COUGARS OPEN MWC PLAY

PROVO, Utah (April 1, 2009)—The BYU softball team travels to Colorado State to begin Mountain West Conference play on Thursday before heading to New Mexico for a two-game series Friday and Saturday.

The Cougars were picked to contend for first place in the MWC pre-season poll, as both BYU and San Diego State were tied in a vote for first place cast by the MWC coaches.

With a 23-14 record over a difficult tournament schedule, the Cougars have look forward to League play.

Last season BYU finished second in the conference with a 42-18 overall record and a 14-6 finish in MWC play. San Diego State beat BYU to a race for first place with a 15-5 MWC finish.

BYU will face Colorado State at 3 p.m. Thursday. They finished fourth in the conference with a 9-11 showing. The Rams are currently 16-9 on the season.

After Thursday's game the Cougars will face New Mexico, who finished the MWC season 7-13 in fifth place. The Lobos are 9-23 on the season.

COUGAR QUICK HITS

- The Cougars opened their home season with four-straight wins. The defeated Boise State 7-3 on Tuesday, and beat Idaho State 4-0 before sweeping North Carolina in a doubleheader 7-0, 10-4.

- Christie Zinanti threw her first collegiate no-hitter on Saturday, with 11 strikeouts to tie her career best. She was named MWC Pitcher of the Week, while Andrea Ramirez took Player of the Week honors.

MWC 10TH ANNIVERSARY TEAM

BYU had three former players named to the MWC 10th Anniversary Team. Ianeta Le'i, who currently serves as assistant coach to the Cougars, played for BYU from 2002-06. A three-time All-American, Neta still holds three single-season records. Oli Keohohou, a five-time All-American, played for BYU from 2001-03. Keohohou led the MWC in several statistical categories and still holds many BYU records including a season-best .458 batting average. Catcher Lauren Watson-Perry, a two-time All-American was also named to the Anniversary Team.

COUGARS IN THE CONFERENCE

BYU and San Diego State are expected to contend for the MWC title according to a vote by the league coaches. The Cougars and Aztecs each received three first-place votes to finish in a tie for first in the pre-season poll.

VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

The Cougars are now 2-8 against opponents ranked in the top-25 at the time of the game. BYU faced No. 3 Washington (Then No. 15) in a 7-3 defeat before falling 0-4 in 10 innings against No. 13 Tennessee (Then No. 12) at the Red Desert Classic. BYU dropped a 4-2 game to No. 9/10 Michigan, before taking on No. 5/4 Alabama in a 6-0 loss (then No. 1/1). BYU also dropped a game to No. 19/16 Louisville (then RV). The Cougars won their first game against a ranked opponent with an extra-inning no hitter against then-ranked Fresno State (21/24) before falling to No. 12/14 Cal (9/10). Against then No. 20 Florida Gulf Coast (Ultimate College Softball Poll) BYU dropped 5-4, after leading 3-0 for majority of the game. The Cougars exacted revenge on Cal at the Capitol Classic when they defeated the Golden Bears 4-0. In their last battle against a ranked opponent BYU fell 4-1 against then No. 24/25 Cal Poly (RV).

DID YOU KNOW...

- This year BYU carries two married players: Stephanie Hopkins and Whitney Nix-Thomas.
- The BYU softball program began in 2000, and the team has had eight-straight winning seasons.
- BYU has had four-consecutive berths to the NCAA Regional Tournament.
- During the program's existence it has carried six different All-Americans, including Jodi Norton and Jennifer Whitely from the 2007 MWC Champions.

CORNER**

BYU head coach Gordon Eakin is enjoying his seventh season at the helm of the Cougar softball team. Eakin holds a .679 winning percentage through six-plus seasons and has directed the team to four-straight NCAA Tournament Appearances.

MILESTONE COACHING WIN

During the Lousivilee Slugger Classic BYU head coach Gordon Eakin earned his 250th win with a 8-0 victory over Virginia. As the second coach in BYU history, he is the winningest coach in Cougar history.

NATIONAL TEAM COACHES POOL

The Amateur Softball Association of America and USA Softball announced that Eakin is one of 14 coaches selected to the 2009 Women's National team coaching pool. The coaches have been selected for the 2009-2012 quadrennium and are responsible for the training and preparation of the national team. The final selection will be released at a later date.

REMEMBERING LARRY H. MILLER

As a long-time fast pitch softball supporter, Larry H. Miller made significant contributions to the BYU softball team. The Cougars are proud of the baseball/softball complex that bears the Miller name. The softball team is wearing LHM patches on their uniforms in honor and gratitude to Miller. Both head coach Gordon Eakin and assistant coach Vaughn Alvey played on the Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch Softball Team.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Cougars completed a 33-game road trip to begin the season. The team traveled as far as Tampa, Fla., to compete during their tournament schedule. The bounced from coast to coast, also playing several tournaments in California.

HOME SWEET HOME

The back-to-back Miller Park facility will host six dates when both baseball and softball compete at the same time. Larry H. Miller Field seats 2,204 fans in two-tiered permanent seating for baseball. Gail Miller Field has 2,100 chair seats, making it the fourth-largest on-campus NCAA softball facility.

THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN

The seven freshman on the roster have already begun to make significant contributions to the Cougars. Eakin expects all of the rookies to continue to make impacts both with their defense, their speed and their strength at the plate. Six of the seven have made starting appearances.
