Mountain West Conference Play Begins For BYU

PROVO, Utah (Sept. 15, 2008) – The No. 24 BYU women's volleyball team (7-2) will begin Mountain West Conference play this week on the road, playing at Wyoming on Thursday and at No. 15 Colorado State on Saturday. Both matches will begin at 7 p.m. and be broadcast live on BYU Radio.

"We've learned a lot about ourselves during our preseason tournaments," said BYU head coach Shay Goulding. "We know we have some work to do, but we're ready to put it out there and start conference play. The MWC will be tough this year, and Colorado State has done very well so far, but I think when we play our best, we can match up against anyone."

BYU was picked to finish third in the MWC this season behind CSU and Utah in a vote of the league's head coaches and selected media. The Cougars (12-4) were tied with UNLV for second last year behind the Rams, finished second behind Utah in 2006 and won the league title in 2005. BYU has a 100-32 (.785) regular-season record in nine years of MWC play. Overall, the Cougars have a winning record against every team in the league with an all-time record of 321-76-1 (.808) against conference teams.

The Cougars went 2-1 last weekend to finish second at the InnTowner Invitational hosted by the University of Wisconsin. BYU started the event on Friday with a four-set win over Boise State followed by a sweep of Central Michigan Saturday morning. The Cougars faced the No. 14 Badgers in the tournament finale on Wisconsin's home floor and led two sets to one before falling in five sets. Seniors Rachel Dyer and Bryn Porter were named to the All-Tournament Team.

Including six matches over the last two weeks and two upcoming contests this week, the Cougars are currently in the middle of an eight-match road stretch. All in all, BYU will play 10 of its first 14 matches of the 2008 season away from the Smith Fieldhouse.

WYOMING IN 2008

The Wyoming Cowgirls are 1-8 overall this season after earning their first victory with a sweep of Cleveland State on Saturday. Two of their eight losses came against nationally ranked teams Hawaii and Minnesota. Sophomore rightside hitter Dani Bedore leads the team with 2.83 kills per set after transferring from South Carolina. Bedore's 0.57 blocks per set is third for Wyoming. Three other Cowgirls – Lauren Whitney (2.63), Jenna Arneson (2.17) and JennaRae Jester (2.09) top two kps to balance out the Wyoming offense. Senior libero Carissa Lee paces the team with 3.09 digs per set while sophomore middle blocker Chantilly Watson posts a team-best 0.92 bps.

WYOMING'S LAST OUTING

LARAMIE, Wyo. (Sept. 13, 2008) -- The Wyoming Cowgirl Volleyball team (1-8 overall) earned their first victory of the season with a three-set sweep (25-18, 25-19, 25-21) against the Cleveland State Vikings (1-8 overall) to close out the UniWyo Cowgirl Classic on Saturday night.

"I think the players did a great job at maintaining their composure," said UW head coach Carrie Yerty. "The key component to our other two losses was the fact that we didn't keep the ball in the court. Tonight we did a good job of keeping those errors down. They competed hard, executed a lot better and didn't get frazzled in tight situations."

The Cowgirls were led by sophomore Dani Bedore who finished with a team leading 14 kills, while hitting .429 (14-2-28) and tallying six digs. Both JennaRae Jester and Lauren Whitney each finished with nine kills, while setter Tasha Weishahn added eight. Samantha Eley had a season high 21 digs followed by Jenna Arneson with 13. The Cowgirls hit .396 (49-11-96) for the match and had five total team blocks. Both Weishahn and Bedore each earned All-Tournament Team honors.

Wyoming took a 5-3 lead in the first set but the Vikings scored four of the next five to go up 7-6. The Cowgirls scored the next two points of three points to regain a 9-7 advantage. The teams traded points back and forth until UW went on a small run to go up 14-11. CSU pulled to within one, but Wyoming answered to make it 18-15. They would extend that lead to seven, 22-15, and closed it out 25-17.

COLORADO STATE IN 2008

The Colorado State Rams are 8-1 so far in 2008 and ranked No. 15 nationally after an upset of No. 8 Florida on Friday. CSU's only loss was a four-set setback against Pepperdine. Two Rams pace the CSU offense as senior outside hitter Jaime Strauss tallies a team-best 3.23 kills per set while reigning MWC Player of the Year Mekana Barnes, a senior middle blocker, is right behind with 3.12 kps. Barnes is also hitting .351 on the year and notches a league-leading 1.59 blocks per set. Junior middle blocker Tessa Nelson is second on the team and sixth in the conference with 1.13 bps, helping Colorado State lead the MWC in blocks at 3.17. Junior libero Katelin Batten records a team-best 3.50 digs per set.

