trio of juniors also returns from last year's starting line-up in Melissa Lake Wright, Christina Measom and Kiana Rogers. Lake Wright earned the starting libero spot midway through the season and finished fifth in the league in digs. Measom also earned her starting opportunity halfway through the year and made her presence felt on the outside. She may also be asked to contribute in the middle in 2009. Rogers rounds out the returning starters for BYU as she prepares for her third season as the Cougar setter.

Several other returning players will be looking to make their mark this year starting with senior Morgan Lloyd Sorensen, who played in every match in 2008 as a libero and defensive specialist after joining the team from Salt Lake Community College. Fellow senior Stephanie Lau could also contribute as an outside hitter or defensive specialist. Senior Marisa Boaz will be competing for playing time in the middle while sophomore Casey Speredon came on strong at the end of last season on the outside and could immediately contribute again this year. In addition to the experience BYU's eight returning letterwinners bring, the Cougars will also benefit from three sophomore redshirts who are no strangers to the court. Christie Carpenter took a redshirt last year after playing in 10 sets on the outside as a true freshman in 2007 and has improved tremendously. Chelsea Goodsell also redshirted last year after transferring from Sacramento State, where she played in every match as a freshman libero. The Cougars will also be welcoming Brooke Taulii Soon back to the court this season as a sophomore after she redshirted in 2007 and served as the team manager last year. Redshirt freshman middle blocker Nicole Warner will also be competing for time after gaining valuable experience last year.

Six new faces will contribute to the Cougars' success this year both on and off the court as BYU welcomes one transfer and four freshmen for the 2009 season. Junior outside hitter Camilla Phillips was named an NJCAA All-American last season out of Salt Lake Community College, where she played under Goulding as a freshman. The All-Region 18 First Team honoree averaged 3.07 kills per set with 67 blocks in 2008. Two Utah products, setter Heather Hanneman (Alpine) and middle blocker Kathryn LeCheminant (Bountiful), will join the Cougars this season as freshmen along with rightside hitter Lauren Sagers out of Las Vegas, Nev., libero/defensive specialist Courtney Honka from Porterville, Calif. and rightside hitter Courtney Donaldson from LaVerne, Calif. All six newcomers could contribute significantly for the Cougars this year.

A breakdown by position follows.

MIDDLE BLOCKER

Led by Academic All-MWC junior, Christina Measom, the Cougars will post a strong attack in the middle. Measom played in 18 matches and 51 sets for the Cougars in 2008. She began hitting on the rightside and moved to the outside near the end of the year, but will be playing middle for the Cougars this season. Measom finished the year with 91 kills, two assists, 19 digs and 33 blocks on .154 hitting, averaging 1.78 kills and 0.65 blocks per set.

Measom will be joined in the middle by Senior Marisa Boaz who posted a season-high four blocks against Wyoming in the final match of the 2008 season. Freshman Nicole Warner who hit .543 while averaging 1.3 blocks per game in 2007 for the Idaho Falls Juniors club will provide depth to the middle. While in high school she was named to first-team All-State as a senior in 2007 after posting 332 kills and 197 blocks. Freshman Kathryn LeCheminant will also add depth to the middle, who helped her team finish 38th at the Junior Olympics in 2008. LeCheminant brings a career-high 25 kills, eight blocks and five service aces to the Cougar roster.

OUTSIDE HITTER

Casey Speredon Thurston and Christie Carpenter are both touching 10-foot-4 and will look to be the leading outside hitters for the Cougars in 2009. Thurston saw action in 11 matches and 13 sets as a redshirt freshman in 2008, totaling 18 kills, one dig and one block on the year. Carpenter played in three matches and 10 sets as a freshman in 2007, tallying 16 kills, two aces, 13 digs and four blocks.

Senior Stephanie Lau will provide collegiate experience to the outside as well as serving as a defensive specialist. In 2008 she totaled four kills, one ace and five digs while hitting .250 on the year. Salt Lake Community College transfer, Camilla Phillips, played her freshman year under BYU head coach Shay Goulding and was named 2008 NJCAA honorable mention All-American. She totaled 374 kills (3.07/set) on .288 hitting with 67 blocks as a sophomore at SLCC.

RIGHTSIDE

A 2008 All-MWC selection and 2009 All-MWC preseason pick, Kayla Walker, will lead the Cougars in the attack from the right side. After transferring from Pepperdine in 2008, Walker played in every match and all but one set in her first season with the Cougars. Although she started 2008 on the outside, she hit on the rightside in the last 10 matches, finding her niche in BYU volleyball. Walker finished the 2008 season with 285 kills, 10 assists, 13 aces, 197 digs and 86 blocks. She ranked first on the team and sixth in the MWC with 3.03 kills per set. She also ranked fifth in the league in points per set (3.64). Walker led the Cougars in kills 13 times, hitting percentage three times, digs once and blocks six times on the 2008 season.

Newcomer, Lauren Sagers will also provide depth to the rightside being a four-time letterwinner at Centennial High School in Las Vegas, Nev. She was named region MVP and all-region first-team as well as team MVP.

SETTER

Junior Kiana Rogers played in every match and every set for BYU as the starting setter in her sophomore season. She averages 10.14 assists per set, ranking third in the MWC. She finished the 2008 season with 20 aces, .21 per contest. Rogers tallied a team-best 10 double-doubles while posting double-digit digs in 10 matches on the year.

