**ABOUT THE PILOTS**

- Portland (17-14, 7-11 WCC) snapped a four-game losing streak with a decisive 69-52 win over third-seeded Saint Mary's in the WCC quarterfinals on Saturday.
- The Pilots defense and depth stifled the Gaels as Saint Mary's shot just 30 percent from the field. A total of 11 Pilots saw the court in the first half four reached double figures, led by senior G Kevin Bailey with 16 points.
- Freshman Jason Todd started in place of Volodymyr Gerun (flu) and scored a season-high 14 points.
- Alec Wintering was named to the All-WCC Second Team, one of only two underclassmen to earn first or second team honors.
- Seniors Thomas van der Mars and Kevin Bailey earned honorable mention honors.
- Van der Mars is UP's all-time leader in blocked shots (119) and is also top 10 in rebounds, field goal percentage and games started.
- Wintering leads the WCC in three-point percentage (.485) and also ranks top five in assists and assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Bailey's 1,367 career points ranks eighth in UP history.
- Van der Mars has been named a First Team Academic All-America, the first Pilot men's hoopster to earn such an honor. He was joined on the WCC All-Academic Team by senior C Riley Barker.
- The Pilots rank 34th nationally in three-point percentage (.386), 38th in assists per game (15.0), 54th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.23), 55th in rebounding margin (+4.0) and 58th in blocked shots (4.5).
- Wintering has two game-winning three-pointers this season. He opened WCC play at San Diego with a three with 0.3 seconds left for a three-point win and then beat the buzzer in Portland's 72-69 win versus Pacific on Jan. 22.
- Bailey missed eight games with a foot injury suffered against Portland State on Dec. 3 before returning to the court versus Santa Clara on Jan. 8.
- Portland is 6-3 this season in games decided by five or less after going 1-7 last season.
- Head Coach Eric Reveno added experience to his staff in the offseason with the addition of veteran NBA head coach Herb Brown and former Portland Trail Blazers video coordinator Tim Grass.
- The Pilots signed three high school seniors to NLI's in the fall: Jazz Johnson (Lake Oswego, Ore./Lake Oswego HS), Colin Russell (Folsom, Calif./Folsom HS) and Chiir Maker (Sydney, Australia/Newington College). Johnson broke the Les Schwab Invitational scoring record by averaging 35.0 points per game against elite national competition earlier this year. Russell is a McDonald's All-America nominee and Maker recently scored 49 points in a loss to Rainier Beach (Wash.) as part of a Pacific Northwest Tour with Newington College.

**PILOTS AT THE WCC TOURNAMENT**

- Portland is 11-25 all-time at the WCC Championships and 4-5 in Las Vegas.
- Head coach Eric Reveno is 5-8, previously advancing to the semifinals in 2009 and 2010.
- Portland's lone WCC Tournament Championship came in 1996.

**ABOUT BYU**

- The Cougars (24-8, 11-5 WCC) are on a seven-game win streak after senior G Tyler Haws buried a pull-up jumper with 2.5 seconds left for a 74-72 win over Santa Clara in the WCC quarterfinals on Saturday.
- BYU previously knocked off the Pilots in Portland and then snapped Gonzaga's 41-game home winning streak with a 73-70 win over the Bulldogs to close the regular season.
- Haws, BYU's all-time leading scorer, finished with 30 against the Broncos and ranks third nationally in points per game (22.2).
- Junior G Kyle Collinsworth has set an NCAA single-season record with five triple-doubles this season
- Head coach Dave Rose is in his ninth season and has a 246-83 record.
- BYU swept the regular season series with the Pilots. The Cougars had a big first half in a 97-88 home victory and then overcame an eight-point halftime deficit for an 82-69 win in Portland on Feb. 26.
- Last year the team's split the season series with the Pilots pulling out a thrilling 114-110 triple overtime win at the Chiles Center.

**WCC TOURNEY TIDBITS**

- Portland's win over Saint Mary's was the first over the Gaels in WCC Tournament history (1-4).
- The Pilots are making their fifth appearance in the WCC semifinals, three of which have come during head coach Eric Reveno's tenure (2009, 2010).
- Portland's other two semifinals came under coach Rob Chavez in 1995 and 1996, both against Gonzaga.
- The Pilots won the 1996 Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for just the second time in school history (1959).