COLORADO STATE'S LAST OUTING

FORT COLLINS, Colo. (Sept. 13, 2008) -- In front of 4,009 rabid fans at Moby Arena, the CSU Rams volleyball team knocked off one of the top teams in the country as the Rams swept No. 8 Florida 3-0 (26-24, 25-16, 25-14).

The Ram faithful, the most in Moby Arena since 2001, saw the Rams extend their home winning streak to 19 matches as they took it to the mighty Gators early and often. After a tight first set that saw the Rams (8-1, 0-0 MWC) take an early lead, fall behind and then rally for a dramatic come-from-behind win, the Rams dominated the rest of the way.

"It was somewhat surreal," said Head Coach Tom Hilbert. "I remember the first game, but from there on out, I sat there as a fan. I have very little recollection of Sets 2 and 3. We played with the right attitude and our crowd was as good as it's ever been. This was fun tonight."

After surviving a Gator rally in the first set, the Rams took over. In the second set they led by as many as eight points (18-10) as the Rams hit .353 in the set while holding the high-powered Florida offense to .091 hitting. The third set was much of the same as CSU totally dominated. The Rams led 11-4 and then pushed that to 21-10 before closing out the Gators in three sets.

Redshirt freshman Katelyn Steffan led the CSU attack, which combined to hit .352 and added 12.0 blocks. Steffan posted a team-high 11 kills while hitting .500, while Jaime Strauss added 10 kills on .375 hitting. Tessa Nelson posted eight blocks for the Rams and senior setter Ashley Fornstrom added 30 assists.

Weekly Notes:

Week #3 In Review

The BYU Cougars went 2-1 last weekend to finish second at the InnTowner Invitational hosted by the University of Wisconsin. BYU started the event on Friday with a four-set win over Boise State followed by a sweep of Central Michigan Saturday morning. The Cougars faced the No. 14 Badgers in the tournament finale on Wisconsin's home floor and led two sets to one before falling in five sets. Seniors Rachel Dyer and Bryn Porter were named to the All-Tournament Team (see below). In addition to solid performances from their starters, the Cougars got lifts off the bench from sophomore rightside hitter Christina Measom, who posted a career-high eight kills on .700 hitting against the Chippewas, and sophomore defensive specialist Melissa Lake, who led BYU with 18 digs against Wisconsin.

InnTowner Invitational All-Tournament

BYU's two senior co-captains, Bryn Porter and Rachel Dyer, were both named to the Wisconsin InnTowner Invitational All-Tournament Team. Porter led BYU with 3.33 kills per set and paced the Cougars with 17 kills against Boise State and 11 winners against Central Michigan, the only Cougar in double figures. She also tallied 12 putaways in a five-set loss to No. 14 Wisconsin. The Camarillo, Calif., native notched her fourth double-double of the year with 13 digs in a four-set win over the Broncos. Dyer averaged 2.42 kps on .350 hitting on the weekend, posting double-digit kills against the Broncos (10) and the Badgers (10) while posting a .643 hitting percentage against Central Michigan (9-0-14).

Other All-Tournament

Senior middle blocker Rachel Dyer and junior outside hitter Kayla Walker were named to the Texas A&M Invitational All-Tournament Team. Walker averaged 3.25 kills per set while hitting .322 on the weekend, leading the team in both categories. Dyer averaged 2.25 kps, 1.17 bps and .317 hitting on the weekend. Two Cougars were named to the BYU Molten Classic All-Tournament Team in the first week of the season. True freshman Malia Marquardt earned all-tournament honors in her first weekend of collegiate volleyball after averaging 2.75 kills, 1.50 digs and 1.25 blocks per set on .356 hitting. Senior Bryn Porter became the 14th Cougar in program history to earn Molten Classic MVP honors as she averaged a team-best 3.67 kps with 2.33 dps and 1.17 bps.

The Nation's Best

The Cougars' 1,024-283-5 all-time record entering the week makes them one of the best teams in the nation, ranking fourth in all-time wins through Sept. 14. UCLA tops the list with 1,066 victories while Nebraska is second with 1,037 wins and Missouri State is third with 1,033. The top 10 is rounded out by Long Beach St. (1,009), Penn State (985), Hawai'i (969), Texas (942), Minnesota (925) and Texas-Arlington (918).

On The Road Again

For the second year in a row, BYU will begin the season playing 10 of its first 14 matches on the road. After three home matches to begin the year, the Cougars are currently in the middle of a stretch of eight straight matches away from the Smith Fieldhouse. In addition to three contests at the Texas A&M Invitational and three more matches at the InnTowner Invitational hosted by Wisconsin over the past two weeks, BYU begins Mountain West Conference play on the road at Wyoming and Colorado State this week. The Cougars end the month of September with a home contest against Air Force on Sept. 27 but then hit the road again on Oct. 2 at New Mexico and Oct. 4 at TCU. BYU went 10-4 in its first 14 matches last season. Prior to that, the Cougars had not begun the season with so many matches away from home since playing 10 of their first 14 on the road in 1997.