Freshman Heather Hannemann will challenge Rogers for the starting position at setter. She earned prepvolleyball.com All-America honors and first-team all-state as a senior in high school. She was also named 2008 Deseret News 5A state MVP and Provo Daily Herald Utah Valley Player of the Year. Hannemann averaged 0.47 service aces, 1.86 digs and 9.36 assists per set as a senior at Lone Peak High School. After serving as the team manager in 2008, Brooke Taulii Soon will serve as a backup setter for the Cougars. As a senior in high school she earned first-team all-league recognition in 2006 while totaling 246 kills, 21 assists, 56 aces, 420 digs and 31 blocks on .300 hitting.

LIBERO

Senior Morgan Lloyd Sorensen who played in every match and set in her first season with the Cougars will serve in the capacity of libero. In 2008 she tallied three kills, 29 assists, 24 aces and 218 digs, leading BYU and tied for fourth in the MWC with 0.25 aces per set. Sorensen was third on the team in digs per set with 2.29 and tallied double-digit digs in 10 matches. Melissa Lake Wright will join her with 21 match and 71 set-experience as a walk-on sophomore in 2008. She began last season as a defensive specialist but became the starting libero midway through the season. Wright finished the season with a team-best 253 digs along with two kills, 16 assists and eight aces. She led the team and ranked fifth in the MWC with 3.56 digs per set.

Sacramento State University transfer, Chelsea Goodsell, helped her team compile a 29-8 overall record while winning the Big Sky Conference Championship and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament before losing to eventual national runner-up Stanford. She played in every match for the Hornets as a freshman, ranking second on the team with 4.37 digs per game. Goodsell also recorded double-digit digs in 31 matches on the year, topping the 20-dig mark nine times. Freshman Courtney Honka will also defend for the Cougars. She was named league MVP as a senior at Monache High School and played for varsity all four years.



Shay Goulding Head Women's Volleyball Coach

Shay Goulding enters her second season in 2009 as the head coach of the BYU women's volleyball program after starting out on Feb. 27, 2008.

COACHING CAREER

Goulding has 10 years of collegiate coaching experience, including five seasons as the head coach at SLCC where she cultivated the Bruins into one of the elite junior college programs in the country. A four-time NJCAA District I Coach of the Year and two-time American Volleyball Coaches Association West Region Coach of the Year, Goulding guided her SLCC teams to four NJCAA Tournament berths, placing as high as second. Her teams have earned a top-10 NJCAA ranking in each of the last four seasons.

Goulding's 2007 team earned a 44-2 record while finishing third at the NJCAA National Tournament with both losses coming against eventual national champion Western Nebraska. Goulding was honored with her second AVCA West Region Coach of the Year award and fourth District I honor and graduated her fifth All-American. The Bruins made their third consecutive national tournament appearance in 2006 while Goulding garnered her third District Coach of the Year accolade and graduated her third NJCAA All-American. After placing third in the Scenic West Athletic Conference, Goulding led the Bruins to the Region 18 Championship and a bid to the NJCAA Tournament, where the team finished in 11th place.

The 2005 Bruins also finished third in the SWAC and rallied to win the region and district championships. The Bruins ended the year ninth nationally after Goulding received her second District Coach of the Year award. In 2004, she guided the Bruins to a second-place finish at the NJCAA Tournament, producing her first two All-Americans in just her second season as head coach. As a result, she was named the District I and AVCA West Region Coach of the Year.

Prior to coaching at SLCC, Goulding spent one year at Solano Community College in Fairfield, Calif., and three years as part of the coaching staff at Utah State University. During her time as an assistant coach at USU, the Aggies went to the NCAA Tournament twice and were ranked in the top 25 in the country for two consecutive years. The Aggies' climb to the top included back-to-back 20-win seasons and 10 Big West All-Conference selections.

Goulding's coaching experience also includes coaching at the high school and club levels in both California and Utah for the past 10 years. Goulding has directed and coached at camps throughout the western states and has become known as a sound clinician and excellent teacher of motor skills. She was a featured speaker at the 2007 AVCA convention and has served as the Chairman of the AVCA Awards Committee since 2004.

PLAYING CAREER

Goulding played collegiate volleyball at Coastal Carolina University in South Carolina. A middle blocker/outside hitter, she was named team captain and the Chanticleers Most Valuable Player in 1994 while being selected to several all-tournament teams.

PERSONAL

A native of Visalia, Calif., Goulding received her Master of Education degree in Exercise Science with an emphasis in Motor Learning from Utah State University in 2001 and her Bachelor of Arts degree in History from BYU in 1998. She served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Santiago, Chile, from 1996-97.

MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars own a 107-41 (.723) league record in the 10 seasons of the MWC after finishing 2008 in sixth place with a 7-9 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and won again in 2005 with a 14-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively while Colorado State captured the 2003 title in San Diego and the 2004 crown on its home court. Utah won the 2005 title, Colorado State took home the crown in 2006 and UNLV earned the title in 2007, all in Las Vegas.

Six of the nine MWC programs have competed in postseason action in the 10 years since the league was formed. In 2008, two MWC teams earned NCAA bids, including Utah (automatic) and Colorado State (at-large). Overall, BYU has made 24 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 20, SDSU with 13, Utah with 10, New Mexico with seven, Wyoming with four and UNLV with one.

Three MWC teams were ranked in 2008 as BYU, Colorado State and Utah represented the league in the AVCA Coaches' Top 25 Poll.

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .793.
