BYU/UTAH STORYLINES

- **SERIES HISTORY.** BYU and Utah resume the rivalry and the Deseret First Duel after just one regular-season game between the last meeting. The Cougars and Utes met in the Las Vegas Bowl in 2015. The Utes jumped out to a 35-0 lead after five consecutive BYU turnovers to start the game. BYU came back to make it 35-28 but fell short. The Utes led the all time series 55-31-4. In the past 20 meetings, 15 of the games have been decided by 7 points or less.
- **COACHING TREE.** BYU head coach Kalani Sitake coached 10 seasons under Kyle Whittingham at Utah, working his way up to Whittingham's No. 2 man as assistant head coach. Sitake returned home to BYU as head coach where both he and Whittingham had played under Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards. Defensive coordinator Ilaia Tuiaki, defensive line coach Steve Kaufusi and tight ends coach Steve Clark have all spent time on the Utah staff. Utah co-offensive coordinator Aaron Roderick, linebackers coach Justin Ena and wide receivers coach Guy Holliday all spent time at BYU as players or staff members and are among many rivalry ties between the two schools.
- **PAC-12.** The Cougars are facing their second consecutive Pac-12 team and will have one more next week with UCLA. BYU is 72-122-6 overall against the Pac-12.

POSTGAME MEDIA AVAILABILITY

After home games, postgame press conference will be conducted in the LaVell Edwards Stadium press room, located on the southeast end of the stadium next to the BYU locker room. At the discretion of the visiting team, opponent interviews will be conducted in the Blue Zone, near the opponent's locker room located on northwest end of the stadium. Coach Sitake and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A direct video feed will also be sent to the press box from the BYU postgame press conference. A basic transcript of Sitake's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided with additional player quotes upon availability. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

UTAH FOOTBALL SHUTS OUT SOUTHERN UTAH, 24-0, TO OPEN 2016 SEASON

TROY WILLIAMS PASSES FOR 272 YARDS, TROY MCCORMICK HAS OVER 100 ALL-PURPOSE YARDS.

SALT LAKE CITY –The Utah football team recorded its first shutout since 2012 as the Utes won their season opener, 24-0, against Southern Utah on Thursday, Sept. 1, to open the 2016 season.

Utah's last shutout was against Northern Colorado in 2012, a 41-0 win.

Utah led 3-0 after a field goal on its first drive of the game before a pair of late-second quarter touchdowns gave Utah a 17-0 halftime lead. Utah increased its lead to 24-0 after a fourth-quarter score.

Making his first start as a Ute, quarterback Troy Williams threw for 272 yards (20-of-35) with no interceptions and two touchdown passes. Tim Patrick had 105 yards receiving on five catches with two touchdowns. Between 55 yards rushing (12 carries) and 55 yards receiving (three catches), Troy McCormick recorded 110 all-purpose yards to lead the Utes. He also scored on a touchdown run in the second quarter.

On defense, Cody Barton led Utah with 11 tackles, a career high. Kylie Fitts came away with three of Utah's nine tackles for loss, including 1.5 sacks. Hunter Dimick had two TFL and a sack. Marcus Williams caused two first half turnovers, forcing a first-quarter fumble and picking up his seventh career interception in the second quarter. He also had a pass breakup.

Also notable for the Utes was punter Mitch Wishnowsky, who set a school record with a 55.5 punt average (six punts, 333 yards). His five punts of 50+ yards on the night is second-most in school history.

A pair of touchdowns in the final four minutes of the second quarter gave Utah a 17-0 lead at halftime and control of the game. The offense took advantage of an interception from Marcus Williams to go 53 yards on the next drive which resulted in a four-yard touchdown run by McCormick to put the Utes up 10-0 with 3:41 left in the first half. Following a quick three-and-out by the defense, the Utes quickly came back to score their second touchdown of the game, a two-yard pass to Patrick from Troy Williams, which was set up by a 33-yard rush from McCormick.

The Utes gained 115 yards in the second quarter and held the Thunderbirds to just 12 yards. The Utes held the ball for over 22 minutes in the first half and held a 236-89 advantage in total offense yards in the half.

Utah capped its scoring in the fourth quarter with a 57-yard touchdown pass from Williams to Patrick, giving the Utes a 24-0 lead.

Utah took a 3-0 lead on its first drive of the game on a 26-yard field goal from Andy Phillips. Phillips was 1-for-2 in field goals on the night, breaking a streak of 11-straight field goals dating back to last year.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR SIX

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from eight different conferences and an independent team. Six games come against Power Five opponents, including teams from the Pac-12, Big 12, Big Ten and SEC. The schedule ranks No. 7 in Phil Steele's preseason schedule rankings. The opponents on the 2016 schedule posted a 97-57 record in 2015, with 10 bowl teams and an FCS playoff team.