Making Milestones

With the Cougars' three-set win over Utah State to open the 2008 season, BYU head coach Shay Goulding achieved her first career Division I victory. Goulding spent the last five years as the head coach at Salt Lake Community College after one season guiding the Solano Community College women's volleyball program, compiling a 188-73 (.720) record at the NJCAA level. A four-time NJCAA District I Coach of the Year and two-time American Volleyball Coaches Association West Region Coach of the Year, Goulding guided her SLCC teams to four NJCAA Tournament berths, placing as high as second. Her teams earned a top-10 NJCAA ranking in each of the last four seasons.

BYU In the Polls

After beginning the season ranked No. 20 in the CBS College Sports/ AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll, the Cougars are No. 24 this week after losing at No. 14 Wisconsin last weekend. BYU has been ranked as high as No. 16 in 2008. BYU has a rich history of rankings in the AVCA Top 25 Poll. Among NCAA Division I programs, the Cougars are ninth all-time in total number of weeks ranked (288) and 11th in weeks ranked in the top 10 (123) and weeks ranked No. 1 (4). The Cougars have also traditionally finished strong, coming in eighth all-time in number of times ranked in the final poll (21), 10th in top-five final rankings (3) and seventh in weeks ranked No. 1 in the final poll (1). The Cougars began last season ranked No. 17 in the preseason poll and rose as high as No. 9 in the rankings before ending the year at No. 12.

Rivals in the Rankings

Three Cougar opponents also appear in the latest rankings. Wisconsin is ranked No. 13 after defeating the Cougars last weekend at the InnTowner Invitational hosted by the Badgers. The Texas Longhorns, who will host the Cougars on Oct. 24, are ranked No. 3 in the nation while Mountain West Conference foe Colorado State is ranked 15th. BYU will face the defending league champions on Saturday in Fort Collins, Colo., and on Nov. 20 at home. One other Cougar opponent – Utah – received votes. Defending NCAA Champion Penn State tops the poll.

2008 Rule Changes

Volleyball fans will notice two significant rule changes in 2008. The first major change approved by the NCAA Rules Committee changes the name of games to sets. The second change shortens matches from 30 points to 25 points, changing the collegiate version of the sport to be more in line with international standards.

Here Comes The Bride

Two Cougars are sporting different last names this season after getting married in the off-season. Junior rightside hitter Marisa Vandersteen Boaz tied the knot in May while Ashton Hansen Hosford quickly followed suit in June.

Team Captains

The 2008 women's volleyball team has selected its two seniors - outside hitter Bryn Porter and middle blocker Rachel Dyer - as captains for the season. Both players have been at BYU their entire collegiate careers and started as juniors last season.

Redshirts

BYU head coach Shay Goulding has asked three players to redshirt the 2008 season. Sophomore libero Chelsea Goodsell, who transferred from Sacramento State this offseason, and freshman middle blocker Nicole Warner will wait one more season to make their Cougar debuts. Sophomore outside hitter Christie Carpenter, who played in three matches and 10 games as a true freshman last year, will also redshirt the season.

Newcomers

Several new faces will contribute to the Cougars' success this year both on and off the court as BYU welcomes a new coaching staff and seven newcomers for the 2008 season. Former Salt Lake Community College Head Coach Shay Goulding will guide the BYU program this year, becoming just the fifth head coach in Cougar history. On the sidelines with Goulding will be former BYU men's volleyball standout Shawn Olmstead and recently graduated All-American Chelsea Goodman, who hopes to build on her tremendous on-court success over the past four years by helping the Cougars from the bench. In addition to three incoming freshmen – setter Markelle Malone, rightside hitter Malia Marquardt and middle blocker Nicole Warner – and one walk-on, defensive specialist Melissa Lake, three transfers have made their way to BYU. Junior libero Morgan Lloyd played two seasons at SLCC under Goulding while junior outside hitter Kayla Walker comes to BYU after two years at Pepperdine and sophomore libero Chelsea Goodsell spent her freshman year at Sacramento State. All seven newcomers could contribute significantly for the Cougars this year.

