Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU '93, played '85-'88) is in his third season as head coach at BYU, 32-21 (.604) in 2013 and 22-31 (.415) in 2014. The 48-year-old coach had a 213-132 (.617) record in seven seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie '08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia '07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU '99), all in their third year at BYU.

Series Record vs. Santa Clara

The series with Santa Clara is tied, 8-8. The Cougars won all three games vs. the Broncos in 2013, but lost the first four meetings of the series which started in 1968. Santa Clara won the first and last of a three-game series in Provo in 2014.

Hitting Streaks

Bronson Larsen leads the team with a current a 20-game streak. Derrick Whitney has a six-game streak. Tanner Chauncey had a nine-game streak and Eric Urry had an 11-game streak ended against USF. Nielsen had a 12-game streak stopped at San Diego and again at Pacific. Lund had 24 game streak ended vs. St. Mary's. Dillon Robinson had a nine-game hitting streak ended vs. SMC. Colton Shaver had a nine-game hitting streak stopped against Hartford.

BYU in NCAA statistics

BYU was ranked No. 50 in doubles, No. 36 in batting average and No. 58 in fielding percentage in the NCAA rankings of the 2015 season. Colton Shaver was ranked No. 33 in home runs, Kolton Mahoney No. 63 in strikeouts and Tanner Chauncey No. 91 in toughest to strike out.

Deseret First Duel

For the seventh of eight times BYU won the baseball portion of the Deseret First Duel in games against Utah. BYU won the 2014 competition due to a tiebreaker with a 38-21 run differential after the two teams split the four-game series. BYU won the baseball portion of the Duel in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015. The 2008 series won by BYU and the 2011 series won by Utah were also by run differential.

Graduation last month

Jeff Barker (economics) and Dillon Robinson (finance) from this season's team graduated last month. Brandon Kinser (geography) is scheduled to graduate in August.

Robinson Repeats as Academic All-District

Infielder Dillon Robinson of BYU baseball was named a repeat selection to the Capital One Academic All-District® Eight Baseball. He is one of four players from the West Coast Conference voted to the team selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America. Robinson has a 3.58 cumulative grade point average in finance. First-team Academic All-District® honorees advance to the Capital One Academic All-America® Team ballot, where first-, second- and third-team All-America honorees will be selected later this month.

BYU vs. WCC in 2015

Here are a couple of interesting baseball facts on the WCC. Pepperdine won the College World Series in 1992. Of the 10 WCC teams, only St. Mary's has not participated in the NCAA post-season tournament. BYU's 1-1 tie against Pepperdine came in the second game of a doubleheader in 1963. Quick Look at BYU

BYU was picked to finish sixth in the West Coast Conference after placing seventh its third year in the league and second under Coach Mike Littlewood. The Cougars return 20 lettermen and lost 12 letterman for Littlewood's third season. Kolton Mahoney threw BYU's seventh no-hitter in a 5-0 win at Nicholls State. Third baseman Dillon Robinson injured his ankle in the third game of the Nicholls State series and has missed 14 games due to that injury. Hayden Rogers suffered a concussion when he was hit in the face in a freak injury by a batted ball as he was warming up in the bull pen during the pregame.

2015 Home Season

The Cougars finished the 2015 home season with a 189-108 (.636) record at Larry H. Miller Field which seats 2,204 fans in its 14th season since it was built. In the first nine years BYU drew 218,981 fans for an average of 1,177 and 142,248 at night for an average of 1,452. The largest crowd at home during 2013 was 1,593 vs. Pepperdine and the crowd of 11,240 fans at LSU was the largest on the road. BYU drew 20, 313 fans (averaging 967) for an 16-5 home record in 2013.

Shaver Player of Week vs. Utah, San Francisco

Colton Shaver was named WCC Player of the week for batting .353 (6-17) over the three San Francisco games last week and recorded four home runs to give him 10 on the season. The Cougars out-scored their opponents 30-17 in the four games and Shaver drove in 11 of them for a 1.118 slugging percentage. Shaver opened the week with a two homer effort against instate rival Utah and then powered home runs in the series opener and the series finale against San Francisco. Five of his six hits were for extra-bases. Shaver leads the league in home runs (10) and total bases (87).

Robinson Player of Week vs. UVU, Pepperdine

Dillon Robinson was named the Rawlings West Coast Conference Player of the Week after he raised his batting average from .323 to .360 by batting a team-high .538 in the four games last week. He scored BYU's seventh run in the 10-7 victory at UVU. He had six hits, two of which were doubles in the Pepperdine series where he batted .545 to lead the team.

Mahoney National/WCC Pitcher of Week vs. Portland

Kolton Mahoney was named a Louisville Slugger National Player of the week by Collegiate Baseball magazine and selected as the Rawlings West Coast Conference Pitcher of the Week and WCC Player of the Week by College Sports Madness. Mahoney tied a school record with 15 strikeouts against Portland as he threw 141 pitches. He pitched eight of those innings, retiring Portland in order in the third (all swinging strikeouts), sixth and seventh innings. Mahoney had at least one strikeout every inning, including two in the second, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh innings. Ten of those strikeouts were swinging. In the first inning he picked off a runner at first base. He lowered his ERA from 4.12 to 3.80 and improved his record to 3-3.

Top 25 Teams

BYU played four nationally ranked team this season, UC Santa Barbara, Nebraska, San Diego and upset No. 29 San Diego State. In 2014, the Cougars played two nationally ranked teams, No. 19 TCU and No. 26 Texas Tech. In 2013, BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Also in 2013, BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1; and BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball). In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after upsetting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.

Mahoney's No-hitter in 2014

Kolton Mahoney threw BYU's seventh no-hitter in school history in a 5-0 defeat over Nicholls State University. He threw 102 pitches, striking out 11 Colonels in nine innings, and walking only two batters in leading BYU to its fifth straight win and was named pitcher of the week by four different organizations. Mahoney's was the second nine-inning no-hitter in school history and the second no-hitter on the road.

Recent Inductees

Coaches Mike Littlewood (& son Marcus), Trent Pratt, Gary Pullins, Bobby Noel and Dave Nelson were inducted this past January into the Mountain West Baseball Academy Hall of Fame. Coach Littlewood, Pullins, Noel and Nelson also played for the Cougars.