The Cougars host six home games and have four true road contests with two neutral site games, both at NFL stadiums, in 2016. The home schedule consists of UCLA, Toledo, Mississippi State, Southern Utah, UMass and Utah State. Teams on the home schedule put together a 44-31 record in 2015, with four reaching bowl games and Southern Utah earned an FCS playoff berth. Road contests include Utah, Michigan State, Boise State and Cincinnati with neutral site games against Arizona (University of Phoenix Stadium - home of the Arizona Cardinals) and West Virginia (FedEx Field - home of the Washington Redskins). All six games away from home are against 2015 bowl teams with a combined record of 53-16 last year.

TEAM CAPTAINS

BYU will have four captains for the 2016 season in senior quarterback Taysom Hill, senior running back Jamaal Williams, senior defensive back Kai Nacua and senior defensive lineman Harvey Langi. Hill is serving as a captain for the third time. BYU offensive coordinator Ty Detmer was also a three-time team captain (89, 90, 91).

FLAG BEARERS

BYU's tradition of carrying team flags out of the tunnel adds some new looks for 2016. A United States serviceman will carry an American flag for every game, with team flags carried by selected players and alumni flags carried by former BYU players for each game.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,275-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 63,275 after various refurbishments. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 150 nations speaking more than 160 languages. Over 74,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 418 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

The 2016 team has 84 players that served church missions and there are another 27 currently serving. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

ALUMNI FIRESIDES

POLYNESIAN PIPELINE

The Polynesian Islands have become a hotbed for recruiting in recent years, but BYU has been one of the pioneers in bringing these players from Tonga, Samoa, the Hawaiian Islands and all of Polynesia to the forefront of college football since the early 1950s. More than 40 members of the current roster are of Polynesian descent.

Some of BYU's most celebrated and decorated players have come from the Pacific islands, including All-Americans, national record holders, players who have gone on to compete in the NFL and now, several members of BYU's current coaching and support staff.

Kalani Sitake was named BYU's 14th head coach on Dec. 19, 2015, becoming the first Tongan head football coach in the NCAA. Sitake was raised in Laie, Hawaii and later moved to the mainland. His staff includes Polynesians Ilaisa Tuiaki, Steve Kaufusi, Reno Mahe, Nu'u Tafisi, Russell Tialavea, Tevita Ofahengaue, Jack Damuni, Jasen Ah You, Sione Kinikini, Vince Feula and Harvey Unga.

FIELD GOAL GIVES BYU 18-16 WIN IN FIRST GAME OF SITAKE ERA

GLENDAL, Ariz. – True freshman Jake Oldroyd made a game-winning 33-yard field goal to give the BYU football team an 18-16 win over Arizona in its first game under head coach Kalani Sitake Saturday night at University of Phoenix Stadium in the Cactus Kickoff.

Oldroyd came in for his first collegiate field goal attempt with eight seconds remaining and put it through for the win. The kick capped a nine play, 53-yard drive highlighted by a 17-yard strike to Moroni Laulu-Pututau to get things moving.

BYU was led by senior running back Jamaal Williams, who had 29 carries for 162 yards. It was his 11th career 100-yard rushing game. Senior quarterback Taysom Hill completed 21 of 29 passes for 202 yards and a touchdown while adding 37 yards on the ground.

The Cougars (1-0) held the Wildcats (0-1) to 328 total yards and no first-half points en route to the win. It was Arizona's fewest total yards since a 55-17 loss at Stanford in 2015. BYU forced the Wildcats into two turnovers.

BYU's new-look offense recorded 415 total yards, balanced with 213 rushing and 202 passing.

Sophomore linebacker Butch Pau'u led the defense with nine total tackles including seven solo, 2.5 tackles for loss, one sack and one forced fumble. Senior safety Kai Nacua and running back turned linebacker Francis Bernard recorded an interception and a sack in his defensive debut.

THE BYU OFFENSE

• **AN ENVIOUS QUARTERBACK SITUATION.** BYU has one of the best quarterback situations in the country. Fifth-year senior Taysom Hill takes the No. 1 spot after coming back from injury in 2015. The 6-foot-2, 235-pound dual-threat is No. 11 in BYU history with 7,057 career yards of total offense. Backing up Hill is Tanner Mangum, the Freshman of the Year in 2015 by the Touchdown Club of Columbus. After Hill went down in 2015, Mangum threw for 3,377 yards and 23 touchdowns, both BYU freshman records. In addition to Hill and Mangum, BYU boasts Beau Hoge, Koy Detmer Jr. and Hayden Livingston in the quarterback room ready to contribute.