Cougars Picked To Finish Third In MWC

A voting panel including the nine Mountain West Conference head coaches and selected media has picked the BYU women's volleyball team to finish third in the MWC this season with a total of 82 points and one first-place vote. Defending league-champion Colorado State was tabbed as the favorite to win the 2008 regular-season title while Utah was selected second and New Mexico was slotted just behind BYU in fourth. "It's an honor to be included among the top teams in what will be a very competitive conference this season," said BYU head coach Shay Goulding. "We're excited to get the season started." The Rams collected 13 first-place votes and 125 total points. Utah tallied 95 points to claim second-place in the poll, while BYU edged New Mexico by one point for third place. The Lobos collected 81 points for fourth place in the poll. UNLV (63 points) and TCU (56 points) claimed fifth and sixth place, respectively, followed by San Diego State (seventh, 48 points), Wyoming (eighth, 28 points) and Air Force (ninth, 15 points).

Preseason All-MWC

BYU's Rachel Dyer, a senior middle blocker, was named to the preseason All-MWC Team representing the Cougars. Colorado State senior middle blocker and 2007 MWC Player of the Year Mekana Barnes highlighted the preseason team as she was tabbed the preseason MWC Player of the Year. Four MWC teams were represented on the 2008 preseason All-MWC Team, which also was chosen by the coaches and selected media. "It's an honor to be recognized on the preseason team," said Dyer. "We're looking forward to a great year. We have high expectations for ourselves and expect everyone to contribute to our success."

Cougars Travel to Argentina

In an occurrence as rare as the Summer Olympic Games, the BYU women's volleyball team embarked on a 13-day tour of Argentina from May 1-13. Due to the NCAA's Intuitional Foreign-Tour Limitations policy (17.30.2.1), Division I teams in every sport are only able to conduct a foreign tour once every four years. The trip marked the team's seventh foreign tour, stretching back to 1983, but first to South America. BYU's last foreign tour was in the spring of 2004 when the Cougars traveled through Europe. This year's tour took the Cougars throughout Argentina, including stops in Buenos Aires, Santa Fe, Resistencia, Rosario and the world-famous Iguazu Falls. BYU played five matches along the way, including three contests against the Argentine Junior National Team.

Broadcast Schedule

MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars own a 100-32 (.758) league record in the nine seasons of the MWC after finishing 2007 tied for second place with a 12-4 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and won again in 2005 with a 14-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively while Colorado State captured the 2003 title in San Diego and the 2004 crown on its home court. Utah won the 2005 title, Colorado State took home the crown in 2006 and UNLV earned the title in 2007, all in Las Vegas.

Six of the nine MWC programs have competed in postseason action in the seven years since the league was formed. In 2007, three MWC teams earned NCAA bids, including BYU (at-large), Colorado State (automatic) and UNLV (at-large). Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU and Colorado State have represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament each season. Overall, BYU has made 24 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 19, SDSU with 13, Utah with nine, New Mexico with seven, Wyoming with four and UNLV with one.

Three MWC teams were ranked in 2007 as BYU, Colorado State and UNLV represented the league in the AVCA Coaches' Top 25 Poll.

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .808.

BYU Posts Four-Set Win To Open Tourney

The No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team handed Boise State its seventh loss of the year Friday at the InnTowner Invitational hosted by the University of Wisconsin.

"We're happy to get a win," said BYU head coach Shay Goulding. "We're learning a lot about the things we need to work on to get better for this season."

All four sets were battles from start to finish. An early 5-2 Bronco lead in set one quickly disappeared with three straight Cougar scores. It was not until the set was tied at 20-20 that one team was able to pull away as Boise State scored five of the last seven points to take the 25-22 win. Porter tallied five kills in the set, but three Cougar service errors proved to be the difference.

Set two began with the Broncos again leading early at 11-7 until two kills from Porter and a Dyer service ace got BYU with one point. But Boise State kept the Cougars at bay until BYU was finally able to tie the set at 18-18 on a Bronco hitting error. BYU took its first lead of the second frame on the next point with a block from Porter, but the two squads continued to battle back and forth. Finally, with the score tied at 23-23, the Broncos gave the Cougars the chance they needed with a service error and an attack error to give BYU the 25-23 victory.

The Cougars dominated on both sides of the net in set three, hitting .375 in the frame while holding Boise State to a .135 attack percentage. However, the Broncos still managed to keep it tight, tying the score at 18-18 before BYU scored seven of the final eight points to take the 25-19 win.

Cougars Get Sweep With Dominating Offense

Day two of the InnTowner Invitational went BYU's way as the Cougar volleyball team swept Central Michigan (25-22, 25-20, 25-21).

"I'm very excited about how we played in this match," said BYU head coach Shay Goulding. "We were collected and played intelligently and confidently throughout. It was nice to see us come together and make it work."