**STIFLING DEFENSE RETURNS**

- Portland held Saint Mary's to 30 percent shooting on Saturday, the lowest for a Division I Pilot opponent this season.
- The 52 points allowed also matched the lowest for a D-I opponent this year (Pepperdine, Feb. 12).
- During Portland's four-game winning streak late in the WCC season, the Pilots defense held opponents to 56.5 points per game and 36.8 percent from the field... In the four losses that followed teams averaged 76.8 points and shot 48.7 percent.

**BALANCED EFFORT**

- Coach Reveno used 11 different players in the first half and received contributions from a variety of sources in the Pilots win over Saint Mary's.
- Starting F Volodymyr Gerun was battling the flu and forced to come off the bench, but freshman Jason Todd filled in with his second career start and finished with a season-high 14 points (12 in the second half).
- Leading scorer Kevin Bailey was in early foul trouble, but freshman G D'Marques Tyson provided a lift off the bench with 10 points (eight in the first half).
- Senior C Thomas van der Mars had 10 points at the break, but picked up his fourth foul early in the second half. Little-used freshman C Philipp Hartwich provided a huge boost with 12 solid minutes battling against All-WCC big, Brad Waldow.
- Despite being under the weather, Gerun provided 21 key minutes off the bench.
- Bailey returned for a productive second half and finished with a team-high 16 points.

**THREE PILOTS GARNER ALL-WCC RECOGNITION**

- Sophomore PG Alec Wintering was named to the All-WCC Second Team and was one of only two underclassmen among the top 15 players recognized (Santa Clara sophomore Jared Brownridge earned first team honors).
- Senior C Thomas van der Mars picked up his second straight All-WCC honorable mention award, while senior G Kevin Bailey also was honorable mention.

### IT'S ALL-ACADEMIC

- Under Coach Reveno the Pilots have thrived academically.
- Thomas van der Mars became the first men's basketball player in program history to earn CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team honors last week. He earned third team recognition last year and joins Rick Raivio (1978, 1980) as the only Pilots to receive Academic All-America awards.
- Van der Mars also picked up his third WCC All-Academic Team honor and was joined by teammate Riley Barker on the first team.
- Ryan Nicholas was the recipient of the 2014 Division I-AAA Athletic Director's Association Postgraduate Scholarship and joined van der Mars on the 10-player national all-academic team.
- The team boasts a 100% graduation rate, a near-perfect rating in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, and 16 WCC All-Academic selections since 2007.

### INJURY REPORT

- Senior F Volodymyr Gerun came off the bench Saturday for the first time this season as he battled the flu all week.
- Senior C Riley Barker suffered a season-ending knee injury early in the Jan. 8 win against Santa Clara.
- Senior G Kevin Bailey returned to the lineup on Jan. 8 after missing the previous eight games with a foot injury suffered in the first half against Portland State on Dec. 3.
- Junior G Bryce Pressley missed the Jan. 8 and Jan. 10 games with a concussion, but returned to the lineup the following week.
- Senior G David Carr is out for the year with a torn ACL from the offseason.

### PRESSLEY HEATING UP

- Junior G Bryce Pressley has been on fire from three-point range of late, hitting at least one triple in 14-of-the-last-17 games.
- He has made three or more three-pointers in seven of the last 11 games, going 26-for-52 during that span.
- Last season, Pressley finished second in the WCC in three-point percentage (.457) and he currently ranks fifth in the league (.444) this year.

### VAN DER MARS ESTABLISHES SCHOOL BLOCKS RECORD

- Senior C Thomas van der Mars now owns the Portland record for career blocked shots with 119. He passed previous leader Tim Frost (2000-02, 103) in the second half at Santa Clara on Feb. 7.
- The Pilot big man blocked a career-high five shots at Pacific, the first time a Pilot has blocked five shots in a game since the 2006-07 season. He ranks third in the WCC in blocked shots per game, trailing only San Diego's Jito Kok — a former teammate at the Canarias Basketball Academy — and LMU's Marin Mornar.
- Van der Mars already joined the 1,000-point club earlier this season and has cracked the top 10 in school history for rebounds, field goal percentage and games started.