• **RUSHING RECORDS.** After a 162 yard performance against Arizona, running back Jamaal Williams needs 767 yards to move into a tie at the No. 1 spot for most rushing yards in BYU history at 3,455. The record is held by Harvey Unga, a member of the current Cougar coaching staff as an offensive graduate assistant. Williams ran for 1,233 in 2013.

• **SPREADING THE BALL.** BYU had five players with at least 500 receiving yards in 2015 and on Saturday against Arizona the Cougars spread the ball to eight different receivers, five of which had multiple receptions. Colby Pearson also returns after earning over 200 receiving yards in 2015 and Moroni Laulu-Pututai with over 100. Pearson caught a touchdown against Arizona and Laulu-Pututai led the team in receiving yards.

BYU DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

2 BYU forced two turnovers against the Wildcats in the season opener. Francis Bernard got the first interception and Kai Nacua picked off Anu Solomon for the second. The two picks tied for the No. 9 mark in the NCAA.

4/8 The Cougars got to Arizona's quarterback four times with four sacks and behind the line of scrimmage with eight tackles for loss. Butch Pau'u led with 2.5 tackles for loss. Four sacks was tied for No. 13 nationally in the opening weekend.

50.0 Arizona only reached the red zone twice but failed to score on one for a 50 percent mark. The Cougar defense forced a field goal attempt at the end of the first half that missed.

115 The number of rushing yards given up to Arizona in the opener was just 115. The Wildcats averaged 222 rushing yards last season, No. 23 nationally.

328 Coach Tuiaki's defense allowed just 328 total yards against Arizona. The Wildcats posted nearly 500 yards a game in 2015 and had just one game with fewer yards than Saturday against BYU—a 314 yard performance at No. 3 Stanford.

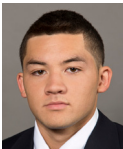

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **SACK ATTACK.** In 2014, the Cougars were 4-0 when notching at least three sacks in a game. In 2015, they went 8-1 and they start 2016 1-0 after sacking Arizona four times. Since 2005, BYU is 50-3 when notching three or more sacks in a single game. The Cougars sacked the opposing QB 40 times last year, which was the most at BYU since official defensive statistics were recognized by the NCAA in 2000.
- **TFL.** The Cougars notched at least six tackles for a loss in 12 out of 13 games in 2015 and got eight against the Wildcats to start the 2016 season. BYU ranked No. 9 nationally with 7.5 tackles for loss per game last season.
- **STAYING POSITIVE.** BYU is 56-8 since 2005 with a positive turnover margin. BYU was plus-2 with two picks against Arizona. The Cougars recorded a positive turnover margin in seven games in 2015.
- **NEW FACES, NEW PLACES.** A number of players have shuffled positions with the coaching change to Kalani Sitake. Notable changes include several linebackers transitioning to defensive line positions with more 4-3 elements in the defensive scheme including Harvey Langi moving from mostly playing middle linebacker to defensive end. Two offensive players of note jumped to defense, including Francis Bernard moving from running back to linebacker and Akile Davis moving from receiver to cornerback. Micah Hannemann, the starting field corner in 2015 also moved into the middle at one of the safety positions.

Kalani Sitake (pronounced kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay) was named head coach overseeing the BYU football program on December 19, 2015, by director of athletics Tom Holmoe.

Sitake is the 14th head coach in BYU history. He comes to BYU from Oregon State, where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator.

A former Cougar running back (1994, 1997-2000), Sitake returns to his alma mater with 15 years of coaching experience, including seven years as defensive coordinator and four seasons as an assistant head coach.

Prior to serving as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Oregon State in 2015, Sitake spent 10 seasons at the University of Utah. He started at Utah in 2005 as the linebackers coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2009 before also being named assistant head coach in 2012.

Sitake has coached several Pac-12 and Mountain West Conference honorees, including Morris Trophy winners Star Lotulelei (2011) and Nate Orchard (2014). He also helped mentor 14 NFL Draft picks during his time at Utah, including 12 all-league players and three freshmen All-Americans. He helped the Utes win seven of eight bowl games during his tenure.

Sitake began his coaching career in 2001 as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Arizona before becoming a defensive graduate assistant at BYU in 2002. Sitake then joined the staff at Southern Utah where he coached running backs, tight ends and offensive line during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

Born in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, and raised in Laie, Hawai'i and Provo, Utah, Sitake becomes the first FBS head football coach of Tongan descent. He is the 14th head coach in BYU history, and just the fourth since 1972, when Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards took over the program.

Sitake began his BYU playing career in 1994 prior to serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Oakland, California. After returning and redshirting in 1997, Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000 under Edwards.

He was named BYU's Football Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1998, Impact Player of the Year in 1999, along with team captain and the most valuable running back in 2000. He signed a free agent contract with the Cincinnati Bengals in 2001, but was forced to retire due to an injury.

Sitake graduated from BYU in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in English. He and his wife Timberly have