The Chippewas led early in set one after getting out to a 4-1 advantage. The Cougars slowly chipped away until tying the score at 8-8, but quickly found themselves trailing 15-11. From there, BYU put together a 7-1 run thanks in part to four CMU hitting errors to gain an 18-16 lead. The Chippewas responded with a 5-1 spurt of their own to knot the score at 21-21, but the Cougars finished strong with two kills from sophomore Christina Measom to close out the set, 25-22. Porter led BYU with six kills in the frame while the Cougar defense held CMU to just .033 hitting. Set two played out in almost identical fashion as the Cougars trailed early by as many as four points but fought back to tie the set at 17-17 during a 6-0 run that eventually extended to a 21-17 lead. However, this time it was the BYU offense leading the charge as the Cougars hit an incredible .577 in the game with 16 kills and just one hitting error. BYU scored 10 of the last 13 points to record the 25-20 win as every Cougar with a kill finished the set hitting at least .500. With the match on the line, set three was a battle from the start until the Cougars were able to create some separation to lead 11-7. The Chippewas stayed close and continued to pressure the Cougars until finally knotting the score at 21-21 after three straight points. However, CMU would get no closer as BYU sprinted to the finish with four consecutive scores to take the set, 25-21.

BYU Suffers First Loss of 2008

The No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team gave 14th-ranked Wisconsin all the Badgers could handle Saturday night before falling in five sets at the InnTowner Invitational. Seniors Bryn Porter and Rachel Dyer were named to the All-Tournament Team.

Set one was tight from the start as the Badgers became the first team to lead by two points at 13-11. The Cougars returned the favor at 18-16 with three straight points, but the two squads continued to fight for every point. Finally, with the score tied at 22-22, the Badgers gained the advantage they were looking for with back-to-back scores to earn set point at 24-22. But consecutive Cougar blocks sent the set into extra play. However, it didn't take long for the home team to regain the momentum as Wisconsin scored the final three points to take the set, 27-25.

BYU jumped out to the early advantage in set two with a 4-1 lead. However, a 5-1 Badger run quickly turned the tables to a 9-7 Wisconsin lead. The Cougars responded with seven straight scores including three kills and a block from Dyer to go up 17-11 and take control of the set. Wisconsin made it all the way back to within one point but would come no closer as the Cougars closed out the set on a 5-0 run for the 25-20 win.

In a fifth set showdown, the two teams traded points for an early 3-3 tie. However, from there it was all Wisconsin as the Badgers pulled ahead and never looked back for the 15-10 win, scoring the come-from-behind match victory.

COUGARS READY FOR NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT IN 2008

After finishing last season ranked No. 12 in the nation with a 24-8 overall record, the 2008 Cougars are looking to build upon the success of last year, which culminated with an appearance in the Regional Finals of the NCAA Tournament. With 39 years of storied volleyball tradition providing the background, BYU hopes to once again challenge for the Mountain West Conference title in 2008 while making another NCAA Tournament run.

"I'm very excited for this season," said BYU head coach Shay Goulding, who begins her first year with the Cougars in 2008. "Our returning players have matured a great deal, and our newcomers will be wonderful assets to what is BYU volleyball. I expect us to pull together and accomplish great things this year."

With three starters among eight letterwinners returning, BYU will have talent and experience to draw on throughout the year as the Cougars overcome the challenge of losing four starters, including All-American Chelsea Goodman. Returning AVCA All-America honorable mention recipient Rachel Dyer is back for her final season and will be part of a tremendous one-two punch in the middle for BYU along with junior Ashton Hansen Hosford. Senior outside hitter Bryn Porter rounds out the returning starters for the Cougars. Several younger players will also be looked to for success as sophomores Christina Measom on the rightside, Kiana Rogers at the setter position and Christie Carpenter on the outside will also be competing for time after gaining valuable experience last year.

"We lost a lot of offensive production from last year, but we expect our returning players to step it up," said Goulding. "Many players will have opportunities to take on new roles as team leaders. We have a lot of great talent and volleyball knowledge on this team. We expect everyone to push each other and keep us focused on the goals we've set."

Several new faces will contribute to the Cougars' success this year both on and off the court as BYU welcomes a new coaching staff and seven newcomers for the 2008 season. Former Salt Lake Community College Head Coach Goulding will guide the BYU program this year, becoming just the fifth head coach in Cougar history. Goulding had tremendous success in her five seasons at SLCC, leading her teams to top-10 finishes at the NJCAA National Tournament in three of the past four years while earning four district and two region coach-of-the-year awards. On the sidelines with Goulding will be former BYU men's volleyball standout Shawn Olmstead and the recently graduated Goodman, who hopes to build on her tremendous on-court success over the past four years by helping the Cougars from the bench.