### LINEUP ADJUSTMENTS GO FULL CIRCLE

- Portland opened the season with a starting lineup of Wintering, Pressley, Bailey, Gerun and van der Mars for the first seven games and went 6-1 in those games.
- The Pilots have had to juggle the rotation due to various injuries to key players since, using nine different starting lineups in the last 24 games.
- The original starting five was back on the court together in the 10 previous games prior to Senior Day (Bobby Sharp replaced Pressley).
- Wintering is the only player to start all 31 games.

### WINTERING DELIVERS BUZZER BEATER... AGAIN

- Sophomore PG Alec Wintering buried his second game-winning three-pointer this WCC season when he beat the buzzer on Jan. 22 for a 72-69 win over Pacific. The shot made SportsCenter's Top 10 plays for the night at No. 2.
- Wintering opened WCC play by burying a step-back three-pointer to win the game at San Diego on Dec. 27 with 0.3 seconds left.

**VOLDY IS VERY GOOD**

- Senior F Volodymyr "Voldy" Gerun recorded a career-high with 15 rebounds at Gonzaga on Jan. 29.
- Gerun has been a key contributor all season and had started all 30 regular season games before the flu forced him off the bench Saturday.
- He was named to the Challenge in Music City All-Tournament Team and had 13 points and 14 rebounds in the WCC opener at San Diego.
- He erupted for a career high 21 points on 10-of-12 shooting against SIU-Edwardsville. That came six days after recording his first career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds at San Jose State.
- Gerun joined the Pilots last season after a brief stop at West Virginia, but playing behind a pair of three-year starters averaged just 11.2 minutes per game.
- He dropped 15 pounds over the last offseason and it showed as he logged 41 active minutes against SJSU.
- Gerun earned the starting nod in place of the graduated Ryan Nicholas and is averaging 8.3 points, 6.0 rebounds, and is shooting 50 percent from the field.
- He ranks fourth in blocked shots (1.1) and seventh in rebounding in the WCC.

**OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY**

- The Pilots rank third in the WCC and 97th nationally in points per game (70.3)
- Portland's 38.6 percent from three-point range ranks 34th nationally.
- Portland has also shot 70 percent or better from the free throw line in 19 games.

**VAN DER MARS REACHING MILESTONES**

- With 20 points during a win at Sacramento State on Dec. 14, Thomas van der Mars became the 37th player in school history to score 1,000 career points.
- He now has 1,228 career points in addition to owning the school blocked shots record (117) and holding down fourth place in career field goal percentage (.555).
- A native of The Netherlands, van der Mars is also sixth on the UP career rebounding charts (815).

**BLOCK PARTY**

- Portland has used its size and experience to become the No. 1 shot blocking squad in the WCC.
- Portland averages 4.5 blocked shots per game, tops in the WCC and 58th nationally.
- Thomas van der Mars and Voldy Gerun rank third and fourth in the WCC respectively, while Riley Barker was also top five in the league prior to his injury.

### **WINTERING HAVING BREAKOUT CAMPAIGN**

- Alec Wintering has recorded eight 20-point games this year, including during WCC play.
- His career-high 30 points at BYU was the first 30-point game for a Pilot since Jared Stohl tallied 30 against Idaho on Dec. 22, 2009.
- He also finished 15-of-17 from the free throw line, marking the first 15 makes from the foul line since Darren Cooper versus Oregon on Dec. 22, 2005.
- Wintering dished out a season-high 12 assists at Sacramento State and followed up with 24 points and five assists at UNLV.
- He had 27 points with six assists against Portland State on Dec. 3 after going 7-of-12 from the field and 11-of-13 at the foul line.
- That effort bettered his career-high of 24 points at San Jose State on 7-of-11 from the field, 4-of-4 from three-point range, and 6-of-6 at the foul line.
- The Charlotte, N.C. native is shooting the ball with much more confidence this season. He leads the WCC in three-point percentage (.485).
- Wintering also ranks second in the league in assists (5.8), third in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.4), fifth in steals (1.5) and ninth in FT percentage (.794).
- Wintering had a phenomenal freshman campaign in which he started the first 27 games before a leg injury sidelined him the final four games of the season – Portland went 0-4 without him.
- Wintering ranked third in the WCC in assist/turnover ratio (2.2), fourth in assists (4.5), fifth in steals (1.6) and ninth in FT percentage (.833) last year.
- His 13 assists against San Francisco were the most by a Pilot against a D-I school in program history, and one shy of the school record.

