### 200th Win

BYU head coach Jennifer Rockwood is the winningest coach in the Mountain West Conference. She currently holds a record of 199-61-19 and will be seeking her 200th win against Cal Poly. Rockwood has been at BYU's helm since the team began Division I competition, and with a win the Cougars will be the first team in the conference to reach the 200 win mark.

### Season Shutout

Brigham Young University is the only school in Division I women's soccer (more than 300 teams) to have not allowed a goal in 2007. The seven consecutive shutouts the team has recorded this season is a school record.

### Soccer Buzz Team of the Week

BYU's Katie Larkin was named one of 18 players on Soccer Buzz's Team of the Week on Tuesday. More than 5,000 players are considered each week for the honor, and she was one of five players in the NCAA West Region to receive the honor. It was Larkin's second time in her career to be named to the team.

### Record Setter

Senior goalkeeper and BYU career-saves-record-holder Erika Woodbury currently has 212 saves in her career, and is the only starting keeper in the nation to not have allowed a goal in 2007. She also has recorded 34 shutouts in her career, which is another BYU record.

### Hermann Trophy Candidates

All-American Katie Larkin and MWC First Team honoree Jessica Harmon-Carter have made the Women's 2007 Missouri Athletic Club Hermann Trophy Watch List, equivalent to college football's Heisman Trophy Watch List. Larkin leads the team in scoring with five goals and 24 shots. Harmon-Carter is a member of a very stingy defense that only allowed 11 goals last season and has not allowed any coming into today's contest. They were both named MWC Players of the Week on Monday.

### This Week in BYU Soccer

#### Rockwood and BYU Seek 200th Win

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 21, 2007) – BYU head coach Jennifer Rockwood will seek both her and BYU's 200th victory against Cal Poly.

Rockwood has been at the helm of the women's soccer team since it became a Division I program. She has led the team to five Mountain West Conference Championships, and has reached the NCAA tournament the last ten years in a row. She was named the 1996 Soccer Buzz West Region Coach of the Year and WAC Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

Cal Poly is off to its worst start in team history with a 1-6 record on the year, but have not finished below .500 in the last 15 years. The Mustangs lost to Utah 2-0 on Thursday.

#### Larkin and Cougars Keep Streaks Alive

OGDEN, Utah (Sept. 19, 2007) – For the fifth time the season and fourth time in a row, Hermann Trophy candidate Katie Larkin scored a winning goal and No. 16 BYU shutout its opponent as the Cougars beat Weber State 2-0 in Ogden on Wednesday.

BYU is the only team in the nation to not have allowed a goal all season. Larkin's goal was her fifth of the season, and sophomore Kelsea Kakadelas scored her second goal of the season. Senior goalkeeper Erika Woodbury also recorded four saves, and head coach Jennifer Rockwood reached earned her 199th victory as well.

#### Fourth Larkin Goal in Sixth BYU Shutout

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 17, 2007) – The proverbial record skipped again Monday at South Stadium: junior Hermann Trophy Candidate Katie Larkin (Draper, Utah, Alta HS) scored her fourth game-winning goal in No. 16 BYU's sixth straight shutout as the Cougars beat the Pacific Tigers 1-0.

The Cougars finished the game out-shooting the Tigers 20-6 and racked up seven corner kicks in the second half to lead that category as well, 7-5.

#### Larkin, Harmon-Carter Named MWC Players of the Week

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (Sept. 17, 2007) -- BYU junior forward Katie Larkin and junior defender Jessica Harmon-Carter have been named Mountain West Conference Women's Soccer Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, respectively.

Larkin, a native of Draper, Utah, scored the game-winning goal in both of BYU's contests over the weekend.

Harmon-Carter, a Provo, Utah, native, was the anchor for BYU's defense that allowed only 12 shots and no goals over the weekend.

**2007 Cal Poly Highlights**

Cal Poly has never started a season 1-5 until this season. From 1998-2001, the Mustangs began their seasons at 1-4. The Mustangs have scored four goals this year — their lowest six-game total to start a season. The Mustangs scored six to start the 1999 and 2000 seasons. Despite the slow starts, Cal Poly has only finished under .500 overall once in head coach Alex Crozier's 15 seasons.

The Mustangs will rely on Carrie Andrews, Big West Co-Freshman of the Year in 2006, fellow all-conference first-teamer Kaleena Andrus and keeper Alli Tramel to bolster an already stingy defense. Erica Leger and Kendahl Steinalso return to the defense. Andrus also plays the midfield, but will also see minutes in the back. Cal Poly allowed a stingy 0.89 goals-per-game in 2006. Tramel logged 1,878:12 minutes at keeper in 2006, second most among Big West net-tenders.

**Roots and Branches**

Under Rockwood's tutelage, a long list of All-American soccer players has emerged from BYU's program. These athletes include Aleisha Rose, Shauna Rohbock, Maren Hendershot, Sara Reading and Staci Reynolds. Rohbock, Hendershot, Reading and Reynolds each went on to play in the Women's United Soccer Association.

Prior to becoming the head coach, Rockwood led BYU's highly successful club soccer team for seven years. In that time she amassed an overall record of 128-25-9, and the final two years she took her teams to the Western National Collegiate Club soccer Association (NCCSA) title and placed second in the NCCSA National Championships.

The Lake Oswego, Ore. native was a four-sport athlete in high school playing soccer, softball, basketball and track. After one year at Rick's College on a basketball scholarship, she transferred to BYU where she became a four-year starter at center midfield on the Cougars' club soccer team and graduated in finance, business management. Rockwood has also coached the Utah ODP, youth club programs and the high school level.