In addition to three incoming freshmen – setter Markelle Malone, rightside hitter Malia Marquardt and middle blocker Nicole Warner – and one walk-on, defensive specialist Melissa Lake, three transfers have made their way to BYU. Junior libero Morgan Lloyd played two seasons at SLCC under Goulding while junior outside hitter Kayla Walker comes to BYU after two years at Pepperdine and sophomore libero Chelsea Goodsell spent her freshman year at Sacramento State. All seven newcomers could contribute significantly for the Cougars this year.

"I have no doubt that our newcomers will fit into our systems and our program not only as outstanding volleyball players but as classy young ladies," said Goulding. "Our transfers especially have valuable experience that will add to the experience of our returning players."

A breakdown by position follows.

MIDDLE BLOCKER

All-American Rachel Dyer returns in 2008 to headline a strong group in the middle. The senior middle blocker ranked 11th in the country and fourth all-time at BYU with a .411 hitting percentage last season while posting 1.31 blocks per game, fifth in the league and 66th nationally. She earned all-tournament honors at all three of the Cougars' preseason tournaments last year and was numbered with the first group of Cougars to receive NCAA Regional All-Tournament accolades since 1998. A dominating presence inside, she posted double-digit kills in 24 matches and hit at least .500 in 12 contests.

Dyer will be joined in the middle by junior Ashton Hansen Hosford, who ranked third in the MWC and seventh all-time at BYU with a .389 hitting percentage as a sophomore starter last season. She also led the Cougars, ranked third in the league and 33rd nationally with 1.42 bpg. Known for her focus and intensity, she led BYU in blocks 17 times and hitting percentage in 10 matches, hitting .500 or above 10 times. Freshman Nicole Warner joins BYU in the middle this season after earning first-team all-state honors at Rigby High School in Rigby, Idaho, as a senior while tallying 332 kills and 197 blocks.

OUTSIDE HITTER

With the loss of Goodman on the outside, senior Bryn Porter is ready to step up as the Cougars' primary offensive weapon at the antennae this year. She posted 2.79 kills per contest in 2007 while notching double-digit kills in 19 matches and tallying five double-doubles. Her leadership and experience will also be a valuable asset to a relatively young Cougar squad. Also returning on the outside for BYU this year is sophomore Christie Carpenter. Carpenter saw action in 10 games as a true freshman last season and has already matured noticeably during her time as a Cougar. Junior Stephanie Lau may also contribute for BYU on the outside this year. Despite playing primarily as a defensive specialist during her first two seasons in a Cougar uniform, Lau saw more time on the outside during the spring and may continue that transition in the fall.

New to BYU's outside hitting core this season is junior Kayla Walker – the tallest Cougar on the roster this year at 6-foot-5. Walker played two years for the Pepperdine Waves before coming to BYU, earning West Coast Conference honorable mention as a sophomore in 2007 after being named to the WCC All-Freshman Team in 2006.

RIGHTSIDE

The Cougars have plenty of options on the rightside this season beginning with sophomore Christina Measom, who played in 11 games as a true freshman last year. Measom averaged 1.09 kills

2008 COUGAR SCHEDULE

Continuing its tradition of competitive scheduling, BYU will play seven teams this season that qualified for the 2007 NCAA Tournament, including two that were ranked in final CSTV/AVCA Top 25 Poll. In addition to a full slate of Mountain West Conference action, the Cougars will play in three preseason tournaments. BYU will open the year hosting the annual Molten Classic on Aug. 29 and 30 featuring in-state rival Utah State, Tulane and 2007 NCAA Tournament-qualifier Missouri. The Cougars will then travel to College Station, Texas, to compete in a tournament hosted by Texas A&M where BYU will face the Aggies along with NCAA Tournament-participants American and Siena. Preseason action wraps up the following week at the University of Wisconsin. In addition to facing the Badgers, who finished 2007 ranked No. 14 nationally, the Cougars will also take on Boise State and Central Michigan. After starting the 16-match MWC schedule on Sept. 18, BYU will step out of league play on Oct. 24 for a match at Texas. The Longhorns advanced to the Elite Eight of last year's NCAA Tournament along with BYU while finishing the year ranked No. 6 in the country. This season will mark the first year that the MWC will not host a volleyball championship. The league's regular-season champion will receive an automatic bid to the 2008 NCAA Tournament.

BYU has a winning record against all of its 2008 opponents with first meetings against Tulane and Missouri set for this season. The Cougars' all-time record versus this year's competition is a dominating 399-97-1 (.804).

and 1.09 blocks per game while leading the Cougars in blocks three times and hitting percentage once. Fellow returning letterwinner Marisa Vandersteen Boaz could also compete for time on the rightside after playing in two matches last year. Returning red-shirt Casey Speredon and incoming freshman Malia Marquardt will both look to make their Cougar debuts this season in that position.