### **BARKER'S SEASON, COLLEGIATE CAREER OVER**

- Riley Barker stepped up big this season, including a season-high 14 points and seven rebounds versus UNLV in his first start this year.
- He added 10 points, eight rebounds and three blocked shots at BYU.
- One of the top shot blockers in school history, he was on pace to break the school record before a season-ending knee injury versus Santa Clara on Jan. 8.
- The Surrey, British Columbia native concludes his career with 91 blocked shots which ranks third all-time.

### **CLOSE CALLS**

- Portland has played four overtime games this season and are 6-3 in games decided by five points or less.
- Portland opened the season with an overtime win at San Jose State, lost in OT at home to Oregon State, and on the road to both UNLV and Pacific.
- Games at Sacramento State and versus Murray State in Nashville also came down to the closing seconds with the Pilots pulling out both wins.
- At home versus Pacific on Jan. 21, Alec Wintering beat the buzzer with a three-pointer for a 72-69 win. Wintering also won the game at San Diego with a three-pointer with less than one second remaining.
- Last season, the team went 1-7 in games decided by five or less and was 1-1 in overtime games.

### **FRESHMEN TAKING ADVANTAGE**

- Freshman G Jason Todd has played effective minutes since moving into the regular rotation.
- Todd is averaging 5.0 points and 3.3 rebounds per game while shooting 50 percent from the field and 46 percent from three-point range. More importantly, Todd has been one of the team's best perimeter defenders and can play multiple positions on the wing or as a stretch four.
- Todd, the two-time Washington Gatorade State Player of the Year at Mill Creek HS, grabbed a season-high eight rebounds versus Montana State and scored 12 points versus Santa Clara.
- Freshman F Gabe Taylor was pressed into more court time following Riley Barker's injury. The Portland native responded with a season-high 12 points in 26 minutes of action against Santa Clara. He followed with eight points and three rebounds against USF and finished 9-of-10 from the field in the two games.
- Taylor led Valley Catholic School to consecutive Oregon 3A State Titles playing under former Pilot assistant coach, Joel Sobotka.
- Freshman G D'Marques Tyson has also had a great impact. He scored a season-high 25 points off the bench in Portland's loss to Valparaiso at the Challenge in Music City. Tyson finished the game 9-for-11 from the field and 6-for-8 from three-point range. He also had 13 first half points in the road win at San Diego and 12 points against San Francisco.
- Tyson is third on the team with 35 three-pointers made this season and is shooting 41 percent from beyond the arc.
- The Bothell, Wash. native played last season at Quality Education Academy in North Carolina after helping lead Lakeside HS to the Washington 3A title game as a junior.

### **STAFF ADDITIONS**

- Head Coach Eric Reveno bolstered his staff with an infusion of NBA-level expertise in the offseason.
- Herb Brown, who has 45 years of coaching experience including four NBA Championship rings, joined the bench as an assistant coach.
- Former Portland Trail Blazers Video Coordinator, Tim Grass, was hired as Portland's Video Technology Coordinator.

## HEAD COACH ERIC REVENO



Eric Reveno was named head coach on April 10, 2006, becoming the 20th coach in Pilot history. He previously served nine successful seasons as an assistant at Stanford. Reveno has spearheaded Portland's rebuilding effort and has already achieved remarkable results during his tenure on The Bluff.

The Pilots set a school record by averaging 20 wins per season from 2009-11, the most wins in a three-year period. Portland reached the post-season three times, cracked the Top 25, and has three wins over ranked teams. The Pilots have also been one of the best 3-point shooting teams in the nation during Reveno's era.

And the success hasn't just been on the court. The team boasts a 100% graduation rate, a near-perfect rating in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, and 16 Academic All-WCC selections since 2007. Thomas van der Mars became the school's first men's basketball First Team Academic All-American in 2015 after earning third team honors in 2014. Ryan Nicholas was granted the 2014 Division I-AAA Athletic Directors Association Postgraduate scholarship and was joined by van der Mars on the association's 10-player All-Academic Team.

