## IN-STATE MATCHUPS

PROVO, Utah (April 6, 2009) – Indications of poor weather conditions forced the BYU softball team to reschedule its game against Utah Valley for Tuesday at 3 p.m. in Orem, Utah.



The Cougars will take their 26-14 record to the cross-town matchup. BYU has won 19 of its 20 games against the Wolverines. Utah Valley is 14-18 this season.

Following the single game contest, BYU will continue Mountain West Conference play. The Cougars will head north to face in-state rival Utah on Friday and Saturday. The games will be the first of a three-game Deseret First Duel softball series.

Last season the Cougars took the individual sport trophy as the two teams split four games and the run differential swung in the favor of BYU.

The Cougars look to maintain their perfect MWC record while in Salt Lake. Utah is 0-2 in conference play and 13-21 overall.

## ABOUT THE TEAM . . .

## COUGAR QUICK HITS

- The softball team opened up MWC play with three wins. They beat Colorado State 11-0 and defeated New Mexico 14-3, 10-4.

- BYU is riding a season-best seven-game winning streak, and the team has scored at least 10 runs in its last four games.

- The Cougars have out scored their opponent 218 runs to 98 runs. They have out-hit their opponents in 32 of their 40 games.

## DESERET FIRST DUEL

This season marks the second Deseret First Duel matchup between BYU and the University of Utah. Last season BYU took the inaugural title after splitting the series, but winning the run differential. BYU leads the all-time series 26-17.

## REMEMBERING LARRY H. MILLER

As a long-time fast pitch softball supporter, Larry H. Miller made significant contributions to the BYU softball team. The Cougars are proud of the baseball/softball complex that bears the Miller name. The softball team is wearing LHM patches on their uniforms in honor and gratitude to Miller. Both head coach Gordon Eakin and assistant coach Vaughn Alvey played on the Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch Softball Team.

## ROAD WARRIORS

The Cougars completed a 33-game road trip to begin the season. The team traveled as far as Tampa, Fla., to compete during their tournament schedule. The bounced from coast to coast, also playing several tournaments in California.

## HOME SWEET HOME

The back-to-back Miller Park facility will host six dates when both baseball and softball compete at the same time. Larry H. Miller Field seats 2,204 fans in two-tiered permanent seating for baseball. Gail Miller Field has 2,100 chair seats, making it the fourth-largest on-campus NCAA softball facility.

## INJURY UPDATES

Freshman Amber Price will miss the remainder of the season with shoulder surgery. Andrea Ramirez has recovered from the knee surgery that sidelined her in 2008.

## VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

The Cougars are now 2-8 against opponents ranked in the top-25 at the time of the game. BYU faced No. 15 Washington (ranking reflect the date of the game) in a 7-3 defeat before falling 0-4 in 10 innings against No. 12 Tennessee at the Red Desert Classic. BYU dropped a 4-2 game to No. 9/10 Michigan, before taking on No. 1/1 Alabama in a 6-0 loss. BYU also dropped a game to Louisville (then RV). The Cougars won their first game against a ranked opponent with an extra-inning no hitter against then-ranked No. 21/24 Fresno State before falling to No. 9/10 Cal. Against then No. 20 Florida Gulf Coast (Ultimate College Softball Poll) BYU dropped 5-4, after leading 3-0 for majority of the game. The Cougars exacted revenge on Cal at the Capitol Classic when they defeated the Golden Bears 4-0. In their last battle against a ranked opponent BYU fell 4-1 against then Cal Poly (RV).

## DID YOU KNOW...

- This year BYU carries two married players: Stephanie Hopkins and Whitney Nix-Thomas.
- The BYU softball program began in 2000, and the team has had eight-straight winning seasons.
- BYU has had four-consecutive berths to the NCAA Regional Tournament.
- During the program's existence it has carried six different All-Americans, including Jodi Norton and Jennifer Whitely from the 2007 MWC Championships.

CORNER**

BYU head coach Gordon Eakin is enjoying his seventh season at the helm of the Cougar softball team. Eakin holds a .679 winning percentage through six-plus seasons and has directed the team to four-straight NCAA Tournament Appearances.

**MILESTONE COACHING WIN**

During the Lousivilee Slugger Classic BYU head coach Gordon Eakin earned his 250th win with a 8-0 victory over Virginia. As the second coach in BYU history, he is the winningest coach in Cougar history.

**NATIONAL TEAM COACHES POOL**

The Amateur Softball Association of America and USA Softball announced that Eakin is one of 14 coaches selected to the 2009 Women's National team coaching pool. The coaches have been selected for the 2009-2012 quadrennium and are responsible for the training and preparation of the national team. The final selection will be released at a later date.

**COUGARS IN THE CONFERENCE**

BYU and San Diego State are expected to contend for the MWC title according to a vote by the league coaches. The Cougars and Aztecs each received three first-place votes to finish in a tie for first in the pre-season poll.

BYU had three former players named to the MWC 10th Anniversary Team. Ianeta Le'i, who currently serves as assistant coach to the Cougars, played for BYU from 2002-06. A three-time All-American, Neta still holds three single-season records. Oli Keohohou, a five-time All-American, played for BYU from 2001-03.