SETTER

The setter position is shaping up to be a battle as the Cougars return sophomore Kiana Rogers while adding talented freshman Markelle Malone to the mix. Rogers played in 14 matches last year while sharing time with injured Amy Schlauder. She averaged 12.66 assists per game and led BYU to a win over No. 10 Wisconsin but is coming off of offseason surgery that held her out of spring competition. Malone comes to BYU out of Durango High School in Las Vegas, Nev., where she was the starting varsity setter all four years, earning Sunset Division All-Conference all four seasons.

LIBERO

Perhaps BYU's deepest position this season, the libero spot will feature plenty of competition. In addition to Lau returning as a possible defensive specialist and outside hitter, three new faces will hope to join the rotation in 2008. Junior libero Morgan Lloyd played two seasons at SLCC under Goulding and was named All-Region 18 First Team in 2007 after averaging 4.13 digs per game, which led the Scenic West Athletic Conference. Sophomore libero Chelsea Goodsell, who played her freshman year at Sacramento State under legendary head coach Debbie Colberg, played every match for the Hornets and ranked second on the team with 4.37 digs per game. And finally, sophomore Melissa Lake joined the Cougars as a walk-on last winter and made significant strides in the back row during the spring. All three could contribute right away for BYU.



Shay Goulding Head Women's Volleyball Coach

Shay Goulding was named the head coach of the BYU women's volleyball program on Feb. 27, 2008.

COACHING CAREER

Goulding has 10 years of collegiate coaching experience, including five seasons as the head coach at SLCC where she cultivated the Bruins into one of the elite junior college programs in the country. A four-time NJCAA District I Coach of the Year and two-time American Volleyball Coaches Association West Region Coach of the Year, Goulding guided her SLCC teams to four NJCAA Tournament berths, placing as high as second. Her teams have earned a top-10 NJCAA ranking in each of the last four seasons.

Goulding's 2007 team earned a 44-2 record while finishing third at the NJCAA National Tournament with both losses coming against eventual national champion Western Nebraska. Goulding was honored with her second AVCA West Region Coach of the Year award and fourth District I honor and graduated her fifth All-American. The Bruins made their third consecutive national tournament appearance in 2006 while Goulding garnered her third District Coach of the Year accolade and graduated her third NJCAA All-American. After placing third in the Scenic West Athletic Conference, Goulding led the Bruins to the Region 18 Championship and a bid to the NJCAA Tournament, where the team finished in 11th place.

The 2005 Bruins also finished third in the SWAC and rallied to win the region and district championships. The Bruins ended the year ninth nationally after Goulding received her second District Coach of the Year award. In 2004, she guided the Bruins to a second-place finish at the NJCAA Tournament, producing her first two All-Americans in just her second season as head coach. As a result, she was named the District I and AVCA West Region Coach of the Year.

Prior to coaching at SLCC, Goulding spent one year at Solano Community College in Fairfield, Calif., and three years as part of the coaching staff at Utah State University. During her time as an assistant coach at USU, the Aggies went to the NCAA Tournament twice and were ranked in the top 25 in the country for two consecutive years. The Aggies' climb to the top included back-to-back 20-win seasons and 10 Big West All-Conference selections.

Goulding's coaching experience also includes coaching at the high school and club levels in both California and Utah for the past 10 years. Goulding has directed and coached at camps throughout the western states and has become known as a sound clinician and excellent teacher of motor skills. She was a featured speaker at the 2007 AVCA convention and has served as the Chairman of the AVCA Awards Committee since 2004.

PLAYING CAREER

Goulding played collegiate volleyball at Coastal Carolina University in South Carolina. A middle blocker/outside hitter, she was named team captain and the Chanticleers Most Valuable Player in 1994 while being selected to several all-tournament teams.

PERSONAL

A native of Visalia, Calif., Goulding received her Master of Education degree in Exercise Science with an emphasis in Motor Learning from Utah State University in 2001 and her Bachelor of Arts degree in History from BYU in 1998. She served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Santiago, Chile, from 1996-97.

2007 SEASON REVIEW

Despite a season of ups and downs, the BYU women's volleyball team maintained its position among the nation's elite in 2007, advancing to the Regional Semifinals of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1998 while earning a No. 12 final national ranking, the program's highest final poll position since 1998.

BYU finished the season 24-8 overall and 12-4 in the Mountain West Conference, tied for second place. Along the way, the Cougars defeated four ranked teams, including No. 10 Wisconsin, No. 25 UNLV, No. 6 Washington and No. 16 Middle Tennessee State. BYU's wins at the Huskies and against the Blue Raiders propelled the Cougars to their first Regional Semifinals appearance in a decade. One of the last eight teams still playing in December, the Cougars bowed out of the NCAA Tournament at No. 1 Penn State, who went on to win the national championship. Overall, BYU has now played in 24 NCAA tournaments in the 27-year history of the event.