Last season, the Pilots bounced back to post 15 wins including marquee victories over Gonzaga and BYU. Injuries to leading scorer Kevin Bailey and starting point guard Alec Wintering hampered Portland down the stretch as the team lost it's final five games.

The 2010-11 season was thought by many to be a 'rebuilding' year following the loss of five key players from a 2009-10 squad that matched a school-record 21 wins and went 10-4 in the WCC to match the best league record in program history. Despite returning just one starter, Reveno led the Pilots to another 20-win season and a third straight trip to the CIT. It also marked the first back-to-back 20-win campaigns in program history.

Reveno was named the 2009 West Coast Conference and District 9 Coach of the Year after leading the Pilots to a 19-13 record and invitation to the inaugural CIT. It marked a 10-win improvement from 2008 and the program's first postseason appearance since 1996. The Pilots also finished third in the WCC standings (9-5) and posted its first win over a ranked opponent (84-66 over #18 Saint Mary's) since 1981.

Reveno preaches a disciplined style of play, has a track record of player development, and respects the role of the student-athlete. He has built the foundation for future success through quality recruiting and an emphasis on development, both on the court and in the weight room. Voted one of the Top 25 Recruiters in the nation by rivals.com in 2006, Reveno has brought his eye for talent to Portland with good results.

Academic integrity is another cornerstone of Reveno's program. A Pac-10 Conference All-Academic Team selection himself in 1989 as a senior, Reveno helped coach 14 players to 25 all-conference academic honors as an assistant, the most of any school in the Pac-10 during his nine-year tenure.

Reveno, long recognized as a leader in the use of sports performance analysis technology, spoke in Sydney, Australia during the Fall of 2008 at a worldwide summit hosted by SportsTec, one of the foremost providers of video & technology solutions to the international sports community. The cutting edge approach to technology has become a staple of the Pilot program in teaching, player development and recruiting. As a result, Reveno was the lone representative from the United States asked to speak to an audience of performance professionals from some of the top sports leagues and organizations in the world.

An imposing 6-foot, 8-inch figure, Reveno commands respect not with his mere presence, but with his passion for, and teaching of, a disciplined style of play reminiscent of his formative coaching years as an assistant under legendary coach Mike Montgomery at Stanford. He also points to the coaching philosophies of Tom Davis, the man who recruited and coached him at Stanford his first two years, and legendary coach Pete Newell as major influences on his coaching style. Reveno served as an assistant coach under Montgomery for seven years before being promoted to associate head coach during the 2004-05 season alongside Trent Johnson.

A post player for the Cardinal in the late '80s under both Davis and Montgomery, Reveno helped coach his alma mater to seven 20-win seasons, three 30-win seasons, eight NCAA Tournament appearances, an NCAA Final Four in 1998, three years with a No. 1 national ranking, four Pacific-10 Conference Championships and a .768 overall winning percentage.

He has developed a reputation as one of the top post player coaches in the country. Reveno recruited and coached numerous outstanding frontline players for the Cardinal including Mark Madsen, Jarron Collins, Jason Collins, Curtis Borchardt, Tim Young, Rob Little, Justin Davis and Matt Haryasz. He was also a prominent staff member at the nationally renowned Pete Newell Big Man Camp for six seasons. Seven players under Reveno's tutelage at Stanford went on to play in the NBA.

Described as a "fierce competitor" on the court, Reveno played in 116 games during his career at Stanford (1985-87, 89), including 30 games as a starter during his senior season in 1988-89. He was a two-time team captain and most inspirational player and averaged 9.4 points and 5.1 rebounds per game as a senior, helping the Cardinal to a 26-7 record, a 15-3 mark in the Pac-10, and a No. 12 national ranking. The Cardinal advanced to the NCAA Tournament, Stanford's first appearance in the tourney since the 1942 season.

After graduating from Stanford in 1989 with a degree in economics, he spent four years playing professional basketball in Japan. He returned to Stanford and obtained his masters degree in business administration in 1995. Prior to joining the Stanford coaching staff in 1997, he served as president for two years of Riekas Center in Menlo Park, a non-profit mentoring organization that works with athletes of all ages.

Reveno was born in Stanford, Calif. on March 12, 1966 and attended The Menlo School during his high school years. He and his wife, Amanda, have two children: Katie (12) and Andrew (9).