Experience and leadership proved to be the determining factors for the Cougars in 2007 as three seniors – Chelsea Goodman, Erica Lott and Annie Pinegar – anchored the team on the court. All three contributed significantly to a BYU team that finished among the top 40 in the nation in hitting percentage (15th - .271), assists per game (21st – 15.35), blocks per game (27th – 3.02), match win/loss percentage (36th - .750) and kills per game (38th – 16.24). After beginning the year ranked No. 17 in the AVCA/CSTV Top 25 Coaches Poll, the Cougars climbed as high as No. 9 before finishing the year ranked No. 12.

The Smith Fieldhouse once again proved dominant for the Cougars as they went 10-2 on Elaine Michaelis Court while averaging 1,739 fans per match, 17th in the nation. A BYU women's volleyball record crowd of 4,509 saw BYU sweep Utah on Nov. 9. The Cougars area now 470-84 all-time at home and 32-3 on Elaine Michaelis Court over the past three seasons.

Perhaps the defining moment of the season came on Sept. 15 in a five-game come-from-behind win at San Diego State. The victory marked the program's 1,000th all-time win, making BYU just the fourth program in NCAA history to achieve that milestone. Though it did not come easily, the triumph epitomized the self-sacrifice, steely determination and elite performance that defines years of Cougar volleyball.

BYU began the year earning back-to-back tournament titles with victories at the Hawkeye Challenge hosted by Iowa and the BYU Molten Classic. The Cougars' home opener on Aug. 31 in the Classic featured an epic battle between the Cougars and No. 10 Wisconsin. BYU emerged victorious with a 3-2 win in front of 3,880 fans in the Smith Fieldhouse, vaulting to the No. 9 spot in the national poll. The following week, the Cougars went 1-2 at the Stanford Invitational with losses to No. 17 Cal Poly and No. 2 Stanford.

Sporting a 6-2 record entering Mountain West Conference play and searching for their 1,000th all-time victory, the Cougars were stunned at UNLV with a three-game loss. The Rebels proved to be the surprise team in the MWC in 2007, earning their best overall record and MWC finish in school history while making their first NCAA Tournament appearance. Two days after the UNLV setback, the Cougars seemed once again headed for defeat at SDSU after losing the first two games. But a monumental comeback effort spurred BYU to victory, the historic 1000th win.

A 6-3 record over the next five weeks offered little in the way of highlights as the Cougars dominated likely suspects TCU, Wyoming, Air Force and Utah Valley but dropped two matches to Colorado State and suffered a surprising home loss to New Mexico. But even in the midst of relative mediocrity, the team still managed to make a little history, getting a 3-2 win at Utah to record the first triumph at Crimson Court since 2000. Goodman led the way for BYU, posting the first Cougar triple-double since 2004 with 21 kills, 11 digs and a career-high 12 blocks, doubling her previous rejection tally.

Goodman had also been steadily increasing her career double-double tally, and with 20 kills and 16 digs at Colorado State on Oct. 18, she became the MWC's career record-holder in that category. The achievement was somewhat bittersweet as it came in a losing effort, but the three-game defeat proved to be the last the Cougars would taste for sometime.

After that point, BYU turned things around in the final four weeks of the regular season, winning eight straight matches. The victory streak included three significant wins as the Cougars exacted revenge on the Lobos in Albuquerque after the earlier home loss and defeated Utah and UNLV in the Smith Fieldhouse. The three-game win over the Utes was the first Cougar sweep over their rivals since 2001 and came in front of a BYU women's volleyball record crowd of 4,509 fans. Combined with the earlier win in Salt Lake City, the Cougars swept the season series against Utah for the first time since 1999 and earned the inaugural Deseret First Duel Rivalry Series volleyball trophy. The final match of the regular season saw BYU once again get some pay back, beating No. 25 UNLV in four games.

A semifinal loss to UNLV in the MWC Tournament on the Rebels' home floor the following week left BYU hoping for an at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament. The Cougars were indeed invited to their 24th Tournament in the 27-year history of the event, opening with a sweep of Ole Miss in the first round. BYU then faced No. 6 Washington in the second round on the Huskies' home court. Looking to advance to the Regionals for the first time since 1999, the Cougars pulled off a spectacular five-game upset, coming from behind to win the last two games and continue their season. After sweeping No. 16 Middle Tennessee State in the Regional Semifinals held at Penn State to become one of the final eight teams playing, the Cougars ended their season with a three-game loss to the top-ranked Nittany Lions, who went on to win the national championship.
